UNNATI SKILL ENHANCEMENT SCHEME: **Empowering Women, Transforming Futures**

HE Seva Mandal **Education Society** (SMES) campus in Matunga, Mumbai, recently witnessed an uplifting celebration on March 29, 2025-the certificate distribution ceremony of the Unnati Skill Enhancement Scheme, a transformative initiative that has changed the course of many young women's lives. Over a span of three years, the Rotary Club of Queen's Necklace (District 3141), in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Germantown, Memphis (District 6800), joined hands with the four colleges under SMES to launch and nurture this impactful project, supported by a global grant of ₹1.44 crore.

The Unnati Scheme, launched in **2022**, was designed to address a critical gap: the employability of

women students. With over **965** women successfully completing various job-oriented courses, the initiative has now empowered hundreds of young women with market-ready skills and confidence to chart their own career paths. At the certificate distribution event, Chief Guest **District Governor Rtn. Chetan Desai** personally handed out certificates to graduates and honoured top rankers.

A total of 11 specialised courses were offered across the fields of:

These courses were curated after an in-depth needs assessment and aligned with real-time industry expectations. More than **30 seasoned industry experts** and training partners collaborated to deliver practical, job-oriented instruction.

To facilitate job readiness, the participating colleges also established **dedicated placement cells**, which connected students with recruiters. The results were remarkable: over **70% of the students** secured placements in reputed organisations such as:

- Finance & Media: ICICI Bank, Axis Bank, HDFC Bank, Motilal Oswal, HDFC Life, ICICI Prudential Life Insurance, Midday, Hawkins, TCS
- Healthcare: Fortis Hospital, Global Hospitals, Reliance Hospital
- IT: Deloitte, Capgemini, Infosys
- Beauty & Wellness: Bliss Salon, Lakme Salon
- ♣ Law: Little & Co., HNT Legal
- Retail and F&B: Starbucks

The program was driven by an incredibly committed team led by **Chief Coordinator Mr Dattatray Gawade** and a set of dedicated course coordinators:

- ▲▼ Dr. Shubhangi Kulkarni (Retail)
- ▲▼ Ms. Shagufta Memon (Media)

The Rotary-supported grant not only ensured quality training but also funded smart classrooms and online platforms like Zoom, making it possible for students to attend live sessions with experts even remotely. Hearing directly from the students was one of the most heartwarming aspects of the event. Their testimonials offered a real glimpse into how deeply the program has impacted their lives:

Ms Kimaya Patil, an IT student, shared:

"Unnati has helped me and many other needy students enhance our skills. I especially loved the hands-on IoT workshops and cybersecurity sessions. They helped me develop problem-solving skills and sparked innovative thinking. Today, I'm placed at **Deloitte** as an Associate Analyst with a package of ₹3.25 lakh per annum."

Ms. Yukta Mehta, a Media and Marketing student, said: "Being part of the first batch has been life-changing. I gained so much confidence and skill and secured a role at Midday InfoMedia. I am so grateful to the Rotary Club of Queen's Necklace for making this possible."







Ms. Srushti Shinde, from the Wealth Management stream, spoke movingly:

"My father is a driver, and my mother is a housewife. Thanks to the Rotary-funded courses taught by real Chartered Accountants, I learned GST and Tally. I was offered a manager's role at CPL Distribution with a CTC of ₹2.4 lakhs before even getting my hall ticket. For the first time, my family listens to me. This is a win not just for me—but for all of us." **Ms. Nuzhat Shaikh,** a final-year LL.B student, said: "The Cyber Law course was a blessing. Such programs usually cost a lot, but we were given this opportunity free of cost. It has sparked my interest in pursuing cyber law further."

Another subtle but telling outcome has emerged from many informal student-teacher conversations. Several girls shared that **marriage proposals from families significantly improved** once they started earning. "When families see that the girl is working—and with a branded corporate—they feel more confident and inclined. It changes how they view the girl's potential."

This speaks volumes about the wider social transformation Unnati is fostering—where women are

seen not just as homemakers but as professionals, decision-makers, and equal contributors to their families.

Notably, the program was inclusive at its core. Students from economically challenged backgrounds received full scholarships for these training modules. This reflects the deep commitment of both Rotary and SMES to equal opportunity and empowerment through education.

The Unnati Skill Enhancement Scheme is not just a skill-building project but a **movement**. A mission to uplift, empower, and enable young women to take charge of their futures with pride, confidence, and dignity.

As District 3141 celebrates milestones like these, we are reminded of what's possible when vision, collaboration, and purpose come together. Unnati is a shining example of Rotary's power to create meaningful, measurable, and lasting change.

Vimukti Yatra 10,000 Kilometres of Purpose, Prevention, and Possibility

IMUKTI Yatra, a 10,000 km road trip focused on addiction prevention and mental health awareness, was flagged off on 26th January 2025 from Sion, Mumbai, traveling across 17 Indian states and 26 Rotary districts under the guidance of DG Chetan Desai (3141) and DG Mohan Parashar (3055).

The Yatra was organized by the Rotary Club of Addiction Prevention 3141, the Rotary Club of Mumbai Mulund East (3141), and the Rotary Club of Mandvi Kutch (3055). On behalf of all the above clubs, Rotary Charitable Society Mandvi facilitated the entire Yatra. This initiative was conceptualised by Rtn Dr. Siddharth Udeshi, President 2024–25 of RC Addiction Prevention 3141.

The Yatra aims to break the stigma surrounding addiction and mental health, promote open conversations, and provide crucial resources to individuals and communities. It works to bring together Rotarians, professionals, educators, students, and policymakers to create a nationwide movement for a healthier future.

GEOGRAPHICAL COVERAGE & ROUTE:

The Yatra traversed diverse regions of India, covering rural and urban landscapes to maximise outreach. The journey spanned across 17 states, reaching thousands of individuals through direct engagement and digital outreach. The entire Yatra was divided into four legs:

Leg 1: Mumbai to Kanyakumari Covering: Pune – Kolhapur – Hubali – Bengaluru – Tirupur – Nagercoil – Kanyakumari

Leg 2: Kanyakumari to Kolkata

Covering: Madurai – Perambalur – Puducherry – Chennai – Nellore – Kavali – Vijayawada – Rajamahendravaram – Visakhapatnam – Bhubaneswar – Kolkata



Leg 3: Kolkata to Atal Tunnel (Manali)

Covering: Dhanbad – Bodh Gaya – Lucknow – Mathura – Delhi – Yamunanagar – Chandigarh – Rupnagar – Mandi – Manali

Leg 4: Manali to Mumbai

Collaboration with Stakeholders:

- Partnerships were established with 104 Rotary Clubs, 4 Rotaract Clubs, 2 Interact Clubs, 1 RCC, and 15 other NGOs to create sustainable support systems. Sixteen Rotary Club meetings were addressed. Nearly 1,000 Rotarians across 26 districts contributed to the project.
- Local influencers, youth icons, spiritual leaders, local political leaders, and media personalities joined the movement, drawing more attention and engagement.
- Government agencies were engaged in discussions on policy improvements for mental health and addiction recovery programs.

Media Engagement:

- Real-time updates were shared via social media, blogs, and videos, ensuring nationwide engagement.
- Press conferences and digital media bytes were provided to local news (print and digital).
- Nineteen newspapers across India covered the Vimukti Yatra. News and interviews of the Vimukti Yatra featured on nearly 11 local news channels. A special two-part interview was featured by All India Radio

(Bhuj), also available on their YouTube channel.

IMPACT & OUTCOMES

- Direct Outreach: Thousands of people were reached through in-person events and awareness sessions.
- Digital Reach: Social media campaigns gained significant traction, spreading awareness to an even larger audience.
- Community Empowerment: The initiative empowered youth, educators, and healthcare professionals with the knowledge and resources to combat addiction and promote mental health.
- Sustainable Support Networks: Partnerships formed during the Yatra will continue to support addiction prevention and mental health awareness in their respective communities. Rotary District leaders including DGs, DGEs, DGNs, DGNDs, and PDGs—have agreed to actively participate in addiction prevention projects and form committees for the same in their districts.

CONCLUSION



Rebooting Dreams

The Rotary Club of Bombay is dedicated to digitally empowering underprivileged children and making them future ready through two initiatives: 1. IT Innovation Laboratories - helping the students embrace cutting-edge technologies and

2. Career Learning Facilitation Centres - building a strong foundation in core STEM subjects thereby getting the students ready for competitive exams.

IT INNOVATION LABORATORIES



Set up in the Palghar district, these labs serve rural and tribal high school and college students, offering hands-on exposure to 3D technology, IoT, Robotics, AI, and Data Science. The programme, supported by Grok Learning Pvt. Ltd. as a knowledge partner, features a curated curriculum and trained lab staff, boosting students' technological skills, confidence, and job readiness.

The labs operate in three-month batches, with students attending weekly 2-hour sessions across multiple time slots, six days a week. Of 18 batches, 15 are pre-scheduled while others are reserved for extra support and project work.

Key Features

- 24 students per batch, working in pairs.
- 12 custom-designed tables with socket panels arranged in a U-shape.



- Learning resources include laptops, Grok IoT Kits, LEGO sets, guidebooks, 3D printers, and more.
- Additional infrastructure includes a projector, Wi-Fi, and staff laptop.
- Impact Since January 2022, over 5,000 students across ST Kadam School (Palghar), PJ High School (Wada), and SD Vartak School (Boisar) have benefited from these state-ofthe-art labs, gaining confidence, communication skills, and realworld problem-solving abilities.

CAREER LEARNING FOUNDATION COURSE



This year-long programme supported by Speed Labs as a knowledge partner, strengthens foundational knowledge in Maths, Science, and English while preparing students for post-12th competitive exams. With 320 sessions per grade (120 each for Maths and Science, 80 for English), it supports deep learning and skill development and gears the students to be ready for competitive exams like JEE and NEET.

Key Features

- Structured syllabus aligned with academic goals.
- Small batch size (max. 30 students) for personalised guidance.
- Admission based on a scholarship exam to select dedicated learners.
- Impact Supported by the Rotary Club of Bombay, 464 students from BMC School (Prabhadevi), PJ High School (Wada), ST Kadam High School (Palghar), and Dr. SD Vartak High School (Boisar) have participated in this transformative programme.

Far beyond the festive ritual, it stands as a profound reminder of sacred beginnings inviting us to pause, reflect and realign with the rhythms of nature and life itself.

Each element of the Gudi is layered with deep symbolism, gently guiding us toward peace, purpose and positive energy. Let us, together, reflect on its essence – to understand not just what we do, but why we do it.

The bamboo pole upholding the Gudi symbolizes resilience – strong yet flexible. It teaches us to bend without breaking, mirroring our ability to endure life's challenges. Positioned at the entrance of the home, it allows the smooth flow of positive energy while blocking negative vibrations, safeguarding inner balance and harmony.

The inverted copper pot (kalash) atop, when touched by the morning sun radiates warmth and positivity. Its inversion signifies a conscious letting go, an inner shift to empty pride, fear, ego & negativity making space for clarity, compassion, and divine inspiration – a true transformation.

The garland strung across the Gudi harmonizes contrasts – sweet candy (battasa), bitter & healing neem leaves, purifying mango leaves, and vibrant flowers. Together, they reflect life's blend of sweetness and struggles, joy and pain, healing & grace. They remind us to cleanse our inner world regularly and to continue spreading joy, even in transient moments.

The brocade saree adorning the Gudi is more than visual richness. It embodies legacy, abundance, and protection – a symbol of continuity passed down through generations. It reflects both inner and outer beauty and the blessings carried forward through karmic ties.

Gudi Padwa calls us not just to celebrate, but to internalize its wisdom. Are we, like the bamboo, grounded yet adaptable? Have we emptied our inner kalash to receive what truly matters? Do we carry beauty and strength into the spaces we inhabit?

As we carry these reflections into the year ahead, may we live mindfully, act meaningfully, and become quiet beacons of peace and purpose in our homes and beyond.
