Through his Social Change Initiative, Julius has worked to empower young people in Cameroon to take active roles in peacebuilding and leadership.

His project provided training in conflict prevention, civic engagement and leadership to youths and community officials in areas affected by conflict, equipping people to drive sustainable peace efforts. Julius harnessed Rotary's global network to overcome obstacles, including limited funding and security risks and make a meaningful impact. The Rotary Peace Fellowship gave Julius the tools and support to turn his vision into reality. His work embodies The Magic of Rotary - the transformative power of connecting people, sharing resources and uniting for a common purpose. As we reflect on the achievements of our peace fellows and celebrate Rotary's enduring commitment to peace, let us also recognise the role that everyone in our network of 1.2 million members plays in creating magic through service. 

10. No long presentations, no lengthy introductions—every speech was under 10 minutes with clear, well-executed delivery. A brilliant approach!

Past RI Presidents were introduced in just five minutes—no frills, no fanfare—keeping the event efficient yet respectful.


As we fly back, our minds are brimming with ideas, and we feel grateful for this opportunity of a lifetime. Having Venky as Chair of the whole event made it even more special.














COIMBATORE TERM 19

The club has contributed USD 2,800 to The Rotary Foundation (TRF), with a commitment of USD 30,000. Under the District Project 'Blossom', they support education, blood donation, maternal and child health, and environmental initiatives. The Governor praised the club's dedication to service and its commitment to creating lasting community impact.

Rotary Club of Coimbatore Legend

During the meeting, the club presented a detailed report on their ongoing and completed projects, highlighting the club's impactful initiatives and commitment to community service. The event was a great opportunity to showcase the club's contributions and future plans, reinforcing their dedication to Rotary's mission.



Rotary Club of Cochin Milan

The Governor's Official Visit (GOV) to the Rotary Club of Cochin Milan took place on 25th February 2025. Chartered in 2013, the club consists of 24 members, all of whom are women, with plans to expand to 28 members. Their signature project, Organ (Eye) Donation, in partnership with Giridhar Eye Hospital, has signed up 15 donors so far. Other major initiatives include Kinshakti Menstrual Health Talks, cervical cancer awareness, palliative care support, blood donation drives, scholarships for girls, and sanitation projects. The club has contributed USD 4,950 this year to TRF, with a target of USD 6,000. Under District Project 'Blossom', they support education, legal aid, blood donation, special children's welfare, and environmental sustainability. The Governor commended the club's strong community engagement and impactful service projects.



Rotary Club of Coimbatore Satellite

The Governor's Official Visit (GOV) to the Rotary Club of Coimbatore Satellite took place on February 7th, 2025. Chartered on February 7, 1990, the club has 44 members, including 4 new additions and 3 women members. Their signature project, "Kalvi Kalam," focuses on constructing two classrooms (₹24 lakhs) and toilet blocks (₹5.25 lakhs) benefiting over 1,500 students. Other major initiatives include a ₹70-lakh Red Cross Blood Centre Project, water purifiers for schools, and a hemodialysis machine for CMCH. The club has contributed USD 9,274 to TRF, with a target of USD 12,000. Under District Project 'Blossom', initiatives include student scholarships, environmental projects, sports promotion, and maternal and child health support, reaffirming their commitment to impactful service.

Their signature project, "Santa Run," is a major public image initiative with 3,500 participants. Other key projects include heart surgeries, palliative care, autism support, tailoring units for vocational training, and housing projects with CSR funding. The club has contributed USD 83,261 to TRF, with a planned USD 22,000 contribution. Under the District Project 'Blossom', they support education, health care camps and events, housing, clean water initiatives, special children's welfare, and environmental sustainability. The Governor commended the club's strong public engagement and impactful service projects.

Rotary Club of Cochin Technopolis

Other major initiatives include juvenile diabetic camps, dialysis support for 1,960 kidney patients, menstrual hygiene awareness with 500+ menstrual cups distributed, and vocational training for autistic children. The club has contributed USD 100 to TRF, with a planned contribution of USD 7,200. Under the District Project 'Blossom', initiatives include educational aid, scholarships, eye camps, and old age home support. The Governor praised the club's proactive and impactful service initiatives.

Rotary Club of Tripunithura Royale

Other major initiatives include the Royal Housing Project, with four houses under construction, Onam kit distribution with Pulse of Tripunithura, and riverbank cleaning of Poorna Nadi with Cyrix Healthcare. The club has contributed USD 200 to TRF, with a target of USD 8,000. Under District Project 'Blossom', they support education through the "Madhuram Malayalam" program, blood donation camps, school library renovations, and clean water projects. The Governor commended the club's commitment to impactful service and public engagement.

Rotary Club of Coimbatore Uptown

The club has contributed USD 1,500 to TRF, with a planned contribution of USD 5,000. Under the District Project 'Blossom', they provide career guidance for students, eye camps, medical camps and special children's welfare. The Governor appreciated the club's commitment to impactful service and suggested increasing membership, particularly women Rotarians.

Probable projects for MARCH

Rotary clubs have a long history of supporting water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) projects that improve the health and well-being of communities. Here are some probable Rotary project ideas in the WASH sector:

Clean Water Access Projects:

Installation of Water Wells or Boreholes: Provide clean and safe drinking water by drilling wells or installing boreholes in areas where water scarcity is a major issue. Water Filtration Systems: Install community-level water filtration systems to provide clean drinking water in underserved areas.

Sanitation Facility Projects:

Building Community Latrines: Construct sanitary and sustainable toilets in schools, public areas, and rural communities to reduce open defecation and improve health. Waste Management Systems: Create systems for proper waste disposal and recycling, including the building of composting toilets or waste treatment plants.

Hygiene Education and Training:

Hygiene Promotion Campaigns: Organize educational campaigns to raise awareness about proper handwashing, safe water handling, and menstrual hygiene management. School Hygiene Programs: Provide hygiene kits, teach students about sanitation and handwashing, and install handwashing stations in schools.

Rainwater Harvesting Systems:

Rainwater Collection and Storage: Install rainwater harvesting systems in schools or communities to provide an alternative source of water, especially during dry seasons.

Water and Sanitation Infrastructure Improvement:

Repairing and Upgrading Existing Infrastructure: Provide financial or technical support for the repair and improvement of existing water systems, pipes, or sewage infrastructure in underserved areas.

Community-Based Water Management:

Water User Associations (WUAs): Set up community-managed systems where local groups are trained to take responsibility for maintaining water sources and managing sanitation facilities.

Water Conservation Projects:

Promote Water-Saving Technologies: Implement projects that focus on water-saving technologies like low-flow taps, water-efficient irrigation systems for farming, and public awareness campaigns about water conservation.

Health Clinics with Water & Sanitation Focus:

Sanitation in Health Clinics: Improve water and sanitation facilities in local health centers, ensuring proper hygiene for staff and patients, and providing access to clean water in medical facilities.

Disaster-Relief Water Systems:

Emergency Water Supply: Establish temporary water supply solutions in disaster-prone areas, such as portable water treatment systems or water trucks for displaced communities.

These projects help to reduce waterborne diseases, increase the accessibility of clean water, and ensure that hygiene and sanitation standards are met, thus significantly improving the quality of life for vulnerable populations.
