A HISTORIC VISIT OF HOPE:

RI President Francesco Arezzo Ignites the Spirit of Rotary District 3141

Rotary District 3141 witnessed a landmark moment as Rotary International President Francesco Arezzo visited Mumbai on the 8th and 9th of November 2025. Across two memorable days, the district showcased its spirit, strength, and commitment to Rotary's global mission of compassion, inclusion, and transformational impact. Guided by the presence of RI President Francesco and the leadership of District Governor Dr. Manish Motwani, the visit radiated purpose, pride, and renewed dedication to service.

A Heartwarming Start at Nehru Science Centre

The visit began with an emotionally uplifting programme at the Nehru Science Centre, where specially abled children delivered performances filled with courage and creativity. Their pure, powerful expressions of talent moved everyone present and reaffirmed that the human spirit rises far beyond limitations. RI President Francesco interacted warmly with the young performers, inspired by their resilience and enthusiasm. DG Dr. Manish Motwani echoed this sentiment, noting that these children represented the perseverance and potential Rotary seeks to nurture across communities.

Following the programme, an elegant luncheon was hosted for AKS members and major donors. The gathering reflected a shared mission rooted in compassion and meaningful action. RI President Francesco expressed deep appreciation for India's exceptional contribution to The Rotary Foundation, commending the country's leadership in scale, innovation, and service impact. DG Dr. Manish thanked the donors for their unwavering generosity, emphasizing that their philanthropy powered Rotary's most transformative initiatives. The afternoon closed with heartfelt gratitude and a renewed shared purpose.

Day Two Begins: The Grand Car Rally Across Mumbai

The second day began with vibrant energy as nearly 35 cars assembled for a grand rally across Mumbai. With RI President Francesco and DG Dr. Manish leading the convoy, the rally became a moving symbol of Rotary's unity and momentum. The route showcased the city's scenic beauty—from the coastal road to the iconic Sea Link—where a massive welcome hoarding greeted the President. His delight reflected the affection and respect he received from the district.

The rally continued through Happy Street and Mulund, where Rotarians welcomed the President with festive cheer,

music, and fellowship. The journey concluded gracefully along Pipeline Road, with the serene Powai Lake offering a picturesque finish.

Press Conference with the RI President

The morning's energy transitioned into an important media engagement—a press conference in honour of the RI President. Journalists from leading television channels and newspapers attended, eager to understand the significance of the visit and Rotary's future direction. District Governor Dr. Manish stated, "Rotary's mission is to create lasting change—in individuals, in communities, and across the world. The presence of our International President today adds great inspiration to our journey of service."

RI President Francesco ad-

ressed media questions with clarity and depth, acknowledging India's leadership in global Rotary initiatives and expressing strong confidence in District 3141's ability to drive sustainable impact. The conference amplified Rotary's message across the city and beyond.

Immediately afterwards, the district launched one of its most impactful initiatives—the Pink Auto Project, dedicated to empowering women through sustainable livelihoods. RI President Francesco and DG Dr. Manish jointly flagged off the first fleet of Pink Auto Rickshaws, marking a significant step in promoting women's independence and economic mobility. President Francesco lauded the project for blending immediate relief with long-term transformation. DG Dr. Manish announced the district's ambi-

tious plan to scale the initiative to 1,000 Pink Autos, reaffirming Rotary's commitment to bold action and inclusive progress.

Luncheon with Senior Leaders

A warm luncheon hosted at DG Dr. Manish Motwani's residence provided RI President Francesco the opportunity to spend meaningful time with the School of Past District Governors and senior district leaders. The interactions were genuine, reflective, and rooted in shared responsibility. Discussions touched on Rotary's evolution, the district's growing impact, and the collective vision for the future.

Inauguration of the District Eye Hospital

RI President Francesco then inaugurated the Smt. Nirmaladevi Sardarmal Jain Rotary District 3141 Eye Hospital, one of the district's most significant healthcare milestones. With the unveiling of the donor wall and formal opening of the facility, Rotary strengthened its mission of ensuring accessible, quality eye care. In a city where sight-related challenges affect thousands, the hospital stands as a beacon of dignity and compassionate service.

Unveiling of the Heart & Multispeciality Hospital

A defining moment of the visit came with the inauguration of the Spandan & Rotary District 3141 Heart & Multispeciality

Hospital. DG Dr. Manish spoke passionately about the acute shortage of cardiac care in underserved communities and how this 59-bed facility would serve as a lifeline for countless families. Along with providing critical care, the hospital is expected to generate employment and skill-building opportunities for local residents. With the MoU scheduled for December and refurbishment set to begin in January 2026, the project signifies Rotary's long-term investment in healthier futures.

Festa di Amicizia: A Celebratory Close

The President's visit concluded with Festa di Amicizia—an evening of fellowship, culture, and meaningful dialogue. From national anthems to reflections on service, the event encapsulated the warmth and unity of Rotary. In a fireside conversation, RI President Francesco shared inspiring thoughts on compassion, continuity, and leadership, leaving members energized and deeply motivated.

Across two impactful days, RI President Francesco Arezzo and DG Dr. Manish Motwani illuminated the extraordinary power of Rotary—its humanity, its unity, and its boundless potential. This visit will be remembered as a milestone that strengthened Rotary District 3141's resolve and shaped its path toward an even more inspiring future.

Festa di Amicizia: Celebrating Friendship and Service in Mumbai

The Rotary Clubs of Bombay and Bombay North, under Rotary District 3141, came together on November 9th, 2025 to host “Festa di Amicizia”—an evening dedicated to friendship, fellowship, and the spirit of Rotary. Held at the Trident Hotel, Mumbai, the event honoured Rotary International President Francesco Arezzo and Signora Anna Maria Criscione. The evening was hosted by President Bimal Mehta of the Rotary Club of Bombay and President Kamal Chokshi of the Rotary Club of Bombay North, in the presence of District Governor Dr. Manish Motwani and Convenor PDG Sandip Agarwalla.

The programme began with a warm welcome by President Bimal Mehta, followed by the National Anthems of India and Italy. A significant highlight was the launch of the Rotary Verified Business (RVB) initiative, with certificates handed over by RI President Francesco. The evening concluded with an inspiring fireside conversation with President Francesco and a vote of thanks by President Kamal Chokshi.

President Bimal Mehta set the tone with an address filled with warmth and gratitude. He paid tribute to the global leadership of President Francesco and Signora Anna Maria and acknowledged past Rotary leaders, governors, and dignitaries for their unwavering service. Welcoming the gathering, he said, “As hosts, we take great pride in showcasing the warmth, hospitality, and community spirit that defines our district.” His message emphasised friendship, meaningful conversations, and renewed commitment



to Rotary’s mission.

District Governor Dr. Manish Motwani reflected on the high-impact Rotary Service Week, during which the district conducted cancer screenings, cybercrime awareness drives, major blood donation efforts, and initiatives for senior citizens. He highlighted the launch of ten Pink Autos under the ambitious 1,000 Pink Auto project for women’s empowerment. Dr. Motwani also announced two landmark healthcare initiatives—a Rotary District Heart & Multispecialty Hospital and a Rotary District Eye Hospital. Stressing the importance of retention and member engagement, he introduced two new networking platforms: the Rotary Internship Employment Program and Rotary Verified Businesses, urging clubs to ensure every Rotarian feels valued and empowered.

Past RI Director and Past Trustee Ashok Mahajan delivered an eloquent address tracing Rotary’s inspiring journey in India—from the first club chartered in Calcutta in 1920 to the present 170,000 Rotarians across 40,000 clubs. He spoke of India’s leadership in polio eradication, its extraordinary generosity to The Rotary Foundation, and its success in producing four RI Presidents. Underscoring India’s ethos of service, he invoked Gandhi’s words: “The best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others.”

In conversation with PDG Sandip, RI President Francesco shared thoughtful reflections on Rotary’s future. He reaffirmed Rotary’s commitment to polio eradication, acknowledged the need for continuity across leadership terms, and recounted moving lessons

from projects in India—especially one involving children whose courage and leadership deeply inspired him. Calling Mumbai “a vibrant and sparkling city,” he praised the generosity of its people. When asked which value he wished to instil in every Rotarian, he answered simply: “Compassion—the ability to suffer with another.”

Audience questions brought further insights. President Francesco encouraged young Rotarians to be bold and revolutionary, just as Rotary’s founders were. On motivating new members, he urged clubs to rethink traditional formats and create modern, relevant spaces for younger generations. Addressing global membership decline, he identified stronger retention and regionalisation as Rotary’s most vital priorities for the future.

RSW : Eye care for every one

On a rainy Sunday morning, the entire district joined hands to kickstart the 8-Day Service Week by organizing eye camps across the district, from Colaba to Dahanu.

A total of 48 camps benefited 6562 individuals screened for refractive errors, cataracts, and other eye diseases. Out of these, 541 cases of cataract were detected and referred to specialty hospitals for surgery at a concessional rate or free of cost. Spectacles were prescribed to those who needed them, with around 50% of the camps even giving away spectacles for free or at a concessional rate.

While individual clubs have all contributed significantly, some stood out. Mumbai Western Elite organized a comprehensive medical camp attended by 792 beneficiaries, showcasing breathtaking effort and execution. Rotary Club of Palghar conducted five simultaneous camps at different locations. Lotus Eye Hospital supported the Rotary Club of Coastline by hosting the inauguration function attended by the District

Governor. RC Bombay Central conducted a large camp in a crowded slum area in Worli, with 500 attendees despite heavy rain.

This exercise began with metic-



ulous planning by Group Avenue Head, Avenue Chair Rajendran Unnikrishnan, District Governor Dr Manish Motwani, and Advisor PDG Shashi Sharma. We held online and physical meetings to plan and execute the camps. I thank all the Zonal Chairs, Co- chairs, and Project Directors for their excellent motivational skills and organizational abilities, which encouraged the Presidents to create a working plan for the camps. The RSW saw excellent coordination between clubs in each zone, promoting interaction and fellowship during their planning and participation in the camps.

The Eye Camps went a long way towards increasing the visibility of Rotary and spreading awareness about Rotary's activities in the community. The Eye camps were

publicized using local community networks, posters and banners at prominent locations, distribution of pamphlets, social media and by word of mouth. Many camps received excellent media coverage via print, social media and television.

I thank our supporting partners, including Dr Agarwal's Eye Hospitals, Lotus Eye Hospital (Rtn. 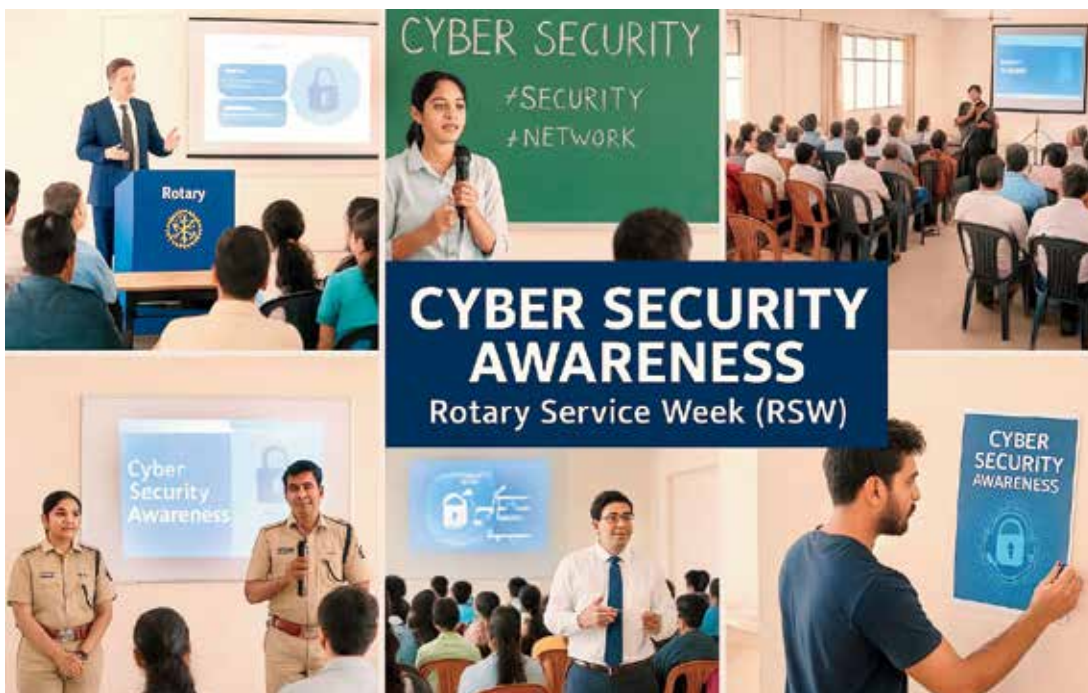

The Rotary Service Week Breast & Cervical Screening Initiative held on 5th November stands as one of the district's most remarkable health service achievements. Conceived under the dynamic leadership of District Governor Dr. Manish Motwani, the project demanded exceptional planning, coordination, and teamwork. With over 35 camps proposed and only 15 trained breast screening technicians initially available, executing the entire project on a single day appeared nearly impossible. Yet, through extraordinary collaboration, the district not only met but significantly surpassed expectations.

UE Life Science partnered as the primary technical collaborator for the iBreast Exam, offering streamlined training and deployment support under the guidance of Rtn. Asim Shah. Rotary Club of Mumbai Nova served as the co-hosting backbone for all breast screening camps, ensuring smooth execution, uniformity, and timely coordination across locations. Special thanks to Shalmali for the coordination

To strengthen manpower, Rotaract club of Medicrew provided vital assistance by president Radharani for mobilizing medical students just 15 days prior to the event. With students available only on Sundays, night-time training sessions from 9–11 PM were conducted intensively. Rotary Club of Mumbai Ghatkopar West played a pivotal role by organizing rapid-response training camps, screening 400+ women during practical sessions and successfully certifying 35 new breast screening technicians. The final batch was completed on 2nd November.

For cervical screenings, the district collaborated with SSO, with Ashi coordinating gynaecologists across multiple locations. Medical guidance and operational support from senior Rotarians, including Rtn. Krishna Desai, and Rtn. Meena Kothari, ensured high-quality and consistent service delivery across all centres. In addition, Aditya Birla Group CSR under PRIP Rtn. Ashok Mahajan and Rtn. Sudhir Joshi provided critical financial support. Significant funding assistance for cervical screenings was also facilitated by Rtn. Vishal, President of RC Mulund, who contributed 50% support for these

camps.

On the final day, 125 Rotary clubs united as host or co-host clubs, running 35 screening centres across the district. With exemplary teamwork and unwavering service commitment, these efforts resulted in 2,490 breast screenings and 1,106 cervical screenings, setting a powerful benchmark for Rotary Service Week.

The project was further strengthened by dedicated individual hosts and coordinators who ensured local arrangements, logistics, mobilization, and on-ground support. This initiative became a profound journey of learning and enrichment for all involved..

Team Formation and Role Clarity

Comprising a dynamic team of 64 members, the initial challenge was to ensure every member clearly understood their respective roles and responsibilities. The team was structured into two layers: administrators and project executors. It was imperative that both groups developed a well-defined plan of action to drive the project forward.

Zonal Organisation and Strategic Direction

The organisational structure was further divided across zones, with each zone containing three club groups, making a total of fifteen groups. Achieving clarity and unity of purpose across these groups was crucial for the success of the Rotary Service Week.

Leadership and Communication

DG Dr Manish consistently emphasised the significance of the Rotary Service Week at every installation ceremony, highlighting its importance to both himself and the District. He clearly conveyed the importance of teamwork to all club presidents, prompting them to reserve RSW week and prepare for special activities.

Initiating Collaboration

Fostering Collaboration and Navigating Communication Challenges

Reflecting on the early stages of the Rotary Service Week preparations, a distinct pattern emerged in team dynamics and inter-club collaboration. At the outset, there was a sense of scepticism among club presidents regarding the feasibility of working closely with other clubs. Each president, being a capable leader in their own right, carried the weighty responsibility of managing their respective clubs. This initial disbelief posed a challenge to establishing a collaborative spirit across the district.

To address this, Unnikrishnan and I took the initiative to organise zone-wise meetings for each RSW online activity. These meetings served as a platform for open dialogue and facilitated a gradual shift in mindset. As discussions progressed, participants began to appreciate the core objective of the Rotary Service Week: to magnify the collective impact and visibility of Rotary projects within the community by pooling resources and efforts.

Introducing the concept of

a 'lead club' led to some initial misunderstandings. Many members misconstrued the role, assuming that the designated lead club would be solely responsible for bearing all expenses associated with the projects. Despite this misconception, several clubs willingly volunteered to take on the lead role, demonstrating a willingness to step forward for the greater good.

Communication between lead clubs and participating clubs presented its own set of challenges. There was confusion over who should initiate contact—lead clubs expected other clubs to reach out, while the participating clubs held the opposite expectation. This ambiguity required time and repeated engagement to resolve, but it ultimately paved the way for clearer communication channels.

Frequent and, at times, complex meetings were held with zonal chairs, project heads, and their respective teams, particularly due to technical considerations. Club presidents played a pivotal role in communicating the Rotary Service Week's objectives and budgetary requirements to their Boards and members, while simultaneously encouraging the formation of inter-club partnerships.

The zonal chairs—Chetan

Kotak, Pushpa Suryamurthy, Shashank Thakare, Shelda Choudhary, and Dilip Shah—were instrumental in coordinating these regular meetings. Their efforts with their co-chairs, ensured that, over time, club groups took ownership of the process, with meetings becoming increasingly self-driven. Project heads continued to keep all groups updated on preparation status and the availability of technical support, thus maintaining momentum and fostering a collaborative environment throughout the preparatory phase.

Key Observations and Emerging Synergies

During the course of the RSW preparations and implementation, several important and noteworthy observations came to light. As the clubs began to build connections with each other, there was a visible transformation in the way they operated. Rather than functioning as individual entities, the clubs evolved into a proactive and cohesive team, working together towards shared objectives.

One of the significant developments was the manner in which resource constraints were addressed. In cases where developing clubs faced budgetary limitations, the larger and

more established clubs stepped in to provide support, acting as a guiding force and helping to alleviate financial pressures. This 'big brother' approach fostered a sense of unity and collaboration, ensuring that all clubs could participate effectively.

The collective enthusiasm among members saw a remarkable surge, particularly in the final two weeks leading up to the RSW. This heightened excitement translated into energetic participation and a strong drive to achieve the goals set forth for the event.

It was also observed that many clubs possessed the necessary resources and expertise to independently organise their own eye-care and cancer screening teams. This self-sufficiency contributed greatly to the overall impact and reach of the initiative.

Furthermore, the involvement of strategic partners played a pivotal role in expanding the scope of services provided. Notably, the SSO Oncospecialty collaborated with District 3141, bringing their team of doctors to conduct cervical cancer screening camps. Such partnerships significantly enhanced the effectiveness and depth of the projects undertaken during the RSW. The Rotaract club of Mediacrew came in and got trained for

the Breast I-Scan.

Project heads Dr Haresh Asnani, PP Sunil Mehta, Shruti Dharamsi, Yogesh Zaveri, Pushpa Suryamurthy, Kala Sridhar, Nargis Gaur, and Tehmina Khandwala all made significant contributions.

Overcoming Unexpected Challenges and Celebrating Surprises

Throughout the course of preparations, the journey was not without its share of unexpected developments. There were occasions when permissions from authorities, which were crucial for the smooth conduct of activities, were denied at the last minute. At times, venues that had been finalised were suddenly cancelled, and access to schools and colleges was not always granted as anticipated.

Despite these setbacks, the resilience and unity of the clubs shone through. Each obstacle gave rise to inventive solutions—better venues were identified and arranged, and collaborative brainstorming among clubs led to even more effective outcomes. The spirit of camaraderie was evident as clubs readily supported one another in moments of need, ensuring that the momentum never faltered.

Amidst these challenges, there were also moments of great delight. One such highlight was the unexpected visit of RI President Francesco Arrezo during the RSW, which served as a tremendous morale booster for all involved. Time and again, clubs came together to rescue each other, turning potential setbacks into opportunities for strengthened partnerships and shared success.

Visiting projects across the district was exhilarating. We felt fulfilled when DG Dr Manish Motwani said the RSW exceeded his expectations.

We express our sincere gratitude to DG Dr Manish Motwani for this enriching opportunity to connect with Rotarians of our district and serve our communities through RSW.

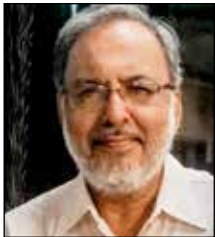
