

#### Annadan Mahadan

## Netralaya



Between 20th January and 4th February, Rotary Mahanagar Netralaya conducted a total of 217 eye surgeries, providing critical ophthalmic care to patients. Out of these, 203 were free Small Incision Cataract Surgeries (SICS), reaffirming the hospital's commitment to serving underprivileged patients.



Additionally, 10 paid SICS procedures were performed, along with 3 Phaco surgeries, which are known for their advanced cataract removal technique. Apart from these, 1 other surgery was also conducted.



## **Homeopathy**









At a homoeopathy clinic, an eye camp was conducted on the 21st of January, during which 5 male and 7 female patients were provided with spectacles to help them improve their vision. Following this, regular eye treatments continued at the clinic. On the 25th of January, 7 patients received treatment, followed by 11 patients on the 30th of January. The number of patients further increased on the 2nd of February, with 19 individuals receiving eye care. Continuing this trend, 17 more patients received treatment on the 6th of February.



The visit to Felix School of Education (FSE) aimed to explore potential collaborations for enhancing Rotary Vivekananda School (RVS), Kultali, including transitioning to an English-medium curriculum and seeking CBSE affiliation.

#### **Key Observations:**

The delegation was impressed by FSE's infrastructure, modern classrooms, well-equipped labs, and use of Finnish pedagogy. Discussions with Dr. Ranjana focused on RVS's curriculum shift, teacher recruitment, and board exam preparation.

Action Points for Collaboration:

- 1. Teacher Recruitment:
- Recruit at least three English-medium teachers with FSE's assistance.
- 2. Teacher Training & Support:
- FSE will train and mentor the new teachers, ensuring a smooth transition.
- 3. Curriculum & Books:
- Adopt FSE's recommended curriculum and books.
- 4. Board Exam Collaboration:
- Facilitate CBSE board exam preparation through FSE's guidance.

#### Additional Opportunity:

Dr. Ranjana proposed a partnership to establish a Teacher Training Institute at FSE, aligning with Rotary's educational goals.

#### Conclusion:

The visit was productive, and we thank Dr. Ranjana and the FSE team for their hospitality. This collaboration offers significant potential to enhance education at RVS, and we look forward to a successful partnership.







