

Olayinka Hakeem Babalola

selected to be 2026-27

Rotary International president


Olayinka Hakeem Babalola, a member of the Rotary Club of Trans Amadi, Nigeria, has been selected by the Board of Directors to become Rotary International's president for 2026-27. His term will begin on 1 July 2026.

The Board, guided by the RI code of policies, conducted a special session to select the organization's leader after the resignation of RI President-elect SangKoo Yun, who decided to step back from his Rotary responsibilities and focus on his recovery from recent cancer treatment.

Babalola began his Rotary journey in 1988 as a Rotaractor. He joined the Rotary Club of Trans Amadi six years later. His leadership roles include serving as district governor (2011-12), RI vice president (2019-20), and member of the RI Board (2018-20). He was also an active leader and participant in RI committees such as the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee (2017-23) and the Nigeria National PolioPlus Committee (2013-present, adviser 2016-present).

An attorney, Babalola received a university degree in engineering in 1988. He has worked for 25 years in the oil and gas industry, holding senior positions in Shell PLC and carrying out projects on four continents. He is the founder of two companies: Riviera Services Ltd., an oil and gas infrastructure delivery company, and Lead and Change Consulting, an executive coaching and organizational performance advisory group.

Babalola's professional affiliations include the Nigerian Society of Engineers, the Institute of Safety Professionals, and the Association of Change Management Practitioners. He is a member of Jericho Business Club, an organization in his home city that provides input to governments on economic and social policy.



Babalola and his wife, Preba, live in the city of Port Harcourt. He supports The Rotary Foundation with a named endowment and as an Arch Klumph Society member. A trustee of ShelterBox UK and director of the Safe Blood Africa project, he is a recipient of the Africa Centennial Heroes Award, the Regional Service Award for a Polio-Free World, the RI Service Above Self Award, and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service.

The president of Rotary International serves a one-year term, presiding over the Board of Directors and providing inspirational leadership for the organization. As the spokesperson for the global network, the president visits clubs around the world to promote Rotary's values and represent the organization at major events. Rotary chooses its president from members who have demonstrated extensive leadership experience within Rotary, including service as a club president, district governor, and member of the Board.

Larry A. Lunsford

selected to be 2027-28

Rotary International president

Larry A. Lunsford, a member of the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza, Missouri, USA, is the selection of the nominating committee to become Rotary International's president for 2027-28. He will officially become the president-nominee on 15 September if no other candidates challenge him.

Lunsford attended Truman State University in Kirksville, Missouri, on an academic scholarship, earning bachelor's and master's degrees in accounting. He first encountered Rotary when he received a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship to spend the 1981-82 academic year at the University of Newcastle in Australia.

A certified public accountant, Lunsford spent seven years working for Ernst & Young before joining a family-owned business, Bernstein-Rein Advertising, in 1990. He is currently executive vice president and chief financial officer for the Bernstein group of companies. He has held positions on the boards of the Kansas City Spirit Festival and the Variety Club as well as serving as director of a local bank and treasurer of the Epilepsy Foundation for the Heart of America. He has also served on Truman State University's alumni and foundation boards and received the university's Distinguished Service Award.

Lunsford joined the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza in 1991 and has since served as district governor (2001-02), RI director (2013-15), and trustee of The Rotary Foundation (2021-25, vice chair 2024-25). He has been a member of RI committees, including the Executive Committee (chair 2014-15),



Membership Growth Committee (chair 2016-18), and Nominating Committee for President of RI (chair 2023-24). He also has served on The Rotary Foundation's Executive Committee (chair 2023-24), Finance Committee (chair 2022-23 and 2024-25), and Participant Experience Committee (chair 2023-24).

Lunsford has been awarded The Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award, The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service, and the RI Service Above Self Award. He and his wife, Jill Lunsford, have two children and one grandchild. They are Major Donors, Bequest Society members, multiple Paul Harris Fellows, Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation, and Sustaining Members.



OUTSTANDING CLUB



ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLIANCE MANDATORY GOALS

1. Submit 1st Semiannual R.I. Dues by 31st August 2025
2. Submit 2nd Semiannual R.I. Dues by 28th February 2026
3. Clear District Dues no later than 31st August 2025
4. Ensure Payment to Rotary News Trust by 20th August 2025
5. Mandatory Participation in PELS at Guwahati

(In case of new member, reporting in CMR will be accepted with membership ID within 1 (one) month from the date of induction including District Dues)



MEMBERSHIP (5/7 goals must be achieved)

1. Achieve a net 10% increase in total club membership by June 30, 2026
2. Induct at least one new member under the age of 40, fostering youth leadership.
3. Ensure the induction of at least one female member, promoting inclusivity.
4. Welcome at least one past or present Rotaractor into the club, reinforcing the Rotary–Rotaract continuum.
5. Maintain 100% member retention, cultivating strong engagement and long-term commitment.
6. Sponsor one new Rotary Club, contributing to Rotary's expansion and service footprint.
7. Sponsor an RCC (Rotary Community Corps) or a Satellite Club, to empower grassroots leadership and extend community service.



THE ROTARY FOUNDATION (9/13 goals must be achieved)

1. Annual Fund - Minimum contribution of USD 100 per club by 31st July 2025.
2. All members to contribute a minimum of USD 25 by 30th June 2026.
3. Induct a minimum of 2 new Paul Harris Fellows (PHFs).
4. Elevate at least 2 existing PHFs to Multiple Paul Harris Fellow (MPHF) level.
5. Ensure at least 1 Paul Harris Society (PHS) member from the club.
6. Secure 1 new Major Donor from the club.
7. Minimum USD 100 contribution to the Polio Fund.
8. Participate in at least 1 Global Grant Project.
9. Execute 1 CSR Project through The Rotary Foundation (TRF).
10. APF \$80 Per Capita, EREY, 100% PHF Club recognition
11. Participate in the "USD10 PolioPlus Club" — 100% members contribute USD 10 each to celebrate World Polio Day in October
12. At least one member to contribute INR 25,000 to become a District End Polio Fellow.
13. Minimum one contribution of USD 1,000 to the District Pooled Endowment Fund.



PUBLIC IMAGE (7/9 goals must be achieved)

1. Organise High-Visibility Public Events such as Walkathons, Marathons, Bicycle/Bike/Car Rallies, Sports Meets, or Human Chains to enhance Rotary's community presence.
2. Conduct a Polio Awareness Rally on World Polio Day with 24th Oct 2025, reinforcing Rotary's mission for a polio-free world.
3. Adopt and Maintain a Public Space — be it a Garden, Park, Road, or Traffic Island — as a symbol of civic responsibility.
4. Install Rotary Signage or Displays through Temporary Hoardings, Buses, Autos, Tota, Railways, or Airports for impactful brand visibility.
5. Mark special days like Peace Day (Feb 23), Women's Day, No Tobacco Day, and more with vibrant Public Image events.
6. Ensure at least one active social media presence to share Rotary stories, projects, and community milestones.
7. Feature club activities in local newspapers or electronic media to boost awareness and engagement
8. Publish club highlights in Rotary News, showcasing achievements to a broader Rotary audience.
9. Promote the "4-Way Test" prominently in your Rotarian office or place of work.



SERVICE PROJECTS GOALS (5/7 goals must be achieved)

1. Undertake at least 1 impactful Service Project aligned with any of the 7 Areas of Focus of Rotary International.
2. Organize a PolioPlus Awareness Program during the month of Oct'25, reinforcing Rotary's commitment to end polio.
3. Upload a minimum of 3 completed Service Projects to the Rotary Showcase platform by June 2026
4. Implement at least 2 high-impact projects under the Basic Education and Literacy
5. Execute a minimum of 1 project focused on Environmental Protection, for a sustainable planet.
6. Carry out at least 1 project under District 3240 through Foundation, District, or Global Grants to create an impact
7. Complete at least 1 project funded through a C.S.R. (Corporate Social Responsibility) Grant.



NEW GENERATION SERVICE (5/7 goals must be achieved)

1. Collaborate on at least one impactful Service Project with a Rotaract or Interact Club.
2. Sponsor the formation or support of one Rotaract Club, nurturing Youngs for future Rotary leaders.

OUTSTANDING PRESIDENT
