

# **DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S VOICE**



### Dear Rotary Leaders.

Warm Rotary Greetings to all.

Let me thank all Rotary leaders and families for participating in the District Conference Valiya Perunnal held at Gokulam Convention Centre, Kochi.

Dear friends, March is assigned to be Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Month. This month is dedicated to raising awareness and taking action to address the lack of access to safe water and sanitation facilities. Globally more than 750 million people lack access to safe water and more than 2.5 billion people lack access to adequate sanitation facilities. Clean water and sanitation is a human right. When people, especially children, have access to clean water, sanitation and hygiene, they lead healthier and more successful lives. We don't just build wells and walk away. We Rotarians integrate into education projects. When children learn about disease transmission and practice good hygiene they take those lessons home to their families, expanding our impact. The sad thing is at least 3,000 children die each day from disease caused by unsafe water, which is what motivates our members to build wells, install rainwater harvesting systems and teach community members how to maintain new infrastructures. While a few people die of thirst and waterborne diseases providing the impetus for our members to also improve sanitation facilities in underdeveloped countries.

What can our clubs do?

1. Community Clean Up Drives -

Organise local clean up efforts to improve sanitation in neighborhoods, parks and public spaces, helping to promote a cleaner environment and reduce health risks.

2. Educational Workshops & Awareness Camps -

Host workshops to educate communities on the importance of hygiene practices such as Hand Washing, Safe food Handling and proper waste disposal. Launch awareness camps using social media, draw attention to WASH issues and mobilise resources and volunteers.

- 3. Sanitation Facilities -Partner with local Government or NGOs to build or improve sanitation facilities; like toilets and sewage systems, particularly in underserved communities.
- 4. Support to Vulnerable Populations -Focus on providing resources and support to vulnerable populations such as children, elderly and differently abled people who have greater challenges in accessing clean water and sanitation.
- 5. Fundraising -

Organise fundraising events or campaigns to support WASH projects, ensuring that resources are available to implement necessary initiatives.

Let's engage in these activities to make a meaningful impact on the health and well being of our communities and the world. We need to make a difference in the lives of others by doing impactful Projects, Let's be humble, simple and simply irresistible.

# "TRANSFORMING YOUTH FROM CHAOS TO CALMNESS"



Recently, I've been avoiding mainstream TV channels due to the overwhelming negativity in the news. Stories of drug abuse, violence, and family conflicts create an environment of anxiety and fear, leaving us unsure of how to navigate this turbulent world.

As we reflect on Rotary's role in addressing these challenges, especially for today's youth, the question arises: What can we do to bring calmness, patience, and positivity to this environment?

A pressing issue today is the loss of patience among youth, fueled by constant access to social media and smart phones, leading to Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and shortened attention spans. During a recent conversation with my son, he highlighted an incident when a parent tried to make their child watch The Lion King, a favourite classic among millennials, but the child couldn't sit through more than 10 minutes. This shows how attention spans have shrunk. Today's youth prefer quick, 2-minute reels on platforms like Instagram and Facebook, further diminishing their ability to focus.

In contrast, our generation grew up with outdoor games that taught us the value of patience, resilience, and learning from failure—skills that seem less accessible to today's youth, often confined to screens instead of engaging in physical activities that help expend energy and build character. The video games they play are nothing but fighting, killing and shedding blood.

So, what can Rotary do to restore balance in the lives of today's youth? Here are several avenues for Rotary to make a meaningful difference: we cannot easily measure the success of these activities, but if we could change the mindset of one child, our mission will be accomplished.

1. Anti-Drug Awareness Rally: Rotary can spearhead an Anti-Drug Awareness Rally from Aroor to Parassala, covering educational institutions in the 5 southern revenue districts in partnership with the State Excise Department. The rally should raise awareness about the harmful effects of drugs, while emphasizing the importance of arts, sports, and social service. We should also highlight the happiness and fulfillment youth experience when they serve the marginalized, just as we Rotarians do.

2. Promote Outdoor Activities and Sports: Rotary can organize and sponsor sports events and physical activities that encourage teamwork, discipline, and perseverance. These activities help youth channel their energy positively while teaching life skills like coping with failure, setting goals, and building patience. Reviving outdoor games can foster the emotional resilience necessary to face challenges.

3. Yoga and Meditation: Incorporating yoga and meditation into youth programs can instill patience and calmness. Yoga promotes physical health and mental clarity, while meditation teaches mindfulness, helping youth manage stress and emotional turmoil. Rotary can partner with wellness experts to offer youth yoga and meditation workshops, helping them cultivate inner peace and patience.

4. Tackling the Menace of Drugs: Substance abuse among youth requires urgent attention. Rotary can continue its leadership in this area, building on initiatives like the donation of drug-testing equipment to Kerala Police by Past District Governor, Rtn. K. Srinivasan. Rotary can further support awareness campaigns, rehabilitation programs, and law enforcement efforts in the fight against drugs.

5. Education and Skill Development Initiatives: Rotary can focus on providing educational programs and skill-building workshops that equip youth with tools for success. These programs can include emotional intelligence, leadership skills, and career training. By offering guidance, Rotary can help youth find meaningful paths that promote discipline, purpose, and patience.

6. Enforcement and Awareness: Alongside promoting positive alternatives, Rotary can work with local authorities to enforce regulations that protect youth from harmful influences like drugs, violence, and cyber bullying. Awareness campaigns through workshops, seminars, and community discussions can help youth make informed decisions.

The challenges facing today's youth—short attention spans and substance abuse—require a collective response. Rotary, with its extensive network and commitment to service, is in a unique position to make a lasting impact. By engaging youth in physical activities, promoting mindfulness through yoga and meditation, addressing drug abuse, and providing educational opportunities, Rotary can help restore balance and patience, essential for the well-being of the next generation.

Let us unite as Rotarians to create a future where our youth are empowered, calm, and equipped to face life's challenges with resilience, patience, and strength.

# **DEEPSEEK: A NEW AI LANDSCAPE IN CHINA**



Chinese AI startup DeepSeek has sparked a significant rally in tech stocks, with Hong Kong's Hang Seng Tech Index up 25% this year. The integration of DeepSeek's AI model into Tencent'sWeixin led to an 8% surge in Tencent's stock, following gains in Alibaba and Baidu.

Chinese President Xi Jinping held a rare meeting with major tech figures, including Jack Ma of Alibaba and RenZhengfeiof Huawei, signaling a shift in Beijing's approach towards private companies. This gathering aims to bolster sentiment amid ongoing US-China tech tensions and reflects concerns over China's economic slowdown.

Trump Media & Technology Group has reported a staggering \$400.9 million loss for the year 2024, a significant increase from the \$58.2 million loss in 2023. The company's earnings per share were reported at a loss of \$2.36, with total revenue at \$3.6 million, reflecting a 12% decline year-over-year.

DeepSeek's open-source AI revolution is forcing China's tech giants to

redefine their strategies, proving that China's AI future will not be shaped solely by Baidu, Tencent, and Alibaba. Instead, success will depend on which companies can adapt to the open-source movement and respond to fast-moving challengers like DeepSeek.

However, while AI competition is evolving, certain boundaries remain firmly in place—DeepSeek's refusal to discuss politically sensitive topics suggests that, despite its technological disruptiveness, the company is still operating within China's broader political framework.

DeepSeek has emerged as a silent disruptor in China's AI landscape, forcing major tech incumbents like Baidu, Tencent, and Alibaba to rethink their approach to AI development. Unlike the traditional closedsource model these companies previously championed, DeepSeek's open-source AI innovation is shifting the industry's trajectory, prompting major players to adapt and integrate DeepSeek's models into their ecosystems.

### China's Tech Giants and the Al Shift

For years, Baidu, Tencent, and Alibaba dominated China's tech sector by developing proprietary technologies, controlling their ecosystems, acquiring emerging competitors, and relentlessly monetizing their products. However, AI's rapid evolution is rewriting the rules, making it harder for these companies to maintain control.

### 1. Baidu's U-Turn on Open-Source Al

• Baidu, once a staunch proponent of closed-source AI, has pivoted to embrace open-source AI following DeepSeek's breakthrough.

• At the Dubai World Government Summit, Baidu CEO Robin Li acknowledged the need to adapt, reversing his prior stance.

• The company subsequently integrated DeepSeek's R1 model into WenxiaoYan (formerly WenxinYiyan) and announced that the app would be free for users starting April 1.

### 2. Tencent Integrates DeepSeek into WeChat

• Tencent, traditionally a gaming and social networking giant, has integrated DeepSeek's AI into WeChat's search function.

This marks a strategic shift, as Tencent typically takes a cautious approach to feature upgrades.

• However, Tencent is keeping its gaming division separate from DeepSeek, ensuring that its primary revenue source remains within its control.

 Investor confidence in Tencent's AI strategy surged, leading to its highest stock valuation since 2021.

### 3. Alibaba's Alternative Strategy

• Unlike Baidu and Tencent, Alibaba has not partnered with DeepSeek and is instead forging its own Al path.

• Apple selected Alibaba as its Al partner in China, rejecting both DeepSeek and Baidu, reportedly due to concerns about DeepSeek's lack of manpower and experience and Baidu's slower progress.

Alibaba's AI ambitions align closely with China's national priorities, with Chairman Joe Tsai emphasizing economic impact and AI democratization rather than cutting-edge research.

• This state-aligned AI strategy is resonating with investors, as Alibaba reported strong earnings growth in e-commerce and cloud services, leading to an 8% stock increase.

### DeepSeek: The Silent Challenger

DeepSeek's rise challenges the dominance of China's well-resourced tech incumbents and underscores the shift toward open-source AI development. However, questions remain about its long-term sustainability.

### 1. Funding and Expansion Plans

• Reports indicate that DeepSeek is exploring external funding, with Alibaba and state-affiliated investors expressing interest.

• The company is also considering a transition from a research-first model to one focused on revenue generation and profitability.

 DeepSeek is evaluating the establishment of data centers in Southeast Asia to bypass U.S. export restrictions and gain access to Nvidia's AI chips.

### 2. Founder Liang Wenfeng's Growing Influence

• DeepSeek's elusive founder, Liang Wenfeng, has gained significant political and business recognition.

• He attended a high-profile meeting with President Xi Jinping, signalingDeepSeek's growing importance in China's AI ecosystem.

• Despite accusations from international media regarding state influence and technology theft, DeepSeek remains a leading force in Al innovation.





# THE ROTARY INTERNATIONAL ASSEMBLY- AN EVENT TO CHERISH



The Rotary International Assembly held at Orlando, Florida, was a pivotal training event for incoming District Governors Elect (DGsE) and their partners worldwide.

The event was held at the heritage hotel Rosen Shingle Creek which with its imposing high ceiling roofs and more than 1500 rooms, several banquet halls and smaller halls ideal for Breakout session, surrounded by ponds, unending lawns and even a golf course was the apt location for this International Assembly.

The General Sessions, where both the DGsE and Partners attended together had fantastic speakers from across the globe and we were provided with translator radios for instant translation. The hallmarks were the presentations from Influential

Leaders and Rotarians who shared stories of impact and change.

Topics covered were:

**Strategic Leadership**: Training on how to inspire and guide clubs within the district, set goals, and create a strategic vision.

Conflict Resolution: Provided us tools to manage club conflicts and encourage collaboration.

Motivation Techniques: How to motivate club leaders and members to achieve District Goals.

The moderator of the International Assembly was our very own Past RI Director AC Venkatesh.

From 2025, the RI Board had decided to do away with the Annual Theme and RI President-elect Mário César Martins de Camargo, instead in a powerful speech, introduced his vision for the Rotary year-UNITE FOR GOOD which was received by a standing ovation.

The BREAKOUT SESSIONS endorsed Rotary's approach to knowledge dissemination from training model to learning model.

The breakout sessions covered:

**District Management**: Best practices for overseeing clubs, managing district committees, and ensuring compliance with RI policies.

**Financial Stewardship**: Guidance on managing district finances responsibly, including grant management and reporting.

**Engaging Existing Members**: Techniques to retain members by fostering meaningful engagement and leadership opportunities.



# Dr V Rajan, former Rotarian of RC Karunagappally


