So think about your future, Special things to see and do... New faces and new challenges, Just waiting there for you!


For twenty one is a milestone And it marks another turn. Today's a day of celebration, See those candles burn!

## VOYAGE EXTRAORDINAIRE By Rtn. Brinda Mukherjee

Turkey, lying at the junction of Asia and Europe is a melange of cultures. Witnessing multiple civilizations over the ages it has come to be known as the "Country of Civilizations".





Exploring Turkey has been on our bucket list since a long time which got realised this summer. We wanted to maximize our visit without wasting

time in transit and we chose Capadocia as our first destination.

Capadocia region is steeped in historical richness and natural beauty. There are a number of underground cities in this region. We chose to visit Derinkiyu which is the largest one excavated.

It is estimated to accommodate a population

of 20,000. The city could be sealed off from inside by rocks and thus an entire population could disappear. The people used it to protect themselves from the invading forces. The city has different floors with granary, stables, church, kitchen, wine cellar and a system of air circulation. The entire landscape of the region is dotted with geographical

features called Fairy Chimneys. They were formed by volcanic eruptions. Eroded by rain and wind they reflect a different world as it were and are considered one of the natural wonders of the world. This is a place worth a visit.

Capadocia is also known for its exquisite pottery, sufi dance called 'Dervish', hamam bath, which we could all pack in except the coveted 'Balloon Ride' which got cancelled twice due to inclement weather. The flip side being that we could not see the sunrise and take Instagrammable photos but what's the bright side to it? Of course we saved Rs. 40k which was fruitfully used for other purchases.

Our next destination after spending 3





beautiful days at Capadocia was the city of Izmir and Kusadasi. Izmir is a port city along the Aegean Sea and is the third biggest city of Turkey. We chose Kusadasi as our destination mainly to visit Pamukkale and the city of Ephesus which is the pièce de resistance of this tour. Ephesus city has many attractions namely the Byzantine baths, gymnasium, colonnaded streets, theatres and of course the library of Celcus. It is said that Virgin Mary spent her last days in the Ephesus region. The house of the Virgin Mary is the place of pilgrimage for the Christians. The main goddess of Ephesus is Artemis which is also the main attraction of the city.

Pamukkale known as the 'cotton castle' is steeped in natural beauty. Flowing thermal spring water leaves behind calcium carbon crystal deposits which in turn form travertines, a sight simply spectacular and worth a visit.

Cleopatra pool is another major attraction and we didn't miss the opportunity to take a dip at the thermal pool. Many tourists think Pamukkale is overhyped but for me the visit was worth every penny.

We literally saved the best for the last: the fascinating Istanbul. I discovered a hidden gem as it were and I fell in love with it. Paris is magical, my first love for various reasons but Istanbul is a close second and I simply adored the people; nice, warm, friendly, courteous, respectful and charming not to mention their physical beauty. My jaw literally dropped every other minute at the sight of those slim, pearl complexioned, dewy-eyed beauties

with a waist that matched Scarlet O Hara's. Modern, sophisticated and courteous and vanity is not one of their virtues, thank God. Honestly it is the people that also make a city beautiful and Istanbul bears testimony to this fact.

The cuisine is subtle, delicately flavoured without being overpowering and we gorged on their kebabs of various sorts accompanied with their mouthwatering naans, something to be savoured, a different category altogether, a must try. I know the French people have a love affair with their breads but the Turks know how to make them as well without the fanfare. And the baklavas, the Turkish delights, their spices, nuts, fruits (pomegranates look like rubies) ...the list goes on. God has bestowed many blessings upon them and they have preserved them with love and care.

Their ittar is another subject matter of discussion. There are various kinds to suit everyone's budget, the most expensive ones vying for the best perfumes of France.

The cultures of the Byzantine and the Ottoman empires are best reflected in the city of Istanbul. It is a veritable paradise for the history aficionados and I would willingly accompany them once more to my new found love of a city that boasts of rich cultures, heritage and fine tastes.

Four and a half days is not enough to explore Istanbul but we tried to do justice by packing them all in and literally got exhausted at the end of it all.
