## The Golden Handshake for **FUTURE PROGRESS**

strong partnership goes a long way. When two giants in the social service sphere - Rotary District 3141 and the Corporates of India - come together to cement their relationship, the result is a shared together journey. On an evening when the skies opened its heaviest downpour, an event to showcase this shared partnership - the Rotary CSR Conclave - was underway at the iconic National Stock Exchange in the Bandra Kurla Complex. The downpour did not dampen the spirit of service as Rotarians and the leaders of the industry came together to light the lamp of shared service. The event, on the evening of September 27, was led by DG 3141 Rtn Chetan Desai, District Chair (CSR), rtn Akkshay Mehta, Convenor Rtn Rupen Doshi and President of the host club, Rotary Club of Bombay Pier, Rtn Kamlesh Shroff was a resounding success.

The event was graced, not only by Rtn Mark Maloney, Past RI President and TRF Trustee Chair as well as Rtn Dr Bharat Pandya, Past Rotary International Director and TRF Trustee, but also by Rtn Piyush Goyal (that's not a typo he is a Rotarian), Union Minister for Commerce & Industry and Ashishkumar Chauhan, CEO, NSE. Also present were poet and actor Shailesh Lodha and Prof Bipin Jojo, Dean of Tata Institute of Social Sciences.

The object of the event was to start building an ecosystem around Corporate CSR and Rotary. It is expected that more companies will see Rotary as the ideal partner to ensure that their CSR funds

are used wisely and efficiently to benefit the community in their chosen area of focus and more Rotary clubs get access to CSR funds to execute their service projects. A project booklet listing over 70 projects was given to all the corporate invitees.



The event was divided in 3 parts: Demo Gallery, Knowledge Sharing and CSR Awards

#### **DEMO GALLERY**

A dedicated space was set up for display of projects by Rotary Clubs. About 30 projects are showcased by clubs to corporate invitees. Many visitors were seen interacting with the clubs to understand the various projects. They also interacted with many Rotarians to understand how they can work together.

#### **KNOWLEDGE SHARING**

At the beginning of the session, during the lighting of the lamp, Al enabled glasses were given to two visually challenged girls. These glasses are equipped with sensors, cameras, and AI algorithms to interpret the environment and provide useful information.

DG Rtn Chetan talked about the amazing work done by our district in just a few short months and significant contributions made to TRF. He touched upon the strong corelation between Rotary's Areas of Focus and the permitted



activities under the CSR rules. He also emphasized that TRF has been receiving the highest rating by Charity Navigator, a global rating agency for NGOs, every year for 15 years. He also announced that at a meeting with the Vibrant Presidents and Mark, just prior to the event. US\$ 55.000 was committed on the spot towards an endowment.

PRID and TRF Trustee Rtn Dr. Bharat Pandya emphasized









that while most NGOs have administrative costs between 25 - 50 %, for CSR projects executed by Rotary, this cost is between 3 - 5 %. This is because most of the project work, especially the oversight and stewardship, is undertaken free of cost by Rotarians, who are not only professionals in their own right, but often domain experts as well. He also explained the extremely high stewardship standards followed by TRF and Rotarians.

Dr. Jojo, Dean of TISS said that the three pillars of a successful service project are Time, Money and Expertise and Rotary is able to contribute all of these due to its collective and collaborative nature. He appreciated the connection and partnership with Rotary.

Ashish Chouhan, CEO NSE was appreciative of the opportunity to partner with Rotary for this event. He said that, as a past Rotarian he was keenly aware of the exemplary work being done by Rotary. He also explained about NSE's new initiative, the Social Stock



Exchange, that brings together social enterprises and donors.

The honourable minister, Rtn Piyush Goyal, as a member of the Rotary Club of Bombay Pier, said he was very proud of the work being done by his club and by all Rotarians. He constantly referred to "our work" and "our time". He explained that giving back to society was a concept he learnt from his parents since childhood. He expressed the joy he felt when he could contribute to improving the life of people less fortunate than us. He also appreciated the work being done by corporates over the years, whether required

by law or not, in ploughing back some of their profits to benefit the society in general because, it was the Indian ethos.

TRF Trustee chair. Mark Malonev. was appreciative of the Hon Minister's speech and corelated how he also learnt lessons on contributing to society early in his life. He talked about TRF's global experience in "Doing good in the world". He talked about learning from his future father-in-law the idea of "paying your civic rent" for occupying the space in the world and that this is done by doing service for the community.

#### **CSR AWARDS**

This year Rotary District 3141 decided to recognise all the good work being done by Corporates through their Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR).

Entries were invited from Corporates who had done excellent projects benefitting the community at large, in consonance with five (of the seven) Areas of Focus identified by Rotary Foundation. One award was given in each category - Disease Prevention and Treatment; Basic Education and Literacy; Community & Economic Development; Environment; Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

From the numerous, high-quality entries that were received, 45 were carefully studied, debated and judged by an elite panel of judges consisting of: Peecom Basu (Assistant Professor Tata Institute of Social Sciences) and the Jury Co-ordinator, Abhishek Karnani (Founder and Managing Director Free Press Journal), Madhu Chhibber (Executive Vice President and Head of Corporate **Communications - HDFC Bank** Ltd) and Pratibha Pai (Founder/ **Director Chirag Rural Development** Foundation).

The entries were judged through a very stringent process, with hours of discussions and the winners were judged on the following criteria: Need Assessment; Holistic Implementation; Impact Assessment; Sustainability.

The winners included:

#### **DISEASE PREVENTION** &TREATMENT

Mahanagar Gas Limited – for their holistic approach to health, promoting health of marginalised people - from children to adults to livestock and Using technology for monitoring the work that includes live feedback.

#### **BASIC EDUCATION &** LITERACY

In this category there was a tie

#### Tata Class Edge Limited. The

initiative enhances Basic Education and Literacy by improving the accessibility of quality content to the unreached....and orienting teachers in the integration of technology for improving

teaching-learning, evaluation, and ' professional development"

#### Hyundai Motor Private Limited.

For their Increase access to practical, hands-on science education for economically disadvantaged government school children has resulted in a 20.9% increase in science knowledge, and they sustain the initiative through training of teachers in government schools.

The Jury gave a special mention in this category to Connect Chemical India - for helping provide a place for education and long-term support to 9 primary teachers who, in turn, teach approximately 450 students every year and use Malkhamb for the physical and mental well-being of the students.

#### COMMUNITY **AND ECONOMIC** DEVELOPMENT

Rallis India Ltd. For the skills implemented as per local market demand while aligning with the interest of beneficiaries as well.









In FY24, 722 individuals initiated self-enterprises, and 22 became job creators, providing jobs for 30 people.

#### **ENVIRONMENT**

**Sudarshan Chemical Industries Ltd.** A community driven water resource development model, that provides technical solution to address the severe water scarcity as well as inputs on water conservation and awareness on sustainable agricultural practice.

#### WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE

**Crompton Greeves Consumer Electricals Limited** For their Watershed Initiative that integrates environmental restoration and economic empowerment. Planting of Mango trees reduce soil erosion, improve water retention, and contribute to carbon sequestration, while also providing livelihood by generating ₹2.5 crore annually.

September, the month focusing on 'Child Development,' saw 2.500 children across 32 schools participate in various competitions, including chess, elocution, essay writing, quizzes, folk dances, and drama, culminating in a valedictory program on September 27.

#### THE ROTARY CLUB OF DUEEN CITY

The Club has undertaken several impactful projects, thoughtfully allocating resources to support education and community welfare.

A state-of-the-art computer lab was established at Banganga Municipal School, benefiting 100 students. with an annual investment of approximately Rs. 5 lakh. In addition, the club covered school fees and provided study materials for six students at Banyan Tree English Medium School, contributing around Rs. 1.25 lakh.

A field trip was organised for 184 children from Zilla Parishad School to Jawhar District, where raincoats were distributed to 500 students at Vinwal School. Vocational guidance was provided to 80 girls

preparing for the NEET exam. The club also distributed school bags and snacks to 70 children at Zilla Parishad School in Nesave Village, with a total outlay of Rs. 54,000.

Books were distributed, and vocational guidance was provided to 200 children at the Banganga Municipal School, supported by Rs. 70,000. At the same time, 90 YJS Gujarati Night School & Junior College students received educational materials, with Rs. 30,000 allocated.

The Ideal Study app was introduced for 1,000 10th-grade students across 15 municipal schools, with a commitment of Rs. 65,000. The club also launched an inter school science quiz competition at Nehru Center, engaging 150 schools, with a funding of Rs. 1.5 lakh.

In a long-term initiative, the club adopted five Anganwadi centres in tribal villages in Jawhar for three years, benefitting 200 children, with an investment nearing Rs. 6.1 lakh.

The club sponsored a library in Kashmir, reaching 500 children, with a contribution of Rs. 1.25 lakh.

Support for special education was extended to 45 children at Umang Special School through vocational programs. In addition, blind students at Bahai Center were recognised and supported, with around Rs. 60,000 devoted to 100 children.



#### IMPACT OF THE TEACH INITIATIVE

The overall impact of the TEACH initiative in the past two months has been remarkable, touching the lives of more than 4,000 students across District 3141. With over ₹3,20,000 raised, these funds have been crucial in supporting the various initiatives under TEACH.

In just the first two months of the Rotary Year, 5202 students have successfully received the Ideal Study App under the leadership of District Governor Chetan Desai. A big shoutout to the Rotary Clubs of Mumbai Mulund South, Mumbai South and Queen City for their effort and commitment.

## **MASIK CHAKRA**

A Comprehensive Initiative for Menstrual and Menopause Health

ASIK Chakra is a holistic program aimed at improving menstrual and menopausal health through education, eco-friendly solutions, and community support. Founded by President Shruti Dharamsi of the Rotary Club of Mumbai Ghatkopar West, with the support of IPP Sangeeta Shahani and AG Padma Kapoor of the Rotary Club of Deonar, as well as Rtn Ujwala Jiandani of the Rotary Club of Mumbai Mulund East, this initiative embodies the essence of its name—"Monthly Cycle," a term coined by DG Chetan Desai. The program is also backed by First Lady Jwala Desai and focuses on four key components.

#### 1. PERIOD AWARENESS FOR GIRLS (AGES 8 TO 15)

This segment educates young girls about menstruation using the comic book Menstrupedia. Interactive sessions, conducted in Hindi, English, and Marathi, last 1 to 1.5 hours. They include

ice-breaking activities, a 25-minute educational video on menstruation, and a questionnaire to reinforce learning. In just 2.5 months, over 15 schools have hosted these sessions, reaching more than 3,000 students, fostering a positive and informed attitude towards menstruation from an early age.

#### 2. PERIOD PANTIES DISTRIBUTION

Targeting teenage girls aged 10 to 18, this component promotes eco-friendly period panties in collaboration with Chumsafe. For ₹700, participants receive three reusable panties, providing a sustainable alternative to sanitary pads. This economical choice helps teens manage menstruation effectively while minimizing environmental impact.

#### 3. MENSTRUAL CUP DISTRIBUTION

For individuals aged 18 and above, this component provides medicalgrade silicone menstrual cups as a safer alternative to plastic options. Available from brands like Stone Soup and Pee Safe for ₹250, the cost is partially subsidized by the Ghatkopar Club. Over the past 8 years, more than 5,000 cups have been distributed, including donations to community helpers like lady police officers and nurses. These cups can last for up to 10 years.

#### 4. MENOPAUSE AWARENESS

This component addresses menopause through awareness sessions led by gynecologists. These sessions cover symptoms, management strategies, and available resources, empowering women to navigate this stage of life effectively.


The Rain Gods have passed, and 'Vignaharta' Bappa has returned to His heavenly abode, only to return in the coming year to bless humanity.
