ROTARY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

October is Rotary's Community Economic Development Month, a time to highlight our efforts to help communities build thriving, sustainable futures. This month's observance aligns directly with the Rotary core value of leadership.

Leadership means empowering people to guide their own progress. This is precisely what Rotary's economic development projects aim to achieve.

Consider a recent initiative in southern India where Rotary members empowered women of the Adivasi tribal groups through sewing training to earn a living and regain social inclusion. Historically, widows and abandoned women in this region lose social standing and face social exclusion or blame for their circumstances. Opportunities for self-support or training are minimal.

This year, the Rotary Club of Windsor Roseland, Ontario, partnered with clubs in Districts 3203 and 3234 in India—and with the Indian organization Sevalaya Trust—to provide sewing machines and training to 80 Adivasi women. They learned to stitch saree blouses, kurta tunics, and salwar suits, enabling them to support themselves and their families. Each woman received a certificate upon completing the program, and the sewing machine provider offered free long-term maintenance. The project delivered vital income and dignity to women ostracized by society after widowhood.

This story exemplifies Rotary leadership in action: local people guiding solutions that address their community needs. Our role is not to deliver charity or impose external models, but to foster self-reliance by investing in leadership, skills, and sustainable enterprise.



This October, I invite Rotary members worldwide to reflect on economic leadership in their communities. Who is stepping forward to lead local economic initiatives? Where is untapped talent that could benefit from training or mentorship? How can your club catalyze opportunity through partnerships with local businesses, vocational schools, or savings groups? Leadership is not always visible. Sometimes it means listening, collaborating, and amplifying the voices of others. This approach lies at the heart of Rotary's philosophy and our lasting impact on economic development.

By building capacity—through microcredit groups, vocational training workshops, or entrepreneurship programs—we enable communities to lead their own transformation. When people take ownership of their progress, change becomes sustainable.

Let us lead with good intention and provide support with heart. By nurturing local leadership, we create opportunities that ripple through communities, empowering individuals, families, and societies.

Together, we can support economies that work for everyone and implement community development projects that endure.

ELIMINATING CERVICAL CANCER: ROTARY'S NEXT HEALTH MISSION



Few diseases highlight health inequality more sharply than cervical cancer. Globally, one woman dies every 90 seconds – 346,000 annually – with 94% of deaths occurring in low- and middle-income countries. Yet cervical cancer is among the most preventable and curable cancers.

In Great Britain, HPV vaccination and cervical screening are free through the NHS, but uptake remains uneven. Screening attendance in England is just over 69%, leaving nearly one in three women untested. Post-pandemic, participation has fallen further, especially among younger women. HPV vaccination, offered to children aged 12–13, is widely available but not yet at levels sufficient to eliminate the disease.

Cervical cancer is caused by persistent infection with high-risk HPV strains. While most infections clear naturally, some progress to precancerous changes that, untreated, develop into cancer over 15–20 years. Vaccination provides lifelong immunity, and screening detects abnormalities early, but barriers such as stigma, misinformation, and fear remain.

Dr John Philip, retired cancer surgeon and member of the Rotary Club of Newbury, draws parallels with Rotary's polio campaign: "Prejudice and misinformation were barriers to polio vaccinations, but our tenacity helped achieve an almost polio-free world. We can apply the same determination to eradicate cervical cancer."

Rotary has already supported over 125 Global Grants worth \$11 million across 40 countries. In Great Britain and Ireland, clubs are uniquely positioned to raise awareness, challenge myths, and guide communities to NHS vaccination and screening programs. By partnering with schools and health providers, Rotarians can boost HPV vaccination, encourage screening, and share reliable information.

As Dr Philip concludes: "Cervical cancer should not be a death sentence. With Rotary's reach worldwide, eliminating this disease is a realistic and achievable goal."

UNITE FOR GOOD: THE POWER OF ROTARY SERVICE



Rotary's unifying themes show how local service adds up to global impact. By pooling passion, expertise, and lived experience, Rotarians strengthen projects, spark new initiatives, and learn together. This collaborative approach reflects Rotary's Action Plan priorities: increasing impact, expanding reach, enhancing engagement, and building adaptability.

Rotary service connects local action with global frameworks — the five Avenues of Service, Foundation Areas of Focus, the UN Sustainable Development Goals, and the Eight Pillars of Positive Peace. In 2022, Rotary added Positive Peace to three Avenues of Service, recognizing that every project — from literacy to clean water — helps create conditions where peace can flourish.

Three unifying themes guide Rotary's service:

- Health & Wellbeing
- Future Generations
- Rebuilding Lives & Communities

At the heart of Rotary is service, transforming lives and leaving a lasting legacy. Individually, projects bring hope and stability; collectively, they demonstrate Rotary's global relevance.

Rotary International President Francesco Arezzo (2025/26) calls on members to Unite for Good, describing the vision as “extraordinary in its simplicity, gravity and impact.” He emphasizes unity across time and space, building on the work of past members and preparing for future generations.

This unity is most visible in Rotary's commitment to a polio-free world. The Global Polio Eradication Initiative shows what is possible when vision, perseverance, and partnership combine. That same spirit of collaboration is needed to confront today's challenges — from climate change to child poverty and mental health.

The message is clear: Rotary service is strongest together. By sharing time, talents, and skills, and aligning projects within unifying themes, Rotarians demonstrate relevance everywhere. Together, we create hope, build peace, and change lives — today and for generations to come.

ROTARY CLUB OF GUWAHATI LUIT: SERVICE HIGHLIGHTS | OCTOBER 2025



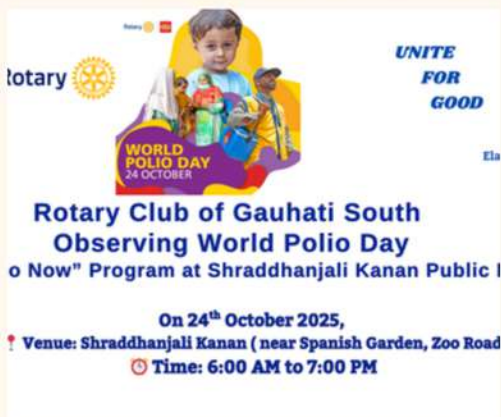

The school was upgraded with functional toilets, handwashing stations, safe drinking water, classroom artwork, play equipment, and mid-day meal plates to improve attendance and reduce dropouts. The club also advanced Women Empowerment through a vocational sewing training programme at the Rotary Luit Skill Centre. Nineteen beneficiaries completed training and received certificates, enabling sustainable livelihood opportunities. The month concluded with a Polio Awareness Programme and Rally in collaboration with the Interact Club of Bengali High School, spreading awareness through student participation, rallies, and community engagement. 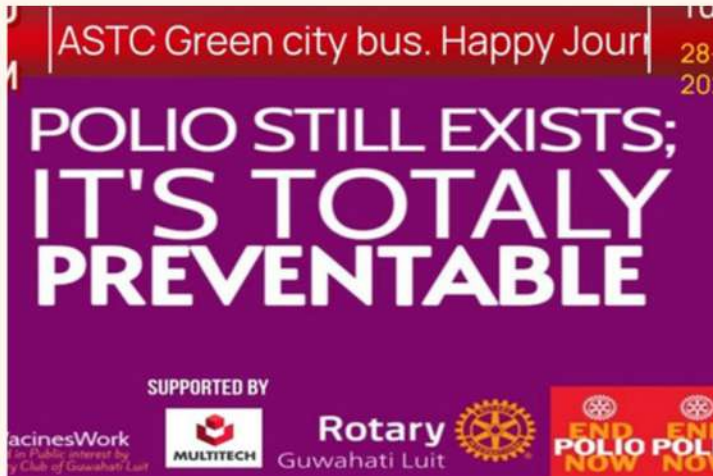

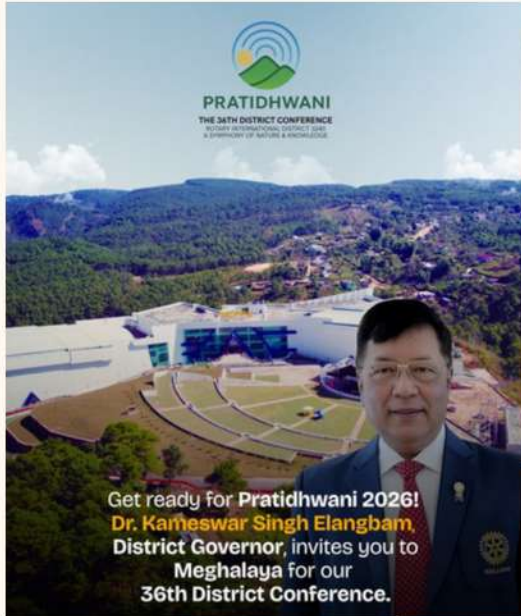

EDITORIAL
