While sitting with a group of Rotary leaders outside of Lusaka, Zambia, I ask a question: "How many of you have ever had malaria?" Every hand in the room goes up. They even begin to tell me about the first, second, or third time they experienced the disease, one of the main causes of death and sickness in many developing countries.

They are fortunate. They have access to medical treatment and lifesaving medicines. For the people of rural Zambia, their story is very different.

On a wooden bench in a small village, I sit with Timothy and his young son Nathan. With a camera crew capturing our conversation, he tells me of the time Nathan showed signs of malaria. He brought the boy to the nearby home of a community health worker, where Nathan quickly received medicines that in all likelihood saved his life.

Calmly, Timothy tells me about his other son s bout with the disease a few years earlier. He had to race that son to a medical clinic more than 5 miles away. Riding a bike and carrying his child on his back, he tells me, he could feel his son s legs turn cold and then his little body go limp. As he finally entered the clinic, he screamed for help, but it was too late. The camera stops rolling, and we sit in silence. He begins to weep, and I hold him tightly. "Ilost my son, Ilost my son," he says.

This story is all too familiar for the families we meet over the next few days. And yet there is hope. Partners for a Malaria-Free Zambia is Rotary s first Programs of Scale grant recipient, and it is saving lives. Across two provinces of Zambia, 2,500 volunteer health workers have been selected by their communities. They are trained to bring medical care closer to those who need it, and they are able to diagnose and treat malaria and other ailments. Rotary partnerships create lasting change.

DISTRICT EVENT LEGAL AID SEMINAR

At the first of its kind event in R.I.District 3011, DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor welcomed the Chief Guest of the evening, Supreme Court Judge Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul and Guest of Honour, PDG Rtn Vivek Tankha, Member of Parliament.

The MoC welcomed all the distinguished guests and galaxy of luminaries present from the Legal fraternity. PP Rtn Asha Sharma in her welcome address said Rotary has decided to take up the cause of providing Legal Aid and Legal Services to the poor and people from EWS sections of Society and that is the relevance of the very important seminar.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor in his opening remarks welcoming everyone present and briefed the Legal fraternity and non Rotarians about the phenomenal activities Rotary undertakes in almost every avenue of service. He said Rotarians have taught more than 1500 Peace Warriors to prevent conflicts and resolve issues peacefully. Rotarians take on many charities for the welfare of humanity. There is a Legal Aid Cell in all Courts and DG requested the Legal luminaries to suggest a way forward to see how Rotary can work together towards providing Legal Aid and Justice to poor people.

District Chair Legal Committee Rtn Jayant Nath (Retd) Justice of Delhi High Court said he is actively involved in Rotary's various social activities. Rotary was founded by Paul Harris who was a Lawyer by profession way back in 1905. Women became members of Rotary as a result of Supreme Court judgement in USA in 1987. R.I.District 3011 wants to have a collaboration and partnership with Legal Aid Cell and Legal services wing of Lawyers fraternity to provide legal Aid to poor people.

PDG & Member of Parliament Rtn Vivek Tankha, the Guest of Honour at the event, said that he is a compulsive worker and he likes to take challenges. He said that during Covid times with the cooperation of Rotarians and particularly from R.I. District 3011, we were able to arrange Oxygen Concentrators within 5 days when there was shortage of oxygen. During this year's recent chilling winter with biting cold, Rotarians were able to provide blankets, heaters and mattresses to shelter homes for the poor homeless people within two to three days - thanks again to Rotarians of R.I.

District 3011 and District Governor Rtn Ashok Kantoor for the immediate response.

There is a Parliamentary Committee on Legal Aid and he suggested that Rotary should try to collaborate, associate and partner with this Committee to seek guidance for providing Legal Aid and Legal services to the poor and destitute people and women who are hesitant to go to Courts. Rotary can be a supplement to what services Legal Authorities Cells are providing. Rotary has a very large number of Lawyers as its members. He added that Rotarians are a force in itself. They should take this as an opportunity to create innovative ideas and evolve mechanism for joining hand with NALSA and SALSA to alleviate the sufferings of poor people.

Hon'ble Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Chief Guest of the evening in his inspiring and motivational address said Courts are an institution and so is Rotary an organisation providing services for welfare of communities. Peace is a methodology to determine camaraderie and fellow feeling. Peace is a common concept for both Courts and Rotary. The access to Justice is a greatest challenge for the poor people from EWS sections. It's very difficult to resolve disputes between people from the marginalised underprivileged sections of Society. He added that they have a very large number of cases pending in Courts. Cost of litigation is quite expensive and keeps on going up. Poor people can't afford such high legal costs. Legal Aid authorities are there in Courts but poor people are hesitant in going to them believing high cost of litigation which they can't afford. Rotarians have to create awareness about their legal rights. Rotary can help in creating awareness about legal rights of people. There are a very huge number of prisoners languishing in jails for many years and they can not fight for their rights because they are not aware of their legal rights. Everyone has to put their heads together to find out some methodology for early resolving of disputes. Some part of the punishment has already been undergone by the undertrials while languishing in jails. On grounds of good behaviour their cases should be considered under plea bargaining. In USA they have a system of plea bargaining resolution of disputes through settlement. In California 97 to 98 % cases are settled and solved without going to Courts under plea bargaining system.





However in India 99 % cases go to trial. Unless some methodology is developed to resolve disputes, the cases will go on increasing. Reformation of huge number of undertrials in the prisons is most important and all stakeholders should work in that direction. Rotary should help improve such a situation by providing Legal Aid services. The prosecution and defense should have equal opportunities. Idea is to find a solution to resolve the issue. Disputes arise because of family members ego. No body wants to go to Courts voluntarily. Going to Courts is the last resort.

Innovations are required to find solutions for settlement of cases. Rotary is able to deal with people because they have an access due to its vast outreach through numerous service activities. Mediation is one of the best ways for finding amicable solutions. He said the government has already opened Legal Aid Centres in educational institutions and even in Churches at some places to assist people getting advice and guidance for resolving disputes. Rotarians can help in providing assistance in finding alternate Justice solutions for the good of Society and specially poor marginalised and underprivileged people.

After this was open house question--answer panel discussion moderated by Rtn Jayant Nath at which

questions from the audience were satisfactorily answered by the eminent dignitaries on the Panel.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor in his concluding remarks said that we have learnt so much about Legal Aid, most of which we were not aware of earlier. Alternate disputes redressal mechanism should be developed to help maximum people. We will take up the cause of providing Legal Aid further and ensure that each Club has a Legal Aid Committee under the District Leadership.

Mementos were presented to Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul and PDG Rtn Vivek Tankha in gratitude. Presence of Justice Amit Bansal of Delhi High Court was recognised and a bouquet was presented to him. DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor recognised host Rotary Club Presidents with a Memento for organising this Legal Aid Seminar.

District Secretary Rtn Sanjiv Jawahar proposing Vote of Thanks expressed gratitude to the Chief Guest and Keynote Speaker Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul and Guest of Honour PDG Rtn Vivek Tankha for their highly informative and educative addresses. He also thanked everyone for their presence in such large numbers.

District Clubfoot Awareness Seminar

Sir Gangaram Hospital, Sunday, 29th January

The Seminar started with Welcome addresses by Rtn. Prof. Dr. Manish Dhawan, Clubfoot Chair, Rotary Club of Delhi South and Rtn. Amarnath Goyal, District Clubfoot Chair who started the first clinic at Safdarjung Hospital sponsored by RC Delhi South.

District Governor Ashok Kantoor delivered a highly inspiring talk and asked Rotary Clubs to do new projects, and start more Clubfoot Clinics to cover the children in spread-out locations of Delhi and beyond. In response, 3 offers poured in for additional clinics:

a. A regular clubfoot Clinic at Sir Gangaram Hospital,

b. An offer by Rtn. Rajesh Gupta for RC Delhi Rajdhani Club to start a clinic at Agrasen Hospital.

c. Another clinic at Dr BR Ambedkar Hospital in the process of being started - by RC Delhi West, DG's home Club. We requested the DG to get it expedited, and

d. RC Delhi Panchshila Parkis also planning to start a clinic.

PDG Raman Bhatia, District Advisor, Clubfoot Elimination Project spoke about how with the help of repeated Global Grants from TRF the RC of Delhi Midtown is helping run 5 clinics in the District at AIIMS,Kalawati Saran, CNBC, St. Stephens and Badshah Khan, Fbd with active involvement of RC's of Rajdhani, New Delhi and Faridabad NIT. He further added that the program is now spreading pan India through Rotary Clubs, with support from CURE India. Our District is leading this initiative.

Ashok Kantoor and Dr. Ajay Swarup, Chairman, Sir Ganga Ram Hospital also released an Information Booklet in English and Hindi, written by the Seminar faculty and aimed at parents of Clubfoot-affected children. The faculty included Dr. Mathew Varghese, Dr. Manish Dhawan, Dr. Vikas Gupta, Dr. Atul Vaish and Mr. Santosh George of CURE India. The seminar ended with a live demonstration of the Ponseti method of treatment, showing the way the plaster cast is done for Clubfoot-affected children.

The seminar was attended by a large number of Rotarians and Club Presidents from 10 Rotary Clubs, Past District Governors Vinay Bhatia and Sanjiv Rai Mehra and District Secretary, Mukesh Kohli. The participants included a large no. of parents of Clubfootaffected children and Counsellors from CURE India.

At the seminar, we also presented a 12-year old girl, Shweta who was born with Clubfoot and was operated upon by Vikas Gupta at the Safdarjung Clinic. She has recovered so well that she is now playing Lawn Tennis at the National level, with her Tennis coaching fee of Rs. 3 lakhs p.a. having been waived, thanks to one of our Rotarians' efforts.

The condition is caused by a blockage in the lymphatic system, part of the immune and circulatory systems. Lymphoedema is most commonly caused by lymph node removal or damage due to cancer treatment. While the seminar was useful for all present another significant development was of the understanding between R.I.District 3011 and AIIMS to start Skin Centre.

A very important and absolutely necessary project is being undertaken by the Rotary Club of Faridabad Elite in Collaboration with Awaaz Foundation. A press conference was held at the Gymkhana Club in Faridabad where Guestbof Honour DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor and Chief Guest Deputy Chief Minister Shri Dushyant Chautala made impactful speeches. The Deputy Chief Minister Shri Dushyant Chautala said that the ground water had receded in many parts of Haryana because of which the borewells across the state had no water in them. It is the need of the hour to rejuvenate these borewells and use natural means to fill them with water again. The Government has already set aside a budget of 1100 crores and there is work being carried on a mammoth scale. He said it was heartening to see Rotary and Awaaz coming together to rejuvenate 100 borewells.

DG Rtn Ashok Kantoor said that conservation of water was a vision of R.I.District 3011 this year and one of the main focus areas towards which the entire District machinery was moving in a sustained way. From sensitising young students about the use of aerators to recharging borewells conserving this very important resource was at the heart of all the activities. The ultimate aim was to ensure that no borewell was left unattended across Faridabad and other areas of Haryana.

ROTARY BLOOD BANK CHARITABLE TRUST FARIDABAD

More than a hundred Rotarians of Faridabad consisting of 32 clubs have formed a Rotary Blood Bank Charitable Trust Faridabad, mainly with objective of serving society by providing blood to the needy with a motto "NOBODY SHOULD DIE FOR WANT OF BLOOD". The Blood Bank are conducting voluntary blood donation camps in various institutions, associations and corporates around Faridabad, Delhi, Noida and Gurugram and collecting phenomenal amount of precious blood for people in need. This blood bank was established in 2017. It has been progressing steadily and they are now collecting & dispersing around 1500-2000 units per month which is very commendable.

The blood bank provides blood free of cost to poor patients, to Thalassemic patients and Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Charitable Hospitals, Palwal who in turn are conducting free surgical heart surgeries on children and offer them free residential facilities along with their guardians.

The Blood Bank is looking after the needs of around 187 Thalassemic kids registered with them and they get free blood transfusions & medicines at the Rotary Thalassemia Centre. The establishment is equipped state of the art facilities and has separate Transfusion Rooms, Play Room, Refreshment Room & Waiting Lounge. They also provide Blood to BK Hospital(Civil Hospital) at camps organised specifically for them. The donations received by the Charitable Trust are all voluntary and they don't ask for any replacement. Almost 40-50% of blood is given free of cost to different patients and at very nominal costs for others.




