## District Governor's Message

September is the month of festivals. It is a month to meet and greet, and at the same time launch new projects. Presidents are going full steam to implement their plans for the year. New Rotaract & Interact Clubs are being formed. Membership expansion and forming new clubs have been an important focus by DG and Membership Chair George Cherian.

LEAD '25 saw the launch of Projects worth 40 crores. RI Director MMM applauded RI District 3234 for its planning and projects. 100 PINK AUTOS was a super launch. RI President Francesco Arezzo and Deputy CM Udhayanidhi Stalin witnessed the spectacle of 100 PINK AUTOS lined up with 100 women in pink jackets smiling to become the proud owners of the Pink Autos. They applauded Rotary's efforts to empower women and make them self-reliant. LEAD '25 gave great opportunity for RI District 3234 to showcase the power of its Presidents. All areas of LEAD '25 had important Team Leaders from RI District 3234. Right from Registration, Stage Management, Technology, Venue Management, Project Launches, Pre-Leads program – in all these areas, RI District 3234 was in the forefront. The crowning glory was the End Polio Formation on 24th

August, when 4000 Rotaractors gathered in Red End Polio T-shirts. The Captains and Marshals assured Rotaractors into a pre-determined grid, holding the board of End Polio in their hands. Once the grid was complete under the command of RI President, the Rotaractors lifted the boards above their head to see a massive image of END POLIO witness dramatically through the drone photography on the large LED screen. The RI President could not believe that Rotaractors of one District could do this act and it was applauded by all Rotary leaders assembled onstage, a huge Public Image activity for Rotary.

The Vocational Service Team of the District wanted to recognize the unsung heroes, coaches and guides from various arts and crafts, who do not get recognized for

their tremendous service. The District Dronacharya Award to commemorate Teachers Day recognized outstanding faculty members from diverse fields who have dedicated their lives from shaping young minds. Teachers, regardless of their disciplines, hold a position of great respect and reverence, and this celebration was a fitting tribute to their invaluable contribution.

# Rotary Dronacharya Awards 2025

The Rotary Dronacharya Awards 2025, was organized by Rotary District 3234 under the guidance of District Governor Vinod Saraogi, with key organizers Rtn. Dr. Kumar Rajendran (Chairman - Vocational Awards) and Rtn. Sarada Ramani (Chairman - Vocational Services). Various Rotary clubs across the district submitted over 300 nominations. Out of these, 83 were selected and honored with shields and certificates. The event took place on September 6, 2025, at Sathyabama MGR Maligai, Adyar.

The event honored unseen mentors who built dreams in various fields, and spanned multiple categories, including: Theatre, Music, Aviation, Boxing, Gymnastics, Cycling, Painting, Sculpting, Dance, Photography, Yoga and meditation, Kabaddi, Archery, Handball, Hockey, Basketball, Football, Badminton, Table tennis, Physical education, Cricket, Silambam, Muay Thai, Vedic chanting, Vedic astrology, Aquatic sports, Drawing, Karate, Shooting, Bharatanatyam, Rugby, Beauty and grooming, Sports physiotherapy and chiropractic care, Kung fu and Celebrity hairdressing.

Theatre stalwart Aysha Rau, with over three decades of work and 50 productions, was recognized for pioneering international festivals and hospital clowning. Dr. Eric Miller, co-founder of the World Storytelling Institute, and media veteran Ramkumar Singaram were also honored for shaping narratives through storytelling and theatre.

In music, honorees included Sathish Kumar, trained by the legendary Shri M.S. Gopalakrishnan; cultural promoter Ramjhi; drumming innovator B. Sridhar; and Meenakshi Seshadhri, a graded AIR artist with over four decades of excellence. Dance luminaries such as Sneha Vakkala, Dr. Sujatha Mohan, Saradha Sethuraman, and Srimayi Vempati were recognized for preserving and spreading India's classical traditions globally.

Sports excellence was celebrated with Dhivya Kamalesh for gymnastics, Vinolee Ramalingam for triathlon and cycling, and Bharath Krishna for boxing and fitness education. Veteran contributors like Gold M. Rajendran (Kabaddi), R. Babu Rajendran (Handball), Kennet Thomas (Hockey), and V. P. Danapal (Basketball) were honored for decades of service as players, coaches, and mentors.

The field of Yoga and wellness saw recognition for Dr. R. Elangovan, who has guided 46 Ph.D. scholars in Yoga education, and Sridevi Aravindan, known for her therapeutic expertise. Other awardees such as Akshaya Lakshmi, Padmapriya Mani, Ramya Chakravarthy, and Dr. Madheena Saleem were acknowledged for integrating wellness, research, and healing practices to benefit thousands worldwide.

Educators including J. Samson (Physical Education), Meenakshi Ganesh (Table Tennis), and Sudhasrinivasan (Music) were celebrated for shaping young talent, while artists like M. Janaki and K. Latha were recognized for blending tradition with creativity in the classroom.

The awards also honored achievers in emerging professions, including Ramya Rengarajan, Commander at Air India, for her 21-year aviation journey; Ellappan Swaminathan, a pioneer in international barbering education; and Dr. Geetha Loganathan, a trailblazer in chiropractic physiotherapy and sports care.

The awardees attended the ceremony along with their family members and appreciated the organizers for conducting such a well-organized event. The entire event was sponsored generously by Rtn. Dr. Kumar Rajendran, Chairman - Vocational Awards.

# Vocational Services Project – Sri Lanka Visit

Rotary District 3234, along with Calidai Motors is setting up a Vocational Wheel Chair Manufacturing Unit at Uyirilai – Centre of Spinal Cord Injured Victims, Mangulam, Srilanka.

On 11th September a group of 27 Rotarians from our District 3234 along with our District Governor AKS Rtn. Vinod Saraogi went on an International Trip to Jaffna, Killinochi and Mullaitivu. Immediately on reaching Srilanka all the Rotarians proceeded to Uririlai- The Centre for Spinal Cord Injury Association. The Munnetram Mobility Solutions was inaugurated at Mangulam by our 3234 District Governor AKS Rtn. Vinod Saraogi and 3220 District Governor Rtn. Delvin Pereira and First Lady Lucine Pereira. Vocational Services Chairman Rtn. Sarada Ramani, Project Dhanvatri Chairman Rtn. Dhanasekhar, Vocational Training Team Chairman Rtn. Punniyamoorthy, Additional Chairman International Service Rtn. Satheesh, Assistant Governors Rtn. Usha Ajit Prasad, Rtn Harisharan and Unite for Good Presidents from various clubs and Rotarians from our districts along with District Secretary PP Dinesh Kumar and President Rtn. Dr. Y. Gowthaman President RC Kilinochchi were part of the inauguration of this unique project. The members of the Uririlai Association were present in large numbers and were very emotional and thankful for having conceived this idea and getting this done for

their benefit. This project provides Custom design & Assembly, Local Assembly, Sustainable business model benefiting the war affected victims and will provide

- Employability-by manufacturing readymade/ customized Wheel chairs
- Improved mobility- customized wheel chairs can enhance the mobility and independence of individuals with spinal cord injuries.
- Economic Empowerment - the assembly unit can create employment opportunities and contribute to the local economy.
- Community support - profits from wheelchair sales can be used to support medical expenses rehabilitation and other leads of association members.

This project comprises of initial stock 100 wheel chairs components to be sent by ship from Chennai, machine sets & tools, consumables for 3 months. Training at Mangulam by trainers from Callidai Motors will commence from November.

The total project cost is Rs.13.50 Lakhs and is being supported by many clubs in the District. District Governor of 3220 Rtn. Delvin Pereira said that the Clubs in Srilanka will purchase wheel chairs from this unit.
