#### Dear Rotarians,

I read this quote in THE HINDU September is Basic Education and Literacy Month for Rotary. This is one of Rotary's seven areas of focus. We all know how critical reading and writing are for success in life – for gaining information, communicating, making agreements, and so forth. Enhancing Basic Education skills and Literacy are essential in reducing poverty, improving health, encouraging community and economic development, and promoting peace. Knowledge can reduce maternal death, improve childhood survivability, and reduce poverty. They can also enable success in business or a profession. Consider how your club is, or could be, MAKING A DIFFERENCE by supporting basic education and literacy in your community or somewhere else in the world. Some initiatives that your Club can adopt:

- Dictionary Project. Provide students a personal dictionary of their own for use in primary and middle school. It is a path to supporting better reading, speech, and writing.
- Reading with Children. Children who need special assistance and support are identified by the school and paired with an adult volunteer (Rotary Reader). Each week of the school year, the adult spends one-on-one time with their special elementary school child. Readers not only assist with reading, but they also provide mentoring and support for young learners.
- Birthday Books. On their birthday, Members donate books to the School Library chosen with the help of the school faculty.
- Reading Tutors. Volunteer tutors read with students one-on-one or in small groups to improve reading skills.
- School Supplies. Providing materials and supplies supports schools and classroom learning.

Finally establish a culture in your club and society that supports literacy. Support and celebrate every child's effort to develop reading muscles and increase reading stamina. Let them know you believe in them. Show students how valuable books are, sharing ideas and working together to make meaning. Teach students how to select books based on personal interests, as well as challenges within the book. Let's Create Hope in the World.

### **Enclave Projects**

#### **BOONDH**

Environmental concerns are very close to our DG Rtn Asha Venugopal's heart. Project Boondh has been introduced to help the environment. This project implores the clubs in the district to motivate and encourage citizens for the use of aerators which has multipronged benefits. Tap aerators have a range of benefits designed to help both you and the planet. The first is an increased water pressure. As the air mixes with the water, the pressure increases. The water will come out in a much more powerful stream - meaning you need far less of it to get the job done! By increasing the pressure, a tap aerator will reduce your water use. You will need to run the tap for less amount of time (as you'll be able to thoroughly wash your hands in 1 minute as opposed to 5!). Finally, tap aerators will reduce splashing. Water can flow erratically in tap -aerator-free taps, which can be messy and frustrating. Aerators will direct the water into one single stream downwards, meaning very little in the way of splish-splash-splosh.

# What are faucet aerators?

- ~ A faucet aerator, which is also referred to as the tap aerator is an important equipment in the modern plumbing systems.
- ~ They are installed at the tip of the modern tap systems.
- ~ The most common aerators can be screwed at the tips of the taps to deliver a non-splashing stream of water.
- ~ The available configurations have been designed to give different streams such as spray, laminar or aerated flow.

#### Aerator Uses I

- ~ This equipment is screwed onto the end on a tap's spout.
- ~ This implies that, when water comes from the supply, it passes through the aerator strainer with very many tiny holes on its surface.
- ~ The stream of water will turn into very first drops, resulting in a bubbly soft water flow.
- ~ They vary in sizes depending on the required flow of water.







# **Enclave Projects**

#### PROJECT BAMBOO PLANTATION

Rotary 3030 under the leadership of DG Rtn Asha Venugopal along with the Government of Maharashtra has acknowledged to promote Bamboo plantation to ensure a regular income to farmers and build climate resilience.

The Government of Maharashtra, launched a special project on Bamboo plantation for small and marginal farmers, in Latur and Satara Districts, under the Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGA).

This project was inaugurated in the presence of Hon. Chief Minister Eknath Shinde at Dare village in Satara district on 11th August, 2023. Small and marginal farmers having a Job card will get a subsidy of approximately 7 lakhs/ hectare over a period of 3 years for growing Bamboo plantations on his own land, under MNREGA.

Marginal farmers are defined as farmers having less than 1 ha of land, and small farmers are defined as farmers having 1 to 2 ha. land. Out of 13.6 million farmers in the Maharashtra state, 48.9% are marginal farmers and 29.5% are small farmers. The support from Rotary 3030 will help to ensure the success of this venture.






# **Rotary Month**
