Stephanie A. Urchick has been an RI director and Rotary Foundation trustee and has served Rotary in numerous capacities, including as training leader, regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, and RI president's representative. In addition, Urchick was a representative and member-at-large at three sessions of the Council on Legislation.

Urchick has also served as chair of the Strategic Planning Committee and The Rotary Foundation's Centennial Celebration Committee, as well as a member of various Rotary committees, including the Election Review Committee and Operational Review Committee.

A Rotary member since 1991, Urchick has participated in a variety of international service projects, including National Immunization Days in India and Nigeria. In Vietnam, she worked with clubs to help build a primary school and traveled to the Dominican Republic to install water filters. A student of several Slavic languages, she has mentored new Rotary members in Ukraine and coordinated a Rotary Foundation grant for mammography equipment and a biopsy unit for a hospital in Poland. In its commemorative book, the Rotary Club of Krakow, Poland, noted Urchick as a key figure for helping the rebirth of Rotary in post-Communist Poland. Urchick has also helped to pair clubs and districts in the U.S. with Rotary clubs in Albania, Kosovo, and Ukraine for humanitarian and educational services.

Urchick's professional background is in the higher education, consulting, and entertainment industries. She received her doctorate degree in Leadership Studies from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and has been recognized by The Rotary Foundation and numerous community and international organizations.

Urchick asks members to champion Rotary's Action Plan so they can improve their clubs and keep Rotary strong, find a balance between continuity and change, and work for peace. She also emphasizes the continuing importance of the effort to eradicate polio. She urges members to join or initiate PolioPlus Societies in their districts and do all they can to help end the disease. Urchick will lead the 2025 Rotary Presidential Peace Conference in Istanbul, Turkey, 20-22 February 2025, with the theme Healing in a Divided World.

Hon'ble Justice Sashikanta Mishra born on 17th January 1967 at Bhubaneswar as the youngest son of Khetramani Mishra and an illustrious father late Bimal Kishore Mishra who is still remembered for his profound knowledge and contribution in the codification of revenue laws in the state, administrative proficiency and die hard honesty and integrity. As an IAS Officer, Late Bimal Mishra had set exemplary standards in the field of administration, which evokes respect even long after his departure.

Justice Sashikanta Mishra completed his early education from St. Joseph's High School and Kendriya Vidyalaya, Bhubaneswar. Passed ISC in first class from BJB College. Graduated with Economics honors from BJB College. Did his PG in Economics in 1st class from Ravenshaw College, Cuttack. Completed his LLB from Dhenkanal Law College. Started practice as an advocate in the High Court in 1996 in the office of Senior Advocate Narendra Mishra. Started his independent practice in the year 2003. Dealt with Labour, Insurance, Company, Consumer, Cooperative and Writ matters etc appearing before the High Court and various courts and Tribunals of the country.

Was directly recruited in the Cadre of District Judge in the year 2009. Held various posts in the Cadre such as ADJ, Balasore, ADJ Rairangpur, Vigilance Judge, Jeypore, District and Sessions Judge, Angul, Member Secretary, State Legal Services Authority, District and Sessions Judge, Keonjhar, Chairman of Sales Tax Tribunal, Principal Secretary, Law Department and finally District and Sessions Judge, Ganjam. The Supreme Court collegium approved the proposal for his elevation as Judge of Orissa High Court on 29th September. Was elevated as Judge of the High Court on 19th October.

DR. ASHUTOSH DEBATA is an eminent environmental scientist, outstanding researcher, prolific writer, distinguished teacher, social reformer, firm believer of humanism and a Member of Rotary Family since RY 1985-86, He has also served as PDG of Y's Men International of Central VI Region in 2011. He chose a noble profession of Teaching but his passion was curiosity of discovering the world of down trodden, destitute and differently able people, young and old, with a service to the mankind. His journey of life started growing up in a doctor's family of Salipur in the foundation of strong values of life which set him for success, helped him sustained hard work, cultivated a curious and open mind for caring others, shaped his formative years in hopes which resonate with his own life and leadership. Born with a divine genius, he started his profession as a faculty of Botany after obtaining Master's and Doctorate in Botany from Utkal University and Central Rice Research Institute, Cuttack. He reached to the pinnacle of his career as Principal of Stewart Science College, Cuttack, Director of the DRIEM's Group of Institutions culminating as the Director of Centre for Environmental Studies of Forest, Environment and Climate Change Dept. Govt. of Odisha as well as the Coordinator of Envis Center of Odisha under the Ministry of Forest, Environment and Climate Change, Govt. of India. Besides Dr Debata was acting as visiting Professor in Ravenshaw University and Utkal University. His concern for environment was in his blood, and from an early age, Prof. Debata was struck by the stark realities of modern industrialisation and environmental degradation, community deprivation and inclusive growth, he saw all around him, become a lifelong intellectual lodestar to carry on his dreams during his post retirement time in the service of mankind. He has left his indelible marks in the community service of the downtrodden as an active life member of Redcross Society, Council of Child Welfare Committee, Animal Welfare Society, Cuttack District sakshyarata and Zilla Swasthya Samiti, Adviser to Voluntary Organisations, institutes of blind, deaf, orphan, Jarashram, Youth Clubs, Member of the Odisha High Court Legal Aid Cell, State Consumer Protection Committee, founder Secretary of Cuttack District Environment Society, Member Secretary of Anshupa Lake Development Committee besides Member Convenor of District Implementation and Monitoring Committee for 35 years. He is included in a number of National and State level Educational, Social and Environmental Expert Committee also. American Biographical Research Board of Advisors USA in the year 1999, and Secretary of Bigyan Prachar Samiti since 1976 and continuing. Firmly believing in the power of education, motivation and awareness to transform human lives, Dr. Debata consistently devoted his time to the call of his duties for the needy people with exceptional dedication. His close encounter with under privileged children has been a source of inspiration which led him in the path of service to the mankind through bringing hope and cheers in the face of the differently able children, in the millennium city of Cuttack at Utkal Balashram and Reba Devi Shovaniya Sikshyashrama, Old age Home Sakha, Gandhi Smruti Pitha, SAHAYA- Ashraya The Shelter since 1980 thus making a difference to their lives through his voluntary and charitable contributions. His enthusiastic and empathetic spirit for the cause of humanity and unparallel support to the people in despair have been the ray of hope to create a difference in their lives. Now, even in the superannuated phase of his life, Dr. Debata is still continuing his uninterrupted services for the society. His unstinting care for the old age people, Dr. Debata involved himself with senior citizens of Shradha-Sadhana an old age home at Naraj, Cuttack since 2002-03 for their wellbeing.

Dr. Gopal Krishna Panda, Former Professor of Geography of Utkal Univ. and presently, Emeritus Professor at Kalinga Institute of Social Science, Deemed to be Univ., Bhubaneswar is a well known geographer, who has inscribed his name in the annals of the Earth Sciences. He is an excellent teacher, an outstanding researcher and a mentor for the scholars and students in the areas of Earth Sciences. He has been awarded the prestigious Senior Research Fellowship by Indian Council of Social Science Research, MoHRD, Govt. of India, New Delhi in 2020 and honoured with the Emeritus Fellowship in geography in the year 2016 by the University Grants Commission, British Council Fellowship in 2005 to visit U.K, conferred Ph.D in geography in 1989 and University Gold Medal in 1978 and National Scholarship in 1976. During his tenure of service at Utkal Univ, he has served in different capacities as Professor and Head of the Dept. of Geography, Chairman of the Post Graduate Council, Member of the Syndicate, Senate and Chief Executive of the Population Research Center of Govt. of India.

He has nearly 35 years of teaching and research in the areas of Earth Sciences focusing on capacity building, programme evaluation and value addition. He was the Visiting Professor at M.S Univ.. Vadadora in 2016, Punjab Univ., Chandigarh in 2018, Gauhati Univ, Assam in 2019 and Fellow of the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine of Liverpool Univ., UK in 1995, and visited Minnesota State University, USA in the year 2013. He was the person to prepare the “Odisha State Disaster Vulnerability Report” for OSDMA in the year 2010. Under his guidance 16 students have been awarded Ph. D degree in geography and environmental science. He was awarded Smt. Parbati Mishra and Prof M. M. Mohanty Memorial award in the year 2017 and 2021.

He has authored and edited 15 books, directed 5 major research projects of UGC, ICSSR, UNDP, DST and OSDMA and worked for international agencies like WHO, UNDP, DFID on various contemporary issues of environment, natural hazards and climate change. Three of his most recent publications are “Indigenous People and Nature” published from Elsevier, Netherland, Indigenous knowledge in Disaster Risk Reduction” and Landslide Susceptibility and Risk Reduction by Springer Nature from Switzerland during 2022 to 2024. As the chief executive of the Population Research Center of Utkal Univ., he has under taken evaluation of many ongoing programs of National Health Mission and was also associated with large scale demographic and population surveys like NFHS – 3 and DLHS and research studies of the H & F W Dept. of Govt. of Odisha and India besides Advisory Board Member in the World Bank supported ICZM project and DST sponsored Spatial Database Infrastructure Project of the state. Even after his superannuation from Utkal Univ. in 2015, his active involvement in academic research and publication of books and journals at the international and national level, his motivational behavior, inspiring words, good manners and humility have made him close to the hearts of his students and peer groups.

Dr. Amaresh Kumar Nayak completed his B.Sc. (Ag.) from OUAT, Bhubaneswar in the year 1991, M.Sc. (Ag) in 1993 and Ph.D. in 1996 from BHU Varanasi.

He joined ICAR as an ARS Scientist in the year 1996 and served at ICAR-CSSRI, Anand and Lucknow; ICAR-PDFSR, Modipuram at various capacity till 2010; Principal Scientist at ICAR-NRRI from 2010-2014, Head, Crop Production Division, ICAR-NRRI, Cuttack from 2014 to 2022. Currently, he holds the post of Director, ICAR-National Rice Research Institute, Cuttack, Odisha from November 2022 to date.

He is a renowned Soil Scientist with specialized research area on Nutrient management, Carbon sequestration, Problem soil management, Water quality assessment and modeling, and Climate change: adaptation and mitigation.

Borlaug International Agricultural Science and Technology Fellowship 2008; Australian Endeavour Executive Fellow 2018; Visiting Scientist to SWERI, ARC, Egypt 2007-2008; ISSS-Dr. J.S.P. Yadav Memorial Award 2013; IPNI-FAI Award 2016; SCON & SIT Excellence in Science Award 2021; CRRI Best Worker Award in the Principal Scientist category in 2013, Basudha Award in 2023, Dr. M.S. Swaminathan Agri Excellency Award-Agri Vision 2024 etc.

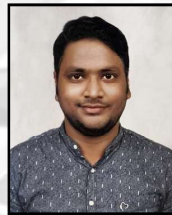
