


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Of Friendships and More



"Talwada Diaries:

Rotary Club of Bombay's Day of Service and Smiles"

N April 27, 2025, the Rotary Club of Bombay (RCB) once again lived up to its reputation for impactful service by conducting two mega projects at its landmark Talwada Medical Centre. The day marked not only a celebration of Rotary's commitment to community healthcare but also a demonstration of unwavering fellowship and service.

These projects were inaugurated by District Governor Rtn. Chetan Desai, who praised the efforts of the club in sustaining and scaling impactful programs in remote regions. The initiatives included a Breast Cancer Detection Camp—one of the District's thrust areas—and the distribution of Well Baby Kits to mothers and infants from surrounding villages.

Led by President Rtn. Satyan Israni, the day saw the participation of



over 25 Rotarians, Rotary Partners, Rotaractors, and Rotary staff, who turned the outreach into a vibrant day of service and camaraderie. The group also made site visits to PRVEC (Phiroze R. Vakil Eye Centre) and Taparia College, reinforcing their connection with the long-standing projects in Talwada.

The day began bright and early, with the team boarding a bus at 6:30 a.m. from Mumbai. True to Rotary spirit, the journey was filled with laughter, fellowship—and snacks, of course—including sandwiches, wafers, chocolates, and the quintessential stop at Shree Dutt for vada pav and hot beverages.

By 10:45 a.m., the group arrived at the ADMC (Ajit Deshpande Medical Centre), where the projects were formally inaugurated by DG Rtn. Chetan Desai. By this time, however, work was already underway—patients had turned up in large numbers and technicians had begun screenings for breast cancer, a condition that continues to need early detection in rural India.

Also inaugurated on this





occasion was the newly installed Biochemistry Analyzer, further upgrading the capabilities of the Pathology Laboratory at ADMC. The diagnostic equipment will now aid in faster and more accurate testing for the hundreds of patients the centre serves regularly.

The team toured the ADMC campus, which was buzzing with activity-families had arrived from far-flung villages, many traveling for hours to avail themselves of the medical services. It was particularly touching to see the smiles on the faces of young mothers and children receiving the Well Baby Kits, after thorough check-ups by Dr. Apte. The kits, filled with essential items for neonatal care, were distributed with detailed guidance on their use and benefits.

The journey then continued to PRVEC, where Dr. Rumi Jehangir offered a heartfelt walk through memory lane, recounting the inception and evolution of the centre. He spoke of the countless contributions made over the decades by devoted doctors and generous donors, turning Talwada into what he described as the "Kohinoor" of RCB's service projects. The group was taken through the patient dormitories, the operation theatre, and the outpatient department (OPD), reflecting the holistic nature of care offered at PRVEC.

The final stop was at Taparia College, adjacent to PRVEC, where the faculty welcomed the group and showcased the academic and infrastructural growth of the institution. Highlights included visits to the classrooms and

the newly equipped chemical laboratory, where teachers shared their transformative experiences of working with the local youth.

By day's end, both mega projects had together touched the lives of over 200 beneficiaries, reaffirming the value and reach of Rotary's service. More than just numbers, it was the visible impact, heartfelt gratitude, and bonds formed through service that defined the day.

For the Rotarians, it was a fruitful, fulfilling, and truly satisfying experience, reinforcing their belief in the project's longevity and legacy. The Talwada initiative, often referred to as the "Kohinoor Project" of the Rotary Club of Bombay, continues to embody the Rotary motto of "Service Above Self."

EyeHope – Illuminating Lives Through **Vision Care**

In a landmark initiative to advance public healthcare, the Rotary Club of Bombay Up-Town, under the visionary leadership of Club President Rtn. Suman Agarwal and Project Leader IPP Rtn. Malvika Lalit Sukhani, successfully executed Project EyeHope - a Global Grant focused on enhancing ophthalmic surgical capabilities at the Lokmanya Tilak Municipal General Hospital (Sion Hospital), Mumbai.

TRANSFORMING EYE CARE FOR THE UNDERSERVED

Launched on 10th April 2025, the project involved the procurement and installation of state-of-the-art ophthalmology surgical equipment, addressing a critical need in Mumbai's public healthcare ecosystem. With a total value of \$108,561, EyeHope significantly bolsters the hospital's ability to provide advanced eye surgeries, helping thousands from underprivileged communities regain their vision and dignity.

Launched with a vision to provide interest-free microloans to underprivileged women, the project has enabled beneficiaries to start or grow small businesses in areas such as catering, tailoring, trading, handicrafts, decoration services, and even rickshaw driving. What sets this initiative apart is its self-sustaining nature - as women repay their loans in monthly instalments, the recovered funds are immediately reinvested to support new entrepreneurs, eliminating the need for continuous external donations.

This year, under the dynamic leadership of President Seema Joshi, the initiative has witnessed continued growth and impact. In just the past year, 20 women have collectively received over ₹7 lakh in financial support, entirely through recycled repayments - a testament to the strength and sustainability of the model.

The program addresses a critical gap in financial access. Conventional banking systems often shut out women due to the lack of collateral, forcing many to turn to informal moneylenders who charge crippling interest rates of 24% or more annually. By removing

This state-of-the-art equipment is the first of its kind to be installed in India for clinical trial purposes, positioning ACTREC at the forefront of advanced oncological research. The AutoMACS® NEO Cell Separator brings together advanced magnetic technology and targeted antibody recognition, allowing for the gentle, high-speed separation of live cancer cells. This paves the way for early detection, precise diagnosis, and timely intervention—a game-changer for thousands battling cancer.



The significance of this machine extends beyond ACTREC. As shared by Dr. Prashant Bhatt, the equipment will be used not only in clinical trials but also as a training module for doctors and institutions across India, enabling a ripple effect of skill enhancement and impact.

With the capacity to handle 1,000 samples annually, the machine is projected to touch the lives of over 10,000 patients during its operational lifetime. The entire initiative, valued at ₹40,00,000, was made possible through the

CSR partnership with Marsh McLennan Global Services India Pvt. Ltd., reflecting the power of industry-NGO collaboration.



Rotary Year 2024-25 Update & Call to Action for Clubs Yet to Tap In

S we near the end of May 2025, it's time to take stock of the tremendous momentum built around CSR India Grants this Rotary year—and to renew our call to clubs that are yet to harness this transformative opportunity. Since July 2024, Rotary clubs across the District have already mobilized significant CSR funds through well-planned, impactful projects. From health camps and dialysis centers to

smart classrooms, women's empowerment programs, and environmental sustainability initiatives—CSR-backed projects are now a core pillar of Rotary's service impact.

Many clubs have embraced the CSR India Grants model: professionally managed, fully compliant with corporate regulations, and seamlessly executed through Rotary Foundation India (RFI). These projects are not just creating change on the ground but also elevating Rotary's brand visibility and credibility among corporate India.

A SNAPSHOT OF THIS YEAR'S CSR GRANT ACTIVITY IN OUR DISTRICT:

- \$ 2.5 mln mobilized so far through CSR India Grants
- 36 Projects approved and funded



- > Partnerships with 33 corporates, many of them repeat contributors
- > 19 clubs so far have applied for a CSR India Grant in current RY.

This is a promising trend—but here's the truth: we are only scratching the surface. The Government of India mandates companies to spend 2% of their

profits on CSR, amounting to over Rs. 40,000 crores annually, as of last count. Rotary, with its unmatched grassroots presence, credibility, and execution capabilities, is perfectly positioned to be a preferred CSR partner. Yet, many clubs have not yet applied for even a single grant this year.

WHY THE HESITATION?

From conversations with clubs. common reasons include uncertainty around how to approach corporates, lack of a dedicated CSR team, or hesitation around compliance processes. But these barriers are not insurmountable:

- > CSR mentors and Rotary


- leaders are available to guide clubs every step of the way
