**Eye Vision Camp: A Step Towards Better Vision for Students** 



On December 9th, 2024, the club successfully organized an Eye Vision Camp for the students of Bal Vidya Mandir Secondary School and Adarsh English School, catering to children from standard 5th to 10th. This initiative was made




possible through a partnership with the Ratnanidhi Charitable Trust, which aimed to provide free eye check-ups and eyeglasses to students in need.

At Bal Vidya Mandir, a total of 179 students underwent eye screening, and it was found that 61 students had weak vision. Meanwhile, at Adarsh English School, 115 students were checked, with 44 students identified as having vision issues. The camp not only offered professional eye care but also ensured that students who required corrective eyewear received free glasses, helping to improve their learning experience.

This event highlights the importance of vision care in the overall health and well-being of students, ensuring that no child is held back from their education due to visual impairments. The club and the schools extend their heartfelt gratitude to the Ratnanidhi Charitable Trust for their generous support and for making this valuable service available to the students free of charge. service. The air buzzed with possibility as CSR leaders, Major Donors, and potential philanthropists connected over a common cause.


The evening was graced by none other than Padma Bhushan Smt. Rajashree Birla, whose presence

In his illuminating presentation, Capt. Tendulkar revealed the remarkable growth in CSR-Rotary partnerships-from 60 companies in 2021-22 to 166 in 2023-24, with funding surging from \$2.8 million to \$8.1 million. Even more impressive? RID 3142 alone has contributed \$400,000 and is ambitiously striving toward a \$1 million target.



When Dr. Pandya took the stage, the room fell silent. His words resonated as he spoke about the intrinsic joy of giving. "Rotary embodies two powerful words: 'Hope' and 'Opportunity'," he said, his voice carrying to every corner of the venue. "Hope represents the aspiration for a brighter, more compassionate world where individuals can thrive and communities can flourish. Opportunity signifies the chance to turn this vision into reality."

Perhaps the most poignant moment came when Smt. Rajashree Birla addressed the gathering. With characteristic elegance, she invoked the wisdom of Swami Vivekananda: "Take only one idea and work on it sincerely with commitment." She shared how the Birla Group embraces





"compassionate capitalism," emphasizing that when corporations serve greater social causes, they simultaneously strengthen communities and their own organizations.

The evening wasn't without its recognition of exceptional generosity. AKS Donor Rtn. DP Tripathi received well-deserved accolades for his substantial contributions to the Polio Fund and TRF. The host club and co-hosts were also celebrated for orchestrating such a meaningful gathering.
