

From the Editor's desk

Dear Fellow Rotarian,

A new Rotary year has begun with Rotary International President Stephanie Urchik at the helm. The second woman to hold this post. In 2022-23 Rtn Jennifer Jones was the first woman to be RI President in the 117-year history of Rotary.



In 2024, 28% of Rotary members worldwide are women. And our own club just upped the percentage of women members from 25% to 30% by welcoming Rtn Surekha Kothari and Rtn Sangeetha Shinde to the club.

It has been a long journey for women in Rotary. Though clubs had tried to include women these attempts were repeatedly struck down. The first official attempt was at the R.I. Convention in 1910. Some delegates introduced the topic but it was overwhelmingly rejected. In 1950, at the Detroit Convention, the Ahmedabad Club of India (of which I was briefly a member) proposed that the word "male" be dropped from Article III of the Standard Club Constitution. This too was soundly defeated.

In 1977 the Rotary club of Duarte, California admitted two women and in 1978, RI terminated Duarte's charter. In 1986 the California Court of Appeal ruled in favour of Duarte, The RI Board appealed the decision to the United States Supreme Court which ruled in March 1987 that the club could not discriminate against members because of gender. On 23 June, Duarte inducted Dr Sylvia Whitlock as the first woman president in the history of Rotary. My mother was inducted into Rotary in July 1987. By June 1990, the number of female Rotarians was over 20,000. By July 2010 they comprised about 16% of Rotarians, and more than 23% in 2020.

Rotary recognises the need for growth in female membership and members under the age of forty. New members bring new perspectives, new ideas, and energy, into our clubs. As we extend our Rotary family, we increase our scope and capacity to serve.




