While sitting with a group of Rotary leaders outside of Lusaka, Zambia, I ask a question: "How many of you have ever had malaria?" Every hand in the room goes up. They even begin to tell me about the first, second, or third time they experienced the disease, one of the main causes of death and sickness in many developing countries.

They are fortunate. They have access to medical treatment and lifesaving medicines. For the people of rural Zambia, their story is very different.

On a wooden bench in a small village, I sit with Timothy and his young son Nathan. With a camera crew capturing our conversation, he tells me of the time Nathan showed signs of malaria. He brought the boy to the nearby home of a community health worker, where Nathan quickly received medicines that in all likelihood saved his life.

Calmly, Timothy tells me about his other son's bout with the disease a few years earlier. He had to race that son to a medical clinic more than 5 miles away. Riding a bike and carrying his child on his back, he tells me, he could feel his son's legs turn cold and then his little body go limp. As he finally entered the clinic, he screamed for help, but it was too late. The camera stops rolling, and we sit in silence. He begins to weep, and I hold him tightly. "I lost my son, I lost my son," he says.

This story is all too familiar for the families we meet over the next few days. And yet there is hope. Partners for a Malaria-Free Zambia is Rotary's first Programs of Scale grant recipient, and it is saving lives. Across two provinces of Zambia, 2,500 volunteer health workers have been selected by their communities. They are trained to bring medical care closer to those who need it, and they are able to diagnose and treat malaria and other ailments. Rotary partnerships create lasting change.

District 3011 also gave Vocational Service Awards to a small number of exceptional individuals in recognition of their outstanding contributions in their particular fields, or for their service and impact in our region and communities. They were given awards after a rigorous selection process that ensures our recipients share and embody our Rotary values. VOCATIONAL SERVICE AWARDS

The District Vocational Service Awards Function was held on Wednesday, 29th of March, 2023 at PHD House, New Delhi. The event was sponsored by three Rotary Clubs-Rotary Club of Faridabad Cosmopolitan, Rotary Club of Delhi Panchshila Park and Rotary Club of Delhi Central plus two individuals - PP Rtn Jagdish Sahdev and PP Rtn Prem Singhania.

Hon'ble Justice Mr Uday Umesh Lalit, Former Chief Justice of India was the Chief Guest at this prestigious Award giving event. The Jury to select the Awardees was headed by District Chair Vocational Service PP Rtn Ravi Bhatia along with members from District Team Vocational Service.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor called the Vocational Service Awards meeting to order. After National Anthem, Lighting of ceremonial auspicious Lamp followed by Invocation of Ganesh Vandana, District Secretary and MoC for the event Rtn Sanjeev Jawahar acknowledged the presence of Past District Governors and also of the Special Guests -the Awardees.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor in his opening address welcomed each and everyone present at the Awards ceremony and said Vocational Service is one of the most important of the Rotary's Five Service Avenues. He said he himself had endorsed the decision of the Jury and approved the names of the Six Awardees selected by the Jury of Vocational Service Team Members.

PP Rtn Ravi Bhatia, District Chair Vocational Service and Chair of the Jury said Vocational Service is one of the pillars of Rotary. The motto of Rotary is: "Service above Self". We Rotarians are doing so many community service projects for the good of humanity, especially underprivileged people from economically weaker sections of Society. Today we are giving Vocational Service Awards to eminent people who have excelled in their vocations and professions. Rotary follows very strict regulations and rigorous criteria in selecting the Awardees for this prestigious Rotary Vocational Service Award. After very careful consideration the Six Awardees were selected and

approved by DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor.

The Awards Ceremony began with fanfare. Each Awardee was honoured and recognised with presentation of a Shawl, a Memento and a Citation.

The first Awardee was Mr Divya Prakash of Donate An Hour NGO. He is a technologist turned educator. He is the founder of Donate An Hour-aka DoAR, an initiative to encourage people to donate their time in teaching children. DoAR is now one of the largest volunteer based NGO in NCR promoting children's education.

The Citation was read by PP Rtn Ajay Joneja of Rotary Club of Faridabad Cosmopolitan.,

In his acceptance speech, Mr Divya Prakash said his aim is to improve the education levels of children to make them better human beings. He profusely thanked Rotary for bestowing him with this prestigious Vocational Service Award.

The next Awardee was Mrs Kusum Duggal. She is the Vice Chancellor of Cyber Law University, an internationally known online University which is specifically dedicated to the study of Cyber Laws and related legal issues. She had also served Delhi Public Schools Society in the past in various different capacities.

The Citation was read by Rtn Arun Kapoor, President Rotary Club of Delhi Panchshila Park.

In the acceptance speech, Mrs Kusum Duggal thanked everyone and said that she was connected with Rotary for more than 30 years. As Principal of Delhi Public School, they had the Rotary's Interact Club at the School and they organised many activities with Rotary Clubs for students of the school. She said she was connected with students now for more than 60 years. Cyber Law University has now risen to a high esteem with more than 30,000 students. She said they are still going strong in Cyber security and Cyber Law. People have to be made aware of Cyber law remedies and Cyber crimes which are spreading like wild fires. She also expressed her gratitude to Rotary for the prestigious Vocational Service Award.

The next Awardee was Mr Arvind Bali who is the current CEO of Telecom Sector Skill Council (TSSC). He is an accomplished business leader with over 35 years of expertise in managing various business streams with globally recognised outcomes. He also acts as a part of advisory boards in consulting promoters and their organisations in Telecom, IT, and Security & Surveillance.







VOCATIONAL SERVICE AWARDS

The Citation was read by PP Rtn Jagdish Sahdev.

In his acceptance speech Mr Arvind Bali said over 10 lakh youth have been skilled in the telecom sector in the past few years. In 2008, they started Interacting and training in telecom. In 2014 Skill India Mission was launched. The organisation are doing a lot of skill development training work. He said they train 1,00,000 youths every year. These are underprivileged people. They provide the training and skill them through CSR funds provided by Corporates who also give employment opportunities.

The next Awardee was Padma Shri Dr Randeep Guleria, who is a renowned Indian Pulmonologist and is the former Director of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi and is credited with the establishment of India's first Centre for Pulmonary Medicines and Sleep Disorders at AIIMS, New Delhi. He was honoured by the Government of India in 2015 with Padma Shri Award, the fourth highest Indian Civilian Award. He single handedly handled the Covid situation very successfully. His exemplary services during Covid Pandemic times have been highly appreciated and profusely acknowledged & applauded.

Rtn Sanjay Aggarwal, President of Rotary Club of Delhi Central read the Citation.

In his acceptance speech, Dr Randeep Guleria said health is very important. There is a necessity to have healthy individuals and also a healthy nation. Earlier the importance of health was under played. Today preventive health is more important than curative health. Since the year 2000, during the last 23 years we have had so many outbreaks of different types of virus in different parts of India. This is because people travel frequently as travel has become very common and one is suspected to be carrying the virus while travelling. As such we have to be very very careful and cautious about our health, he said.

The next Awardee was Padma Shri Mr Muzaffar Ali, who is a renowned film maker, a fashion designer of repute, a poet, an artist, a cultural revivalist and a social worker. He is a popular actor, film Director and also a music Director, truly a multifaceted personality. He is well known and remembered for his direction in the film Umrao Jaan (1981). He was awarded the Yash Bharti award in 1994, Padma Shri in 2005 and the Rajiv Gandhi Rashtriya Sadbhavna Award in 2014. He has been recognised with many awards and the list goes on.

The Citation was read by PP Rtn Prem Singhania.

In his acceptance speech the Internationally acclaimed celebrity, Mr Muzaffar Ali said it is a very proud moment to be awarded by Rotary with this prestigious Vocational Service Award. Films are a medium to connect with people and to understand them for progressing forward.

The last Awardee was Padma Shri Mrs Malini Awasthi. She is a renowned Indian folk singer. She sings in Bhojpuri, Awadhi and Hindi. She also presents Thumri and Kajri. The Government of India awarded her the Civilian honour of Padma Shri in 2016. She is also known for her contribution in Bhojpuri music thru' folk songs.

Mrs Malini Awasthi could not come to receive the Award in person, but joined the Award ceremony online through Zoom platform.

The Citation was read by PP Rtn Prem Vohra.

The Citation Award, Memento and Shawl was received on her behalf by her son, Mr Aditya Awasthi.

Accepting the Award, Mrs Malini Awasthi joined the meeting on Zoom platform and said our Culture was getting back stage and becoming obsolete. She thought we could revive our cultural heritage through folk music and songs with children and young students of BHU and JNU. She said that she was just only a medium to continue to keep the rich cultural heritage of India alive through social media through these folk songs. She said she can also see India beyond songs and folk traditions. She thanked Rotary for bestowing her with this prestigious Vocational Service Award.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE AWARDS



She offered every possible help to further these objectives.

At Rotary Blood Bank Tughlakabad, they were welcomed by Mr Deewan and Dr Anju Verma who took them all around the facilities at the Blood Bank and gave a brief introduction of the services being rendered the Blood Bank. The delegation took keen interest in services being offered in supporting healthcare to the underprivileged sections of society.

Rotary Club of Delhi Central extended a warm welcome to the delegation at its Rotary Divyang Kendra at Karkardooma where they were shown around the facilityand learn about the process to manufacture the artificial limbs and how are theywere being fixed on many disabled recipients at the Divyang Kendra. The visit was followed by an official meeting organised by RCD Central in honour of the delegation. Visiting Rotarians were offered Indian food from Delhi-6 which was enjoyed by all.

During their stay, the Rotarians from Lithuania visited various cultural and historical sites in the city, such as the Qutub Minar, India Gate, Red Fort, and a rikshaw ride at Chandni Chowk. The delegation took keen interest while visiting Akshardham Temple. At all these places besides the hosts, the group was accompanied by a guide who provided them with detailed information on the significance of each location.

The Rotarians from Lithuania also had the chance to experience the local cuisine, which was quite different from what they were used to. They were introduced to various traditional dishes and were able to enjoy the flavours and aromas of Indian spices.

To give a warm send off to the delegation all the host clubs hosted a joint meeting on the evening of the 30th of March where Rotary Club of Akash Megapolis signed a cooperation MOU with Rotary Club of Vilnius. All the three host Clubs, RCD Akash Magapolis, RCD Manthan and RC Delhi exchanged their flags with Rotary Club of Vilnius. Visiting Rotarians expressed their experience during their 3 days visit to New Delhi. While extending thanks to the hosts, the visiting Rotarians extended their invitation to host them at Vilnius at their earliest.



Nearly 800 students from the nearby slum area are getting free education at Quetta D.A.V School Nizamuddin, New Delhi. However the school has limited resources and are unable to provide hygienic toilets, hand wash stations, mid day meal area and proper access to exit and entry to the school because the road is broken. The school facade is in a poor stare with a leaking roof that allows the water to seep into classrooms. When members of the club visited an adjoining school for an investiture ceremony the Principal took the team to see this school which is in a deplorable state. A club member, Rtn Ajay Gupta, kindly agreed to use his company's CSR funds for whatever was required to be done at the school and the members started the work on the premises. It was indeed a gratifying moment to see the smiles on the students' faces when the members visited the school on 18 March and DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor to inaugurate the toilet block with sturdy and High quality fittings, the wash stations with very durable Jaguar fittings, a proper mid day meal area and newly cemented roads around the entrance and exit areas. This was all a part of phase 1 of the project. The members also installed 2 drums for collecting plastic waste to make students aware of the need to protect the environment. The plastic collected in the drums will be sold to a scrapdealer every month and the money collected will be awarded to 10 Plastic Heroes every month.

The members also planted 100 trees at the school. The students were given 100 bags to collect plastic bottles and bring them to the school for recycling. The overall expenditure on this project was Rs 55 Lakhs to Rs 60 Lakhs



























ROTARY CLUB OF CENTRAL YOUTH SHAKTI - PRAGYAM SCHOOL PROJECT, AN EFFORT TOWARDS EDUCATING NEEDY

Our club has a vision to provide education to needy kids, who could not afford the primary education and in this vision collaborated with Pragyam Pathshala, Faridabad. This has been going successfully with the phenomenal efforts and contribution of all club members. Some club members have gone an extra mile in donating utensils, rice, wheat and other cooking materials to the school.

The club has also tied up with Rotary action groups to conduct health check-up camps - Dental check-up and eye check-up camp. More than 100 students were tested, and spectacles were given to the needy students.

The club celebrates all national events like Republic day and Independence day with the school

students. They also celebrate festivals like Christmas, Baisakhi, many birthdays and anniversaries in the school. Students are so excited and elated to enjoy savouries and gifts which members bring to them on these occasions.

The club's next target is to help construct the first floor of the school, for which the work has already started and is in full swing. In all, the club has spent around 5 lacs INRin contributions that have been made to the school, but more than this, it is countless hours put in by the members which brings a smile to the face of not only the school students, but also the teachers. It is this smile and happiness that we see on every student's face that motivates teachers and us and makes us believe that we are heading in the right direction.




