Adapting with Heart and Strategy: Inspiring Examples of Rotary Innovation

To adapt, as laid out in Rotary's Action Plan, we must occasionally step out of our comfort zone and try something new. Here are two examples of clubs that adapted, one with heart and one through critical thinking and strategy.

The Rotary Club of Chandigarh Mid Town, India, led with heart earlier this year. To engage members and grow membership, Club President Nitin Kapur personally called every former member of the club and invited them to a gathering billed as an alumni meetup.

Eight former members attended, and the results were stupendous. The visitors had a chance to connect once more, not only with current members but with the sense of camaraderie and belonging that membership gave them. By the end of the evening, the club welcomed six of the former members back into the Rotary family.

Club President Kapur showed courage when he reached out to the alumni. Not only did he adapt and try something new but he had the strength of character to show the club's alumni how much they still meant to the family of Rotary. That bravery paid off.

People want to feel needed and appreciated. People want to feel that they belong. And they might never feel that way if we don't have the courage to tell them.

Meanwhile, the Rotary Club of Seoul-Hansoo, Korea, has been experimenting with different club models to great effect. Over the past four years, Seoul-Hansoo has created and maintained four satellite clubs — a service club, an interest-based club for musicians, a cause-based club that mentors professionals, and a club for college students.

These satellite clubs are part of a five-year plan the Seoul-Hansoo club implemented to increase membership through innovation.

What's the secret to founding and maintaining so many satellite clubs? Membership between Seoul-Hansoo and its satellite clubs is fluid and synergistic. Many members of the satellite clubs attend the sponsor club's meetings. And many of the sponsor club's members participate in the satellite clubs.

Additionally, the focus of each satellite club is no accident. Each one appeals to different interests of people in the sponsor club and in the community, attracting existing and potential members. This is an excellent strategy to both retain and attract members because it offers flexibility. If someone is interested in joining but they can't make it to the sponsor club's meetings, they have plenty of options to choose from.

These are just two examples of how we can adapt with our hearts and minds. Every club is different, so I encourage you to reach out to members of your club and of the community around you. Ask them about the club experience and what you can do to improve.

Talk to enough people and you might find ways that you can adapt and spark The Magic of Rotary in your club.

District Foundation Seminar

Dr. Sunil Bhatt and his team tested and registered 148 children under 11 years suffering from thalassemia. The transplant costs will be covered by the government and organizers.

Rotary Club of Darbhanga Vidyapati, in collaboration with the Satsang Vihar team, Darbhanga, distributed relief materials to flood-affected people in Darbhanga district. Around 350 people received sarees, blankets, and towels under this initiative.

A Blood Donation Camp was organized at the Law College on November 16, 2024, under the Global Grant Mobile Blood Collection Van Project (Grant No. GG2240240). The event, conducted in collaboration with SNMMCH Dhanbad, successfully collected 21 units of blood, contributing to community health and well-being.

At the Kids Education Centre, Nirsa, prizes were awarded to the Best Sports Boy and Girl during the annual sports finals, with special recognition to the Principal for excellence in education, sports, and public awareness. The Rotary Dialysis Centre provided 63 dialysis sessions, benefiting 9 individuals. Skill development training in stitching and mehendi designing was conducted for 22 girls at the Saheli Centre I in Wasseypur, while 28 girls received stitching training at Saheli Centre II in Nirsa. Additionally, computer classes were held for 24 girls, and 15 girls attended English speaking and writing classes in November. These efforts demonstrate Rotary's commitment to empowering underprivileged communities.



Empowering Futures: Saheli Centres and Literacy Drive

Centre I: Wasseypur – Empowering Girls, Transforming Lives

At the heart of Wasseypur, the Saheli Centre is lighting the path for underprivileged girls by equipping them with life-changing skills. In November 2024, 22 eager learners embraced training in stitching and mehndi designing, attending 20 intensive classes over 30 hours. Beyond skill development, the centre nurtures dreams through education, with 15 young women enrolled in English-speaking and writing classes, benefiting from focused learning during 3 sessions. The ripple effect of this effort is evident in their growing confidence and determination to shape their destinies.

Centre II: Kids Education Centre, Nirsa – A Hub for Learning and Growth In the village of Nirsa, the second Saheli Centre stands as a beacon of hope for school-going girls. Here, 24 young learners honed their stitching skills through 5 practical sessions spanning 8 hours. Additionally, the centre empowers 47 students with essential computer literacy, conducting 5 classes over 6 hours in November 2024. These initiatives are not just about learning skills; they are about building brighter futures for young minds who aspire to rise above their circumstances.

Rotary Pustak: Opening Doors to Knowledge

Under the RI District 3250 initiative "Rotary Pustak," in collaboration with RI District 3011 and led by RC Gurgaon Passion, Rotary Dhanbad

Midtown took a significant step in promoting literacy and education. The club donated 100 valuable school books to the RCDM School Library at Kids Education Centre, Nirsa. This school, though not government-run, provides affordable education to children from neighbouring villages. These books will serve as a gateway to knowledge, enriching the lives of students and inspiring them to dream big. The heartfelt gratitude expressed by the school principal reflects the profound impact of this contribution on the young learners.

Through these efforts, Rotary Dhanbad Midtown continues to uphold its mission of empowering communities, nurturing talents, and creating a brighter tomorrow for women and children.




- A 7-day radio campaign was broadcasted on Big FM and Radio City.
