GYAN PRAKASH- Free Coaching Classes for the underprivileged.

Our Mission is to Transform the Lives of children and their Families Living in poverty by providing access to quality education. Under this mission of literacy, Rotary Club of Borivli, has started this initiative of providing free coaching to students of std 9th and 10th since last ten years and benefitted 4000+ students. The purpose of starting this program was to provide access to students of Std. 9th/10th appearing for their Boards exams & could not afford costly coaching fees and yet be in competition with their counterparts. In the academic year 2023-24, around 700 students took benefit at 15 different centers. These centers are spread between Dahisar to Kandivali, East and West areas.

Qualified Teachers are appointed to take classes in Maths, Science, English, Hindi and Marathi subjects. The school principals and parents are satisfied as there is an average increase of 10-15% in students performance at Boards exams. There are students securing marks above 85% - 90%.

Seminars on time management, career counselling, etc. are arranged. Medical check up camps to keep them hail and hearty for their exams are arranged. Picnics and birthday celebrations make them joyful during the year.

This program is carried out in fond memory of our past president, under "RAJENDRA KINARIWALA MEMORIAL ROTARY BORIVLI EDUCATION" banner. Working together we invest in the lives of the children & youth, build healthy environment they need to thrive & empower them to create lasting change in their own lives and communities. Gyan Prakash is achieving milestones each year in this mammoth endeavor.

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#### Spreading Smiles, HOPE AND IMPACT: RID 3141'S TRANSFORMATIVE INITIATIVES ON CHILDREN'S DAY

#### A New Chapter for ADAPT: Rotary's Commitment to Empowerment

The Rotary Clubs of Marine Drive Mumbai and Mumbai Downtown Sealand have proudly unveiled the renovation of ADAPT's Upper Colaba Centre Building, a transformative initiative for this iconic institution (formerly known as the Spastic Society of India).

This landmark project was inaugurated by DG Chetan Desai, marking a significant milestone in the journey of creating a more inclusive and supportive environment for individuals with special needs. The comprehensive renovation of the building's exteriors was accomplished under a CSR grant of approximately ₹18 lakhs from a corporate donor, complemented by an



additional ₹2 lakhs contributed by Rotary. This collaborative effort was led with vision and dedication by Rtn. President Arvind Katakdhond of Rotary Club of Marine Drive Mumbai and Rtn. President Dr. Arun Sawant of Rotary Club of Mumbai Downtown

#### Sealand.

This revitalization not only enhances the centre's physical infrastructure but also reinforces Rotary's unwavering commitment to making a difference in the lives of those who need it most.

## Empowering Through Health: Detection Camps in Tribal Schools of Palghar District

In Palghar district, where genetically transmitted anaemias such as Thalassemia and Sickle Cell Anaemia are prevalent, Rotary District 3141 took the lead in addressing this pressing health challenge. Under the focus area of Maternal and Child Health, the district organized detection camps for students in grades 8 to 10 across tribal schools.

The camps aim to screen around 23,000 students, identifying and managing conditions early to ensure proper care. Additionally, follow-up counseling for children, their families, and teachers will play a crucial

role in preventing the birth of children with severe disorders.

"Children and adults with Thalassemia or Sickle Cell Anaemia traits require different treatments than those with nutritional anaemia. Early detection is not just about treatment; it's about prevention and awareness," said Dr. Nilima Inamdar, Avenue Chair for Anaemia and Blood Donation.

The cost per child for testing is ₹160, and Rotary Clubs have appealed to sponsors to adopt children for testing to support this impactful initiative.

## Breaking Taboos: Menstrual Hygiene Awareness-Masik Chakra



Rotary Club of Bombay Powai in collaboration with Rotary Club of Mumbai Ghatkopar West and Rotary Club of Nariman Point, conducted a session on Masik Chakra-Period Awareness and Menstrual Hygiene Management at Green Lawns English High School.

The two-hour session engaged 100 girl students through an informative video, an interactive Q&A session led by RCB Powai President Rtn. Shruti, and the distribution of educational comic books Menstrupedia and chocolates, sponsored by RCB Powai. Additionally, 100 cramp relief pads, sponsored by RC Nariman Point, were distributed.

This impactful initiative, led by President & project head Rtn. Shruti with passion and enthusiasm, emphasized the importance of menstrual health, empowering young girls with knowledge and resources for better hygiene management.

#### Digital Learning Through Mobile App Distribution

Rotary Club of Mumbai North Island advanced its mission of fostering education through technology by distributing Educational Mobile Apps to students in two schools.

At Gandhigram School, Vile Parle, 80 students received the app in a program attended by the Club President, Secretary, and Literacy Director, Rtn. Suhas Ambiye. Following this, 40 students at Vidyanidhi School, Juhu, were also empowered with the digital resource.

This initiative aims to enhance learning experiences, providing students with access to modern educational tools and supporting their academic progress.









#### Harbor of Heroes – A Naval Tale

Children's Day took on a unique and inspiring dimension this year with multiple Rotary Clubs organizing visits to the Naval Air Station, Colaba, for students to witness a special Static Air Display. The district event, coordinated with the Indian Navy by Rtn. Arun Garg, provided students with an unforgettable opportunity to understand the Navy's pivotal role in national security and life-saving operations.

At the Naval Base, the day began with a video presentation highlighting the Navy's heroic missions and the crucial role of its aircraft in rescue and relief operations. Students were then introduced to the Chetak helicopter and two other advanced aircraft, with detailed explanations of their life-saving and operational capabilities. The hands-on exposure gave children a glimpse of the Navy's technical expertise and discipline, transforming abstract ideas of naval life into tangible realities.

Rotary Club Bombay Uptown arranged the visit for school children's offering a thrilling introduction to the Navy's operations Led by President Rtn. Suman Agarwal.

HE Rotary Club of Bombay Juhu Beach (RCBJB) is proud to announce a remarkable milestone in its ongoing commitment to sustainable development and community empowerment. The club has been selected as a key distribution partner for an inspiring event co-hosted by Porsche, Liter

of Light's India chapter, and Power Pack.

On October 30, 2024, the historic Gateway of India became the backdrop for a stunning art installation titled "Field of Dreams: A Pathway to a Brighter Future." This installation, which has been officially recognized

by the Guinness World Records, featured an extraordinary display of solar-powered flower lamps. The lamps served as a powerful symbol of hope, innovation, and the transformative potential of renewable energy in creating a brighter future.

Building on this momentum, the









Rotary Club of Bombay Juhu Beach took a significant step forward by hosting a hands-on workshop on October 15, 2024, focused on the assembly of solar study lamps. ### UNVEILING THE VALE OF KASHMIR

For centuries, India was home to great Sanskrit scholars, with the banks of the Vitasta (Jhelum) and Sindhu (Indus) nurturing some of its most eloquent teachers. Many of the greatest Sanskrit poets were born in and wrote from this valley. Indian philosophy, rooted in the Vedas, finds its origins in this very land.

### Here are just a few notable contributors:

- Panini: Known as the "Father of Modern Grammar and Sanskrit."
- Patanjali: Author of the Mahabhasya, an important commentary on Panini's Ashtadhyayi, and the Yoga Sutras.
- Charaka: Renowned author of the Charaka Samhita, a foundational text in Ayurveda.
- Abhinavagupta: Philosopher and scholar of aesthetics and

Kashmir Shaivism.

- Vasugupta: Composer of the Shiva Sutras.
- Kshemaraja: A philosopher and commentator on Shaivism.
- Anandavardhana: Poet and theorist known for the Dhvanyaloka.

And there are countless more.

Kashmir's monumental contribution to the world has been overshadowed by dominant narratives. Today, when the world seeks peace and tranquility, it is ironic that the Indian concept of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam—the universal brotherhood—has been excluded or diluted in global discourse.

Not many are aware of the *Gardez Ganesha*, a historic statue found 40 kilometers from Kabul, or the *Bamiyan Buddhas*, magnificent symbols of shared heritage, destroyed in Afghanistan. Similarly, while students worldwide recognize the Hindu Kush mountain range as a geographical landmark separating Afghanistan and Pakistan, few know that ancient Sanskrit literature referred to it as *Uparisena*, meaning "mountains beyond the reach of eagles."

The term "Hindu Kush" itself is a tragic misnomer, meaning "Hindu killer." It reflects the harsh





reality that countless prisoners of war perished in its unforgiving conditions while being marched to Afghanistan by invading forces.

The Sharada Peeth, once a thriving university and knowledge center on the banks of the Kishanganga River (now in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir), is another forgotten gem. It had its own script, the Sharada, which belonged to the Brahmic family of scripts. Inscriptions in this script can even be seen on the Gardez Ganesha.

Taxila, another ancient university that flourished around 1000 BCE. was regarded as the benchmark for education in its timecomparable to today's Harvard and Oxford.

Even the Kalash people, residing in the Chitral District of northern Pakistan in the Hindu Kush mountains, maintain a religion strikingly similar to the historical Vedic tradition.

Over 2,000 towns and villages in Kashmir have had their Sanskrit names replaced, symbolizing a systematic erosion of cultural identity. This is a case of cultural disintegration and the imposition of a universal narrative.

Kashmir is a land of complexity, steeped in dichotomies and contradictions. The Vedas and Upavedas are believed to have originated here, and as Kalhana, an ancient historian, observed, it was the "gateway of knowledge to the world." Once acknowledged as such, it is now largely forgotten.

Kashmir-Kashyap-Mir (the land of Rishi Kashyapa)-deserves understanding, not erasure.

The iconic Paisley design is yet another testamen to the creation of a universal a signature motif found in nearly all Kashmiri shawls, particularly the exquisite and luxurious

Jamawar shawls, which were historically exported to part of a flourishing cottage industry, these shawls were meticulously handcrafted. However, with the advent of mechanized looms, England began producing these shawls mechanically, faster and at lower costs.

This shift dealt a devastating blow to the renowned Jamawar artisans, whose craft industry collapsed nearly 90 years ago and has never fully recovered. The name of the English town where these mechanically produced became synonymous with the design. Today, the pattern is universally recognized by this English town's name, rather than its true origin.

The design itself is inspired by the meandering course of the river Vitasta (Jhelum), its shape resembling a mango and its seed. In Kashmir, it is still known as कायिरू (Kairu), कूइरी (Kuiri), or कोय (Koi). Sadly, this connection has faded elsewhere, leaving its original identity largely

### THE CHALLENGE TO SURVIVE

HE hardfought elections for the 15th Maharashtra Assembly has seen the decimation of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA), whose constituents do not have the singular strength to sit on the chair of the Leader of the Opposition. This will see a hard pitched political tussle between MVA constituents, Congress Party, NCP (SP) and the Shiv Sena (UBT) to occupy that position.

The decimation of the Opposition parties has also put in line the political survival of the Raj Thackeray led Maharashtra Navnirvan Sena (MNS) and the Shiv Sena faction headed by Uddhav Thackeray, a former chief minister. Either the warring cousins Uddhav and Raj Thackeray join hands to give a thrust to their political survival or face the certainty of fragmentation. For both the Thackerays, the results of the 2024 Maharashtra Assembly polls, come as a shocker because they were heavily invested in positive results for revival and survival.

Since the shocker, the best way out may be to join their combined forces to stay relevant.



Furthermore, given the political aspirations of the partymen of the Sharad Pawar led NCP faction as well as the Congress Party it will be a daunting task to keep their MLAs within the boundaries of their parties. In the days since the election results declared on November 23, there is talk of some MLAs from the constituent parties of the MVA already dialling those who matter in the BJP, Shiv Sena (Eknath Shinde faction) and NCP (Ajit Pawar).

Political analysts predict that there could be sizeable movement from the MVA to the Mahayuti (BJP, SS (Eknath Shinde), NCP (Ajit Pawar).

The high-pitched campaign across Maharashtra by both the Mahayuti and the MVA saw the eyes of India watching this State. Though perceived to give both the ruling combine as well as the opposition parties a close race to the finish, the results shocked everyone.

From the results it has emerged that the reelected Parag Shah,
from the Ghatkopar
East constituency, is the richest MLA in the 15th
Maharashtra Assembly.
The average asserts of the newly elected MLAs in 2024 are ₹43.42 crores, which is nearly double the average of ₹22.42 crores in 2019. The number of "crorepati" MLAs has risen with five legislators

declaring assets exceeding ₹100 crores.

Politically, it will be interesting to watch events unfold in Maharashtra in the coming days, for post-election results when all analysts failed in their predictions, few are willing to lay wagers on the next chief minister.

It will also signal a long haul to survival for those who lost the elections.
