










The power to ACT is within you. Use it. Remember two things when you ACT:



# The Journey of VIBRANT DISTRICT GOVERNOR CHETAN DESAI

nce upon a time in bustling Mumbai, two eight-year-old boys, Chetan and Ketan, forged an unbreakable bond of friendship. Chetan was an ordinary boy, while Ketan faced the challenges of polio, which often hindered his daily activities in school. Despite this, the duo was inseparable. Chetan's compassion and empathy set him apart from his peers. He could not bear to see his friend feeling isolated and excluded from the lively activities on the school playground.

While other children played games, Chetan chose to spend his playtime with Ketan, ensuring his friend never felt alone. This simple yet profound act of friendship blossomed into a lifelong bond between the two boys. As they grew older, Chetan's support for Ketan never wavered. He helped Ketan with school assignments and provided the encouragement needed to overcome life's challenges. Their bond, forged in childhood, remained strong through adulthood, continuing to the present day.

Now, as Chetan prepares to step into the role of Rotary District Governor, his early demonstration of empathy and kindness shines brightly. His journey from a compassionate child to a leader in the community exemplifies the values that Rotary stands for. Chetan's story is a poignant reminder that true leadership is

rooted in compassion, and his lifelong friendship with Ketan is a beautiful testament to the power of enduring kindness.

## THE RISE AND RISE OF CHETAN DESAI: A LEADER IN ROTARY

Chetan Desai was born and raised in Mumbai, where his journey of compassion and leadership began. He was a high school topper. He pursued Mechanical Engineering and later transitioned into the IT industry, becoming an entrepreneur. As the Business Director of Vibrant ETechnologies Private Limited, a high-end networking and software consultancy company with offices in India, the USA, and the UK, Chetan's professional achievements were numerous.





Vibrant ETechnologies has been recognized multiple times as one of the best training partners for Microsoft and Redhat. Chetan has the distinction of being amongst the first Microsoft Certified Trainer in India.

Chetan's journey with Rotary began in 2003-04 when he joined the Club of Borivili. His impact was immediate, earning him the award for the best new Rotarian. He embraced the challenge of leading the Rotary Club of Borivili as President for the 2008-09 Rotary year. His tenure was action-packed, and the Club bagged eighteen awards from RI and the District, including the Excellent President Award, Best International Service Project, Most Unusual Project, and Best Cooperative Project for the "KANHERI FESTIVAL." This project garnered coverage in ROTARY NEWS Magazine, Mumbai Mirror, and other publications.

Chetan's success at the club level led to challenging assignments at the district level. As the District's Rotary Youth Exchange Avenue Chair in 2011-12 and 2012-13, he achieved a remarkable 100% growth in the Long-Term Exchange Program, STEP, and NGEP Program. His efforts made District 3140 the top district in India for sending the maximum number of

Long-Term Exchange students.

In 2012, Chetan had the rare distinction of being on the fivemember Findings Committee appointed by Rotary International at the Youth Exchange Preconvention meet in Bangkok. As an Assistant Governor in 2013-14, he was awarded as a Diamond AG for his efforts in gathering TRF from clubs under his purview. One of the clubs under his guidance, Mumbai Lakers, was adjudged the Most Vibrant Club in the world. He played significant roles as Co-Convener of PETS 2011 and Convener of the District Membership Seminar in 2014.

Avenue Chair in 2014-15, Chetan conceptualized RISE (Rotary Inducts for Service and Excellence and Retain and Induct for Service Excellence) with a unique point system, which was well-received by WOW presidents across the district. District 3140 inducted 1,541 new members and chartered eleven new clubs with an average of forty members per club. Chetan and his team made history by chartering RC Mumbai Western Elite with 125 members, the largest club of charter in district 3140.

Chetan received Rotary International's prestigious "Club Builder" Award in 2014-15 and the "Avenues

of Services" award in 2016. He received prestigious TRF's District Service Awards thrice. He completed both levels of leadership training at the Rotary Institute of Leadership and is a certified Training Leader.

During the peak year of 2015-16, as District Secretary, he was instrumental in getting a record 110 clubs to qualify for the RI Presidential Citation, the highest in the Rotary world. He won the "Avenues of Services" award in 2016. He received prestigious TRF's District Service Awards thrice. He completed both levels of leadership training at the Rotary Institute of Leadership and is a certified Training Leader.

Chetan continued to serve in various leadership roles, including Training Facilitator and TRF Avenue Co-Chair in 2016-17. He received the District Service Award for his work as co-chair of a TRF Team

As an Assistant Trainer and District Conference Co-Chair in 2017-18, he oversaw ROTARY UTSAV conference. As a Chief Avenue

Head of community service in 2018-29, he led five verticals under the Community Service Avenue. He played a crucial role in getting into the Guinness Book of World Records for the Rotary Humsafar Project, which created awareness about eye, skin, organ, and diabetes prevention.

In 2019-20, as the Avenue Chair for a significant TRF Avenue. Chetan led the district to collect a record \$4 million for the foundation, the highest ever for District 3141 and the second highest in the

entire Rotary World. Despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, his leadership was exemplary.

During the Rotary year 2020-21, as District Project Director, Chetan led the Annapoorna Project, providing over two million meals and 17,000 ration kits to the hungry in RID 3141. The Baghbaan Project under his leadership provided ration. equipment, and wheelchairs to old age homes, and the Baghbaan Sangeet Utsav, a musical program for senior citizens, was a

tremendous success.

Chetan is a Major Donor, PHS member and a Gold Pin recipient for introducing over ten new members to the fold. His philanthropic spirit extends to many charitable endeavours. Notable amongst them was the contribution to Rotary Club of Borivili Charitable Trust to help creation of an eye bank in honour of his mother.

In recognition of his contributions, his parent club honoured him with









in

the Rotary Borivli Ratna Award in 2020-21. He was appointed as Principal Aide – TRF and Avenue Chair for Baghbaan in 2021-22 and led a historical tie-up with the Shankar Mahadevan Academy for Baghbaan.

He is also a founder member and director of an affiliate of the International Council for Small Business in India.

Chetan won the District Governor 2024-25 election by a significant margin, a testament to his leadership and dedication.

He believes in Power of Now and his hobbies are Reading, Singing and Cricket. He actively plays in



IFCR cricket tournaments and has the honour of becoming first IFCR member to have risen to the post of District Governor.

Chetan is indebted to his parents for instilling the right values and compassion. Chetan recognises it is the solid support of his wife, Jwala that has helped him carve a niche for himself. According to Jwala, "Chetan exemplifies the perfect balance between personal and professional life. Amidst managing a successful business and passionately serving the community through Rotary, he remains a devoted son, a doting father, and an extraordinary husband. His unwavering commitment to family makes him truly special". A powerful testimonial from a doting wife.

The couple are blessed with two sons. Elder one Krish, 24 years, is perusing M Fin. from UIUC, USA after getting a B Tech from Manipal Institute of Technology. The younger one Yash, a 16-year-old, is back home from Brazil after a year long Rotary Youth Exchange program. He will be starting his junior college soon.

#### In Conversation:

#### **EMBRACING THE ACTION** PLAN FOR A BRIGHTER **FUTURE**

In an exclusive interview with DGE Chetan Desai and Managing Editor Sree Nandy, RIPE Stephanie Urchik shares her vision for the future of Rotary, emphasizing the importance of collaboration, continuity, and the Action Plan in driving impactful and sustainable projects.

Sree: District 3141 has consistently featured among the most giving districts in the Rotary world. Today,

over 6,500 Rotarians from the district are waiting to create magic in your year. What would be your message to them?

Stephanie: You are absolutely correct. Rotary work in this district, as well as elsewhere in India, has been fantastic, with members being generous donors. My hope is that through the District Governors and the Presidents, we embrace the Action Plan, which is the tool that will help our clubs grow from good to great. Once our clubs become irresistible, it will not only help retain current members but also attract new ones who might not fit into our traditional clubs. It's no use bringing in members who will leave within a year. Every

club must embrace the Action
Plan in its own way, as every club
has different cultures, not only in
regions but even within a district.
When people ask, "Where's the
directory?" I say there is none; you
have to use the local.

Sree: The Vibrant year will see an unprecedented number of women Presidents...45 among 115 clubs, to be precise. You are a part of history, being only the second woman RI President in 119 years of Rotary. Do you feel this is a welcome trend, with women participating in more leadership roles in Rotary, and what does it augur for the future of Rotary?

Stephanie: I think it brings balance

to our organization. Most of us in Rotary come from business and industry, and if we had just one gender in our operations, how would that work out? I did not realize that I was only the second woman, but I understand its importance. Women in Rotary feel, if she could do it, so could I, and that makes me absolutely happy. I wish someday we could have a young woman Rotarian here who says, "I am young, and if I could do this, they can do it too." I am also single, and people tell me, "You don't have a partner?" I say no, and they feel they can also do it singly. Having a partner is wonderful, but you can be a great leader, even otherwise.

Sree: Today we found you having an animated conversation with the Peace Scholars. It is something close to your heart. One very interesting project idea from our DGE is setting up Peace Poles at strategic locations. This is a great way to propagate Rotary's vision of peacebuilding and also boost Rotary's public image. Please elaborate on your vision behind this initiative.

Stephanie: We want the world to know that this is what Rotary does, and our Foundation is about world understanding and peace. Every time we make a peace pole in a prominent location, any member of the community who walks by and sees the Rotary logo knows this is what Rotary does. That's my hope: we must get the message to as many Rotary communities and

clubs around the world.

Chetan: Our District will be taking an active role in building Peace Poles around the city.

Sree: You have set out a welldefined Action Plan for Rotarians across the world. Please share with us how this action plan will help Rotarians stay focused and align with the strategic priorities of Rotary.

Chetan: Rotarians often do not understand the practicality of implementing the Action Plan. Can you give us an example of how the Action Plan will help achieve, say, a net growth of 10 percent in membership in District 3141?

Stephanie: It happens differently in every club. One of the priorities is

increasing the impact. Sometimes clubs do the same project over and over again, but its impact decreases. So it's important for the clubs to examine if they are doing the right project. When I say expanding the reach, it means looking out for people who would be good Rotarians but whom we have not reached yet. Maybe they do not fit into the models of our traditional clubs, so we have new models. Next is better engagement, which means everyone in the club has a chance to be a part of something. They are not just coming to meet and have fun. Moreover, it is how we make our clubs learn about continuity and learning new things. There is a delicate balance between change and continuity, but both are important for our organisation.











Meeting with Core team

Sree: DGE Chetan is propagating collaboration and continuity. He has been asking clubs and districts to come together to increase the impact and sustainability of projects. We would like to know your vision of continuity and collaboration in Rotary, given that the entire leadership changes every 12 months.

Stephanie: You are right. It's 12 months, and most positions change. The beauty of that model is you get fresh ideas all the time, but the challenge is that it doesn't promote the continuity of thinking. So we are urging the Presidents and District Governors to work with people before them and those coming after. All of them will have different ideas. This will help the clubs and the districts to move in the right direction. President Gordon McInally, President Stephanie, President Mario, we talk all the time. We are not always in the same place, and we talk on Zoom. We have different ideas, but all of us are focused on moving in the same direction. That's what continuity is: no back and forth. For example, Gordon McInally showed

us how important mental health is. He is leaving office on June 30. It does not mean we let go of a program that has engaged all our Rotarians.

**Sree:** That is something our incoming DGE Chetan is doing. We have a beautiful project, PNI, where we are trying to integrate the people of Kashmir into mainstream India, and DGE Chetan is gracefully taking the project forward.

Chetan: This is a unique project in so many dimensions, where we are bringing about lasting change among the people of Kashmir. Schoolchildren are being helped with transportation at 12,000 feet in Muchhal, which is a difficult terrain. After our District intervened and provided them with two buses, the attrition rate has reduced. We are paying for the fees, training teachers, and wish to donate an Operation Theatre on Wheels. I spoke to the Major General, and I'm going there on May 9th; funds are ready. Once we uplift the Kashmiri people in the valley, peace will prevail. Owing to their economic development over the last two

years, there is a lot of intelligence that our military has received from the local people. This is a project close to my heart, and I am taking it to the next level.

**Sree:** As a Mumbaikar, the sweltering heat has been really bad. You have visited some of the projects today and will be visiting more tomorrow. Would you like to share your experience of witnessing the work being done by Rotarians of D 3141?

Stephanie: I did not notice the heat; what I saw was the magic. When I visited the school for underprivileged children who have been abandoned, I was almost in tears. I was thinking, how can people have children and not want them, and yet we Rotarians want them. We want to educate them, feed them, train them, and give them a future. That, to me, is all worth it. We want to change the world.

All I saw was magic, Stephanie concluded.

#### **INAUGURATION OF NEW INFORMATION CENTRE CUM LIBRARY**

In 2022-23, the Rotary Club of Deonar transformed a twoacre dump ground at Chembur Children's Home, a staterun facility that supports runaway, destitute, and orphaned children at Mankhurd, Mumbai, into a vibrant Bio-Diversity Park. This year, RIPE Stephanie Urchick inaugurated a new Information Centre cum Library within the park. Lauding the club's dedication, she added, "By transforming a neglected area into a centre of learning and biodiversity, they enrich children's lives and demonstrate environmental stewardship." An abandoned structure onsite has been transformed into the Information Centre, offering resources on biodiversity, urban forestation, and habitat retention, benefiting both orphanage residents and visiting students. The transformation included critical repairs such as fixing the roof, installing windows, and extensive plastering and painting. Equipment like cupboards, an audio-visual projector, screen, portable sound system, tables, and chairs have been procured. "These resources will create a comprehensive learning environment, ensuring that students have access to both modern technology and valuable literature," noted Urchick. The project is supported by the club's CSR partner, Rossari Biotech Ltd., and the Ratnanidhi Charitable Trust provided five cupboards and 500 books. "The dedication and hard work of the Rotary Club of Deonar and its partners will leave a lasting legacy," said Urchick. This project stands as a beacon of hope, emphasizing the power of collaboration and the importance of environmental conservation and education.

## VISIT TO SHRUTI SCHOOL, RC BOMBAY WEST

#### PAEDIATRIC HEART SURGERIES AT KOKILABEN DHIRUBAI AMBANI HOSPITAL



RI President-Elect Stephanie Urchik was moved to tears when she toured the Children's Heart Centre at the Kokilaben Dhirubai Ambani Hospital in Mumbai, where one-day-old infants were being treated for congenital heart conditions. Rotary clubs of Mumbai are supporting the heart surgeries for infants in this hospital. "We are performing 1,000 paediatric cardiac procedures a year, that is 4-5 procedures a day. Rotary has helped us scale up the program," said Santosh Shetty, the hospital's executive director. Thanking the doctors for "giving new life to infants," Stephanie said, "I am honored to see what you are doing. If anyone from this hospital comes to Pittsburgh (her hometown), I'll coordinate with the Rotary clubs there so that you have a homestay and other facilities." The Centre's director, Dr. Suresh Rao. sought Rotary's support for a neonatal transport unit (NTU) to bring critically ill newborns and infants from far-flung villages to the hospital for treatment. "Many children die on the way to the hospital. We want a specially designed ambulance to take care of these kids who have to withstand 5-6 hours of travel from places like Pune or Nashik. Such a facility could keep the child alive until he/she gets expert medical help." RID Subramanian sought Rotary's help to fund a highend ambulance. He announced that his personal AKS contribution next year will be for this grant. He added that multiple clubs can come together to sponsor an NTU, and this concept can be spread to other major cities too. Rotarians present were RID Rtn. Raju Subramanian, DGE Rtn. Chetan Desai, Rtn. Khuzem Sakarwala, Rtn. Nazneen Sakarwala, Rtn. Parth Sejpal, and R Anne Natasha Sejpal.

#### NON-INVASIVE AND RADIATION-FREE BREAST CANCER SCREENING CAMP

Cancer is the fastest growing disease in the world and is affecting people of all ages. Rotary District 3141 has entered into an understanding with UE Life Sciences USA, makers of iBreast Exam & CervAlcal, for conducting Breast Screening Camps at very reasonable rates. Rotary Club of Mumbai Nova, along with Rotary Club of Mumbai GenX and Juhu Vile Parle Gymkhana Club, arranged a Breast Cancer Screening Camp on April 28, 2024, Sunday, at the Juhu Gymkhana. RIPE Stephanie Urchik visited the project site where 168 women were examined and 15 women were found with irregularities and required further investigations as advised. Being a lady, she was aware



of the pain women have to go through with mammograms and the aftereffects of radiation. The technology being painfree and radiation-free was something that interested her, and therefore she visited the project and assured her fullest support throughout the year. Under this unique project, the equipment and trained personnel will be made available by the team of iBreastExam. The clubs will have to arrange for the venue and funds for the scanning. If 100 clubs cover 1,000 women over a year, the first target of 1 lakh scans will be achieved. DGE Chetan is also working aggressively to take this project to other Rotary districts who will execute this in coordination with District 3141. As regards cervical cancer, there are options of traditional Pap smear or screening with CervAlcal. Details are being worked out on these options.

#### **BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING**

Cancer Can't Silence Our Courage



It is commendable that Rotary District 3141 is taking proactive steps to address and combat breast and cervical cancer, the two most

common forms of cancer found in India. It has partnered with UE Life Sciences USA to conduct breast and cervical cancer screening camps using iBreast Exam and CervAlcal technologies.

These scans are non-invasive, radiation-free, and can detect cancer at an early stage, improving survival rates. Unlike mammography, iBreastExam is portable & suitable for all above 25 years of age, making it accessible as 1st screening tool to a broader demographic.

The district aims to perform over 100,000 scans, urging clubs to organize camps in their respective areas. While the equipment and trained personnel are provided by iBreastExam, clubs are responsible for arranging venues and funds. Leveraging CSR funds from Companies is identified as a viable funding source. RC of Mumbai Nova will be the coordinating club. The initiative has received enthusiastic support from club presidents, indicating promising community engagement.

We are working on donating a Neonatal ICU Ambulance to provide immediate care during transport, reducing infant mortality by ensuring timely treatment at specialised hospitals.



#### ANAEMIA, THALASSEMIA AND BLOOD DONATION

People Live When People

In India the pervasive issue of anaemia, affecting 53% of women, is exacerbated by poverty, caste issues, and poor sanitation. Thalassemia, a genetic disorder, compounds this



challenge, particularly when both partners carry the trait, necessitating lifelong blood transfusions for offspring survival. The gravity of the situation, especially in Mumbai where there is notably high demand for blood transfusions, prompts DG Chetan Desai to designate anaemia and thalassemia as primary focus areas.

To combat these issues, anaemia testing camps for women will be organized across diverse locales at an estimated cost of ₹3100 for 100 beneficiaries.

Additionally, thalassemia screening, along with anaemia testing, is planned for adolescent girls in educational institutions and rural settings, requiring approximately ₹12000 for 100 beneficiaries.

Furthermore, blood donation camps are scheduled for July 1st at railway stations, with 75 clubs already committed to the cause. Each camp, anticipated to cost between ₹25,000 to ₹26,000, a substantial impact is expected. Collaboration is crucial to achieving these goals and ushering in positive change. Let's unite in our endeavours to save lives and make a meaningful difference in our communities. Together, we can create magic and contribute to a healthier world.

Despite India's E-Waste (Management) Rules, enforcement remains challenging. To address this, the Mumbai Municipal Corporation, NGOs, and educational institutions conduct awareness campaigns and organize e-waste collection drives.

Rotary and InnerWheel Clubs (IWC) play a vital role, in collecting substantial amounts of e-waste and generating revenue for community projects. 14,401 kg in the year 2019-20, 45,000 kg -2020-2021, 21-22 -17,683 kg for IWC alone. Rotary and IWC managed to generate a fair amount of revenue from this e-waste, which was used



in donating, oximeters, and oxygen concentrators and assisted in the building of the ecotourism centre at Vasai.

"Circuit to Success" symbolizes the journey towards sustainable e-waste management, highlighting the importance of responsible actions and the potential for positive outcomes. It emphasizes empowerment, innovation, and economic development within a circular economy framework.

- 3-5% admin fee applicable, can be paid by Club Members
- Full Contribution Counts towards Club TRF giving and Donor TRF recognition
- DDF + its World Match: available for a GG
- Application, evaluation, approval, and reporting to RF(I), Delhi
- Usually approved within 2-weeks
- All Funds are to be sent only after approval and usually will be transferred to the Club's CSR dedicated a/c in 7 days after receipt by RF(I)
- No International partner is needed
- Community needs assessment recommended, not mandatory
- Certain Construction activities are permitted
- Cannot be used for operational costs like salary, but Training costs are permitted
- 1 CSR India Grant: 1 Company: 1 MOU
- Maximum-5 open CSR India Grants per club
- Hand holding by RISAO and District CSR Support Team

#### SUSTAINABLE TRIBAL WELFARE & VILLAGE **ADOPTION**

Journey towards Holistic Development

The Vibrant Avenue of Sustainable Tribal Welfare, led by Dr. Ranjit Bijoor under Rotary District 3141, plans to address critical needs in rural and tribal areas: malnutrition, health issues, water scarcity, unemployment, education gaps, and inadequate

infrastructure.

Key projects include:

- 1. Health Initiatives: Training village couples for disease diagnosis, health data mapping, and providing medical equipment.
- 2. Agriculture and Water Projects: Installing solar-powered pumps, constructing artificial ponds, and promoting agro-education.
- 3. Self-Empowerment Programs: Providing sewing machines, establishing bamboo processing centers, and creating microprocessing centers.
- 4. Environmental Projects: Mass fruit tree plantations and bore well rejuvenation.
- 5. **Educational and Skilling Programs:** "Kishori Vikas" for menstrual hygiene, "Madhav Shikshan Kendra" for personality grooming, and setting up computer centers.
- 6. Infrastructure Development: Installing solar lights, piped water systems, and repairing state nurseries.
- 7. Emerging Agricultural Practices: Training in precision farming, hydroponics, aquaponics, and IoT-based techniques. The program educates tribals on leveraging government schemes and partners with local bodies and NGOs for sustainability.

In addition to these initiatives, the program aims to educate tribals on how to leverage government schemes effectively.

Partnerships with local bodies and NGOs are critical to ensuring the projects' sustainability and maintenance, promoting long-term community development.

#### SAMAAVESH- PROJECT NATIONAL INTEGRATION

"One Nation, Many Hearts: Together We Thrive."

**Project National Integration** (PNI) tackles the longstanding challenges in Kashmir, affected by terrorism for nearly 40 years, which weakened administration and economic development. Thanks to government and Army efforts, terrorism is now at an alltime low. The Army's "Sadbhavna" program aids civilians in forward areas.

In October 2021, Rtn. Sunil Anand (RC Bombay Mahakali Heights) responded to a request for assistance. After a thorough study and inputs from Rtn. Sunil Anand and Rtn. Amit Sheth (RC Bombay Powai), Machhil (population 17,000) was chosen for initial projects in education and healthcare, totalling ₹ 5 crores in 2023-24.

Following the pilot's success, Rotary District 3141 expanded the initiative to Kupwara town, Keran, Tithwal, and Tangdhar, aiming to benefit 875,000 people in 116 villages. In May 2024, a team led by Vibrant DG Chetan Desai conducted a need analysis, identifying requirements such as mobile operation theatres, cardiac ambulances, medical equipment, school buses, toilet blocks, and solar systems for Army Goodwill Schools.

## Transforming Anganwadis into

## VIBRANT CENTRES OF EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

N the heartlands of Palghar District, a transformative initiative is underway to illuminate the futures of our youngest learners. Welcome to the Vibrant Anganwadi Project (VAP), a visionary endeavour to reshape Anganwadis into vibrant early childhood education hubs (ECE) for tribal chaildren aged 3 to 6. Spearheaded by a dedicated team of visionaries and educators, this project stands poised to rewrite the narrative of educational access and excellence.

#### THE PROGRAMME OBJECTIVE:

The mission is clear: to empower Anganwadi workers and supervisors to orchestrate a symphony of learning and growth within these pivotal early years. Through targeted capacity-building workshops and resource mobilisation efforts, the project aims to equip these educators with the tools and knowledge necessary to nurture young minds effectively.





#### WHERE IS IT PLANNED?

Palghar District serves as the canvas for this transformative endeavour, and the project will unfold across three key areas: two in Jawhar and one in Mokhada.

#### **HOW WILL IT WORK?**

The journey unfolds across four distinct phases, each meticulously crafted to realise the programme's objectives:

1. Preparatory and Resource Mobilisation Phase: Setting

the stage for success by introducing the project to district functionaries, establishing model Anganwadis, and conducting baseline data collection.

Creation of Resource
 Group & Start of
 Universalisation: Building the
 project's backbone through
 training a dedicated resource
 group and initiating beat-level
 training sessions.

#### 3. Universalisation

Phase: Cascading the programme's impact across all levels through beat-level training sessions facilitated by the resource group.

 Programme Completion and Stabilisation Phase: Achieving full coverage across 436 Anganwadis, with government and ICDS functionaries assuming responsibility for programme continuation and final assessments.















#### WHAT WILL WE ACHIEVE?

The impact of this project reverberates across communities, touching the lives of over 26,000 children, 436 Anganwadi Sevikas, 436 Anganwadi Helpers, 17 ICDS Supervisors, 3 Child Development Project Officers, and 52,320 parents.

#### COST SUMMARY – FUNDING REQUIREMENT:

The total amount required for the three-year programme is Rs 5,60,00,000, with an average cost per Anganwadi over the entire programme duration amounting to Rs 1,28,574. Of this total, Rs 75,00,000 has been raised for the 38 Model Anganwadis covered in the preparatory phase, with a per-Anganwadi cost of Rs 1,97,368. The remaining amount of Rs 4,85,00,000 needs to be raised for the implementation phase, with a per-Anganwadi cost of Rs 1,21,859.

#### **RECOGNITION:**

For clubs or donors contributing Rs 1,21,859, the opportunity arises to leave an indelible mark on the project. Anganwadis can be named after the contributing entity, with examples such as "RC ABC Vibrant Anganwadi (President Name)" or "Matushree Rasikaben Dholakia Vibrant Anganwadi, RC ABC Club (President Name)."

## **INVOLVEMENT FROM ROTARY DISTRICT 3141:**

With the balance funds required totalling Rs 4.85 Cr, the Rotary District's engagement is paramount in bridging the gap and realising the project's full potential.

In addition to financial support, Rotary District 3141 can play a pivotal role in amplifying the project's impact through various strategic initiatives. By spearheading marketing and communication activities, the district can raise awareness and garner support from a broader audience. Jointly planning the launch event on July 24 offers an opportunity to showcase collective commitment and enthusiasm towards the project's success. Creating an events and communication calendar ensures consistent engagement and outreach efforts throughout the project duration, while social media interventions provide a platform for storytelling and community engagement.

Furthermore, the District's oversight is crucial in ensuring the project's efficacy and sustainability. Through ongoing site visits, quarterly calls to discuss progress, and detailed annual reviews from both implementation and impact perspectives, the district can provide invaluable guidance and support. Interaction with government officials strengthens partnerships and facilitates alignment with broader educational initiatives. Together, these efforts bolster Rotary District 3141's integral role in driving positive change and transforming communities through education.



# Beyond HILANTHROPY

**CSR** and Rotary

CSR, or Corporate Social Responsibility, broadly refers to the work and activities undertaken by corporations towards social causes and development, the environment, disaster relief, and community support. CSR was made mandatory for companies in India by the Companies Act of 2013.

Every company that needs to comply with the CSR provisions has to spend 2% of the average net profits made during the preceding three years as per the CSR policy. The provisions of CSR apply to every company fulfilling any of the following conditions in the preceding financial year:

- ♣ Net worth of more than INR 500 crore.
- ♣ Turnover of more than INR 1000 crore.
- Net profit of more than INR 5 crore.

#### **Activities permitted under CSR** include:

Eradicating hunger, poverty, and



malnutrition; promoting health care, including preventive health care and sanitation.

- 2 Promoting education, including special education and employment-enhancing vocational skills, especially among children, women, the elderly, and the differently abled, and engaging in livelihood enhancement projects.
- 3 Promoting gender equality, empowering women, setting up homes and hostels for women and orphans, setting up old age homes, daycare centres. and other facilities for senior citizens, and implementing measures to reduce inequalities faced by socially

and economically backward groups.

- 4 Ensuring environmental sustainability, ecological balance, protection of flora and fauna, animal welfare, agroforestry, conservation of natural resources, and maintaining the quality of soil, air, and water, including contributions to the Clean Ganga Fund set up by the Central Government for the rejuvenation of the river Ganga.
- 5 Protecting national heritage, art, and culture, including the restoration of buildings and sites of historical importance and works of art; setting up public libraries; and promoting and developing traditional art and handicrafts.
- Implementing measures for the benefit of armed forces veterans, war widows and their dependents, Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) and Central Paramilitary Forces (CPMF) veterans, and their dependents, including widows.
- Training to promote rural sports, nationally recognized sports, Paralympic sports, and Olympic sports.
- Contributing to the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund, the Prime Minister's









Citizen Assistance and Relief in Emergency Situations Fund (PM CARES Fund), or any other fund set up by the Central Government for socio-economic development



- and relief and welfare of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, minorities, and women.
- 9 Contributing to incubators or Research and Development projects in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and medicine, funded by the Central Government, State Government, Public Sector Undertaking, or any agency of the Central Government or State Government and Universities.
- 10 Undertaking rural development projects.
- 11 Developing slum areas where 'Slum area' shall mean any area declared as such by the Central Government, any State Government, or any other competent authority under any law for the time being in force.

12 Managing disasters, including relief, rehabilitation, and reconstruction activities.

Permitted spending in points 1-4, 7, 10, and 12 above is aligned with the Focus Areas of Rotary, and we can undertake CSR India Grants with projects in any of these areas.

Rotary has specifically launched CSR India Grants to partner with corporations. Details of CSR India Grants appear further in this GML.

#### Let's start with WHAT IS **INTERACT?**

Interact Clubs, founded in 1962 for 12-18 years, focus on youth development through service. Interact stands for International Action and their motto is "Progress Through Service". Interact Clubs require sponsorship by a Rotary Club. There are over 342,953 members in 14,911 clubs worldwide. There are two types of clubs: school and communitybased.

#### How does one charter an Interact club?

- Fill out & sign the Interact Club Certification Form with your club & district leaders.
- Scan and email the form to the District Interact Chairperson.

(Alternatively, fax or mail to Rotary International South Asia).

- No fee is required to charter an Interact Club.
- Allow 4-6 weeks for processing and charter certificate to arrive at sponsoring Rotary Club.
- Celebrate your launch with an event after receiving the charter.

#### What is our responsibility as a sponsoring Rotary Club?

- Before chartering a new Interact Club ensure the existing Interact clubs are fully functional.
- Ensure that each Interact Club has a president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer. Clubs can establish additional officer positions with the approval of the sponsor club.
- Ensure that one updates Interact Club Advisor

information on the RI website. Failure to do so would eventually lead to the termination of the Interact Club.


