

80 women were selected and taught basic sewing skills like stitching saree blouses, kurtas and salwars. Upon completing the training, they received certificates and they signed agreements that they would use their skills in a proper way to support themselves. They were all gifted sewing machines on their graduation day.

Guest Speaker Brigadier Pabitra Chakravarti spoke to members on the topic "Reflection of Life". It was an interesting session with participation from the members. 04/03








