The Green Expedition

The first community service (non medical) project pertaining to the new area of focus "Protect the environment" named " The Green Expidition" was launched on 2nd August 2020 at Dhyanashram Joka and St Xaviers Raghavpur campus.

Apart from District Governor Sudip Mukherjee, District Trainer PDG Angshuman Bandopadhyay, DGN Ajay Kumar Law, PDG Uttam Ganguli who is the national committee member of Environment, many district committee members and Presidents were present for the occasion.

Programme was inaugurated by the District Governor when he briefly described the relevance of the project. DT Angshuman Bandopadhyay, PDG Uttam Ganguli and DGN Ajay Kumar Law expressed their support and solidarity towards the programme. Next, the host clubs were felicitated.

After the brief inauguration, the team moved to the campus. The campus was badly ravaged by the cyclone Amphan. About 100 full grown saplings of mahogany, and other trees were planted by the district team and President of various clubs who were present there.

After this, the team moved to the St Xaviers Raghavpur campus, where again 25 saplings were donated and planted.

This programme was repeated again on 19th August 2020, on E M By Pass opposite ITC Sonar Hotel.

Dr Subrata Gupta, Principal Secretary Food processing and Horticulture, Ms Papiya Ghosh Roy Chowdhury, Joint Secretary Urban development and Municipal Affairs and Mr Partha pratim Ghosh, Executive Engineer Roads and Bridges, KMDA were present as Guests for the occasion.

DG Sudip inaugurated the programme and asked the guests to deliver their words of support and encouragement. Next all guests were felicitated.

100 sampling were then planted on the eastern side of E M By pass opposite ITC . Each tree has gabions and bears Rotary logo on them. It goes a long way in enhancement of Public Image of Rotary.

It is pertinent to mention that both the programme were held following strict guidelines of Health Department under Covid conditions.



"An evening with Shoojit Sircar" a webinar was organized by Rotary Club of Calcutta on 14th August 2020.


AN EVENING WITH SHOOJIT SIRCAR

"WE WILL OVERCOME... WITH LESSONS LEARNT"

Rotary Club of Calcutta South City Towers organized a webinar "We Shall overcome with lessons learnt" on 9th August on Zoom platform on 9th of August 2020. The Keynote speaker for the programme was Dr Kunal Sarkar, Senior Vice Chairman, Medica Hospitals pvt ltd, Kolkata, and Chairman Kolkata Heart Foundation.

The programme started with President Ajay Agarwal welcoming all and introducing the topic. Next DG Sudip Mukherjee made his opening remarks. Next Rtn Ritesh Agarwal introduced Dr Kunal Sarkar to the audience.

Next, Dr Kunal Sarkar started his mesmerizing 2 hours long deliberation on the Pandemic that is currently ravaging the world. He called it the Spectre of Extinction, the).1 micron size virus that is challenging the entire world. Such occurrences comes once in a century and make us look back and ponder where have we gone wrong. He spoke about the Cholera, malaria, Spanish flu and swine flu. Whenever Pandemic occurred, they left lasting changes in our lives.

The Current Corona or Covid 19 as it is known as started in China when human beings invaded the natural habitats of bats. China was playing it down and wasted 6 valuable weeks by keeping it a secret. It was Li Wien Liang who at the cost of his life warned the world about it and posted in social media. It was by 11th January 2020 that the world was aware about its existence. It was decoded as Covid 19 in January

2020. All virologists, epidemiologists started debating on how to tackle it. Washing hands, social distancing, wearing masks or go for lockdown. In Britain Neil Fergusson broke out that Lockdown was essential to break the chain of transmission and prepare for healthcare infrastructure.

He then spoke about how different countries had different approach to tackling the Pandemic. India allowed too many people upto 24th March in the country. Of almost 20 lakh people who entered India from November to March, at least 4/5 lakhs were affected !! It was western India that saw the first cases. Started in Kerala then Maharastra, Delhi and slowly moved towards Eastern India. India has failed to locate one or a group of epidemiologist to head our policies. It is such a regret that all top epidemiologist in Havard, Oxford and other research centres are Indians! In our great hurry for a country wide lockdown, we failed 2% of our population who are migrant labours. After losing jobs and no assurance from the employers, they trudged back home, often walking thousands of kilometer, dying in the process and when they reached home, they carried back the disease there.

He said the only way to deal with this is to test and isolate the infected. Maharastra, Delhi are doing a good job with the testing. In west Bengal, testing has to increase. Hospital are stressed not for absolute case nos but for bad planning.

He said, if we have a Covid patient at home, what is required is isolation, monitoring fever, oxygen saturation of 95%. For those who are very sick and cannot stress their lungs, ECMO is reqd. The main difficulty with the treatment lies with the fact that there is no medicine, and high risk of infectivity.

Research organisations all over the world are working for the vaccine, but the efficacy of the vaccine, the duration for which it will last, the production and distribution are major issues that makes it uncertain.

About the lesson learnt: He said that the lifestyle that we have acquired is here to stay. Wearing masks, maintaining social distancing, washing hands frequently are habits that we will have to adhere to for days to come. Healthy living standards are of prime importance now a days. We have learned how important life is.

There were 250 participants who listened with rapt attention to this excellent speech of Dr Sarkar. Meeting ended with vote of thanks.

District Membership Seminar – Come Abroad the Rotary Train

The District 3291 Membership Seminar held on 22nd August 2020, proudly presented on the cloud platform, Dato' Dr Siva Ananthan, Dist Membership Chair, Kaula Lumpur, Malaysia RID 3300, as the Keynote Speaker and Rotary Coordinator, Zone 6, PDG Pradeep Mukherjee, ARC PDG Swapan Choudhury and our own Dist Membership Chair PDG Debasish Mitra, as Speakers and Trainers. Among many Rotary leaders, the new members, who had joined the clubs of Dist 3291 this new Rotary year, were present.

After the Seminar was called to order by DS(A) Sunny Kollannur, followed by the National Anthem, DG Sudip Mukherjee welcomed the dignitaries and other participants.

Rotary Coordinator Pradeep Mukherjee began by highlighting that our members were the soul of the organisation and that growth was a must. Of the three pillars of Rotary, namely, Public Image, the Foundation and Membership, if we could ensure a steady growth of members, the other two would automatically develop. It was heartening that there has been a slow but steady growth in Zones 4, 5 & 6. However, retention of members was equally important. To prevent losing these Rotarians, we must make concerted efforts to find out why they are not meeting. We must retain Rotarians but if we are losing steadily we must find out why they are leaving. Generally, members mostly left in the first or first two years as they felt neglected or not quite connected. It's important to involve them in the service activities and if they are absent, then we should enquire why. Compatibility and assimilation in the Rotary culture would automatically follow with their active involvement. If the meetings are interesting and purposeful, most members would attend them. Finally, the "Mantra" for getting members simply was: Just ask.

Dato' Dr Shiva Ananthan began his keynote address titled "This is Me" stating that our mission in life was to continually evolve ourselves. We in Rotary have to grow if we believe that what we do is good. As an organization we have to grow organically and sustainably. As happens with most organizations, the Law of Entropy works here too. If we remain static, entropy sets in and there is a gradual decline. We

have to be clear on the business we are in. Our business is feeding the hungry, promoting world understanding and peace, healing the sick, not promoting our own egos and pride. This is possible by engaging ourselves in meaningful service projects. In these activities we have to engage and involve our members. While being so engaged, do we constantly reinvent ourselves, remain flexible and find out the best practices for our clubs? We can, after consulting each member, think of becoming a 'hybrid' club whereby we could have one in-person meeting followed by one online meeting, alternately. Small changes make big differences. If necessary, we have to invest in technology, relax attendance rules and develop protocols. We don't have to focus so much on attendance but on engagements to make sure that every member is involved. This engagement must be total.

The Dist. Membership Chair, Debasish Mitra introduced the District Membership Team with their photos shown in a collage format. DMC Debasish then addressed the participants in which he mentioned that, in the first 50 odd days of the current Rotary year, as many as 205 new members, including 50 lady members, had joined. Also, 3 new Rotary clubs were added. He mentioned that R I President Holger Knaack has repeatedly emphasised that the world needs more Rotarians, nothing more, nothing less. DMC Debasish went on to say that since every club is different so the membership development plans of each should be different. We have around 800 lady Rotarians in our District but our efforts must be to bring in more lady members. To bring in new members, we have to think out of the box, be innovative, do something new, connect, inspire and "make a little magic". Everybody has a responsibility and every Rotarian has a crucial role to play.

In his short 'Vote of Thanks' speech, DGE Prabir Chatterjee thanked all the excellent speakers for their innovative ideas. This well attended Membership Seminar saw the participation of over 350 members who were appreciative of the programme.

EYE DONATION AWARENESS : A Webinar

A webinar on Eye donation awareness was held on 29th August 2020 on Zoom Platform.

Rotary International District 3291 in association with Ophthalmological Society of West Bengal organized the all important webinar. Host Club were Rotary Club of Calcutta Inner City and Rotary Club Of Joka.

Speakers for the programme were: Prof. Dr Namrata Sharma, National Faculty Prof Dr G Mukherjee, President Eye Banking Association of India Dr Tuhin Choudhury, Host Faculty and Dr Pushpita Sahu, President OSWB. Dr Subhasis Nag in his introductory speech spoke about how Rotary can lead in the eye donation movement through the Rotaractors and RCCs. Dr G Mukherjee elaborated on the problems faced in creating awareness about eye donation. He told us about the legends in cornea grafting. Dr Namrata Sharma in her deliveration spoke about why we need to donate cornea. There is no medicine for corneal blindness, only by grafting one can get back his vision. She told us about how a near relative can give consent for the donation. She said that everyone can be a cornea donor. She also elaborated on THOTA and the state guidelines to follow. The webinar ended with vote of thanks by the host Club.

Host Club for this program was Rotary Club of Calcutta Mahanagar.

President Pranay Agarwal welcomes all. Then DG Sudip Mukherjee gives his welcome address. Next RIPE Shekhar Mehta introduces the topic as he speaks on Rotary's role in eradicating Polio. He also spoke about how Rotary is working on literacy for the last 5/6 years and now is in partnership with the government.In 12 government Channels, curriculum formulated by Rotary is being used. In water and sanitation, 10% of the work done by government is being done by Rotary. Rotary is also working towards Adult Literacy in association with Bharat Scouts, BhrahmaKumaris and other organisations.

West Bengal Governor Jagdeep Dhankhar was introduced by District Governor of Dist 3240 Sri Subhasis Chatterjee.

Sri Jagdeep Dhankhar started his deliberation saying that Rotary's motto is very similar to the directive principles of state policies applauding Rotary's role in Polio Eradication programme. He said India 2030 is part of a thought process shared by 1.3 billion Indians around the country. He said that India is at the cusp of a transformation. Our PM calls for more governance, less government. United Nation General Assembly has

Ballygunge



RC Ballygunge was a host for the RID3291 Project on Environment Care, 'The Green Expedition', the first phase of which started off with the plantation of high quality timber saplings, at Dhyan Ashram. The club has embarked upon a Global Grant Project 'KARUNA COVID-19' on 15 August 2020 at a total project outlay of Rs 35,83,000. Under this project 6600 PPE Kits, 6600 N-95 Face Mask, 3300 Face Shields were donated at two hospitals, the Howrah District Hospital and ILS Hospital Howrah. The programme at Howrah District Hospital was attended by the District Magistrate of Howrah and that at ILS Hospital was attended by Senior Hospital Authority. The project was covered by the print media represented by different Bengali and Hindi newspapers. The supporting International partner clubs are Rotary Club of Singapore and Rotary Club of Singapore North.

Calcutta

On 1 July 2020, Club was the co-host for RID 3291 organized Blood Donation Camps held simultaneously at three locations in commemoration of Doctor s Day. Immediately after the blood donation camp, a ceremonial installation was held at Rotary Sadan, witnessed by DG Sudip Mukherjee, DT Anshuman Bandyopadhyay and club officials. A cheque was handed over on the same day for the ongoing Centenary School Project at Baramanga School and 20 imported water pumps were given to RCC Bishnupur.

Later, on the same day, a webinar on 'Life in the time of COVID-19' was held where distinguished medical practitioners including Dr Rivu Basu, Dr Pallab Chatterjee, Dr Arun Manglik discussed various healthcare issues related to Covid pandemic. They also recommended precautions, safeguards, and treatment methodology to be followed for the affected persons.

The formal Installation ceremony was held on 7 July 2020, on virtual platform and was attended by a number of PDGs and other dignitaries as well as by members of other rotary clubs, from India and abroad. On the occasion RIPE



Shekhar Mehta, US Consul Pattie Hoffman and DG Sudip Mukherjee addressed the audience. RIPE appreciated the manner in which the club had celebrated its centenary year. He also spoke of his dream of a 'literate India' which he wishes to achieve within a span of 10 years. Pattie Hoffman spoke of long term effect of COVID-19 on health and economy, and USAID s focus on Covid Collaboration for decease control, through assistance in medical equipments, testing facilities and training of health workers.

During the entire month in pursuance of District initiative for 'Supporting the Environment', club undertook successive Tree Plantation drives and planted over 1000 fruit bearing trees in chicken wire mesh for income generation through RCC Dara in the villages of Sundarban, RCC Krishnanagar in Hoogly, RCC Duttapukur in North 24 Parganas.

During the month club continued its COVID-19 support activities and distributed nutritional food like milk, biscuits, canned juices and snacks, on multiple occasion, to children in the villages through the club sponsored RCCs.


On 3 August 2020 Dettol soap and Face Masks were distributed to the village communities in rural and suburban areas through RCC, as precaution and effective prevention against the spread of COVID-19.

Conducted a Career Counseling program by Counselor Rajeswaree Basu, for the children in remote rural areas served by the club's RCCs, in which more than 80 high school students participated.

Members of the club joined by DG Sudip Mukherjee celebrated Independence Day by hoisting the National Flag at Rotary Sadan. A painting exhibition by students of NCLCL was inaugurated on the same day. Students also performed patriotic dance drama, recitation and patriotic songs. Mosquito Nets were also distributed through the hands of DG Sudip Mukherjee to 7 RCCs, as a measure of prevention of dengue and malaria. Milk & Biscuits were distributed to 115 rural children in its RCC Krishnanagar. On 26 August 2020, essential hospital equipments comprising of Fowler Beds & mattresses, Examination bed, complete with Saline stand, Wheel Chair and Food Trolley were contributed to Humanity Hospital, Thakurpukur. Project was funded by Rtn Arindam Roychoudhury.
