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
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CARE, COMPASSION AND SERVICE

SAMANVAY DISCON: THE MAKING OF A MILESTONE IN COLLABORATION

The recently concluded joint conference of Rotary Districts [3141 & 3142] was a resounding success, bringing together Rotarians from diverse backgrounds to exchange ideas, strengthen partnerships, and celebrate the impact of Rotary's service projects. The event was attended by over 1,700 Rotarians, community leaders, and distinguished quests.

In December 2023, just before the International Assembly in Orlando, US, District Governors Chetan Desai (3141) and Dinesh Mehta (3142) embarked on a short trip to the United States with their families. During this time, they had the opportunity to connect on a deeper level and discussed the idea of organising a joint District Conference on a grand scale.

Recognising the need for an exceptional venue, the only location that came to mind was the prestigious Jio World Convention Centre at BKC, a setting befitting their vision for Discon 2025. Even while they were still in the US, the DGs shared this idea with their Discon Core Teams, sparking enthusiasm and excitement.

On 27 December 2023, the first joint meeting of both district teams was held in Thane. The proposal for a joint conference was met with great enthusiasm, and the



teams began brainstorming various aspects of the event.

A crucial step in the preparation was selecting a name that would encapsulate the essence of unity and collaboration. The team deliberated on several potential names, including:

Sammelan, Sanyojan, Milaap, Drishti, Udaan, Synergy, Confluence

After much discussion, a unanimous decision was made to name the conference "Samanvay", symbolising harmony, coordination, and synergy between the two districts.

To ensure the seamless execution of this grand event, several strategic meetings were held at Fountain Hotel, Ghodbunder Road, a central location for both districts. These meetings served as a platform for in-depth discussions, meticulous planning, and the delegation of responsibilities. Various teams were formed to manage different aspects of the conference, ensuring that all elements were handled with precision and expertise.

The conference featured an inspiring lineup of keynote speakers who shared insights on leadership, innovation, and service. In addition to self-development, the event provided valuable opportunities for networking and fellowship.

The District Governors expressed their gratitude to all participants, sponsors, and volunteers who contributed to the conference's success. They emphasised the importance of such joint initiatives in fostering unity and amplifying Rotary's impact worldwide.

As the conference concluded, attendees departed with renewed enthusiasm and a shared commitment to driving positive change. Plans for future collaborations and initiatives were set in motion, ensuring that the spirit of service and camaraderie continues to thrive.

The esteemed speakers from varied walks of life at the Rotary District Conference SAMANVAY brought a wealth of insight, offering diverse perspectives that enriched discussions and deepened learning. Here are the key takeaways from their thought-provoking articulations, which enabled a dynamic exchange of ideas and inspiration.











RIPR Sangkoo Yun's Welcome Address on Day 1

- Acknowledged the harmony and collaboration between Districts 3141 and 3142.
- Highlighted the impact of AI and digital transformation on society and Rotary.
- Membership Strategy: Encouraged participation in service first, followed by an invitation to join Rotary.
- Lessons from LEGO's Transformation: Emphasized that asking the right questions leads to meaningful change, suggesting Rotary should adapt similarly.
- Proposed evolving Rotary into a "one-stop service platform" akin to Google or Amazon for volunteerism.
- Engaging Youth through Gamification: Recommended introducing a service-based credit system to attract young people.
- Rotary's Key Achievements:
 - ✓ Endowment Fund Growth: \$15M raised in four months.
 - Polio Eradication: Emergency funds allocated for Gaza vaccinations.
 - Rotaract Integration: Increased involvement in leadership roles and funding contributions.
 - Women in Rotary: Targeting 30% representation, currently at 26%, with Egypt leading at 53%.

Large-Scale Impact Projects:

- \$30M disease prevention initiative in Africa in collaboration with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.
- Emphasized empathy, compassion, and commitment to making the world a better place.



RIPN Sangkoo Yun's Keynote Address on Day 2



Rotary International President Nominee (RIPN) Sangkoo Yun expressed gratitude and highlighted the following key points:

- Extended heartfelt thanks to Arch Klumph Society members, major donors, and others for their consistent contributions to The Rotary Foundation (TRF).
- Emphasized the nobility of donating to unknown individuals in dire need, noting that such generosity fosters hope and transforms lives globally.
- Highlighted how donations create positive change in beneficiaries' lives, contributing to a more peaceful world.
- Described TRF as a "temple of service" built by thousands of Rotarians, distinguishing it from foundations established by wealthy individuals or corporations.
- Noted that TRF has received the highest 4-star rating from Charity Navigator for 15 consecutive years, underscoring its credibility and transparency.
- Announced a \$100 million donation from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to TRF, reflecting trust in Rotary's effectiveness.
- Stressed the need for continued vigilance in eradicating polio, urging Rotarians to persist until the disease is fully eliminated.
- Encouraged members to sustain their acts of generosity, creating ripples of hope for billions in despair, and solidifying their roles as champions and inspirational leaders.

PRIP K. Ravindran's Interview with RID Raju Subramanian

- Emphasized the power of collective leadership, visionaries, and changemakers.
- Fromoted unity through the motto "Together we can, together we will," aiming to establish vibrant and irresistible clubs.
- - Six new clubs formed.
 - ✓ Net growth of 750+ members, totaling 6,697.
- □ Rotary District 3141 Impact:
 - 3,463 projects executed.
 - ▼936.73 crore in initiatives.
 - √ 1.24 million+ beneficiaries impacted.
- Global Recognition: Symbiosis Pune selected as a Rotary Peace Centre (2027).
- Call to Action: Encouraged keeping Rotary vibrant, impactful, and a force for change.

DG Dinesh Mehta expressed deep pride in Rotary's transformative work, emphasizing that these initiatives have been his most valuable learning experience as District Governor.

Major Initiatives:

- 1. Construction of 50 check dams, with half of the funding from Rotary International. These will impact 1,350 acres of land, enabling farmers to cultivate a second crop annually and increase their income by ₹15,000 per acre per year.
- 2. District 3142's involvement in India's first sanctioned Scale Grant program, amplifying project impact.
- 3. Awareness and Training Initiatives:
 - Over 25,000 citizens benefited from awareness programs on drug and mobile addiction and good touch/bad touch education.
- 4. Rotary Knowledge Enhancement Faculty Centre in Thane:
 - Features a 200-seat auditorium, boardroom, and upcoming skill development programs.

PRIP K. Ravindran underscored ethical leadership, financial integrity, and independent decision-making, demonstrating how Rotary can function with corporate efficiency while staying true to its mission of service.

Key Insights:

- 1. Family comes first, then business, and Rotary third.
- 2. Integrity is crucial; misusing Rotary funds equates to stealing from a sacred source.
- 3. Strong leadership and governance are essential; tough decisions must be made as RI President.
- 4. Crisis Management: Negotiated a ceasefire during Sri Lanka's civil war to facilitate polio vaccinations.
- 5. Advocated for transparency through secret voting in the RI Board, allowing directors to freely oppose the President's decisions.
- 6. Emphasized financial discipline and operational efficiency in Rotary...









Piyush Shah - District 3141 Coordinator for Youth

Emphasized the Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE) program's significance in fostering young leaders and promoting global peace.

Key Highlights:

- RYE is a three-year commitment for Rotary clubs, estimated to cost \$7,000 to \$10,000.
- The program builds global partnerships, leading to opportunities for mega projects and global grants.
- Non-Rotarian children can participate, offering a potential avenue for membership growth.
- Rotary International President-Elect Mario was once an exchange student, highlighting the program's leadership impact.
- The goal is to host 30-35 students annually, surpassing previous benchmarks and expanding RYE participation.



Sandeep Kedia – District Membership Committee

- Highlighted District 3141's membership growth from 5,834 members on July 1, 2024, to 6,586 by February 28, 2025.
- Attributed success to the dedicated efforts of club presidents and the establishment of six new clubs.
- Stressed the importance of engaging, encouraging, and valuing new members' ideas for retention.
- Emphasized that retaining members is crucial for achieving Rotary's "Service Above Self" goal.



Nikita Sunil, DRR 3141

Rotaract 3141 Overview:

- 21 clubs, 3,324 Rotaractors, including 56 Community & 65 Institution-Based Clubs.
- sign 3,602 projects executed, 947 meetings held, and ₹360 lakh INR worth of impact.
- 51 district projects, 218+ sponsorships secured from major brands.
- Represented at multiple Rotaract & Rotary Institutes across India.



Nisha Raju, DRR 3142


Rotaract 3142 Initiatives:

S. Rajendran, MD & CEO, 63 Moons Technologies Ltd.

- The power of giving lies in selfless service, which transforms both the giver and the recipient.
- Anxiety arises from the disparity between expectations and reality; education should cultivate willpower alongside skills.
- Global challenges such as waste, pollution, and inequitable wealth distribution stem from a lack of self-control rather than limited resources.
- Strong family values promote generosity and emotional well-being, contributing to a more compassionate society.
- Rotarians serve as agents of transformation, inspiring change and uplifting communities through selfless service.

His address reinforced the company's commitment to revolutionising financial technology, cybersecurity, and legal tech, positioning India as a global intellectual property (IP) powerhouse.

Key Highlights:

- 1. 63 Moons has pioneered the development of intellectual property in technology, significantly contributing to employment and wealth
- 2. The company transformed India's securities trading in the 1990s by introducing Odin, a digital platform enabling nationwide market access.
- 3. Despite India's global recognition in IT, much of its contributions stem from outsourcing rather than homegrown IPs. 63 Moons seeks to change this by fostering domestic IP creation.
- 4. Three Key IP Innovations:
 - Qi Legal: A digital platform streamlining legal processes by integrating case research, documentation, and court proceedings.
 - Cybersecurity Solutions: A security product that prevents cyber threats by scanning messages, links, and documents before opening.
 - Web3 & Blockchain: Development of decentralised applications and blockchain frameworks to position India as a leader in nextgeneration internet technology.



ADDL DGP Mahesh Bhagwat

Recognised as a visionary defender, guardian of justice, and a beacon of integrity and innovation in law enforcement, he has been a crusader against human trafficking, organised crime, and cybercrime.

Award: Guardian of Humanity

Leveraging 25 years of policing experience, ADGP Bhagwat prioritised action and development in Naxal-affected regions of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. He fostered trust by ensuring access to clean water, functional schools, and healthcare services. This approach significantly reduced Naxal presence from 190 to 20, as villagers increasingly relied on government support. Additionally, he collaborated with governmental and non-governmental organisations to rehabilitate children of prostitutes through education, demonstrating a commitment to holistic community welfare.









Dr. Suresh K. Haware

Chairman, Haware Group; Former Chairman, Shree Saibaba Sansthan Trust; Nuclear Scientist; Distinguished Fellow, BARC; Global Excellence Laureate; PhD in Affordable Nano Housing.

Award: Divine Dedication and Temple Stewardship

Dr. Haware emphasised that while temple architecture and economics have evolved, temple management remains outdated. Key areas requiring improvement include queue management, prasad distribution, service efficiency, cleanliness, and disaster preparedness. Effective temple administration necessitates the integration of technology and transparency in donations, contracts, and financial management.



Kaustubh Amte, Anandwan Administrator & Social Worker

- Leprosy has existed for 3,500 years, yet no vaccine has been developed due to its non-impact on animals.
- Despite the bacterial cause being identified in 1873, leprosy patients continue to face social exclusion.
- Over 75 years, the foundation has assisted 3.5 million individuals, with cured patients contributing to infrastructure development, including college buildings.
- Anandwan aspires to become a healthcare hub within the next 25 years, offering hospitals, multispecialty care, and vocational training.



Hon. Mike Hankey, Consul General of the United States of America in Mumbai

- His Rotary exchange experience in India significantly influenced his diplomatic career, underscoring Rotary's contributions to global initiatives such as polio eradication.
- Economic, defence, and technological collaborations are being strengthened, with a target of \$500 billion in trade by 2030.
- India leads in U.S. student enrolments, highlighting the importance of legal migration and streamlined visa processes.
- Quad meetings prioritise security, technology, and economic growth for a stable Indo-Pacific region.



Mohinder Amarnath, Man of the Match (Final), Cricket World Cup 1983

- Born into a legendary cricketing family, he was influenced by his father and inspired by cricketing greats such as Imran Khan.
- Overcame setbacks, dismissed calls for retirement, and trained relentlessly to refine his skills.
- With Sunil Gavaskar's support, he managed pressure effectively and played a crucial role in India's historic World Cup victory.
- Advocated self-belief, resilience, and continuous learning as essential components of success.



Sandeep Singh, Former **Captain, Indian Hockey Team**

- Inspired by his brother, he pursued hockey, representing India by the age of 17 and receiving nominations for Youngest Player in 2004 and 2005.
- A gunshot injury in 2006 left him paralysed, but intensive rehabilitation in the Netherlands facilitated his triumphant comeback.
- He played a key role in India's 2012 Olympic qualification, set multiple records, and retired in 2017.
- His journey inspired a 2018 biographical film; later, as Haryana's Sports Minister, he reformed sports policies and received multiple accolades.



Smt. Bharati Thakur, Founder, N.A.R.M.A.D.A.

- Established N.A.R.M.A.D.A. after witnessing rural children's inability to read or write despite attending school.
- Initiated with 14 students in 2009, the organisation has since educated 1,800 children across 15 villages.
- Students receive both academic education and vocational training in furniture-making, plumbing, and classical music.
- Through the FabLab initiative, 9th and 10th-grade students teach engineering students advanced techniques such as laser cutting.



Yogacharva Saurabh Bothra. Founder of HaBuild

Holistic healer, wellness innovator, IIT BHU graduate, and Guinness World Record holder for the largest yoga session viewership.

Award: Champion of Holistic Wellness and Yogic Excellence

Renowned for his boundless energy, Saurabh Bothra emphasised the importance of integrating yoga into daily life. He advocated for developing consistent habits through attentive listening, perseverance, and resilience in overcoming challenges. He underscored the need to disregard sceptics and stay committed to the path of wellness.



Kaamya Karthikeyan, Youth **Mountain Ambassador, India**

- Mount Elbrus was climbed and skied down, and she became the youngest individual to summit Mount Aconcagua, Mount Denali, and other significant peaks.
- Rigorous training in Ladakh, Gulmarg, and the Sahyadris enhanced endurance and technical skills.
- Mount Everest was successfully summited following extensive preparation, overcoming harsh conditions and heavy traffic.
- During the Everest trek, school shoes were gifted to children in Khumjung, contributing to the local community.

Bharat Ghothoskar, Founder & Heritage Evangelist KHAKI

- The contributions of Rotary Clubs to society were acknowledged.
- Highlights of the trailer of the upcoming film were presented.
- Appreciation for the country was expressed.
- Gratitude was conveyed for all blessings, and an invitation was extended to watch the film.
- Insights were provided on the origins and legacy of Mumbai.
- Enthralling details regarding the islands of Mumbai were shared.
- The presence of Stone Age tools in the city, along with historical invasions and attacks, was highlighted.
- The spirit of unity, where individuals from diverse backgrounds collaborate, fostering public-private partnerships, was emphasised.

- The safety, honour, and welfare of the nation take precedence at all
- The profound guestion of what binds an individual to their homeland, compelling them to make supreme sacrifices, was explored.



Rtn Yana Mir, International **Expert & Senior Journalist.** First Female Vlogger of Kashmir. Senior Anchor. **Bharat Expression**



Ensure that the corporate partner receives the required paperwork from Rotary Foundation India (RFI), including:

- Verification of RFI as a compliant CSR partner
- Pre-MOU documentation for project approval
- Project execution and compliance paperwork

STEP 4: APPROACH & ENGAGE WITH **CORPORATES**

- Warm Introduction Ensure a strong initial connection so that the corporate is receptive to your approach.
- Research Corporate CSR Focus Areas - Understand their preferred CSR themes before proposing projects.
- Prepare Thoroughly Attend the meeting with key club and district leaders, ensuring a strong first impression. There is no second chance if the first meeting is unsuccessful.
- Structured Presentation -Prepare well-organized physical dossiers and digital materials in advance.
- Send a Well-Structured Proposal - Share a concise, impactful proposal immediately after the meeting.
- Showcase Rotary's Credibility & Success Stories - Include past CSR projects in post-meeting communication, as this may be reviewed by multiple corporate team members.

- Offer Project Customization - Align CSR objectives with corporate brand values and preferences.
- Appoint a Dedicated CSR Project Team - Once approved, assign a team for follow-ups, paperwork, execution, and corporate engagement. Provide corporate partners with a clear point of contact for smooth communication.
- Relationship Building & Follow-Up - Maintain consistent engagement, providing regular impact reports and updates.
- Corporate Testimonials & Visibility - Obtain testimonials from corporate partners and share them on club social media and in CSR reports. Keep corporates informed about other successful projects to encourage long-term collaboration.

EFORE coming to India I was living in a very small village in Germany. This type of village where everyone knows everyone and the greatest social event is the yearly local flea market... Only two months after saying goodbye to my family and friends at the airport I was sitting with a French girl, our Indian college friend and her family in their apartment around an open fire, celebrating the glory of Lord Ganesha. Which seemed spiritual and peaceful in the beginning, evolved in an unique memory, as the room was fastly filling up with smoke. Our eyes started turning red -moreover tearing. After we started coughing, we all ended up leaving the apartment.

Hello! Mera naam Malena hai. As I already mentioned, I am coming from Germany and have spend 6

months so far living in India.

This was my first time witnessing Hawan Puja for the Ganesh Chaturthi Festival. Since then, my eyes have become a little more robust and I was luckily able to attend loads more of Indian festivals, such as Navratri, Diwali, as well as, just recently, Makar Sankranti. When I asked him, my first host dad used to explain, that "Indians will find a reason for celebrating -they just love it so much." From my point of view this is truly beautiful: Gathering with family and friends, playing music, dancing, praying together, eating the most delicious food, wearing breathtaking clothes. This perfectly describes my perception of Indian people. Their hospitality, warmth and joy. In every single host family I have stayed in, I didn't feel like a

guest, but a real part of the family (just for illustrating this thought: it is already planned, that I'm going to come back to India in 2033 for my mom's 50th birthday)...

Before coming here, my Rotary District in Germany was teaching us future Inbounds on the monthly Orientations how to say "yes and no". This might seem banal, but its meaning is firstly to not miss out on a single activity, moreover opportunity, secondly, to listen to yourself. Where are my boundaries? What is too much for me?

Coming from a quiet life in Germany, Mumbai felt mesmerizing and fabulous at first -seeing the city with its whole lights and glory, but also very overwhelming. I wanted to stay in my room the









whole day and sleep. The learning of "yes and no" helped me to get out of my comfort zone, out of my bubble and to put myself out there.

Ultimately, the vibe of Mumbai is unique and multifaceted. It's a city that can be both exhilarating and exhausting, inspiring and overwhelming. It's a place where dreams are made and challenges are faced head-on. Thanks to the Rotary Youth Exchange Program I wasn't only able to learn more about this diverse, extraordinary country, but also about myself: What do I want from my life? What else is there to experience and to learn beyond what I've dreamed of? Life is way too exciting and short to spend it sleeping in your room. Only because of listening to this advice over and over again, India became my second home. BANGANGA

A Sacred Heritage at the Crossroads of History and Progress



ANGANGA, a heritage site nestled in the heart of Mumbai, is a remarkable destination that offers a unique glimpse into the city's ancient past. Recently, the District heritage team of the Rotary Club, led by Kalpana, organized a walk around this sacred site. It offered participants a journey through the physical location and a walk down memory lane. A professional guide shared captivating stories about the temple's historical significance, the rich culture of the area, and how Banganga has long been a haven of peace and spirituality amidst the bustling city.

Banganga, part of the Walkeshwar Temple Complex in Malabar Hill, dates to the 12th century. According to legend, it was here that Lord Ram stopped during his exile to search for water for his thirsty brother, Lakshman, resulting in the creation of the sacred tank. Surrounded by a collection of small temples dedicated to deities such as Shiva, Balaji, Laxmi Narayan, Vithoba, and Hanuman, Banganga is still fed by freshwater springs that also supply the adjacent dhobi ghat. Despite the site's state of neglect, it continues to radiate an aura of spirituality and stands as a testament to Mumbai's rich heritage.

However, the site is facing modernday challenges. Urbanization and encroachment threaten to overshadow its historical and cultural essence. Preservation concerns have arisen, with fears that rapid development may compromise the delicate balance between history and progress. As





Banganga is a reminder that, amid the rush of progress, we must cherish and safeguard the pieces of history that shape our city's identity. The heritage walk, complete with a South Indian breakfast, offered both a deep appreciation of the site and a call to action to preserve its legacy for future generations.
