



Rotary Club of Angamally Greater

Probable projects for **FEBRUARY**

3. Support for Refugees and Displaced Populations

Collaborate with humanitarian organizations to provide essential services, raise awareness about refugee issues, and offer vocational training for economic empowerment.

4. Conflict Resolution in Schools

Provide funding for peace education curricula, create partnerships with local education authorities, and organize workshops for students and teachers.

5. Promoting Interfaith Dialogue

Project Idea: Facilitate events, create safe spaces for dialogue, and collaborate with local religious leaders and organizations.

Work with local governments and NGOs to design and implement sustainable economic programs, providing grants and technical assistance to startups or small businesses.

11. Public Awareness and Advocacy on Peace Building

Use Rotary's platform to amplify the message of peace, collaborate with media outlets, and host public discussions or events.

12. Support for Peacekeeping Efforts in Conflict Zones

Mobilize local resources to support international peacekeeping missions, or help displaced people through relief and recovery efforts.
