ICONIC SPOTS OF DISTRICT 3080

Har Ki Pauri, meaning the feet of Lord Vishnu (Hari), is a ghat on the banks of the river Ganga and landmark of the Hindu holy city of Haridwar in the Indian state of Uttarakhand. It is believed that it is the precise spot where the Ganga leaves the mountains and enters the plains. King Vikramaditya is said to have built it in 1st century BC.

An area within Har Ki Pauri, where the evening Ganga Aarti takes place and which is considered most sacred is known as Brahmakund. It is considered to be the spot where **the drops of Amrit fell over from the sky, while being carried in a pitcher by the celestial bird, Garuda after the Samudra Manthan.** It's landmark clock tower was erected in 1938.

Let us use this month to welcome new members with a passion for education and empower existing ones to lead service projects that reflect local needs.


Whether you're building libraries, distributing textbooks, or mentoring students, your actions matter. Education is also peacebuilding.

FROM THE DESK OF THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR


Dear Fellow Rotarians,

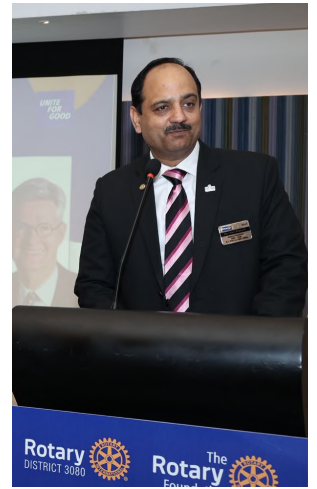

INTERESTING ROTARY PROJECTS AROUND THE GLOBE



In the western Amazon, Rotary clubs in the city of Iquitos participated in a seminar in January to learn about the state of the area's schools. Two District 4465 leaders, Doris Alván and Fernando Del Aguila, enlisted a well-known educator in the area, Josefa Ríos Gil, to share with Rotarians what they can do to assist educators. In May, the **Rotary Club of Iquitos Amazonas** finished one related initiative, a district grant-supported teen empowerment project that taught young people to make earrings sold at eco-lodges near Lake Zungarococha. The club also provided school supplies to primary schools in the area.

Prom is an expensive rite of passage, with purchases of gowns, tuxedos, flowers, meals, and transportation. In New York City, the **Rotary Club of North Shore (Staten Island)** is helping students through its "Cinderella/Cinderfella" project. The entire 25-member club solicits new and gently used formal attire, some of which is purchased new by Rotarians. In April, students from across the borough are invited to choose from about 200 free dresses and suits, as well as shoes and accessories, so they're ready for prom season. The project was started in 2024 by then-President Suzanne Demetrio and is led by members Stephanie Accardo and Regina Boukhvalova.



The **Rotary Club of Zagreb International** organizes regular treks for members and friends. The club, says immediate Past President Petra Pungercar, had "noticed our members were not as connected and focused as they once were." So the group conceived of the hikes as a way to reconnect and motivate members while also raising money for the club's signature project, a mentoring initiative. Their inaugural hike took members of the country's only English-speaking club through the Slapnica Valley near Zagreb in October. They walked in Budapest during a trip to Hungary, and in June they strolled beside the Kamačnik River in Croatia's mountainous Gorski Kotar region.

After an earthquake of magnitude 7.7 struck Myanmar in March, killing more than 3,700 people and injuring many more, the **Rotary Club of Yangon** coordinated a relief effort both at home and at the epicentre near Mandalay, about 400 miles away. The club gathered supplies donated by its members, Mandalay Rotarians, and other Rotary clubs in neighboring countries, notably the **Rotary Club of Bangkok South** in Thailand. In May, a District 3350 delegation to Myanmar brought water purification systems, temporary shelters, and thousands of hot meals. The district committed to providing long-term recovery assistance, including a tube well in Sein Pan, a hard-hit ward in Mandalay.



ROTARY ACTION GROUPS

PEOPLE OF ACTION IN SPECIALISED SERVICE

Rotary gives us many ways to serve, and one of the most impactful platforms is through Rotary Action Groups (RAGs). RAGs are international, Rotary-affiliated groups of Rotarians, Rotaractors, family members, and experts who focus on specific areas of service and expertise. They provide technical assistance, share knowledge, and support clubs and districts in planning and implementing large-scale, sustainable projects. Unlike Rotary Fellowships, which are mainly about friendship and shared interests, RAGs are service-driven.

In this issue, we highlight BELRAG. In upcoming issues, we shall keep bringing to you more Rotary Action Groups, each dedicated to a vital humanitarian cause.

BASIC EDUCATION AND LITERACY ROTARY ACTION GROUP (BELRAG)



BELRAG was formed in 2011. It is a **network of Rotarians and others passionate across the world who have a special interest in acting upon the mission and goals of Rotary International related to alleviating illiteracy; enhancing literacy teaching and learning globally, and helping to provide materials and equipment for literacy education at different levels.** BELRAG is an autonomous association of like-minded Rotarians, partners of Rotarians, and Rotaractors working in partnership with Clubs and Districts on basic education and literacy projects of mutual concern.

BELRAG's Mission and Goals

- Increasing general awareness of the severity of illiteracy throughout the world; and its effect on the quality of the lives of individuals, families, communities, and nations from generation to generation.
- Increasing awareness among Rotarians, Rotary Clubs, and Rotary Districts of ways they can implement basic education and literacy projects that strengthen the capacity of communities to provide education and literacy to all.

- Actively collaborate with Rotarians to establish partnerships for projects involving other areas of focus.

The following strategies are used to achieve BELRAG's goals.

- ✓ Publicize the extent and consequences of illiteracy in terms of human experience and welfare using a website, newsletters, pamphlets, diverse other publications, displays, and conferences;
- ✓ Attract and involve Rotarians, their partners, and Rotaractors as BELRAG members;
- ✓ Develop support systems for Rotary basic education and literacy activities;
- ✓ Develop productive relationships with appropriate non-Rotary organizations and agencies, e.g. International Reading Association
