

His project provided training in conflict prevention, civic engagement, and leadership to youths and community officials in areas affected by conflict, equipping people to drive sustainable peace efforts.

Julius harnessed Rotary's global network to overcome obstacles, including limited funding and security risks, and make a meaningful impact.

The Rotary Peace Fellowship gave Julius the tools and support to turn his vision into reality. His work embodies The Magic of Rotary — the transformative power of connecting people, sharing resources, and uniting for a common purpose.

As we reflect on the achievements of our peace fellows and celebrate Rotary's enduring commitment to peace, let us also recognize the role that everyone in our network of 1.2 million members plays in creating magic through service.

WOUNDS OF WELNESS

The Rotary Club of Chandigarh Central has taken a commendable step towards supporting patients with specialized medical needs by donating special silver-line self-healing bandages. These innovative bandages are particularly beneficial for diabetic patients, individuals with acute burns, and gynaecological conditions. The initiative underscores Rotary's commitment to addressing pressing healthcare challenges and promoting better health outcomes in the community.

Diabetic patients often struggle with delayed wound healing due to impaired blood circulation and higher susceptibility to infections. The silver-line bandages, infused with antimicrobial silver particles, accelerate the healing process, prevent infections, and reduce the risk of complications. Similarly, burn victims, who are highly vulnerable to infections, benefit immensely from these bandages, as they create a protective barrier and foster rapid tissue regeneration. In gynecological cases, these bandages provide targeted care, promoting healing in sensitive areas with reduced discomfort.

The Rotary Club's generous donation aims to alleviate the burden on patients and healthcare providers by offering cutting-edge wound care technology. This philanthropic act aligns with the Rotary ethos of "Service Above Self," bringing hope and relief to individuals who require advanced medical interventions but may lack access to such resources.

The distribution of these bandages is expected to have a far-reaching impact, improving the quality of life for numerous patients in Chandigarh and neighboring areas. BIRTHDAY OF ROTARY

PAUL HARRIS THE FOUNDER OF ROTARY



A LAWYER BY PROFESSION FEBRUARY 25, 2025 - 120TH BIRTHDAY OF ROTARY



Paul Percy Harris was born on April 19, 1868. He played his innings till January 27, 1947 (78 years). He spent 42 years of his life with Rotary (1905-1947). 40 years with his legal profession (1896–1936). He blended Rotary with his legal profession. He was the founder of Rotary. Rotary was his gift to the world.

Paul Harris as a school going boy was mischievous. He was even expelled from the High School. He went to study law at the state university of Iowa. He graduated in law in 1891. After doing law, he set out on a five year mission. To learn life by travelling. Equally, an outlook to deal with different challenges of life. He grew well. He started his legal practice in 1896. He set up his office in a small rented suite in Chicago.

How the Rotary idea germinated. It is an interesting story. In 1905, Paul had been in the legal profession for nine years. Paul invited his three clients who were local businessmen to meet on February 23, 1905. Their names were Silvester, Gustavus and Hiram. They belonged to different professions and businesses. Different faiths. The founding four were of different origins, USA, German, Swedish and Irish. All the four agreed to form a club drawing one member from each business or profession. Acquiring new friends. Building friendship and fellowship. Meeting every week by rotation. This is how Rotary took its birth. Soon, Paul realized that Rotary required greater purpose. Service to community. Service to humanity. The rest is history.

Paul met Homer Wood, a lawyer by profession. He kindled his curiosity about Rotary. This led to the formation of world's second Rotary club in 1908 at San Francisco. Rotary started moving fast. By the year 1910, 16 Rotary clubs had been charted with a total membership of 1800 Rotarians. Accordingly, a conference of national association of Rotary clubs (NARC) was organized in 1910. 29 delegates representing different clubs attended the conference. Paul was elected as President. He was also elected President the next year. At the end of his second term, Paul resigned. He cited demands of his professional practice and personal life as the reasons for doing so. He was elected President Emeritus by the convention action. A title that he held until his death. No other President had this singular honour. The Rotary club started functioning outside US at Winnipeg, Canada, Thereafter, the Rotary moved to different parts of the world.

The year 1910, is significant for another reason. On a Saturday afternoon, Paul was walking with a strikingly attractive Jean. Paul was wearing a fine Harris Tweed jacket. He tore the jacket while climbing a barbed wire fence. Jean mended his jacket. This led to their lifelong association. They were married on July 2, 1910. In 1912, they moved to their own house in Chicago. Jean was not only the life partner. She was also the Rotary partner. She invariably accompanied Paul on all his Rotary meets and visits. The life history of Paul remained intertwined with the story of Rotary.

Paul's journey as a lawyer, the details of which are not easily available. Still, I am weaving some together. Paul was prominent in his profession. He was a member of the Board of Mangers of the Chicago Bar Association at the International Congress of Law at Hague. He was also a committee member of the American Bar Association. Even in the field of law, he was honoured with Doctor of Laws by the University of Vermont. Also, Doctor honoris causa, College of Law, Lima, Peru. From 1905 to 1936, Rotary grew so well. So rapidly. These were the three decades when he was most active professionally also. He had refused the third time as President (1912-13), because he could not cop up both with Rotary and his profession. The profession of law was demanding. It is rare feat that he could blend his legal profession with Rotary. These were the decades when Rotary trees emerged in different parts of the globe. Alongwith Rotary, he also grew professionally. Truly, Rotary and legal and judicial coparcenary are partners in service. Judges find out the truth and do justice. Doing justice is divine service. A reference to

Mahatama Gandhi would be relevant. He was a Barrister. He was admitted as an advocate of the High Court of Bombay in 1891, the year in which Paul did his law. Gandhi practiced for 22 years. He would accept the cases of only those clients where he was convinced that they were speaking the Truth. He would never tutor the client or the witness. His clients were very happy with him. They used to bring such truthful clients to Gandhi. They would take the others to other lawyers. This was in Rotary spirit. I wonder, whether Paul knew about Gandhi. I doubt. About one thing, I am sure. Paul would have loved Gandhi to be embraced as a Rotarian.

Paul was not a sparkling speaker. His wisdom. His vision. They were thought provoking. He was quotable. The breadth of his knowledge was unending. He retired from his law practice in 1936. He wanted to be free and more time for Rotary. He was travelling all over the world. In the name of Rotary. He was a distinguished looking gentleman. Tall. Slender. He breathed Rotary. He nurtured Rotary. Rotary scaled new heights. Yet, he was humble and humane. Paul and Jean strengthened Rotary together. Jean was equally involved in Rotary. She went with Paul all over. She fully shared the glory of Rotary with him. She did far more for Rotary than is generally realized.

Paul passed away on 27 January, 1947. Thank you, Paul for this gift to the world. The Rotary tree was 42 years old when you left us. Today, it is running its 120th year. Adding years only means, it is getting stronger and stronger. Rotary is a perfume. Its fragrance is spreading. It will continue to spread.

EMPOWERING STUDENTS THROUGH EDUCATION AND HEALTH INITIATIVES



RCS Hill Queens, an all-women's Rotary Club based in Shimla, has been a steadfast advocate for education in some of the schools at periphery of Shimla and underserved communities of the area. These areas, often hidden by the beauty of the rugged terrain, face numerous challenges in providing quality education. Schools located 30 to 40 kilometers away from Shimla are often left out of mainstream development efforts, but through the dedication and determination of RCS Hill Queens, these schools have become the cornerstone of a transformative mission to uplift children who have long been neglected.

The journey of RCS Hill Queens began with the establishment of Interact Clubs at Government Senior Secondary School Beolia and Swaran Public School, Tuti Kandi, Shimla in the year 2022-23 and Government Model Senior Secondary School Mashobra in 2024-25 where leadership, teamwork, and responsibility were cultivated among students from humble backgrounds. A Children's Day picnic at Craig Nano, a serene park near Mashobra, allowed these students, many of whom had never ventured beyond their villages, to experience a world beyond their familiar surroundings. These simple yet impactful gestures have proven to be life-changing, reaffirming the club's mission to make a tangible difference.

Under Project Unmesh, Our outreach also extended to some of the most inaccessible areas around Shimla, including Govt Primary School Kasot, located below Kaithu, accessible only after descending a gruelling 250 stairs. Despite the challenging journey, the children's smiling faces and gratitude made every step worthwhile. Under Project Unmesh, RCS Hill Queens distributed 15 sets of school ,uniforms, shoes and refreshments to students. Children from Aanganwadi, Kaithu were also present, we provided them stationery, refreshments and juices. Similarly, the warmth and enthusiasm of students at Government High School Sehal in Shoghi made the physical challenges of reaching the school pale in comparison. The approach to school involved a drive at a narrow stretch and a steep climb of 400 meters .It was a wonderful opportunity to attend the Annual day and Children's day of the school. RCS Hill Queens sponsored prizes to the winners and 10 plastic chairs for the staff room. It was inspiring to see the support and participation of the parents and teachers to make the programme a big success. Similarly At Government Primary School Boh, our consecutive second adventurous journey was truly

memorable. The narrow stretches and uneven roads added to thrill, we walked down at least a kilometre to reach school. We attended annual day function where children showcased a vibrant and colourful programme. The event offered a delightful glimpse into the village life. The warmth and hospitality of locals left a lasting impression as we enjoyed lunch and refreshing lassi, sitting by the chullah to escape the the icy cold winds. It becomes essential to mention about a heartwarming journey to picturesque village Sathli located near the tourist destination Chail, approximately 1hour, 45minutes from Shimla.Our visit was aimed at supporting the students of Government Primary and Middle School Sathli where 24 bright and enthusiastic students' study. We distributed school bags and stationery to these students fulfilling the request from the principal. One particularly moving experience was at Government Primary School Bothwell where many children from very humble backgrounds lacked basic minimal requirements like shoes and school uniform. Providing them with warm tracksuits, socks and shoes ensured they could attend school with dignity and pride. In Government Primary School Rajhana, we got five fans installed to improve the learning environment and provided Aqua guards for safe drinking water, is just one of the many ongoing efforts to improve infrastructure and hygiene.

It was a privilege to represent Hill Queens at the Annual Function of Government Girls Senior Secondary School Lakkar Bazar, Shimla.The event was graced by the local MLA accompanied by Mayor Deputy Mayor and elected councillors. The president shared the stage with dignitaries and also gave away the prizes to the winners in different games. In response to the request from the principal of the of Government Girls High School Lakkar Bazar, a large tin shed dustbin measuring 9*11 feel with a door was installed to prevent the menace of monkeys and dogs



on school grounds, ensuring a safer and cleaner environment for students and staff.

RCS Hill Queens is thrilled to provide essential resources and contribute to the educational journey of these so many needy students.

Childrens Day Celebration for interactors from Government Senior School Beolia was a joyful and unforgettable day. 
