Dear Fellow Rotarian,

The Rotary theme for September is Basic Education & Literacy. We have a responsibility for preparing the next generation for the challenges and opportunities they will face. In the Anthropocene age, as humans are



reconfiguring the climate in various ways knowledge and guidance about green initiatives are essential.

The Wayanad landslide disaster was one of the deadliest in Kerala's history, with reports of over 420 fatalities, 397 injuries, and more than 118 people missing. The possible causes have been identified as deforestation, seismic sensitivity, poor building construction, and global warming. The fact is that many disasters that we see can no longer be called natural disasters given the large footprint of human decisions or interventions that enable them.

The impacts of climate change are not uniformly distributed. Coastal regions in India face rising sea levels and increased cyclonic activity, while northern and central parts of the country grapple with intense heatwaves and droughts. The agrarian sector, which employs a significant portion of the population, is particularly vulnerable. Erratic rainfall patterns and temperature fluctuations disrupt crop cycles, threatening food security and farmer livelihoods. Cities deal with both flooding and droughts.

Climate change is not just a policy issue but a societal challenge. We need to foster a culture of sustainability. Community-driven efforts are also important where formal policies fall short. Here's hoping that understanding and caring for the environment takes as important a place in education as Mathematics, Sciences and Languages.

A shout out to the children of the Stanes school Interact club who took the initiative and collected and sent aid to Wayanad. In the words of Ann Daniella Croning, "most children are genuinely interested and enthusiastic.. We just have to spark that fire and then guide it."
