MESSAGE FROM ROTARY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT



Dear fellow Rotary leaders,

If we are to truly change the world with The Magic of Rotary, it's up to all of us to foster a sense of belonging in our clubs. But every club should take its own path to get there, and the Action Plan can help you find your way. What does that look like?

Take for instance the Rotary Club of Beveren-Waas in Belgium. It was chartered in 1974 but has evolved with the times, developing both a strategic plan and a membership plan. To find new members, the club analyzes the city's professions to help focus its search, and all new members are quickly assigned tasks and roles.

The club also mixes up meeting times, alternating between evening and afternoon sessions, making them accessible for all members.

Sometimes, circumstances force clubs to make changes. But as people of action, we know that behind every obstacle is an opportunity.

The Rotary Club of Holyoke in Massachusetts was forced

from its meeting place because of rising costs after the COVID-19 pandemic, but members took this setback and turned it into a strength. The club started meeting in a library community room that was available for no charge and catering lunch from a nearby deli. Lunch costs \$10 per person but it's optional, so no one has to spend money to attend a meeting. What a great way to work toward being "fair to all concerned."

Since making this change, the Holyoke club has gained 13 members. I suspect part of its membership growth is due to the club's sense of inclusivity — the first step toward belonging.

If you ask members what they expect from the club experience, you might find that your club doesn't meet expectations. Think of this as an opportunity to reshape your club in exciting ways, as alternative club models are making a positive impact.

For example, a Rotary Fellowship called Beers Rotarians Enjoy Worldwide, or BREW, has worked closely with the Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene Rotary Action Group for the past eight years to assist with clean water projects. In that time, BREW has funnelled 25 percent of its dues to those initiatives. BREW is one of many examples of members pursuing belonging to improve the world.

I can't stress enough the importance of belonging. Clubs become simply irresistible when all members feel that they are exactly where they need to be. To me, belonging is the spark that ignites The Magic of Rotary.

As you receive feedback from club members and the community you serve, I urge you to pursue that spark. The Action Plan can help you find the path to success, and if you light your way with the spirit of belonging, that path will lead to a bright future for your club, your community, and the world.

Warm Rotary Greetings to all.





"MEMBERSHIP: THE MAGIC BEHIND ROTARY'S IMPACT"



We often introduce Rotary as a service organization, but is that its true essence? While service is vital, Rotary is fundamentally a member organization. It unites individuals from diverse backgrounds into a cohesive global network, nurturing friendship and fellowship among its members.

So, what role does service play in Rotary? Simple camaraderie and fellowship cannot sustain a global community of over 1.2 million Rotarians. Just as language unites a nation, service brings us together worldwide. Whether through friendship exchanges, Vocational Training Teams, Global Grant projects, or various Rotary action groups, service enables us to collaborate for a higher purpose—serving above self.

Working together on such initiatives creates a synergy that results in outcomes far greater than individual efforts.

Consider my experience with a Rotarian friend in Brazil, whom I was introduced to by another Rotarian three years ago. Despite never having met in person, we have collaborated on Global Grant projects totalling 2.5 crores, undertaken by various clubs in both our districts over the past three years, and we are set to support an additional 4 crores this year. We manage these multi-crore projects through Rotary, despite our communications being in different languages-my English and his Portuguese-thanks to translation tools like Google. We have never seen the places where these projects are implemented, yet our friendship and collective vision keep us united in service through Rotary. It all started with our friendship across two continents. Last year, we supported a dialysis center at Parabrahma Hospital in Oachira, a vaccination drive against cervical cancer by the Rotary Club of Karunagapally, and a pearl culture project in the Amazon by a Brazilian Rotary Club. We would laugh over the phone as we struggled to pronounce each other's project locations. While it's challenging for him to say Oachira or Karunagapally, I find it equally difficult to pronounce Caruaru-Sul, their project location in Brazil. But as Shakespeare puts it in his famous play Romeo and Juliet, "What's in a name?" For the name has little significance; it is the impact created in both communities through Rotary that truly matters.

As membership is a thrust area, it is crucial to focus not just on service but on welcoming more friends into our Rotary family. By fostering more relationships, we lay the groundwork for meaningful collaboration. When such friendships are nurtured, service follows naturally as an organic extension of our bonds.

Ultimately, membership is the true magic of Rotary—where global connections blossom into transformative actions.

EMBRACE GENERATIVE AI TOOLS



RI DISTRICT 3211

RAY OF HOPE FOR HOMELESS - PROJECT UDAYKIRAN 2





During the Rotary year 2024-2025 we are planning to provide 250 affordable homes for the homeless. For this purpose we had entered into a contract between K Chittilappilly Foundation (KCF) and RID 3211 on 1st July 2024. Duration of the project is one year from 1st July 2024 to 30th June 2025. This project will be known as UdayKiran 2.

Our District will identify the most eligible persons from BPL category, in need of house from homeless having own land minimum 3 Cents & maximum 5 cents in their name within the geographical territory of our Dist 3211, that is, from Parassala to Aroor, covering all the five Revenue Districts.

The day to day management of the project and the project activity shall be done jointly by KCF and RID 3211 and for this purpose, on behalf of RID 3211, single point of contact will be the District Chairman Rtn COL K G Pillai.

KCF will provide financial support up to 3 lakhs to construct a house up to an area of 450sq ft. This amount will be paid in four installments. The sanctioned amount will be paid to the beneficiary's new bank account which has been specifically opened to receive money from KCF based on evaluation of work-progress report by KCF. Project cost including contribution from beneficiary and Rotary Club should not exceed 7 lakhs. Installment will be released after uploading of clear photos of work progress. Installment will not be clubbed together.

The criteria for selection of beneficiaries

1. Selection by Rotary club should be fair and transparent manner without any discrimination to caste, creed, religion, gender and politics.

2. The beneficiary/family members should not own/ eligible for any house/other ancestral property currently or in future. Preference will be given to persons with terminal illness, widows, disabled and person below 65 years of age.

3. Beneficiary who are eligible to get government housing scheme like Life Mission/ Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY)/any other housing schemes of Organizations or received any financial assistance from KCF earlier will not be considered.

4. Already constructed house in the area of maximum 5 cents will not be considered, which means the fund will not be used for maintenance.

5. The beneficiary should sign on a stamped paper an undertaking to certify above points.

6. Recently purchased land/recent transfer of ancestral property above 4 cents will not be considered.

7. Construction should be started only after getting KCF approval and receipt of first installment of Rupees 5000.

8. Project should be completed within 6 months from the starting date and no application above 250 numbers/after 30th June 2025 will be accepted.

9. Rotary clubs to collect required documents and upload along with application, before this, ensure details and documents provided are genuine and correct and beneficiary falls in the criteria/category specified by KCF.

10. Rotary club to get the signature of the beneficiary in the undertaking documents sent by KCF and sign as witness. Application without proper/complete documents including non submission of recommendation from Rotary in the prescribed format will not be considered.

11. Club has to monitor the construction and ensure that the fund is utilized properly in a time bound manner.

12. Maintain a personal file of the beneficiary of the project details and stage wise progress report. We must periodically monitor the progress of construction of houses, which has to be as per the approved plan and agreed timelines. No deviations from the plan will be accepted. In such cases the KCF will stop the payments and no further explanation will be accepted. Once the payment is deferred it will not be revived.

Scanned copy of various original documents like Aadhaar Card, Ration Card, Land Documents etc., photographs and recommendation letters from various agencies are to be attached along with the application from the beneficiary to KCF. Detailed list of documents to be produced is available.



ROTARY CLUB OF ALLEPPEY TURNS 75 (1949-2024)



'DOWN THE MEMORY LANE' by Tomi Eapen, Historian of the Club

The town of Alleppey has always excelled in socio, cultural and political arena of the State. In its social scenario, Rotary International plays a vital role since seven and a half decades with the arrival of Rotary.

It was in 1948 that a host of prominent Rotarians from Kochi under the leadership of charismatic Jewish Industrialist, late S Koder, came to Alleppey to explore the possibilities of starting a Rotary Club in Alleppey. They met some of the veteran citizens who were the cardinal stones of the town like A R Suliman Sait, then Municipal Chairman, K C Karunakaran, founder of Alleppey Co, N J Mathew, Director, N C John & Sons, Dr M S Ramachandran, Dr T K Kuruvilla, V Kesavan, P C Mukherje, Parthasarathy Iyengar (Pappa Swami), J Murugandi, M L Janardhana Pillai, K Srinivasan, Kassim Suliman Sait, V Z Job, so on.

With their untiring efforts, the dream came true and Rotary Club of Alleppey was born in 1949. The Charter Presentation was held on 25th July 1949 in an august assembly of noble and eloquent intelligentsia and renowned stalwarts from the different cross-sections of the town. RI admitted RC Alleppey as Club # 7339, in the then R I District 56, comprising the State of Kerala, part of Tamil Nadu and the whole of Ceylon (now Srilanka). The then District Governor, Col. Wignaraj from Colombo was the Guest of Honour and presented the Charter to A R Sulaiman Sait, the Charter President. V Kesavan, affectionately called 'Jupitar Kesavan' was the Charter Secretary. There were 21 Charter members and none of them is alive today. The Banquet was held in Hotel Wayside Inn, north of Tripple Bridge, the only class hotel in those days, owned by the Parcy Rotarian C N Nariyalwala and family. The weekly Club meetings were regularly continued there until the Club owned its own building in 1974.

The dazzling activities of the club spread over seven and a half decades: *Functioning of a Community Centre on the beach side with a reading room and Adult Education programme, *Adoption of a fishermen's colony, *Donation of an Electro Cardiogram, and Ambulance, *Padmasri Dr. Modi's Free Eye Camp and a record total of 512 operations performed in 1967, *Traffic blinking lights at key points, *Low cost buildings, *Champ pipes, *Overhead tanks in schools at the outskirts of the town, *Mortuary at Sahrudaya Hospital, *Ambulance Service, *Bus Passengers Waiting Sheds at different junctions, *Distribution of thousands of soil less Growbags with vegetable saplings, *LN 4 Prosthetic Hand Fitment Camp. *Rotary Alfa Learning Development Centre launched on 29th July 2019 in the Club premises, carried out yeomen service to 500 plus differently abled children until they stopped its operation in Alleppey recently. The continuing projects like Rotary - Neelima Merit Evening to honour the laureled students, Youth Activities, Vocational Awards and Jewel of Alleppey Award Presentations are also to be mentioned.

Yeomen service projects worthy to the affected community were successfully carried out during the 2018 Super flood havoc. The relief work at the adopted Kayalpuram village in Kuttanad consisting of 1500 families, with an outlay of over Rs. 80 lakhs was a major project of the Club. The relief work undertaken throughout the Rotary year in 14 phases including construction of a house and maintenance of a number of damaged houses.

Rotary Blood Bank at The W & C hospital, Alappuzha is a boon to the people of Alleppey, as there were no blood banks in those days in Alleppey district. This Blood Bank was built in commemoration with the Platinum Jubilee of Rotary International. It was inaugurated and dedicated to the public of Alleppey by the then Governor of Kerala Smt. Jyothy Venkitachalam. The Blood Bank is still functional and remains the only one in the district

under the Health Department of Government of Kerala.

The Rotary Community Centre, located in a prime location at Alappuzha was purchased in 1974 to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of the Club. The Inner Wheel Club of Alleppey also joined the project for fund raising by organizing an entertainment programme with the celebrity singer Usha Uthup. The building underwent face lifts from time to time, like air conditioning and modernizing the hall including an A/C Board Room, the tiled path from the gate to the hall, the canopy in front of the hall, the Recreation room fitted with Billiards table etc. The hall was renamed 'Revi Karunakaran Hall' after the death of PDG Revi Karunakaran as a tribute to the legend who took RC Alleppey to the World Rotary Map.

The Club played hosts to a number of key District events like District Conference, District Assembly (3 times) and a host of major District events over the years.

The charisma of PDG Revi Karunakaran.

Perhaps the most charismatic member ever produced by our Club is the late PDG Revi Karunakaran, the doyen of Coir Industry, who shone like a luminous star in Rotary world over. He was a 'Benefactor', who contributed enormously to the Rotary Foundation and held high positions in RI. He was the District Governor during 1976-77. He authored the book 'Rotary for Layman'. The saga continues with his beloved wife Rtn Betty Karan, who is the first Arch Klump Society (AKS) member of our RI District and its Goodwill Ambassador.

Luminaries who addressed the Club

Many a luminary from different walks of life addressed our Club. They include: S/s. C Rajagoplachary, Sanjeeva Reddi, V V Giri, Pattom Thanu Pillai, R Sankar, T M A Pai, P T Chacko, B Ramakrishna Rao, P K V, Dr M S Swaminathan, RI President Rajendra K Saboo, O N V Kurup, Dr S Gupthan Nair, His Excellency Marthoma Valiya Methrapolitha, DGP Jacob Punnose, Justice Cyriac Joseph, Dr Michael Tharakan, Justice J Benjamin Koshy etc. etc. and a number of Film stars, ministers and renowned bureaucrats.

Incredible Journey of a Club Bulletin

Perhaps the most illuminating embellishment of the Club is that it publishes a weekly Bulletin since the very next week of the Charter Presentation. The bulletin dated 1-8-1949 was titled "Members' Bulletin" and numbered Vol. 1"Issue 1". It was typed on sky-blue coloured many fold paper and carbon copied. Believe it or not, it never stopped its publication and the last week bulletin was numbered "Vol. 75, issue 3900 since 1 August 1949" The bulletin underwent many a refulgent transformation in its outlook, printing, content and quality. It was renamed as "ROYALWEEKS" which stands for 'Rotary Club of Alleppey Weekly Bulletins'. A Club bulletin is an integral part of a Club and the Clubs in the modern era do have bulletins since its beginning. But as old as 75 years old bulletin may be the first and the oldest in the Rotary world. ROYALWEEKS had won a number of awards and recognitions incessantly over the years. In 1980 RW was adjudged the Best Bulletin in India, by RC Muradabad in UP. Its editor Tomi Eapen was adjudged Best Editor in India.

Today, Rotary Club of Alleppey reaches a milestone as it completes seven and a half decades of fruitful existence in this ancient town. It's a "100% PHF & a 5 Star" Club. Many a stalwart member was chosen to lead the District as DG, 3 DSGs, 3 District Assembly Chairmen, 2 GML Editors and a number of Assistant / Associate / Lieutenant and Deputy Governors.

Rtn Tomi Eapen traced the history of RC Alleppey for the first time and published 'Four Decades of Service' in 1989. He revised it in 2019 and released 'The Marveling Saga of Seven Decades'. The next book 'The Platinum Saga' is getting ready for publication in 2024. The details given above are Excerpts from the prelude to the book.

Thus goes the history of Rotary Club of Alleppey. Born in yesteryears and flowing through the present to the unknown tomorrows, to meet the posterity who will be proud of those who built it with their sweat and toil, money and might, mission and vision. The saga continues..
