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# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



## With heart and mind

**T**o adapt, as laid out in Rotary's Action Plan, we must occasionally step out of our comfort zone and try something new. Here are two examples of clubs that adapted — one with heart and one through critical thinking and strategy.

The Rotary Club of Chandigarh Mid Town, India, led with heart earlier this year. To engage members and grow membership, Club President Nitin Kapur personally called every former member of the club and invited them to a gathering billed as an alumni meetup.

Eight former members attended, and the results were stupendous. The visitors had a chance to connect once more — not only with current members but with the sense of camaraderie and belonging that membership gave them. By the end of the evening, the club welcomed six of the former members back into the Rotary family.

Club President Kapur showed courage when he reached out to the alumni. Not only did he adapt and try something new but he had the strength of character to show the club's alumni how much they still meant to the family of Rotary. That bravery paid off.

People want to feel needed and appreciated. People want to feel that they belong. And they might never feel that way if we don't have the courage to tell them.

Meanwhile, the Rotary Club of Seoul-Hansoo, Korea, has been experimenting with different club models to great effect. Over the past four years, Seoul-Hansoo has created and maintained four satellite clubs — a service club, an interest-based club

for musicians, a cause-based club that mentors professionals, and a club for college students.

These satellite clubs are part of a five-year plan the Seoul-Hansoo club implemented to increase membership through innovation.

What's the secret to founding and maintaining so many satellite clubs? Membership between Seoul-Hansoo and its satellite clubs is fluid and synergistic. Many members of the satellite clubs attend the sponsor club's meetings. And many of the sponsor club's members participate in the satellite clubs.

Additionally, the focus of each satellite club is no accident. Each one appeals to different interests of people in the sponsor club and in the community, attracting existing and potential members. This is an excellent strategy to both retain and attract members because it offers flexibility. If someone is interested in joining but they can't make it to the sponsor club's meetings, they have plenty of options to choose from.

These are just two examples of how we can adapt with our hearts and minds. Every club is different, so I encourage you to reach out to members of your club and of the community around you. Ask them about the club experience and what you can do to improve.

Talk to enough people and you might find ways that you can adapt and spark *The Magic of Rotary* in your club.

# GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE



**D**ecember is recognized by Rotary International as Disease Prevention and Treatment Month, emphasizing the organization's commitment to addressing global health challenges. It provides an opportunity for Rotary clubs to engage in impactful initiatives, such as health camps, awareness drives, and support for differently-abled individuals, while continuing efforts like polio eradication. This theme also aligns with global observances like World AIDS Day and the International Day of Disabled Persons, inspiring Rotarians to create healthier, more inclusive communities.

Clubs can highlight practical ways to engage in impactful activities to advance Rotary's mission.

**POLIO ERADICATION:** Polio remains Rotary's flagship health initiative, reflecting decades of effort to eliminate this crippling disease globally. While great strides have been made, continued vigilance is necessary.

**HEALTH CAMPS AND AWARENESS:** Clubs are encouraged to host medical camps addressing essential health needs such as dental, vision, and general medical check-ups. These camps also educate communities about preventive measures to avoid chronic diseases like diabetes, hypertension, and heart disease.

**SUPPORT FOR DIFFERENTLY-ABLED INDIVIDUALS:** Clubs can distribute assistive devices such as wheelchairs, calipers, and prosthetic limbs to enhance mobility and independence for people living with disabilities, including polio survivors.

**CHRONIC DISEASE PREVENTION:** Raising awareness about lifestyle modifications, such as balanced nutrition

and regular exercise, is vital to reducing risks associated with obesity, diabetes, and cardiovascular diseases. Campaigns can focus on providing underprivileged communities with the knowledge and resources needed for a healthier life.

**COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS:**

Partnerships with healthcare professionals, local governments, and non-governmental organizations amplify the impact of Rotary's initiatives. For example, constructing healthcare infrastructure or supporting vaccination drives can have a lasting effect on community health.

**WORLD AIDS DAY (DECEMBER 1):**

**INTERNATIONAL DAY OF DISABLED PERSONS (DECEMBER 3):** This day is an opportunity to highlight the importance of inclusion and support for people with disabilities.

Rotary members with specialized expertise can join Rotary Action Groups to tackle global health challenges collaboratively. Groups focus on areas like blindness prevention, diabetes, mental health, and hearing care, providing an avenue for Rotarians to engage in impactful projects.

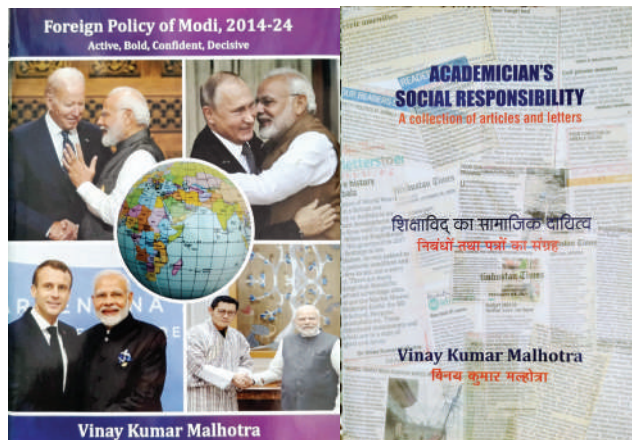
and that too merely in 14 chapters and 140 pages. Book discusses bilateral relations with all the five big powers, important nations of different continents and India's neighbours. In

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# IMPROVING THE SEX RATIO - A CALL TO ACTION FOR ROTARY

Rotary International has always championed causes that uplift communities, such as women's health, promoting gender equality, ensuring education for girls, empowering the girl child, and preventing gender-based violence. However, there remains an area that requires greater focus—preventing prenatal sex selection.

As a gynaecologist with over 22 years of experience in government hospitals in Punjab and a former state PNDT (Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques) nodal officer, I have witnessed firsthand the critical role community involvement plays in addressing this challenge.

District and state advisory committees under the PNDT Act include members from social organisations who advocate, spread awareness, and relay critical information to health authorities about illegal activities related to prenatal sex selection. This partnership is vital for effective action.

## WHY ROTARY?

As a Rotarian myself, I have always believed in Rotary's potential to make a significant impact in this area. Rotarians, with their commitment to service and strong community presence, are uniquely positioned to contribute to these advisory committees. By joining these committees under the leadership of the Civil Surgeon or Chief Medical Officer, Rotarians can:

1. Advocate for gender equality at the grassroots level.
2. Promote awareness about the detrimental effects of prenatal sex selection on society.
3. Act as a bridge between communities and authorities to report any violations while ensuring confidentiality.

## A PERSONAL APPEAL

I urge Rotarians of District 3080 to take up this opportunity to safeguard the rights of both unborn and born girls. Let us ensure that every girl, regardless of her stage of life, is given the chance to thrive.

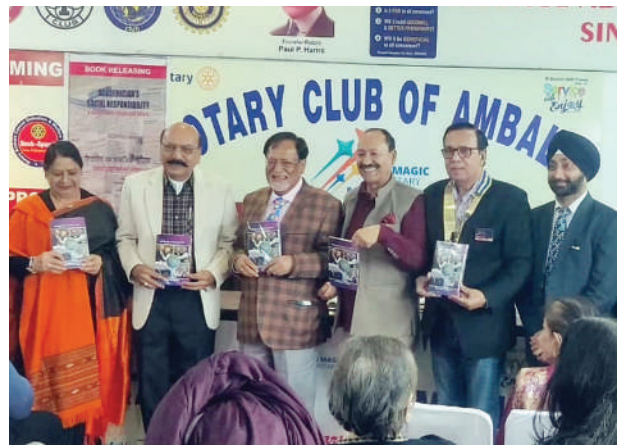

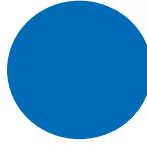
