### ***Project 8- Diwali Celebration***

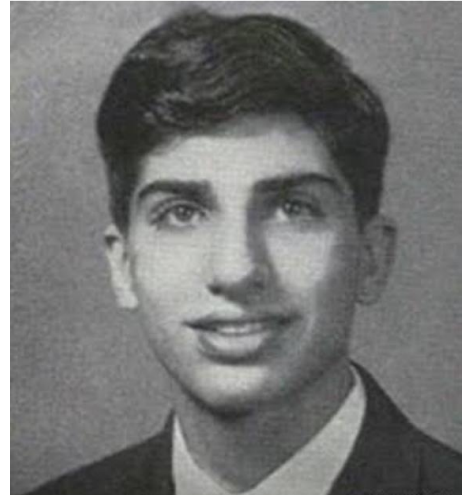
***Dated- 26<sup>th</sup> October***

## **Mr. Ratan Tata Ji**

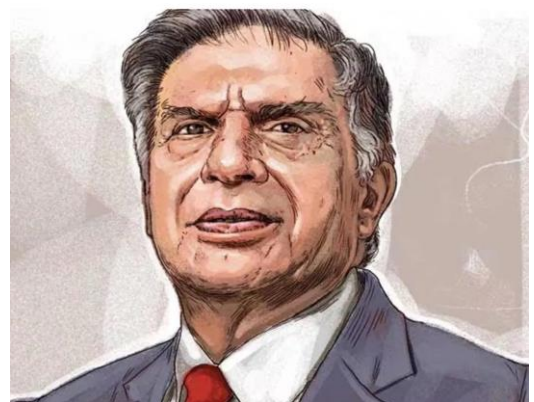
