Our club has been a beacon of hope and change, and the projects we've accomplished this year are a testament to our dedication:

- Nikhay Mitra Initiative: We raised a remarkable ₹17 lakhs to support families battling tuberculosis, positively impacting 1,050 families and reinforcing our commitment to eradicating this disease.

designated " Disease Prevention and Control" month. If you haven't already, do take up a project in this sphere.



ROTARY THEME OF THE MONTH



A healthy mind and body are essential for the proper functioning of human beings. Health has always been a major priority for Rotary International. One of Rotary's significant areas of focus is the eradication of polio worldwide. Poliomyelitis is a highly infectious disease that primarily affects children under the age of five. The virus spreads from person to person through contaminated water. It can attack the nervous system and, in some cases, cause paralysis. Although there is no cure, a safe and effective vaccine has been used by Rotary to immunize approximately 2.5 billion children globally.

"END POLIO NOW"-THE ROTARY MISSION

The History of Rotary's Battle Against Polio

In 1894, a major polio outbreak in the USA caused widespread deaths and paralysis. By 1905, polio was declared a contagious disease, and in 1916, another major outbreak caused significant fatalities and disabilities. In 1955, the polio vaccine developed by Dr. Jonas Salk was declared safe and effective.

Rotary International began its journey in polio eradication in 1979 with the launch of an ambitious project to immunize six million children in the Philippines. The launch of PolioPlus in 1985, a coordinated effort by the private sector to support public health, aimed to raise US \$120 million for the cause. These efforts bore fruit. In 1995, 165 million children were immunized in China and India. By 2006, the number of countries where polio remained endemic had dropped to just four-a significant achievement. The fight against polio continues-not only to eradicate the disease but also to prevent its resurgence.

Other Health Initiatives by Rotary International

Apart from its efforts to eradicate polio, Rotary International is involved in various initiatives to promote a healthy environment, including:

- Establishing health camps and training facilities to provide medical aid.
- Designing and building infrastructure to improve education and health facilities.
- Supporting education for the underprivileged to raise awareness about health and hygiene.
- Supporting immunization drives for various preventable diseases.
- Providing safe drinking water and sanitation facilities to promote healthier living.
- Working on maternal and child health facilities worldwide.

Rotary's commitment to ensuring a better future remains unwavered. Ending polio is a monumental task that cannot be achieved alone. It requires a collective effort from all Rotary members and partners. Together, lasting change is possible, and the reemergence of this devastating disease can be prevented.


W James L. Bomar Jr., then RI president, puts the first drops of vaccine into a child's mouth, & launched the Philippine poliomyelitis immunization effort.


