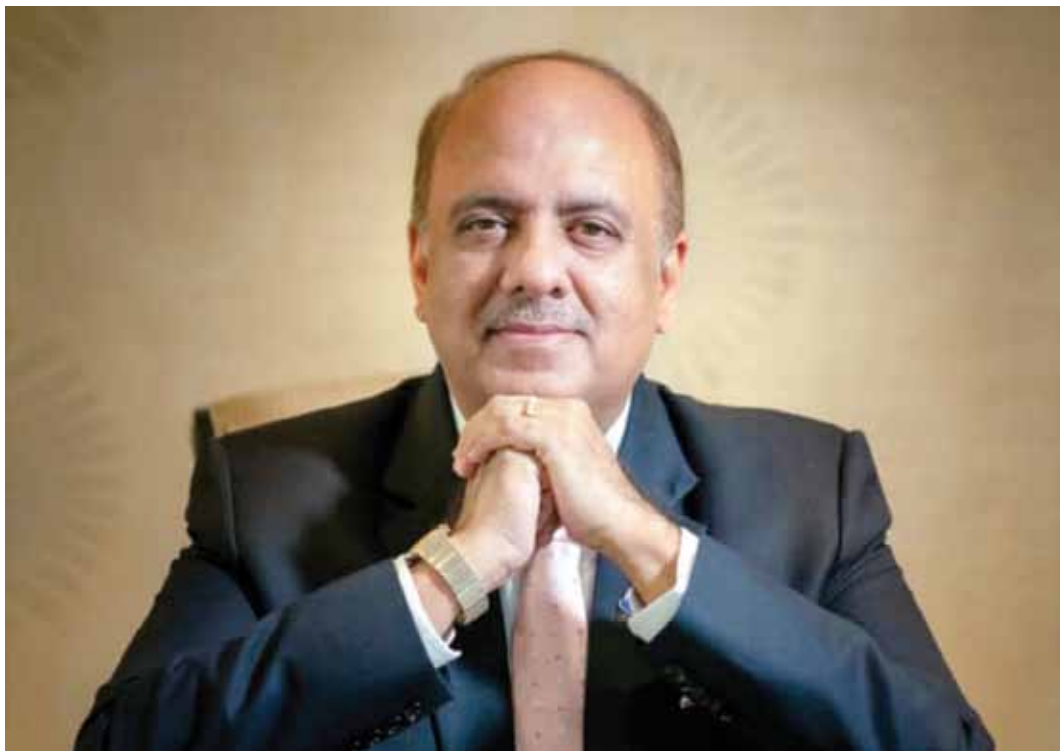

The 'GoGreen' campaign is in full swings and plantation is happening around the District, ensuring a green, healthy environment for the generation to come.

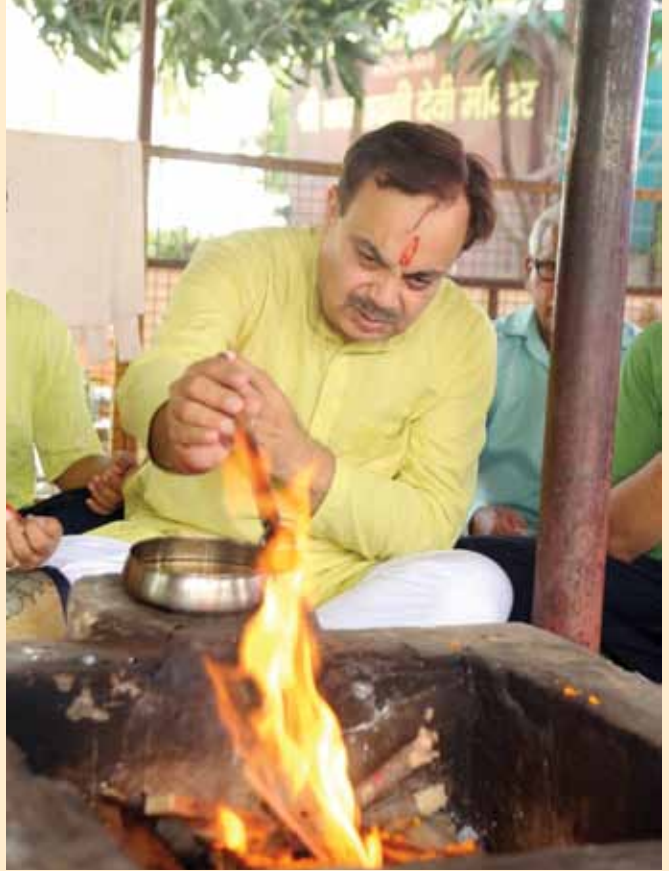

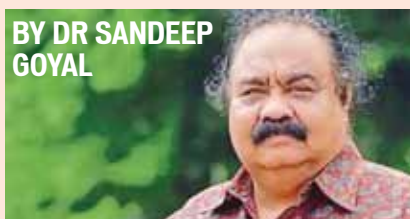

Lifetime Domino's Pizzas for Mirabai Chanu : Gimmick, Guerilla or Gratitude

The universal public verdict on Domino's magnanimity was that it was really very thoughtful of the pizza chain to offer the free life-time pizza to the silver medallist...

Mirabai Chanu opened India's medal tally at the Tokyo 2020 last Friday by winning a silver medal. When asked what she would do now that her event was over, she said she would attend to her craving for pizzas. To everyone's surprise, Domino's heard that and immediately responded. And how! The global pizza chain, India's market leader by far, on the Saturday gone by, took to Twitter to announce that they would be offering the Olympic silver medallist free pizza for the rest of her life. And after that, as expected, social media just went crazy!

Domino's tweeted: "Congratulations on bringing the medal home! You brought the dreams of a billion+ Indians to life and we couldn't be happier to treat you to FREE Domino's pizza for life. Congratulations again!!"

After the medal winning feat, the restaurant chain said they never want Mirabai Chanu to ever wait to eat a pizza.

"What is common between India's Olympic medal Second place medal and everytime you say you'll just have one of pizza? "It's just the first of manyyyyy," dominos_india tweeted.

"Aapne kaha, aur humne sunn liya. We never want @mirabai_chanu to wait to eat Slice of pizza again so we're treating her to FREE Domino's pizza for life! #PizzasForLife," the pizza chain

added.

The universal public verdict on Domino's magnanimity was that it was really very thoughtful of the pizza chain to offer the free life-time pizza to the silver medallist. Her wish had become their command.

For marketers though, the gesture was wrapped in many layers:

- In making the kind offer, Domino's have kind of maxed the concept of 'moment marketing'. Hitherto many brands have tried to draw maximal value out of unfolding events or

happenings by putting out really creative tweets but no one has really and truly 'owned' a moment quite like Domino's have succeeded in doing with Chanu at the Olympics. By making this announcement of the free offer in that moment of time, Domino's has managed to maximize the mileage that could be drawn from the Chanu victory.

- Was the offer gimmicky? Sure it was. But then it caught the popular imagination, and in the ultimate analysis, that is all that counts. The twitterati went delirious on Domino's large-heartedness. The offer won many





hearts and gave the brand the halo of a do-gooder. It was smart thinking; and quick execution that capitalized value out of an impromptu utterance by the new champion.

- What is even better, the offer cost Domino's hardly anything in terms of monetary value. Minister for Railways Ashwini Vaishnaw on Monday felicitated weightlifter Mirabai Chanu with a reward of Rs 2 crore and a promotion in her job in the Northeast Frontier Railway. The Manipur CM also announced a Rs 1 crore cash reward for Mirabai Chanu. Some other smaller cash awards followed. But none of them garnered even a fraction of the media coverage that the pizza offer has got. If Chanu were to order say Rs. 3000 worth of pizzas every month, that would be Rs. 36000 a year. Over 50 years, the total outlay would still be only about Rs. 18 lacs. Max Rs. 20 lacs. That too spread over 5 decades. The PR coverage cornered already by Domino's is already 10 times that amount, at least, if not more. And one can be sure that the pizza giant will continue to milk the PR even more for years hereafter. If they get

Mirabai Chanu to put in a couple of appearances for the brand, then the derived value would be amplified many times more.

- The actual sponsors of the Indian team to the Olympics spent anything between Rs. 50 lacs to Rs. 1 crore to get themselves the right to officially associate with the athletes. Domino's paid nothing, yet gained far more visibility than the official sponsors. The sponsors on television too are spending Rs. 1-2 crores to buy eyeballs. Domino's has got far more from the free pizza than any other brand that has associated itself with the Tokyo Olympics.

- Was this guerilla marketing? Yes, to an extent. Surprise is a very important component of a guerilla campaign. Domino's did surprise the recipient and all her millions of well-wishers with their large-hearted gesture. But guerilla marketing is traditionally more an ambush of an "official" competitor. Here Domino's was pitted against no one.

Freebies to champions are not new. Ravi Shastri won the Champion of Champions Award at the 1985 Benson &

Hedges Cricket World Championship in Australia. The big prize was an Audi 100. Back in those days it created ripples all over India.

Abhinav Bindra's Olympic gold at Beijing earned him a Volvo S-80. Vijay Amritraj won the Volvo International title in Bretton Woods, US in 1973 and earned himself a Volvo car too. Kidambi Srikanth was gifted a Mahindra TUV 300 when he won the Australian Open Series.

PT Usha was gifted a Standard 2000 car on winning four golds at the 1986 Asian Games. PV Sindhu, Dipa Karmarkar, Sakshi Malik and P Gopichand each got gifted a BMW after medals in the Rio Olympics. Sushil Kumar, Yogeshwar Dutt, Saina Nehwal and Gagan Narang received an Audi each from real estate company DLF after their London Olympics in 2012.

Now compared to all those fancy wheels a lifetime supply of pizzas does seem somewhat meager and inadequate. But then a kind-hearted and warm gesture is what counts for brands. Doesn't it?
