MESSAGE

Rtn. JENNIFER JONES President 2022-23 Rotary International

In August, I was proud to visit Pakistan and highlight Rotary's top goal, eradicating polio. It was also a tremendous opportunity to spotlight female health workers who are playing a critical role in protecting children from this vaccine-preventable disease.

This month, as we celebrate World Polio Day, we are shining a spotlight on our more than 30year effort to lead the first global polio eradication campaign and our success in forming partnerships capable of completing this massive goal. We all know that this is one of the most ambitious global health initiatives in history and that we've reduced polio cases by more than 99.9 percent worldwide.

Pakistan is one of only two countries in the world where wild poliovirus remains endemic. (The other is neighboring Afghanistan.) I was able to witness and take part in vaccination campaigns in Pakistan, and soon after I left, a monumental nationwide immunization campaign took place, focused on 43 million children under the age of 5. I saw the incredible work of Rotary members on the ground. More than 60 percent of vaccinators in Pakistan are women, and they are doing a remarkable job building trust and convincing mothers to vaccinate their children.

Seeing it all firsthand, I know that the will exists across the Rotary world to end polio, and I'm confident that we have the strategy. The Pakistani media has been very supportive of our efforts as well, and this is making a difference. This month, a new global pledging moment at the World Health Summit in Berlin promises to pull together more resources to fund these time-sensitive eradication efforts. Now it is up to us to do our part and raise \$50 million this year to earn the full 2-to-1 match from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

There's great cause for optimism on the polio front — but also some staggering new events that have further raised the stakes. Over the past few months, new polio outbreaks have occurred in Israel, the United Kingdom and, most recently, in the New York City area. These stories are frightening, but in every case, the response is clear — vaccines work, and if polio is spreading, we need to make sure the most at-risk people have kept their vaccinations up to date.

Most importantly, we need to eradicate this virus now. If polio exists anywhere, it can spread everywhere. What I saw in Pakistan convinced me that we can and must finish the job, but it will only happen if we remain committed to a strategy that's working and back it with all necessary resources.

Through our commitment, generosity, and sheer determination, we will #EndPolio.

DILA or District Interact Leadership Assembly, aptly christened "DISHA" -- A Path towards Better Tomorrow, was held on Friday 11th November, 2022 at Apeejay School, Sheikh Sarai, New Delhi with participation of over 700 Interactors from 70 Interact Club Schools.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor called the DILA meeting, "DISHA" to order after going round the Exhibition of projects done by various Interact Clubs of different schools. The event started with an Invocation song -- Ganesh Vandana by Interactors of M L Khanna DAV School.

MoC Rtn Sarika Yadav, DILA Chair extended a very warm and cordial welcome to all present. Rtn Prateek Jain, District Chair, New Generations in his opening remarks said we are celebrating 60 years of Interact this year. Rotary is made of people. Interact is International Action. Interact is leadership in action. He said a leader never waits for action -- he creates an opportunity to take action. Mahatma Gandhi was a man of action. He organised a movement and people followed him to make it a mass movement. As Interactors never wait and fail to take an action --- just do it.

SWAMI PEEPAL BABA, Chief Guest of the morning talking on 'Better Environment for Better Tomorrow', said, he has been associated with Rotary since 1984 for almost 4 decades. He asked everyone to contact him for any problems on environmental issues. His NGO has converted 56 acres of baron land into green forests by planting trees. He said he received encouragement to plant trees from his teacher and grandmother. He and like-minded students formed an Eco Club in their school. They were encouraged to plant trees to improve the environment. They went out and learnt from Farmers, from Gardeners and other people about tree plantation and how to nurture them to grow into a fully grown tree. A tree pulls water towards itself and conserves it. Today, glaciers are melting and rivers are likely to dry after a few decades. Young students should focus on positivity and avoid negativity and do as much good to the environment as they possibly can. The leadership should be for community service projects for the welfare of humanity.

There were three performances by students of Apeejay Global School, Indraprastha International School and Adarsh Public School.

After the performances of three schools a Panel discussion moderated by Rtn Prateek Jain was held with eminent Faculty members comprising of Ms Sayali Bhagat, Former Miss India & Actor, Dr. D K Pandey, Educationist, DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor and Intr. Hiya Jain.

Ms Sayali Bhagat said Interactors should be confident and have self belief and stay away from comparisons. Today technology takes lots of our time because of social media and social interaction. She asked students to stay away from these distractions and focus on good things.DG Ashok Kantoor said once students start imagining, their thought process goes towards dreaming and thinking about a better tomorrow and thats when we come with many innovative ideas. We need to imagine ideas that will be beneficial for a better tomorrow.

Dr D K Pandey said the New Education Policy 2020 is already focusing on a better tomorrow with emphasis on different skills to make the younger generation employable and self entrepreneurs when they grow up and come out of schools. Everyone needs to imagine if future has to prosper and to be better human beings as part of the





future generation. He asked everyone to focus on skills building as is envisaged in the new NEP 2020 under 5+3+3+4 curriculum. Learning by doing, learning to know, learning to do and learning to be better human beings are the main focus points of the New Education Policy. Intr. Hiya Jain said Interact opened future for her and motivated her to grow as an individual with confidence and learn about various opportunities that Interact provides for leadership qualities.

The Panel discussion was followed by performances from Satyavati Sood Arya Girls Sr. Sec. School and Soami Nagar Model School.

DG Ashok Kantoor launched "MAIN BHI JAL RAKSH HOON" scheme and said Rotary are propagating use of Aerators for saving water. By using Aerators water consumption can be saved upto 50%. He asked everyone to take a pledge to conserve and save water and say -- "Main Bhi Jal Rakshak".

DGE Rtn Jeetender Gupta talking about Role of Youth in Rotary Leadership said every student must plan as big as possible. Rotary has been akin to a net working NGO for past 117 years and there is a need to infuse the energy of the youth in it. He said the actions of the Interactors must inspire others and that will make them true leaders of a better tomorrow.DGN Rtn Mahesh Trikha talking on inspiring Interactors to become Rotaractors said that every Interactor is a part of the organisation to become a better student in their class and to be a unique student who can improve the world and lead the world the way they want to dream and imagine. He said the next platform for Interactors in Rotary is Rotaract. He asked everyone to keep on doing good work and try to become Rotaractors after they reach 18 years of age.

ADIR Intr Kavya Behl narrating impressions of "DISHA" said this District Interact Leadership Assembly was very successful and fruitful. The Interactors had an enjoyable and enlightening Panel discussion. Awards for Exhibition display of Best projects and Best performances were given to winners.

In his concluding remarks DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor thanked Appeejay School Management Mr Nayar and School Principal Dr Singh for providing all facilities for holding DILA meeting on their school premises and honoured Mr Nayar with a Shawl as a token of our gratitude.

Rtn Yuvnashav Sood, District Interact Chair proposed vote of thanks and expressed gratitude to everyone for their presence and thanked all the Interactors and their teachers for their presence, for their participation and for coming to DILA.

Rotary Club of Delhi Manthan recognised the importance of playing a sport and of keeping students focused in an area which is good for their physical and mental wellbeing from the time the club was chartered and they have been running the Interschool Volleyball Tournament every year. The Tournament was inaugurated on 16th November 20222 under the leadership of DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor and first Lady Alka Kantoor, President Rtn Arun Bhutani and several Rotarians from Rotary Club of Delhi Manthan.

The winners in Boys category were Team from Meera Model School and runners up from Masonic Public School, Vasant Kunj. In the Girls category the winners were team from Meera Model School and runners up from Soami Nagar Model School.

The closing ceremony was held on 17th November 2022 which was presided over by First Lady Alka Kantoor who motivated the teams and presented trophies to the Winners and Runners-Up. All coaches and referee from Delhi State Volleyball Association were well recognised along with Principal of Soami Nagar Model School and the sponsoring Rotary Clubs. The vibrant tournament finally ended on a positive note and with the commitment to continue to hold this event year after year at much greater levels to empower students with development of their skills and to lead a happy life.

















































DISTRICT EVENT LEPROSY CONTROL PROJECT

The Joint Review Meeting with LEPRA, UK on LEPROSY CONTROL PROJECT was held on Monday 14th November, 2022 at PHD House, New Delhi.

Rtn Pradeep Bahri, MOC extended a very warm welcome to all present. He also acknowledged the esteemed presence of DG Rtn Rajiv Singhal from R I District 3100 who had especially come from Meerut to attend the Meet. The Presidents of 4 Host Clubs -- RCD South, RC New Delhi, RCD South End and RCD Regency Next had jointly organised the event.

MOC Pradeep Bahri in his Opening Remarks said that till very recently it was believed that leprosy was a disease of the past. Its continued prevalence, spread and the suffering it caused was not known. The truth is, India today is the world's capital for Leprosy. Leprosy is curable but people are not aware about it. On 21st October 2019, an MOU was signed between Lepra UK and Rotary Clubs of Delhi South, New Delhi & Delhi Southend, at the same venue to make Leprosy a disease of no consequence in India. Later, RCD Regency Next also joined in this journey for Leprosy Control.

PDG Rtn Deepak Kapur who heads India's Rotary Leprosy Control Project informed that out of 1,40,000 Leprosy Cases worldwide , 93,000 cases or roughly about 63% of the cases are in India." Free treatment is available for Leprosy in India but people are not aware of it. Multi Drug Therapy (MDT) is also there for free but lot of us are ignorant about it. We have to create awareness in society. We have already sensitised more than 10,000 people. 56 Physiotherapy & Awareness Camps have already been conducted in 30 Leprosy Colonies in Delhi NCR. Workshops have also been conducted to train Medical Professionals so that they can detect leprosy in people. Special Shoes have been developed and distributed free to Leprosy Patients. Besides, 100 Tricycles, many Walking Aids ,Self-aid Kits, and Solar Electricity have been provided in Leprosy Colonies. We are planning to start shortly a Lepra OPD Department in a Hospital in Delhi. exclusively for Leprosy patients.' They even intend Skilling leprosy cured personnel to make Bandages for use in dressings to help them make a decent living.

Mr Jimmy Innes from Lepra, UK said that in 2019, there were 1 40,000 Leprosy Cases worldwide and 93,000 cases were in India. They, from Lepra are providing all help, assistance and guidance to close this gap. By 2030, they expect to ensure a Leprosy Transmission Free World. The Leprosy Control Project has to be coordinated accordingly to achieve this goal. There is no vaccine to cure Leprosy, as such stress should be on how to Control the spread of Leprosy. Lot of research is going on towards Leprosy treatment. Lepra, UK is too proud of its association and partnership with Rotary towards Leprosy Control and making India and World Leprosy Free following the example of Rotary's Global Polio Eradication Efforts.

Rtn Nayan Patel, a Trustee of Lepra, and Special Representative of Rotary and Rotary Foundation for Polio and Leprosy said, 'it was 3 years ago when an MoU was signed in this very room between Rotary and LEPRA, U K to plan for making India Leprosy free. Hype on this partnership can be translated into responsibilities to solve complex global challenges in controlling spread of Leprosy. Polio Eradication is a very fine example of partnerships of Rotary with UNICEF, CDC, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and various governments from different countries of the world. India was declared Polio free 8 years ago in 2014. Together We Will and We Can beat Leprosy'.

DG Rtn Rajiv Singhal from Meerut, R I District 3100 expressed his happiness on being a part of the event. He said that he would discuss with DG Ashok Kantoor and PDG Deepak Kapur and also Clubs in his District as to how they can associate in this programme of Leprosy Control.





President Lalit Sawhney of RCD South said that Leprosy is not different from Polio. They have conducted many camps in Leprosy Colonies in Delhi in the past 3 years to Create Awareness about Leprosy Cure and Treatment. They need to do more and have to reach out to all the Leprosy Colonies in Delhi. He hopes that in a month, the group of four Clubs would grow from 4 to 6 and possibly by end of June 2023 from 6 to 10 Clubs. Many Clubs were interested in joining this programme of Leprosy Control and banishing Leprosy totally from Delhi and NCR.

Rtn Dr Madhumati Singh, President of Rotary Club of New Delhi said that keeping WHO's call for banishing Leprosy by 2030, her suggestion was that each and every Club in District 3011 should form a Leprosy Committee, like the Polio Committee. They should all go to Leprosy Colonies to help Leprosy Patients and aim to achieve Zero Transmission of Leprosy at least in Delhi and NCR region.

Rtn Udit Piplani, Secretary of RCD South End said,' Leprosy is is curable. Good and Early Diagnosis of the disease is very important. The disease does not spread easily and treatment is easy. We should ensure proper rehabilitation to enable the patients lead a dignified life. We must Control Spread of Leprosy.

We must make patients aware about maintaining Better Hygiene. Mother Teresa did a lot towards treating Leprosy Patients.' His Club is doing more than 2 or 3 Camps every month for Creating Awareness about Leprosy Control and Treatment. Every Club is welcomed to contact RCD South for any information or project on Leprosy Control.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor said that he had the opportunity to witness the MOU Signing Ceremony three years ago. His District 3011 is committed to Control Leprosy. He inaugurated a Massive Cycle Rally to Spread Awareness about End Polio and End Leprosy on 2nd of October, 2022, Mahatma Gandhi's Birthday. Several media houses covered this Massive Cycle Rally and the message went to the Government. NDMC Vice Chairman and Director of Education, Delhi Govt. approached him to work together to Control Leprosy in Delhi. Doctors from MCD Hospitals in Delhi have also come forward to support the goal of controlling spread of Leprosy in and around Delhi. Leprosy Patients are confined to their places in Leprosy Colonies. The DG inorder to enable them to earn their own livelihood, has planned to set up a Skill Development Centre at a big Leprosy Colony in East Delhi. They have even planned to start an OPD Department exclusively for Leprosy Patients in one of the hospitals nearest to a Leprosy Colony. He gave an open offer to all Clubs in District 3011 to join this campaign of Leprosy Control. Whatever support the Clubs need from the District, he assured will be given. He was sure that with joint efforts of everyone, he will be able to Reduce the Number of Leprosy Patients in Delhi.

MOC Pradeep Bahri informed that the Leprosy Control Foundation has been formed and will work towards making Leprosy Zero Transmission.

DGE Rtn Jeetender Gupta proposing Vote of Thanks expressed gratitude to all the eminent Speakers and said Leprosy Control is an Ongoing Project and assured full support to the program during his tenure as DG in 2023-24.

The Meeting was declared adjourned and everyone was invited for Hi Tea.

IMPORTANT PROJECTS CYBER SECURITY WEBINAR

With the increased improvement in technology we also find an increase in innovative cybercrime. The advancement of technology has made us completely dependent on the internet. Internet has given man access to everything while sitting at one place. Social networking, online shopping, online studying, online jobs, every possible things that one can think of can be done through the medium of internet.

The reason why cyber crime is surfacing more than any other crime is because our lives are connected to the internet with all our accounts, our property information, our business proposals and deals and anything to do with our personal and professional lives is on the internet. While we think it is safer to have it all locked up in our own cyber space what many of us don't realise is that criminals can hack into almost everything we have just as they used to enter our homrs and rob us of everything in the old days. Cyber crime knows no geographical boundaries and the cyber criminals are unknown. It is affecting all the stakeholders from government, business to citizens alike. In India cybercrime is increasing with the increased use of information and communication technology (ICT). Many of us have been victims of phishing over the years and in recent times and it is becoming increasingly insecure and unsafe to keep your world locked up in cyber space unless you know everything on how to protect it. R.I.District 3011 invited Dr.Muktesh Chander, IPS Special Commissioner (Retired), Delhi Police, to enlighten us about the different sorts of cybercrime that is happening all across the world and to discuss some steps to overcome cybercrime in India.

The talk was, indeed, very useful and very relevant in the current context. He broadly divided cyber crime into categories where it affects individuals, property and the government. There are hundreds of ways in which cyber criminals can attack all the above through spoofing, defamation, hacking, vandalism, cyber terrorism and several other ways in which they operate. They can completely take over your life and there is a need for greater cyber security & cyber hygiene and strengthening enforcement & investigation. Dr Muktesh Chander's areas of interest are cybercrime and its detection, cyber terrorism, E-governance, Digital signatures, Cryptography, E-policing, Information security and Cyber laws, Social media monitoring, etc. and his manybyears of research have given him an insight into carefully monitoring the system at all times to protect our virtual world. He said that companies are storing and exchanging vital information online and cyber breaches are leading to huge losses if they haven't managed their information security in a planned manner. We have to be one step ahead of the hackers and protect our data by developing software that can safeguard your property online. The cases he cited worldwide of how cyber space criminals have attacked the biggest news channels and social.media houses, brought down governments, even hacked into nuclear power stations sounded very scary and more dangerous than regular crime.

He said there needs to be a nationwide campaign to create awareness about cybe security. There needs to be strong regulations on responsible internet practices and they need to be followed stringently. India needs to develop cyber security systems according to the constantly changing cyber crime threats. While we are moving towards a Digital India we must also focus on becoming a cyber power.

There was a question and answer round at the end where he answered several questions on reporting cyber crime, identifying areas of threat etc. It was definitely the need of the hour and Dr Muktesh Chander helped in creating more awareness about the preventive measures one could take while using the internet.

IMPORTANT PROJECTS Bore Charger Project

Rotary Club of Faridabad Elite Zone 23 AG: Rtn Manoj Gupta President: Rtn: Nitin Kapoor

The club has taken up a very big initiative of recharging borewells in Faridabad which will address the current problems of a receding water table and depleting water resource. The main aim of the Bore Charger Technique is twofold. On one hand it is implemented to increase the chances of directly recharging the deep aquifers from water that is being stored in the upper unconfined zones which in turn ensures overall yield enhancement and on the other hand it also improves groundwater quality.

The Impact of the Bore Charger is as follows:

- 1. Increases water production capacity or yield of an existing borewell with low investment.
- 2. Unique and patented technology that helps harvesting rainwater in unconfined aquifers and makes the borewell more sustainable by recharging the deeper aquifers.
- 3. This is made possible by a unique process which 'perforates' existing

- 4. The solution, by perforating the existing casing, 'leaks' the unconfined aquifer in the borewell and subsequently in the confined aquifer.
- 5. No civil construction space and surface water source required.
- 6. Revives defunct and low yielding borewells.

FUTURE ACTIONS

Awaaz Foundation and R.I District 3011 have joined hands to solve the water scarcity problems in Faridabad, by bringing in bore charger technology which will recharge dried and semi dried borewell/tube wells. Pilot project of technology has been successfully showcased with MCF by recharging 15 abandoned/dried tubewells. Considering the water scarcity issues in the city, projects like these are the need of the hour and bot the organisations ---Awaaz Foundation and R.I. District 3011 intend to recharge at least 100 borewells with this process and take it on further until every borewell of Faridabad is successfully recharged.

Brief History of Rotary Public School :

The history of 43 glorious years is in fact the history of the Herculean efforts made by the Rotarians of Rotary Club Gurgaon, R.I. Distt 3011. The odyssev began in 1981 when there was no secondary school in the great city of Guru Dronacharya. The need of the hour was felt by the Rotarians of the Rotary Club Gurgaon and with a vision to impart quality education to society and the socially under privileged. The Rotary Service Trust was formed comprising of some elite professionals and entrepreneurs amongst the members of Rotary Club Gurgaon. These men of genius, with confidence in God, joined heads and hands together and wove the threads of their project. Their devoted action plans multiplied million folds and built the fabric of Rotary Public School, the first ever Rotary Project with a vision to provide education to the underprivileged of society on a self-sustaining model.

Pioneering the cause of education Rotary Public School stands as the first venture of Rotary Service Trust Gurgaon whose foundation stone was laid by Dr. S.Y. Qureshi the then Deputy Commissioner of Gurgaon Range. Initially the school made humble start with only four rooms in sec-17 and a small number of students. The main aim of the school was "For the want of money, no deserving child should be deprived of the right to quality education". With the passage of time, arose the need for a bigger & better building. Once again with the untiring efforts of leading Rotarians, the school was allotted 5 acres of land by HUDA. The task ahead was all challenging the more because sufficient funds were required for the construction of the building. With dreams in their eves and vision in their minds, they took loan from the bank for its construction of the building.

Hats off to the Trustees of Rotary Service Trust, who took a big risk and mortgaged their personal properties thuswas established theFirst Senior Secondary School in Gurgaon affiliated to CBSE, New Delhi.

Finally the dream came true in the year 2000, when the first rays of sunlight endowed upon superbly designed spacious building incorporating the latest in the school architecture and thus a new school saw the dawn whose foundation stone was laid by Past R.I. President Rtn. Carlo Ravizza & was also inaugurated by him.

Spread over sprawling locale of 5 acres, the present building of Rotary Public School in Sec-22 is agronomically constructed ,Ultra-modern Conference Room with power back facility, hightech Audio-Visual Hall and to top it all technology enabled classrooms.

The school stands committed and does a Yoeman service to the society by providing 700 children belonging to economically challenged families access to Quality Education in the mainstream.

In this endeavour, the school is providing free Education to 33% students in most conducive environment. Setting higher standards of excellence, the students have won several laurels to school in academics by producing the city topper -Shreya Jain in the year 2018 and national players in Judo like Annu Kumari from this category of children to name a few.

Kudos to the dedication of the Rotarians of Rotary Club Gurgaon, who strive together towards the ultimate goal of serving humanity in the most befitting manner.
