RI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Uniting Globally to End Polio: Rotary's Efforts and Achievements in 2024"

With World Polio Day on 24 October, I'm proudly rooting for Rotary as we team up around the world to End Polio Now.

I had the honor of attending a Strike Out Polio event in July at PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates MLB team. The Rotary Club of Delmont-Salem hosted the event, which raised \$1.3 million for Polio Plus.

Later in the summer, I joined members of our Rotary family in supporting the Más Millas Menos Polio (More Miles Less Polio) bike ride. Felipe Meza Chávez and his team rode all the way from Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, to One Rotary Center in Evanston, Illinois, to raise money and awareness. The ride took 12 days, and Felipe and his team collected more than \$100,000 to support the fight against polio. It was a joy to greet them as they arrived in Evanston.

And I was thrilled to see Team End Polio raise global awareness around the 2024 Paris Olympics. This world-class roster of athletes, global leaders, and polio eradication supporters came together to advocate for a world where no child has to live in fear of being paralyzed by polio. Some of the athletes on Team End Polio are polio survivors themselves, adding weight to their advocacy.

These are just a few examples of the many ways Rotary has teamed up recently to End Polio Now. It is vital that we continue to seek out and recruit teammates in polio eradication, especially after the challenges our eradication efforts have faced this year.

The Rotary world was heartbroken to learn about the tragic passing in August of Aidan O'Leary, director for polio eradication at the World Health Organization.

I knew Aidan and worked with him directly. He was a tireless advocate in the fight against polio and a kind, genuine man. We will remember him both for his advocacy and his warmth.

But where there is hardship, there is also hope. I feel hopeful whenever I consider the countless ways Rotary supports the fight every day to eradicate polio.

As people of action, we don't have the luxury of giving in to despair, even in the face of tragedy. The best way to honor Aidan's memory is by teaming up and reaching our goal to End Polio Now.

We made a promise to the children of the world and their families. It is incumbent upon us, together with our global partners, to end this threat once and for all.

There are so many ways we can team up to eradicate polio. You can donate to the End Polio Now campaign, join or initiate a Polio Plus Society in your club or district, or take inspiration from the fundraisers I mentioned above.

I encourage Rotary members around the world to continue to seek out new teammates, so that together, we end polio.

Seminar on Environmental Stewardship

15 September 2024 | Bihar Legislative Assembly Auditorium | Host: Rotary Club of Patna City Samrat

"Environmental Stewardship: A Rotary Initiative for a Greener Future"

The Rotary District-level seminar on environmental conservation, a key focus of Rotary International, was meticulously planned under Event Chairman PP Rtn. Sanjeev Yadav, with support from DG Bipin Chachan. The event began with 500 students from 30 schools participating in painting and essay competitions on "How to Save and Conserve the Environment," followed by a Mega Tree Plantation drive at Marine Drive, led by DG Bipin and Honourable Minister Shree Prem Kumar, alongside Patna City Samrat Rotarians.

On September 15th, Rotary District 3250 made history by hosting its first-ever seminar in the Bihar Legislative Assembly auditorium. The seminar was inaugurated by Honourable Speaker Shree Nand Kishore Yadav, DG Bipin Chachan, and First Lady Shilpi Chachan. DG Bipin highlighted the district's environmental efforts and presented the "Champions of the Earth Award" to Rtn. Piyush Jaiswal of RC Deoghar and Rtn. Swati Modi of RC Pataliputra for their significant tree-planting contributions. District Environment Chair Rtn. Anil Sharma outlined the environmental goals, emphasizing water and forest conservation.

Honourable Speaker Nand Kishore Yadav, an honorary member of Rotary Patna City Samrat, praised Rotary's service and invited Rotarians to a live Legislative Assembly session. Deoraj Ballabh announced the essay and painting competition winners, who were awarded trophies, medals, and certificates by DG Bipin and Speaker Yadav.

Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) Part I, II, & III, the first of RY 2024-25, was excellently hosted by the Rotary Club of Patna City Samrat. The RLI Core Committee of the host club, under the leadership of Charter President Vijay Kumar Yadav, President Rtn. Deoraj Ballabh, and Secretary Devesh Nawadia, along with PE Abhishek Patrick, PP Prakash Barnwal, AG Dinesh Bhadani, PP Binay Lamba, Event Chair Rtn. Anup Kumar, and Dr. Sushil Poddar, District Chair RLI, and club members, made tremendous efforts to make the event a huge success. The team contacted Rotary club leaders in Patna and surrounding clubs in the Bihar zone, emphasizing the importance of Rotary and promoting the event. The tireless efforts of Event Chair Binay Lamba resulted in the participation of 43 Rotarians (22 for Part I & II and 21 for Part III) in the two-day comprehensive training event spread over six sessions each day.

Day 1

The session was called to order, followed by the National Anthem and customary invocation. The Chief Guest for the day was DG Bipin Chachan, accompanied by the gracious First Lady, Shilpi Chachan. President Rtn. Deoraj Ballabh and Chair Rtn. Binay Lamba welcomed the discussion leaders with floral bouquets, scarves, and mementos, and thanked all delegates for their presence. The RLI Special Club Bulletin | The Samrat Times was released by the dignitaries on the dais.





The discussion leaders were PDG Rajan Gandotra, RLI Coordinator D 3250; PP Rtn. Ajay Narsaria from Nasik, D 3030; PDG Dr. R. Bharat; PDG Pratim Banerjee; and PP Rtn. Dr. Sushil Poddar, District Chair of RLI.

On Day 1, all participants of RLI Parts I & II were trained in Hall 1. District Coordinator Rtn. Dr. Sushil Poddar gave general instructions and best wishes for RLI. “Knowledge is Power”, the purpose of the day, and the importance of training in Rotary were highlighted by PDG Rajan Gandotra. PP Rtn. Ajay Narsaria spoke on “My Leadership in Rotary & Engaging Members.” This was followed by a deliberation on “My Rotary World” by PP Rtn. Dr. Sushil Poddar, District Chair RLI. Other topics covered were Ethics & Vocational Service and The Rotary Foundation by PDG Pratim, and Creating Service Projects by PDG Dr. R. Bharat. RLI Part I was successfully completed on 28th September for the 22 participants. The host club made excellent arrangements for accommodations for the faculty and members, provided a good ambiance, and served delicious food, tea, and snacks.

Day 2

RLI Parts II and III were completed on Sunday, 29th September 2024, in Hall 1 & Hall 2. The discussion leaders alternated between the two halls. All the topics for Part II, such as Rotary Opportunities, Effective Leadership Strategy, Communication, Team Building, and The Rotary Foundation, were thoroughly covered by the faculty in Hall 1. Part III topics included International Services, Rotary Public Image, Building Stronger Clubs, The Rotary Foundation, and Strategic Planning in Hall 2. Feedback from the participants was overwhelmingly positive, with all rating the training as five-star. The sessions included tea/coffee breaks followed by lunch, and the event concluded with the distribution of certificates and group photographs. PDG Rakesh Prasad also graced the graduation ceremony.

The participants enjoyed the evening Hi-Tea. The host club was praised for their excellent arrangements. Special appreciation came from PP Ajay Narsaria from Nasik, who said, “It is one of the best RLI setups I have seen to date.” Ajay played a pivotal role in this event, stepping in for PDG Rajan, who had to leave due to the sudden, unfortunate passing of a young relative. The Rotary Club of Supaul, in collaboration with Nagar Parishad Supaul, organized a mega health camp on September 15, 2024, at the Nagar Parishad office campus. Over 500 patients were examined by leading doctors, and the club provided free lab tests and medications.

The Saheli Centre trained 30 unemployed girls in a beautician (Mehndi) course and continued teaching computer applications to 40 more girls, helping them support their families. Additionally, 25 girls received training in tailoring. The Rotary Children's Project continued, providing education to 450 slum and underprivileged children at St. Joseph Academy. The Rotary Club organized several NBA (Nation Builder Award) programs, honoring more than 60 teachers across different villages by distributing certificates and gifts. The club received recognition for the plantation project at the Environment Steward seminar in Patna. On Teachers' Day, the club honoured teachers in 10 government schools as part of the "Chalo Village Chalein" project, boosting teacher morale through appreciation certificates, pens, and sweets.

COVID-19 Grant for Ventilators and Automated Cell Separator : Summary

Global Grant Rotary Patna Mid Town

This project, funded by Rotary Patna Midtown and Busan-Dongrae, RID 3661, aimed to improve the COVID-19 treatment capacity at Netaji Subhash Medical College & Hospital in Bihta, Bihar. With a budget of USD 99,825, it provided ventilators and an automated cell separator to treat severely affected patients, especially neonates and children.

Background

The COVID-19 pandemic overwhelmed hospitals in Patna, Bihar. The shortage of ventilators and blood component machines, crucial for treating respiratory failure and multi-organ complications, particularly in neonates and paediatric patients, highlighted the need for urgent medical infrastructure upgrades.

Project Purpose

The project provided neonatal and paediatric ventilators and an automated cell separator to enhance the hospital's ability to treat critical COVID-19 cases and manage multi-organ failure.

Impact

The equipment increased the hospital's capacity to save lives, particularly among children, and reduced the burden on other healthcare facilities. It also strengthened the region's healthcare infrastructure for future emergencies.

Conclusion

By equipping Netaji Subhash Medical College & Hospital with essential medical devices, Rotary Patna Midtown and Busan-Dongrae, RID 3661 made a significant contribution to COVID-19 care, helping to save lives and improve long-term healthcare preparedness in the region

'Rotary Satellite Eye Screening Clinic'

The Rotary Club of Jamshedpur has been making a positive impact in the world through this Global Grant project, which is receiving an overwhelming response. The project is significantly improving lives and enhancing Rotary's public image in remote villages around Jamshedpur. The primary goal is to reduce blindness through prevention, early detection, and prompt treatment.

Villagers are screened for eye disorders, such as refractive errors, cataracts, glaucoma, and diabetic retinopathy. Subsidized spectacles, provided in Rotary boxes, are distributed to those in need. Additionally, villagers are referred to the Jamshedpur Eye Hospital (JEH) for cataract surgery and other treatments. Camps are also conducted in the city for domestic helps and housekeeping staff in need of eye care.

The project includes training school teachers to screen students and hosting Eye Care sessions in schools. Gratitude goes to The Rotary Foundation, our international partner—the Rotary Club of Guildford (UK), districts, clubs, and Rotarians—for funding this project. Special thanks to PP Rtn. Madhumita Santra for conceptualizing the Global Grant project, and to the core committee members Rtn. Dr. Vijaya Bharat, Rtn. N. Rammurty, and Project Chair Rtn. Jagannath Santra for their tireless efforts in executing this initiative and making it a sustainable engineering and medical marvel.

वसुंधरा परियोजना एम्स में पर्यावरण की हरित विरासत, पीयूष जायसवाल के नेतृत्व में

Rotary Club Deoghar

जून 2021 में, रोटैरियन पीयूष जायसवाल के गतिशील नेतृत्व में रोटरी क्लब ऑफ देवघर ने “वसुंधरा परियोजना” की शुरूआत की। इस महत्वाकांक्षी परियोजना के तहत एम्स परिसर में 50,000 पौधे रोपने का लक्ष्य रखा गया। ये पौधे “ग्रो-ट्रीज” द्वारा रोटरी इंटरनेशनल की वैश्विक पहल के तहत प्रदान किए गए थे, जिसका उद्देश्य 1.2 मिलियन पेड़ लगाना था।

परियोजना ने और गति पकड़ी, और 2022 में इसे 75,000 पौधों तक विस्तारित किया गया, जिसे देश के “आजादी का अमृत महोत्सव” के अवसर पर समर्पित किया गया। पिछले चार वर्षों में, पीयूष जायसवाल के नेतृत्व में 1,25,000 से अधिक पौधे एम्स के 110 एकड़ क्षेत्र में लगाए गए। खास बात यह है कि हर पौधा स्वयं पीयूष जायसवाल, रोटैरियन और स्थानीय आदिवासी मजदूरों द्वारा व्यक्तिगत रूप से रोपा गया। इस परियोजना की असाधारणता सिर्फ इसके पैमाने में नहीं, बल्कि इसके पौधों की देखभाल और जीवित रहने की प्रतिबद्धता में है। हर साल 10,000 से



12,000 पौधों

को बदलकर उनकी देखभाल की जाती है ताकि इस परियोजना का उद्देश्य पूरा हो सके।

कठिनाईयों और लगातार निगरानी की आवश्यकता के बावजूद, पीयूष जायसवाल और रोटरी क्लब ऑफ देवघर ने इस मिशन को बिना किसी जिला अनुदान के पूरा किया। इसके बजाय, रोटरी सदस्यों और व्यक्तिगत योगदान से इस परियोजना को सफलतापूर्वक पूरा किया गया, जो निःस्वार्थ सेवा और पर्यावरणीय स्थिरता के प्रति प्रतिबद्धता का प्रतीक है।

एम्स ने इन अद्वितीय प्रयासों को मान्यता दी और 2022 में पहले 50,000 पौधों की सफल पूर्णता के बाद, परियोजना स्थल पर पीयूष जायसवाल, रोटरी क्लब ऑफ देवघर और परियोजना के नाम का शिलापट्ट स्थापित किया।

वसुंधरा परियोजना केवल पौधरोपण नहीं है, यह आने वाली पीढ़ियों के लिए हरित भविष्य को सजोने की पहल है।

Microcredit/Microloans:

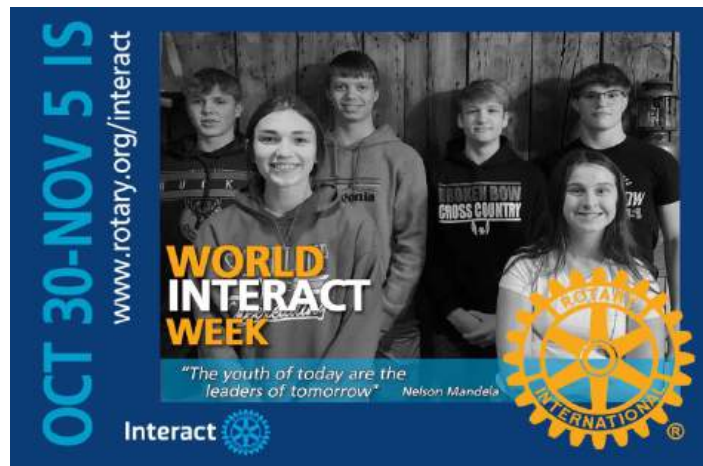

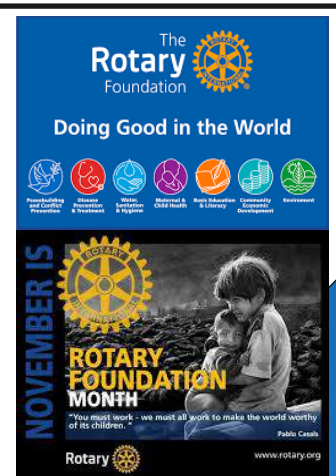

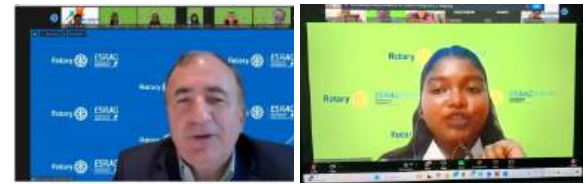

Cancer Seminar



Rotary Club of Patna Millennium Hosts Inaugural Cancer Awareness and Prevention District Seminar.

On September 8, 2024, the Rotary Club of Patna Millennium successfully hosted its first Cancer Awareness and Prevention District Seminar at Gyan Bhawan, Patna. The event aimed to raise public awareness about cancer, promote early detection, and highlight prevention strategies and treatment options.

The organizing committee, led by District Chair PDG Dr. L.B. Singh, Co-Chair Dr. Shruti Khemka, and Convenor AG Ashish Banka, received strong support from club President RTN Sonal Jain, Secretary RTN Dr. Amitabh Banka, Treasurer RTN CA Abhishek Lohia, and committed club members.

Expert speakers from Mahavir Cancer Sansthan, Savera Hospital, and other institutions discussed various cancer types, including oral, breast, gastrointestinal, and blood cancers. They emphasized early symptoms and the importance of timely medical intervention. Presentations were made in accessible language to ensure clarity for all attendees. A panel discussion followed, allowing direct interaction between the audience and medical professionals.

The Seminar reinforced the message “Prevention is better than cure” by focusing on lifestyle changes and medical

interventions to lower cancer risks. A major highlight was the HPV vaccination drive, where 100 girls were vaccinated on-site, and Rotary District 3250 pledged to provide 2,000 HPV vaccinations.

Inaugurating the event, Honorable State Health Minister Shri Mangal Pandey announced that HPV vaccinations will be provided free of charge in Bihar starting in October, positioning the state as a leader in cancer prevention. The conference was attended by DG Bipin Chachan, First Lady Shilpi Chachan, over 800 Rotarians, community health workers, and distinguished guests.

ROTARY AND POLIO

POLIO

Poliomyelitis, or polio, is a paralyzing and potentially fatal disease that still threatens children in some parts of the world. Poliovirus invades the nervous system and can cause total paralysis in hours. It can strike people of any age but mainly affects children under five. Polio can be prevented by vaccines, but it is not curable. Unlike most diseases, polio can be eradicated.

POLIOPLUS

For more than 30 years, Rotary and our partners have driven the effort to eradicate polio worldwide. Our PolioPlus program was the first initiative to tackle global polio eradication by vaccinating children on a massive scale. As a core partner in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), Rotary focuses on advocacy, fundraising, volunteer recruitment, and awareness-building.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.7 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect nearly 3 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.

POLIO TODAY

When Rotary and its partners formed the GPEI in 1988, there were 350,000 cases of polio in 125 countries every year. Today, we have reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent, and just two countries continue to report cases of wild poliovirus: Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Because of the efforts of Rotary and its partners, nearly 20 million people who would otherwise have been paralyzed are walking, and more than 1.5 million people are alive who would otherwise have died. The infrastructure we helped build to end polio is also being used to treat and prevent other diseases (including COVID-19) and create lasting impact in other areas of public health.

CHALLENGES

Rotary and our partners have made tremendous progress against polio, but eliminating all cases is going to take even more progress and perseverance. Afghanistan and Pakistan face unique challenges, including political insecurity, highly mobile populations, difficult terrain, and, in some instances, vaccine refusal and misinformation. With sufficient resources, the commitment of national governments, and innovations that improve access to remote areas, we are optimistic that we can eliminate polio.

ENSURING SUCCESS

Rotary has committed to raising \$50 million per year for polio eradication. The Gates Foundation has pledged to match that 2-to-1, for a total commitment of \$150 million each year. These funds provide much-needed operational support, medical workers, laboratory equipment, and educational materials. Governments, corporations, and private donors all play a crucial role in funding.

ROTARY IN ACTION

More than 1 million Rotary members have donated their time and money to eradicate polio, and every year, hundreds of members work with health workers to vaccinate children in countries affected by polio. Rotary members work with UNICEF and other partners to prepare and distribute informational materials for people in areas that are isolated by conflict, geography, or poverty. They also mobilize to recruit fellow volunteers, assist in transporting the vaccine, and provide other logistical support.

CELEBRITY SUPPORT

Rotary has a growing list of public figures and celebrities who support our fight against polio, including Bill Gates, co-chair of the Gates Foundation; actors Bridget Moynahan, Archie Panjabi, Piper Perabo, Adina Porter, and Omar Sharif Jr.; photographer and television personality Nigel Barker; scientist, engineer, comedian, author and inventor Bill Nye; television presenter and restaurateur Dame Prudence Margaret Leith; supermodel Isabeli Fontana; action-movie star Jackie Chan; pop star Psy; TikToker and storyteller Shermann Dilla Thomas; golf legend Jack Nicklaus; activist Rachel Cargle; conservationist Jane Goodall; premier violinist Itzhak Perlman; Grammy Award winners A.R. Rahman, Angélique Kidjo, and Ziggy Marley; and peace advocate Queen Noor of Jordan. These ambassadors help Rotary educate the public about the disease and the fight to end polio for good.
