






# **Unbottled: The Power** of Speaking Up

# **KLARION KALL OF KASHMIR**

'Samavesh' under Project National Integration [ PNI ]

HE week of 11th to 17th August 2024 will be permanently imprinted in the minds of the 120 plus Rotarians of RID 3141.

The entire contingent under the leadership of District Governor Chetan Desai and the Lead for Project National Integration (PNI) Deepak Jiandani, landed at Sheikh UI Alam International Airport, Srinagar at around 10 am on the 11th of August 2024.

One could feel the excitement amongst the Rotarians, as they were warmly received by Prez Vinay Khetawat, members of the Rotary Club of Western Elite, and Farokh and his team from Arika Travels. Nine plush 16-seaters were lined up for the group, and after morning breakfast with dry fruits, the contingent was on its way to Pahalgam- a three-hour journey through the picturesque vale of Kashmir. All along the journey to our destination in Pahalgam, we witnessed heavy army presence ensuring enhanced security and a peaceful environment.

#### 11TH AUGUST

We checked into the Hotel Hilton, and the stay and meals were very comfortable. This scenic valley was like a heaven on earth set amidst the wilderness of the











mighty Himalayas. These valleys are important trekking routes for the Amarnath and Mount Kailash pilgrimage. The views were serene and soothed the eye.

#### **12TH AUGUST**

In the morning, we left for Kokarnag in the Anantnag district. The visit to the Botanical Gardens was quite enlightening where the springwater is famous for its purity and rich mineral content.

The story of Kokarnag is quite interesting. The origin of the name is 'Kokar' which means Hen and 'Nag' which means Spring or Snake. It is said that at the behest of a holy man, a snake turned itself into a hen, clawed the earth and produced a spring which flows through the seven sources and produces enough water for 3-4 lakh people in the district.

After Kokarnag, we witnessed the ancient Sun Temple: Martanda. This structure bore proof that this land was occupied by progressive and scholarly Hindu and Buddhist civilisations almost 1,400 years ago.

The evening was star-studded with D 3141 talent on display. Songs on the moonlit lawns of Hilton grew into a lifelong bond among fellow Rotarians.



#### **13TH AUGUST**

After a brief visit to Lidder Valley, Betab Valley and the Mamal Temple in the morning, the group headed to Srinagar, the capital city known for its beauty and the famous Dal Lake.

#### **14TH AUGUST**

The day started with a climb to Shri Shankaracharya Temple on the hill overlooking the serene and impressive Dal Lake. The visit and the 'Darshan' of the temple deity was a heartwarming experience.

We visited Chasme Shahi, the Royal Springs, the water of which is supposed to have curative minerals and was adorned by the breathtaking Mughal Garden.

This was followed by a ride in the Dal Lake in the Famous Shikaras.

# THE MAGICAL EVENING OF 14TH AUGUST: CAMP SRINAGAR

The evening was reserved for a Press conference which was well organised. Deepak Jiandani, Project Lead welcomed the audience. District Governor Chetan Desai 'walked the talk' in his address to the august gathering. He appealed to the Press and other media personalities to give credence to the support Rotary is offering to Kashmir's remote





educational projects and midwifery training for 65 young girls in Macchal, a remote area of Kashmir. Ms Abida, a social worker and an activist, validated the benefits the locals were enjoying with deliveries happening with the least complications.

DG Chetan Desai tabled his ambitious plans. He said that the present project 'Samavesh', under Project National Integration will create ripples in the region. This initiative, he claimed, would certainly lead to national integration15th August

#### THE INDEPENDENCE DAY

It is always a big day in every part of India and Srinagar is no exception. Despite heavy rains, Rotarians in full white and 'Tiranga' wrapped around themselves were present in large numbers to hoist the flag with the CRPF Jawans.

areas and the hospitals and Goodwill Schools managed by the Army. Under this initiative 2 benches, 1 mini library cupboard, 2 fences, 5 flowerpots, 1 Bin and paver blocks made of 270 kg of recycled plastic has been placed in one Gazebo of the park for public use. This aims to create awareness on plastic disposal and its recycling, especially among the younger generation. 25 such corners are planned across gardens in Mumbai.

IWC Bombay Pier sponsored 100 nutritional kits for adult cancer patients with nasal tubes and distributed 600 play dough boxes to paediatric cancer patients at the Tata Hospital. The projects benefitted 100 adults and 300 children, with a total cost of INR 84,500.

## Breaking the Silence: ROTARY'S BOLD PUSH FOR MENTAL HEALTH

**AWARENESS**

Rotary has long been synonymous with groundbreaking health initiatives, from nearly eradicating polio to advancing maternal and child health. Today, Rotary is once again at the forefront, addressing the critical issue of mental health, which has gained urgency in a post-pandemic world. With increasing awareness around mental well-being, Rotary is leading efforts to bridge gaps in understanding, resources, and support systems for mental health worldwide.

Mental health conditions, including depression and anxiety, affect over 264 million people globally, as reported by the World Health Organization. Additionally, various forms of addiction are cutting across all demographics—irrespective of age, gender, or socio-economic status. Despite being treatable, many people do not receive the care they need. Our District has responded to this challenge through focused initiatives targeting three key impact areas:

- Breaking the stigma
- · Raising awareness, and
- Increasing access to prevention and early treatment.

### "DON'T BOTTLE IT UP" CAMPAIGN

Our flagship mental health initiative, the "Don't Bottle It Up" campaign, has been central to our efforts to destigmatize mental health. Led by District Governor (DG) Chetan Desai, the campaign leverages social media to unite celebrities, Rotary leaders, and mental health professionals in creating a dialogue around mental health. The message is clear: those suffering from depression, anxiety, and other mental health challenges should not remain silent but seek



help. The campaign, which shares mental health facts, helpline numbers, and personal stories, has reached a broad audience and sparked conversations that help break down the stigma surrounding mental health issues.





#### **AWARENESS WORKSHOPS**

In addition to digital efforts, the Mental Health Avenue of D-3141 has organized numerous awareness workshops targeting various communities, including students from night schools, orphanages, and juvenile rehabilitation centers. These workshops cover vital topics such as substance abuse, digital wellbeing, exam stress, and healthy boundaries. Through art therapy, group discussions, and videos, these sessions provide practical coping strategies, emphasize early intervention, and foster a supportive environment.

A highlight of these efforts has been the involvement of youth through live quizzes, role plays, and games. These activities empower students to understand the importance of mental well-being, addiction prevention, and how to handle peer pressure. Training teachers to recognize early signs of mental health issues and prioritize self-care has also been a crucial component, enabling more robust grassroots support for mental health awareness among teenagers and young adults.

One of the significant

achievements by the Avenue is the training of over 300 doctors in Tobacco Cessation Therapies, in three different dental colleges in Bangalore. This training emphasized a holistic approach to tobacco cessation, equipping medical professionals with the tools necessary to support those battling addiction effectively

#### **MEDICAL CAMPS**

The Avenue's commitment to mental health extends to initiatives like medical camps. Mental health is given equal importance alongside physical health at these camps. and teenagers participate in activities designed to introduce them to mental health concepts in fun and accessible ways.

The recent mega medical camp organized by the District saw over 3000 footfalls, which provided screening and consulting opportunities for numerous beneficiaries.

#### **COLLABORATION AND IMPACT**

Collaboration has been crucial to the Avenue's success in these mental health endeavors. Working with organizations like Mpower (Aditya Birla Foundation), the Tata Institute of Social Sciences, and

the Agrim Agarwal Foundation, the Avenue has expanded the reach of its initiatives creating a powerful network of Rotaractors, Inner Wheel members, and other community stakeholders have contributed to making these programs a reality. These efforts have helped us reach over 5,000 students in just a short span of two months. Furthermore, the Avenue has gone beyond district borders collaborating with Districts 3142, 3132, and 3192 to carry out various mental health projects. This collaboration has broadened the scope and amplified the impact of these initiatives, further cementing Rotary's role as a leader in mental health advocacy.

#### **FUTURE PLANS**

The Avenue team has lined up several impactful mental health initiatives like walkathons, street plays, messaging through comedy shows, and conclaves to creatively engage the community and break taboos around mental health. Led by DG Chetan Desai, these efforts are setting a global precedent to leave a lasting impact by promoting and supporting mental health worldwide.

K.V. Premraj's opening address emphasized the immense cultural heritage our country harbours and that the District 'Sanskriti' team would spotlight these gems. Premraj urged the gathering to immerse themselves in the profound history of the Kanheri Caves, a legacy stretching 2,500 years.

District Governor Chetan Desai conveyed his delight at choosing Kanheri Caves as the inaugural Sanskriti project. Recalling his tenure as Club President of



The caves, renowned for their stupas and viharas, showcased beautiful sculptures and an ingenious water supply system with multiple storage tanks, epitomising ancient engineering prowess.

The participation of 106 representatives from the Rotary Clubs of Borivli, Dahisar, National Park, Kandivali and Parleshwar made it inclusive. K.V.Premraj

and Girish Waingankar planned and executed the heritage walk, a celebration of our cultural heritage. It fostered a deeper appreciation for India's historical treasures, reinforcing the importance of cherishing them.
