Flagship Project of Rotary Club of Borivli

To bring back vision in the corneally blind people, Rotary Club of Borivli started its own eye bank, in the year 2007-08 under the Global grant project. So far we have been able to inoculate nearly 2500 eyes, of which approximately 50% of corneas have been given for the cornea implant surgeries and visions of those beneficiaries have been restored.

We wish to thank DG Chetan Desai; with whose efforts it has become possible to carry out 100 corneal transplant absolutely free. With the forward vision of present eye bank Chairman Rtn. Mayank Desai, TEJOMAY project is also underway, where eye check up camps are carried out at blind girls school / organizations, whereby potential corneal blindness candidates, if any, can be detected and operated upon, so that the beneficiary can lead normal life.

The idea came to life through the vision and persistent efforts of Rtn. Hemang Vora. We must take a moment to recognize the remarkable efforts of PP Vijay Palkar in the early years of securing corneas, along with the invaluable guidance of Rtn. Dr. Hitesh Chheda.

Ours is the only Eye bank having Processing Center in Mumbai after KEM Hospital. Our eye Bank is conceived, built and managed by Rotarians of Borivli Club.

Friends, here is an opportunity to bring light in the life of Corneally blind people and their families. So please join in spreading awareness about eye donation.





HE Rotary Magical Miles Car Drive, held from January 13th to 18th, 2025, was a captivating blend of fellowship, service, and adventure. Spanning four states and five districts, this vision was initially conceived by Rtn. Shruti Dharamsi, President of RCM Ghatkopar West, a year ago, came to life with the participation of 74 cars and representatives from five Rotary districts - 3131, 3141, 3142, 3055, and 3060. The drive became a memorable journey that combined impact, culture, and camaraderie.

DG Chetan Desai, who joined for the entire journey, was accompanied by DG Sheetal Shah from District 3131, who travelled from Pune for the flag-off. DG Tushar Shah expertly coordinated the Surat leg of the trip, and **DG** Mohan Parashar's influence was evident in Ahmedabad, where 54 cars participated in a grand roadshow. We were honoured to

have Guiarat's Education Minister Praful Panshariya, as Chief guest at Magical Miles during our event in Surat.

THE ROUTE AND **PREPARATIONS:**

The journey spanned Mumbai -Surat - Vadodara - Gandhidham -Bhuj - Dholavira - Ahmedabad and back to Mumbai. Meticulously planned through three logistics recce trips, the drive ensured smooth coordination and safety, supported by real-time tracking via Life360.

INSPIRING GENEROSITY: A JOURNEY WITH THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

The Rotary Foundation (TRF) has been a beacon of hope and change for communities worldwide. Its programmes have touched millions of lives, addressing critical global challenges. In this inspiring interview with AKS RID Raju Subramanian, we delve into the thoughts and experiences of this distinguished Rotary leader, exploring the profound impact of TRF, the significance of giving back, and the role of philanthropy in transforming lives.









VIBE-X: What inspired you to support The Rotary Foundation so generously?

RID RAJU: As DGE, we had a meeting with Bill Gates. When asked why he supports the Rotary Foundation when he has his own Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, he said, "Your foundation is a foundation of trust," with a minimum administrative cost of less than 8%, with most of the funds being spent to ensure support to the beneficiary. This was my inspiration to support TRF.

VIBE-X: As a Rotary International Director, how have you seen TRF contributions making a difference in communities?

RID RAJU: Without a doubt. no other organisation has a programme like TRF with matching and support. Whether it be supporting schools in Sri Lanka, paediatric surgeries in India, cataract surgeries in Africa, building houses in Haiti-there are examples that can fill pages where millions of people have benefitted from the Foundation. Not forgetting the eradication of polio worldwide, malaria in Zambia, and tuberculosis in India. Large vision with great impact has been the forte of TRF.

VIBE-X: In which ways does
The Rotary Foundation stand
out among global charities and
philanthropic organisations?
RID RAJU: Sixteen years of
recognition by Charity Navigator
is an unprecedented recognition.
Hardly any other organisation
would have been recognised with
such consistency and continuity.
TRF has been responsible in
multiple ways, through our seven
areas of focus, in changing
lives and making a difference to

communities and even nations around the world. Millions of lives have been touched, saved, and benefitted by the programmes of TRF.

VIBE-X: Does a particular fund of the Foundation hold a special meaning for you, and why? RID RAJU: Each fund has a distinct and special purpose. To choose any one fund would be doing injustice to the others. To name just a few:

- APF, as it helps districts for global grants and district grants.
- Endowment, for building the future with a long-term purpose and vision.
- Polio, until it is eradicated, fulfilling our promise to the children of the world that no child will ever be crippled by the deadly polio virus.

VIBE-X: Is there a beneficiary story of a TRF-funded project that has touched your heart?

RID RAJU: There are so many to talk about, but paediatric heart surgeries have a special fondness for me. Saving the life of a child 18 days old, with just a few days of life left, and seeing the sweet smile is indeed fulfilling, bringing tears to my eyes. The joy on the faces of the parents, who had given up hope, is indescribable.

VIBE-X: In your view, what is the role of individual philanthropy in addressing global challenges? RID RAJU: Every contribution, however small, has a significant role to play in addressing global challenges. In fact, small contributions, from USD 1 to USD 999, make up 40% of the total contributions to the Foundation.

Drops of water make the ocean.

VIBE-X: How has being a donor to The Rotary Foundation enriched your life?

RID RAJU: It has given me a purpose in life and given my wife and me a great sense of satisfaction and fulfilment.

The best charity, as said in our scriptures, is where neither the donor knows who the beneficiary is nor does the beneficiary know who the donor is.

VIBE-X: What message would you like to share with Rotarians worldwide about the importance of giving back?

RID RAJU: My strong belief is that the duty of every Rotarian is to contribute to the Foundation every year—not only when one holds office but also thereafter. The amount is not significant; it can be according to one's means. It is irrelevant whether a friend or foe is in office, as our contribution is for our Foundation. Riding on others' contributions for self-promotion is indeed sad and unfortunate, more so when one does not support the Foundation every year without a break.

I would emphasise that we must continue to contribute to the Polio Fund until the world is declared polio-free.

We need to give back, as it is our Foundation, and the only source is our contribution. We are in Rotary not to take but to give, and it is essential for each of us to support the Foundation so we can continue, through global grants, to undertake big, bold, and impactful projects.

Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) has transcended its initial definition as a charitable obligation, becoming an essential pillar of sustainable and ethical business practices, especially for midsized and large corporations. As Rotarians, we must understand how corporates can maximize their CSR impact while fostering a culture of employee involvement. Here's how corporates can engage their workforce in CSR initiatives and leverage these activities to amplify their impact on society, with examples of successful programs.

THE ROLE OF EMPLOYEE **ENGAGEMENT IN CSR**

Employee engagement in CSR initiatives creates a purpose-driven work environment, increases morale, and aligns employees with the organization's values. By integrating CSR into critical corporate functions, companies can meaningfully involve their workforce:

MARKETING-LED CSR **CAMPAIGNS**

Marketing teams can mobilize employees as advocates for cause-driven campaigns. For example, sustainability drives,

health awareness programs, or community events can engage employees as ambassadors. Hindustan Unilever's Lifebuoy campaign not only promoted hygiene in underserved areas but also actively involved employees in outreach activities, making them proud contributors to societal wellbeing.

PUBLIC RELATIONS (PR) ENGAGEMENT

PR departments can involve employees in community-focused programs and highlight their contributions in newsletters, blogs, and media coverage. Google's GoogleServe initiative encourages employees to volunteer for causes they care about, which are then featured in their CSR reports and public communication, fostering pride and recognition.

HR AS A CATALYST FOR CSR

Human Resources plays a pivotal role in embedding CSR into the company's culture. Activities such as team volunteering, CSRfocused onboarding programs, and recognition for CSR contributions motivate employees to participate actively. Deloitte's Impact Day is an example where employees dedicate their skills to local communities as part of their professional roles.

LEVERAGING CSR FOR **BROADER IMPACT**







Corporates can significantly enhance the scope of their CSR initiatives by adopting innovative strategies. The following examples illustrate how companies have successfully aligned CSR with their strategic goals:

COMMUNITY SKILL-BUILDING PROGRAMS

TCS's Bridge IT initiative trains rural youth in IT and digital skills, contributing to community development while building a skilled workforce.

CAUSE-DRIVEN PRODUCT CAMPAIGNS

Hindustan Unilever's hygiene campaign and Starbucks' Ethos Water program, which funds clean water projects, are exemplary models of linking CSR to product launches, fostering customer engagement alongside social impact.

SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVES

ITC's Mission Sunehra Kal focuses

on sustainable agriculture and afforestation, benefiting both the environment and the company's supply chain. Similarly, Tata Motors' renewable energy projects align environmental stewardship with operational sustainability.

PRO BONO SERVICES

Encouraging employees to provide their expertise pro bono for social causes is a powerful way to enhance CSR. For instance, Trilegal offers free legal services to NGOs, while Deloitte employees use their financial and consulting skills to help local businesses grow.

COLLABORATIONS WITH NGOS AND PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS

Partnerships allow businesses to scale their initiatives. HDFC Bank's Parivartan initiative and Reliance Foundation's Arogya Yojana healthcare program exemplify how NGOs and government agencies can collaborate to address largescale social challenges.

INVOLVING CUSTOMERS IN CSR

Amazon's Smile program and Paytm's donation features engage customers directly, creating a shared sense of purpose. This collaborative approach amplifies CSR efforts and increases customer loyalty.

TECHNOLOGY-DRIVEN **CSR SOLUTIONS**

Tech-driven initiatives like Google's Al for Social Good and IBM's Smarter Cities Challenge show how corporates can leverage innovation to address societal issues like disaster management and urban planning.

CONCLUSION

Engaging employees in CSR and leveraging innovative strategies is the way forward for corporates to create sustainable and impactful change. For Rotarians, the lesson lies in understanding this evolution and adapting to it. We must design CSR projects that actively engage employees while aligning with the larger organizational goals of corporates.

DURING the 2010 Council on Legislation (COL), representatives approved the enactment to add a fifth Avenue of Service, dedicated to youth, titled "New Generations." This significant step aimed to ensure that all efforts under this avenue contribute to implementing a robust succession plan. To make this vision a reality, let's actively reach out to schools, institutions, and large housing complexes in our vicinity to form as many Interact Clubs as possible.

Many Interact Clubs have been terminated in Rotary International records simply due to the failure to update the Interact Club Advisor's information by July 1st each year. Avenue Chair Pankaj Phatarphod is working diligently with clubs to revive such Interact Clubs. Club leaders and Rotarians

passionate about Youth Services must organize and encourage their Interact Club members to participate in various Interact projects and events at the club, district, and Rotary International

The Rotary Youth Exchange Program offers a unique opportunity for our youth to represent us as ambassadors. This program allows participants to broaden their perspectives while living in a different culture and promoting their own culture, fostering international goodwill and understanding. Currently, three of our students are participating in a year-long exchange program, and our clubs are hosting four inbound students. As we emerge from the challenges posed by COVID-19, which temporarily halted the exchange program, we encourage all readers to promote this life-changing initiative among Interactors and young people in their networks.

To support this, connect with

Avenue Chair Hima Dalal and schedule a presentation for your club or Interact Clubs. We currently have five long-term applications and are actively encouraging more youth to participate.

Programs like RYPEN, RYLA, MUNA, and MIPS provide excellent opportunities to engage with the youth in our communities. This year, we have focused on organizing RYPEN sessions at school premises, lasting 2-3 hours, featuring top speakers and activities tailored to schools' interests. Thus far, we have successfully conducted MUNA events in the southern and western zones and one MIPS session. Avenue Chair Anand Ramnani and his team are collaborating with clubs to organize these impactful events.

The New Generations Service Exchange Program is a short-term initiative for youth aged 19 to 30 seeking internships or professional experiences abroad. Avenue Chair Rajendrasinh Chauhan has already shortlisted three applications and is inviting more participants to join this program.

HERITAGE WALK THROUGH RANWAR VILLAGE, BANDRA

A Journey Through Time

N 29th December 2024, the District Sanskriti team led by Rtn Kalpana Khira organised a heritage walk through Ranwar village in Bandra. Over 30 Rotarians including District Governor Chetan Desai was part of the walk.

Nestled in the heart of Bandra, Ranwar village is a hidden gem amidst the city's rapid modernization. Established as early as the 12th century, it was originally home to Koli fisherfolks and underwent significant transformation with the arrival of the Portuguese in the 16th century. This marked the birth of the 'East Indian' community, a term coined by the British to distinguish the indigenous Christian population from European Christians. The East Indians, descendants of Portuguese missionaries and local converts, blended indigenous and European cultures, created Catholic churches, winding lanes, and distinctive architecture that continue to define the village today.

The true magic of Ranwar lies in its nostalgic charm, caught between



two worlds. Once an agrarian and residential area, the village began to feel the first signs of urban encroachment as the 20th century dawned. Despite this, its tight-knit community, with narrow lanes and vibrant homes, remained a defiant symbol against the city's growth. In the last few decades, the village has transformed dramatically, with glitzy real estate projects and luxury boutiques replacing its art-deco and Portuguese-style houses.

As the walk was between
Christmas and New Year, Ranwar
village radiated festive charm, with
narrow lanes adorned in colourful
buntings and twinkling lights.
The vibrant decor highlighted
the village's quaint architecture,
creating a joyful atmosphere.
We could imagine the evenings
filled with church bells, laughter,
and songs, blending history and
festivity in a beautiful display of
community spirit.

Despite changes, the quirks of Ranwar still remain. Its labyrinthine alleys, cobbled streets, and small, family-run shops serve as reminders of a simpler time. The narrow roads, old houses, crosses, chapels, church bells, transports visitors to a different era. But for how much longer? As Bandra's gentrification marches on, one wonders if the rich cultural tapestry of Ranwar will endure or become yet another casualty in the face of
