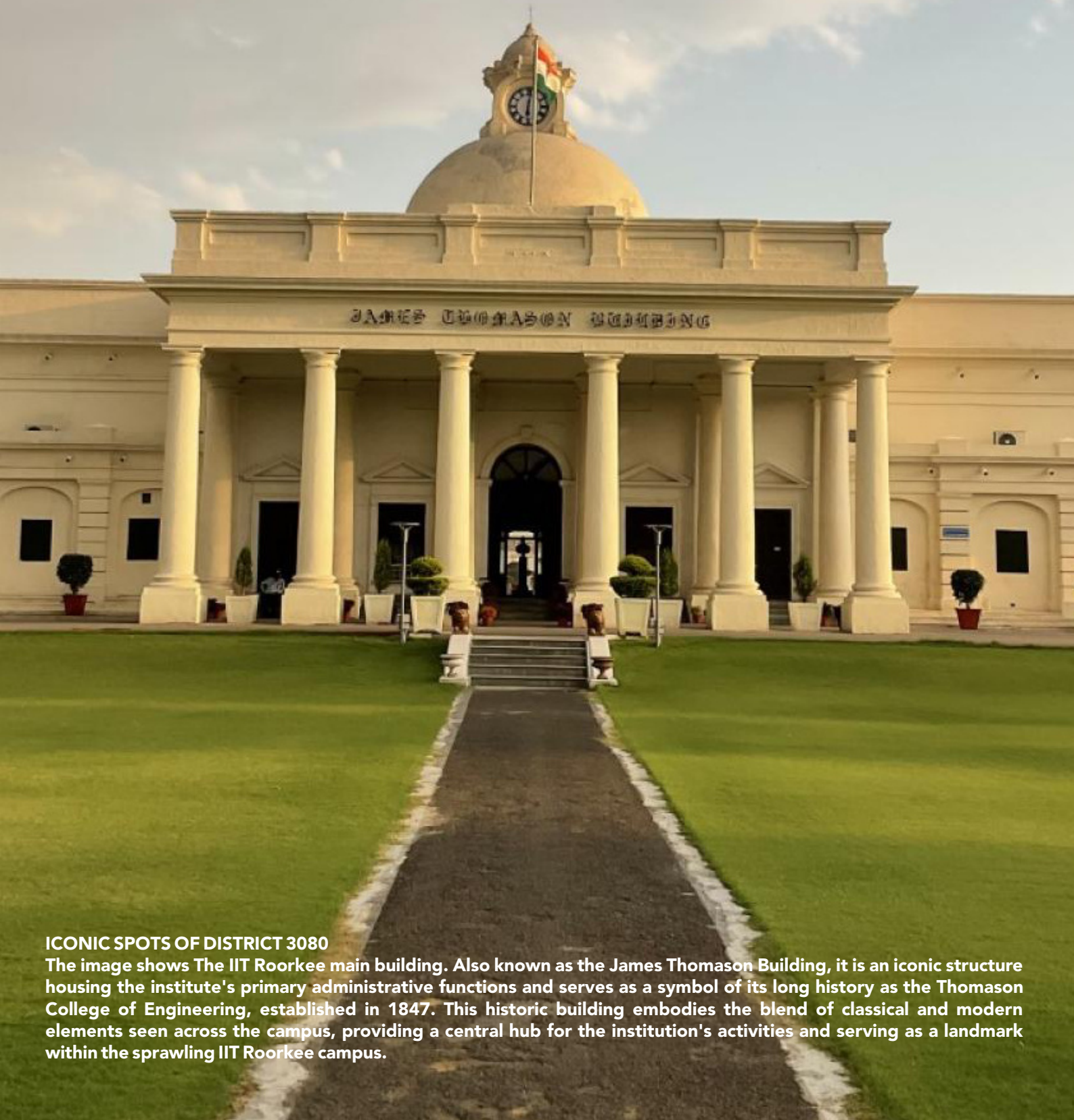

KNOW THE RI PRESIDENT

Francesco Arezzo, a member of the Rotary Club of Ragusa, Italy, is an orthodontist in private practice. He is active internationally as a member of the Italian, European, and American orthodontics associations. He is vice president of the National Association of Italian Dentists for the province of Ragusa and was the founder and head for seven years of the delegation for Ragusa of the National Trust for Italy. He is a Knight of Honor and Devotion in Obedience within the Sovereign Order of Malta.

A Rotary member for more than 30 years, Arezzo has served as vice chair of the Joint Strategic Planning Committee and as RI director, learning facilitator, and as district conference presidential representative.

Arezzo is a Benefactor of The Rotary Foundation. He is married to Anna Maria Criscione, an entrepreneur in the tourism field. They have two children.

Arezzo has been selected by the RI Board of Directors to become Rotary International's President for 2025-26.

The Board conducted a special session following the unexpected resignation of RI President-elect Mário César Martins de Camargo on 8 June. Guided by the RI code and policies, the Board selected the new president-elect from a pool of candidates who were considered by the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International in August 2023.

MONTHLY MESSAGE OF THE RI PRESIDENT

In Rotary's early years, clubs were identified not by city names but by numbers. The Rotary Club of Chicago was, of course, Club No. 1.

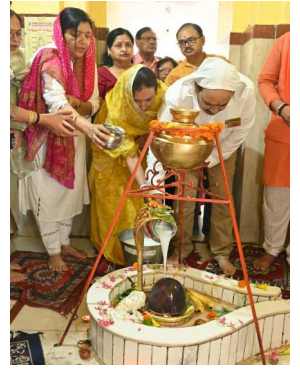
However, during Rotary's rapid international expansion in the second decade of the 20th century, one club's unique designation raised questions about continuity and recognition.

Donating Eyes Makes One Great" By donating eyes after death Subhash Kanodia becomes great

Under this initiative, the club has facilitated the donation of eyes from another individual after their passing. Assistant Governor and Eye Donation Motivator, Harpreet Singh Rekhi, shared that the club received information from Vikash Garg about the passing of Subhash Kanodia (82) from Janata Chowk, whose family wished to donate their eyes. The Rotary Club team promptly visited the family and, after obtaining written consent from Subhash's son, Vikash Kanodia, the PGI eye department team, comprising Mukesh Verma and Amritpal Singh, was called in to retrieve the eyes. Rotary Club President, Himmat Singh Saini, and Secretary Sukhwinder Singh Sonu, applauded the family's noble gesture. The Rotary Club has successfully motivated 74 families to donate eyes, enabling 148 individuals to see the world. Harpreet Singh Rekhi is leading the eye donation efforts.

रोटररी क्लब, खरड़ द्वारा पिछले कई वर्षों से जरूरतमंद लोगों को "दृष्टि का उपहार" देने की मुहिम चलाई जा रही है। इसी कड़ी में शहर की एक और शख्सियत एवं प्रमुख व्यवसायी सतपाल जिंदल आयु 89, रंधावा रोड की आँखें रोटररी क्लब के माध्यम से मरणोपरांत दान की गईं। जानकारी के अनुसार, रोटररी क्लब के सदस्यों को गत दिवस सुबह सरोज वाला द्वारा सूचना मिली कि एक बुजुर्ग व्यक्ति की मृत्यु हो गई है। तभी रोटररी क्लब की टीम उनके घर पहुंची। क्लब की टीम और पार्षद कमल किशोर शर्मा (वार्ड नंबर-23) ने परिवार से नेत्रदान करने का अनुरोध किया। परिवार की सहमति मिलने के बाद पीजीआई के नेत्र विभाग से मुकेश वर्मा ने अंशित परहार की टीम को बुलाया और घर पहुंचकर आँखें लेने की प्रक्रिया पूरी की। रोटररी क्लब ने अब तक 72 लोगों की मृत्यु के बाद उनके परिजनों को प्रेरित कर उनकी आँखें दान करवाई हैं, जिससे अब 144 लोग इस खूबसूरत दुनिया को देख पा रहे हैं।

LARRY A. LUNSFORD SELECTED TO BE RI PRESIDENT 27-28

Larry A. Lunsford, a member of the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza, Missouri, USA, is the selection of the nominating committee to become Rotary International's president for 2027-28. He will officially become the president-nominee on 15 September if no other candidates challenge him.

Lunsford attended Truman State University in Kirksville, Missouri, on an academic scholarship, earning bachelor's and master's degrees in accounting. He first encountered Rotary when he received a Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship to spend the 1981-82 academic year at the University of Newcastle in Australia.

A certified public accountant, Lunsford spent seven years working for Ernst & Young before joining a family-owned business, Bernstein-Rein Advertising, in 1990. He is currently executive vice president and chief financial officer for the Bernstein group of companies.

He has held positions on the boards of the Kansas City Spirit Festival and the Variety Club as well as serving as director of a local bank and treasurer of the Epilepsy Foundation for the Heart of America. He has also served on Truman State University's alumni and foundation boards and received the university's Distinguished Service Award.

Lunsford joined the Rotary Club of Kansas City-Plaza in 1991 and has since served as district governor (2001-02), RI director (2013-15), and trustee of The Rotary Foundation (2021-25, vice chair 2024-25). He has been a member of RI committees, including the Executive Committee (chair 2014-15), Membership Growth Committee (chair 2016-18), and Nominating Committee for President of RI (chair 2023-24). He also has served on The Rotary Foundation's Executive Committee (chair 2023-24), Finance Committee (chair 2022-23 and 2024-25), and Participant Experience Committee (chair 2023-24).

Lunsford has been awarded The Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award, The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service, and the RI Service Above Self Award. He and his wife, Jill Lunsford, have two children and one grandchild. They are Major Donors, Bequest Society members, multiple Paul Harris Fellows, Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation, and Sustaining Members.

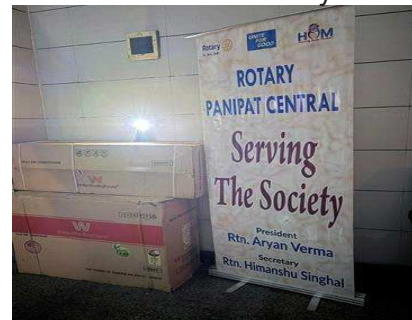
