While sitting with a group of Rotary leaders outside of Lusaka, Zambia, I ask a question: "How many of you have ever had malaria?" Every hand in the room goes up. They even begin to tell me about the first, second, or third time they experienced the disease, one of the main causes of death and sickness in many developing countries.

They are fortunate. They have access to medical treatment and lifesaving medicines. For the people of rural Zambia, their story is very different.

On a wooden bench in a small village, I sit with Timothy and his young son Nathan. With a camera crew capturing our conversation, he tells me of the time Nathan showed signs of malaria. He brought the boy to the nearby home of a community health worker, where Nathan quickly received medicines that in all likelihood saved his life.

Calmly, Timothy tells me about his other son's bout with the disease a few years earlier. He had to race that son to a medical clinic more than 5 miles away. Riding a bike and carrying his child on his back, he tells me, he could feel his son's legs turn cold and then his little body go limp. As he finally entered the clinic, he screamed for help, but it was too late. The camera stops rolling, and we sit in silence. He begins to weep, and I hold him tightly. "I lost my son, I lost my son," he says.

This story is all too familiar for the families we meet over the next few days. And yet there is hope. Partners for a Malaria-Free Zambia is Rotary's first Programs of Scale grant recipient, and it is saving lives. Across two provinces of Zambia, 2,500 volunteer health workers have been selected by their communities. They are trained to bring medical care closer to those who need it, and they are able to diagnose and treat malaria and other ailments. Rotary partnerships create lasting change.



District Conference 2022-23 "ADHIVESHAN" Day-1

District Conference 2022-23, aptly christened "ADHIVESHAN" was held on 11th and 12th February, 2023 at Leela Ambience Hotel, Gurugram.

The program on the First Day, 11th February started with a ceremonial welcome for the R.I. Representative PRID Rtn Robert Hall and Charlene Hall with a school band welcoming them grandly and with fanfare. Thereafter, they inaugurated the Project Display which was greatly appreciated by Rtn Robert Hall. The programme inside the main hall started with the First Lucky Draw of the morning and lucky winners were awarded their prizes.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor welcoming everyone present, called District Conference ADHIVESHAN to order. After National Anthems of USA and India, Lighting of ceremonial auspicious Lamp and Invocation of Ganesh Vandana, DG Ashok Kantoor welcomed the Chief Guest and dignitaries starting with R I President's Representative to the Conference - PRID Rtn Robert Hall and his gracious Spouse Lady Charlene Hall who had especially come from USA for our Conference. There after other Distinguished Dignitaries were welcomed by DG Ashok Kantoor and Alka Kantoor. The welcome of dignitaries was followed by the mesmerising dance performances by Troupe from Sarvam Shakti, a NGO of underprivileged children. The children also performed yoga activities to the delight of the entire audience.

Rtn Anil Aggarwal, Conference Co-chair, welcomed everyone to the Conference and said DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor has given Conference, ADHIVESHAN, a true meaning of "IMAGINE ROTARY". He said we have arranged many eminent speakers at this Conference who will be talking on various interesting and important topics. We also have a spiritual Leader to address the delegates and in the evening we have a gala entertainment programme by the First Indian Idol Mr Abhijeet Sawant.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor in his opening remarks welcoming everyone present at the Conference said Robert and Charlene have come to Delhi only for this Conference. They came yesterday and will leave on Monday. After 118 years, Rtn Jennifer Jones is the first Lady World President of Rotary International. She is motivating and inspiring us to do big successful service projects. Today we have a registration of many delegates for this conference. We have to think and dream big and Imagine something new. The Presidents'

Hand Book was released at PEM--1. R.I. District 3011 is becoming increasingly digital. All the GoVs are paperless. We are working in all the 7 Focus areas of Rotary, he said - under Environment, the District has done major tree plantation drives. Under Literacy the District has adopted more than 100 Municipal Schools and have installed more than 60 Hand Washing Stations in Schools under WASH and WINS program. Cancer Awareness Rally was organised all over Delhi. On 2nd October A massive Cycle Rally was organised for End Polio Now and End and Control Leprosy. Revival and rejuvenating of Water Bodies and defunct Borewells is under way in the NCR region. Several thousand students are being sensitised about how to save Water under Mai Bhi Jal Rakshak program. The District are starting the first Skin Bank in North India in partnership with AIIMS at AIIMS complex. We have added so far, in the first 7 months since 1st July 2022, 347 new members in R.I. District 3011. We have already formed 4 new Clubs and 6 are in the pipeline. We have added 4 new AKS Members, 58 Major Donors and 27 Clubs have committed to become 100% PHF Clubs.

Chief Guest, R I President's Representative, PRID Rtn Robert Hall said "I have never been welcomed like you have welcomed us today. I am reminded of my earlier trip to U P for the Polio NID when we had come to India last time for administration of Polio Drops to children on your Polio NID in 2007 and visited Moradabad in U P. We had great time in 2007 visiting India for giving Polio drops."

R I President Jennifer Jones, he said, is doing a great job this year. The Theme of this year is IMAGINE ROTARY. Imagination is more important to know what Rotary can do. He said Rotarians can partner with others for working for the welfare and wellbeing of people and the community. There are lots of ways we can do various service projects for society. Under Health care you can give Wheel Chairs to handicapped people. You can provide play grounds for children. Ensure the World become 100% Polio Free under End Polio Now initiative. Increase Rotary Membership. Younger members want a mentor. Listen to your members and tell them that you care for them. Get them involved in projects. Polio is now in only Pakistan and Afghanistan. Polio Plus Society is helping to End Polio Now and it is all possible because of Rotary. He also thanked District Secretary Rtn Dinesh Jain who was his Aide during his entire visit and his lovely wife Niti Jain for looking after him and Charlene so well and taking good care of them all through.







Lady Charlene Hall addressing the gathering thanked everyone for the very warm welcome extended to them ever since they landed in Delhi. Polio is on way out, she said. Public Health is a top priority. She talked about Dementia and problems faced in her own family. Her Sister and Brother are both facing dementia problems. Rotary Action Groups people help people suffering with Dementia. She thanked everyone for giving her the time to speak and share her views and wished everyone to enjoy the Convention.

Plenary Session 1 started with a Panel discussion on Digital Transformation in India and Leveraging of emerging technologies of 5G moderated by Rtn Umang Das. The Panelists included Mr Akhil Gupta and Mr Pankaj Mohindroo.

Mr Akhil Gupta said the telecom journey started in India in 1994 when the first call was made by Spice from Calcutta. The charges for a call have come down from Rs 16 per call in 1994 to 0.60 paise per call now. Today the telecom industry is a Rs 25 lakh crore investment industry. We already have 1 billion mobile subscribers in India. Today Bharti Airtel and Jio are expanding. Telecom Industry is the backbone for industrial development.

Mr Pankaj Mohindroo said 5G is a game changer. It provides quality of service. India is becoming a massive exporter of Mobile phones. In January, last month



export of mobile phones from India was \$1.5 million. This year our total exports of Mobile phones is expected to be more than \$9 million.

Transformation from 2G to 5G quickly changed many standards. 5G is going to be a break through with very high speed. 5G phones are available in the price range starting at Rs 10,000 and going upto Rs 1 lakh or even more. Semi Conducter manufacturing is very important for digital transformation. Skilling is very important since capabilities of skills in setting up digital transformation is required. Rotary can help in creating skilled work force for Semi Conducter manufacturing industry, which is a new area and highly challenging.

Thereafter a MoU was signed between Rotary District 3011 and the Telecom Skill Council of India (TSCI) for providing Skill Development Training.

PLENARY SESSION 2

After the Lunch Break, Plenary Session 2 started with the second Lucky Draw.

PP Rtn Ruchi Rai introduced the Speaker of the second session, Swami Prakashananda, Head of Chinmaya Mission, New Delhi.

Swami Prakashananda addressing the gathering said he would like to share some thoughts from vedic sculptures like Shrimad Bhagwat Geeta. Lord Sri Krishna tells Arjuna that his state of mind is confused because of lack of clarity about vision of life. The mind which is divine, clear and purified makes our actions and thoughts pure and self centered. He said that Rotarians, similarly, create peace and happiness in the life of others. Human life exists for a very special purpose. Certain intellect is given to each human being and that should be used constructively.

Next speaker was Mr Satish Kaushik who said Rotarians are known for their tremendous social activities all over the world especially for the welfare and well-being of mankind. He said he was born in Karol Bagh in Nai Wali Gali. He said he was a dreamer and God helps only those who help themselves. He joined the entertainment industry. Bombay film industry is a glamour business. He went to Bombay in 1979 and faced lots of struggle. He was confident that I will make it one day. He finally got a job to work with Shekhar Kapoor as his Assistant for Rs 500. He said his ancestral village is in Haryana and he has adopted his village. He said he wants to do something to make the life of his village people better the way Rotarians do and involve himself in welfare activities for the wellbeing of underprivileged people and making the country proud.

The next Panel discussion was on Living with Covid, moderated by Rtn Anil Aggarwal with Panelists Mr Anil Rajput of ITC and Dr B K Rao of Sir Ganga Ram Hospital. Mr Anil Rajput said Covid hit us all silently amd suddenly. First case of Covid in India appeared in January 2020. On 9th March, he said, he was hosting a Party at his house and some people were hesitant in joining. Suddenly the PM announced that there will be a 24 hours lockdown which continued for a long time after. Many people were asked to work from home and people had to learn new techniques to get connected virtually which changed the lives of everyone concerned and changed the work culture. There were major challenges and issues for Health care workers and they came with various initiatives to deal with this gigantic Covid problem.

Dr B K Rao said Covid was not just a Pandemic but a huge challenge and a severe calamity. Rotarians opened their hearts and their purses to help and rendered assistance to affected people. Everybody has a duty to look around and help the people around them for their wellbeing. India made a Vaccine with great speed because of our Scientists and political leadership. People have learnt many lessons from Covid and are now fully prepared to face such challenges. Covid is still there. It has not gone he said. Precaution is the best word. Protect yourself against the Virus. Use Masks, Wash Hands, use Sanitizers, keep safe distance and behave sensibly.

This was followed by Tea Break

After the Tea Break the session was a conversation between District Secretary Meets Rtn Mohit Luthra and Mr Deep Kalra Founder and CMD of Make my Trip.com Limited. RtnMohit Luthra welcomed and introduced Mr Deep Kalra. Mr Kalra said after MBA he did some odd jobs and even joined a Bank. He gave up the Bank job to become an entrepreneur in a Bowling Alley business but didn't succeed. Then he joined GE Business Development to grow their business in 1998. The Internet came in 1999 and this was a game changer. People were making air travel bookings Delhi-Bangkok/Pukhet online. I learned a lot at GE about air travel online booking and that's how I started MakemyTrip.com. You have to have confidence in yourself. Two of the employees joined me who later on became co--founders. 2001 to 2005 was a initial start up time with slow progress. Something magical happened in 2005 when low cost air carriers came to India like Spice jet and Go Air etc. We grew exponentially from 2005 to 2010 and it was a turning point for us. Every customer should be your Brand Ambassador. Now I am partial Executive and semi retired but still have a long way to go.

After this there was Electors meeting for voting in the morning at which elections process was explained to the Electors by the Officers of the Ballotting Committee.

In the evening Mr Abhijeet Sawant regaled the audience with rendition of his melodious songs from Bollywood films.

The Chief Guest of the morning, Hon'ble Dr Jitendra Singh was welcomed with floral bouquets by RIPR Rtn Robert Hall and DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor. Hon'ble Minister was accompanied by Mr Amish Devgun, a media celebrity.

Mr. Amish Devgun said Rotary is an organisation which is working towards improving the social welfare and well-being of mankind.

There is so much more than can happen in fashion designing. According to him - Fashion is happiness and Fashion is confidence. Women are supporting Women in fashion. Generations are growing and developing culturally. Gaurav Gupta has two stores in Delhi -- one in the Emporio Mall and the other in Mehrauli and is planning to open a store in Mumbai very shortly. Gaurav has worked with great Bollywood Actress like Aishwarya Rai, Deepika Puddukone, Priyanka Chopra Jonas etc. Besides being a Fashion Designer, Gaurav also makes great sculptures.







Incidentally, Gaurav is son of Rtn Arun Gupta, President of Rotary Club of Delhi South East.

DGE Rtn Jeetender Gupta speaking on Relevance of Cohesiveness in Continuity in Rotary said best example of Cohesiveness is in a sports team and it's the team work we appreciate; togetherness and cohesiveness are both important for continuity. Communication is also very important for cohesiveness. 'ME' should be changed to 'WE'. We should build trust and mutual respect for cohesiveness. Ego is a virus and infectious. Ego should be changed to Ugo. U and go and this will help in bringing cohesiveness. We should have cohesiveness to manage

Post Lunch Session

Rtn. Mohit Anand Bhatia was honoured and recognised with the Rotary Award for Public Image. DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor presented to Rtn Mohit Anand Bhatia the Award of Excellence for enhancing Public Image of Rotary during the year 2021-22 in R I District 3011 of Rotary International Zone 4.

PDG Rtn Dr N. Subramanian addressing the delegates on End Polio Now said each one of us is proud of Rotary's work to make India Polio free. More than 19 million children have been saved from being paralysed because of Polio. Polio cases worldwide have come down to 99.9%. Polio cases are now only in our neighbouring two countries Pakistan and Afghanistan. The battle is not over yet. India became Polio free because of cooperation and coordinated efforts of Rotary, Government and Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Number of Polio cases are coming down globally. We need to raise \$ 50 million towards continuing our efforts towards Global Polio eradication initiatives for a Polio Free World. We all must contribute to Polio Plus Fund of TRF. Every Rotarian must contribute some amount to Polio Fund even if it is as little as \$10 each member.

Mr Rajat Sharma of Aap ki Adalat fame was the next speaker. Speaking at Rotary ki Adalat, Mr Rajat Sharma said I have no time management. I just flow with the time. Over last 30 years I have learnt a lot from my TV shows Aap ki Adalat. The media today is doing much more than what we do. He said -- I always tell the youth to be grateful and help people who are not happy and need assistance. Rotary's mantras are-humility, gratitude, helping the needy, hearing, caring and sharing. Rotary's motto is Service above Self. Serving the marginalised underprivileged people from economically weaker sections of Society. Rotary is already doing a great service for welfare and wellbeing of Society. The major project of Rotary is to make world Polio free. He congratulated everyone and said he invited Mr Shah Rukh Khan for his show Aap ki Adalat in 1993, 30 years ago, and today he has become a super star. We should always dream big. We have to be disciplined in life. My diet is controlled and I do exercise regularly and also drink lot of Water. Shah Rukh Khan, Salman Khan, Dilip Kumar have all appeared on my show.

Ms. Neha Dhupia, Bollywood Actress was the last celebrity speaker of the Conference. She thanked

everyone for the warm welcome and said I am excited to be here at your Conference. I am an independent and confident woman. I am a Delhi Girl. I was educated at Jesus and Mary College and I did History (Hons) from Delhi University. After graduation I moved to Bombay. Today I have a family with two kids and they take a lot of my time. Everyone in the audience felt that Neha is a brave woman. She is original, natural and likeable. She loves sports and she also loves competition. She doesn't like overseas destinations for vacations. She said that we have plenty of beautiful places in India and she prefers to travel in the country. She is a feminist and says we should do the right work do wherever your conscience is clear. You have to give yourself 100% to your work to be successful.

She is very philanthropic and does lots of Charitable projects. Shevwas thanked profoundly for especially coming over for the Conference.



WATER AWARENESS DAY IN 50 SCHOOLS

WATER is one of the most important elements in nature for the survival of living species yet we take it for granted.

Every time we open a tap and water flows out - we feel happy & complacent. Little do we realize the tremendous scarcity of potable water that we are going to face in the future. We know that 71% of earth's surface is water & it is called the 'Blue Planet' -yet only 0.3 % is useable for humans. Every day- almost everywhere – we see water being wasted. We continue to wash our driveways and cars, leave our tanks to overflow, allow them to flow at full pressure while brushing & bathing; our lawns, gardens and farm lands are flooded with water when the need is only for a fraction of it.

The situation is deteriorating rapidly so just imagine the day – when we are all faced with 'water rationing' & directed to manage with only 2 buckets per family per day. That is the point at which we ill probably understand what a precious commodity water is.. For the past few decades – alarm bells have been ringing. Per capita availability of water is coming down drastically – especially in India. Everyone talks about most parts of India going dry within the next few years

Awareness for water conservation, efficient utilisation & management has to be created at individual, community, society & the national level. Students being the future of the country it is important for them to understand the precariousness of the situation in the future.

Keeping the above in mind, a large scale Water Conservation Awareness Day was celebrated in 50 schools simultaneously in R.I. District 3011.

The range of programmes conducted in the schools included

- Painting competition
- Skits
- Articles/essays
- Save Water badge design competition
- Innovative projects/ models on water conservation
- Awareness sessions/ documentaries on significance of water
- Rainwater harvesting, Check Dams, Drip irrigation etc
- Student volunteers as 'jal rakshaks'






