## PREVENTIVE&CURATIVE HEALTH SERVICES

**Through MMU1** 



24 OPDs covered 1261 patients and 20 patients were referred. 33 Special Health Education sessions were organized for community people. 277 people benefitted. One-to-one sessions 561. The team organized Dermatology camp for community on 31st July 2024. 43 beneficiaries benefitted. Bone density camp held on 31st July 2024 at Govandi. Total 65 community people benefited through this camp. 11 patients were in the normal range of Bone density, 40 patients in the Osteopenia range of bone density, and 14 patients are suffering from Osteoporotic.



The project team has conducted home visits for elderly people who are not able to visit the mobile medical unit. These activities help these individuals monitor their health on a regular basis. The community greatly appreciate this initiative.

Healthcare professionals conduct otoscopy examination of patients as needed, and then offer personalized recommendations and guidance based on their observations and diagnoses.

## PREVENTIVE&CURATIVE HEALTH SERVICES

**Through MMU2** 



The MMU is functional in 15 selected villages of the Wada block of Palghar District. 10000 patients will be treated. 12000 community people will be educated in preventive Healthcare through community-based Health Awareness programs. General Health OPD - 22, Patients covered - 659 and patients referred - 6. The MMU WADA organized Blood Testing camp for community people which included Hemoglobin and Blood Cell Count test. Total 25 community men & Women have benefited through this camp.



Two Special Health Education sessions were organized for 36 community people. Education sessions, on topics like Anemia, Family Planning ,World Population Day, Menstrual Health, Nutrition, Addiction, and waterborne diseases were carried out. The team has also conducted 23 one on one sessions for the patients. The MMU project successfully conducted a general health check-up camp at the Z.P. school in Gandhre, benefiting 30 children.

## PREVENTIVE&CURATIVE HEALTH SERVICES

**Through MMU1** 



General Health OPD – 22 OPDs covered 1219 patients and 14 patients were referred. 21 Special Health Education sessions were organized. Number of beneficiaries 198 and one-to-one sessions 418. The team has organized Mega camp on 15th August 2024 which Included Blood Glucose & Hemoglobin testing and Ophthalmic camp. 152 patients were checked. The 25 women and 09 men were screened for anemia. Ophthalmic screening camp report: • A total of 152 (69 male & 83 Female) beneficiaries participated in ophthalmic camp. • 147 spectacles were distributed and 05 people were referred for further treatment.



22 patients were diagnosed with Impaired Glucose and Diabetic. The team celebrated World Breastfeeding Week by organizing activities aimed at educating community members about the vital role that family members can play in breastfeeding mothers. supporting They reached out to 44 community women, 22 Pregnant women, lactating mothers. ## **IVD PROGRAM**

Shirsewad Village



The Block Development Officer Mohite and Agriculture Extension Officer Ashok Mahamuni encouraged farmers to adopt advanced technology, engage in group and organic farming. Six Community, SMC, and PTA meetings were conducted focusing on New Education Policy and establishment of Study Centre. 47 members participated. 18 children from 1st to 4th Std. are attending study classes. Children are engaged in reading skill improvement and solving math. 18 children participated in poster making on saving water and other environmental topics. Awareness sessions on importance of improving social indicators where 47 community members participated.



A health awareness campaign was organized in six villages. 87 children participated from six study centres. 84 patients benefited from a Medical Health camp.88 mango saplings were distributed to 10 beneficiaries. 40 farmers are supporting vegetable farming to include Bottle gourd, Bitter gourd, Cucumber, Pumpkin, Brinjal, Chili, Ladyfinger, Beans.

## Educational & skill upgradation programs to be undertaken during RY 2024-25

- 1. Primary & Middle-Level school learning activities for Chimbipada village (71 students) To be held every schooling day.
- 2. Anganwadi pre-primary students at village Chimbipada (15 children) to be exposed to best learning practices once a week at the ECD center.
- 3.Regular Extra classes for 10th std students in English, Maths & Science held every day for students who will be attending the Board exam in Feb-March 2025 (21 students) in village Chimbipada.
- 4. Basic Computer learning class for schooling children of stds 6th & 7th for 3 times a week (16 students).
- 5.5.Adult Literacy and Financial Literacy for Women of the village (15 women)
- 6.Teachers Training Program (65 teachers) Once a month .The above programs are expected to impact about 150 to 160 student beneficiaries and 65 to 70 teacher beneficiaries over 2024-25 up to June 2025.

- 3.10th grade benefited from 24 sessions in additional math, science, and English taught through engaging and interactive methods. ECD Center team met with parents to know that the computer sessions are beginning.



They short-listed students for computer learning and started with basic computer learning. The ECD centers team does home visits to its disadvantaged pupils every Saturday. Second Shishan Parishad was held at **ECD** Centre. On 3rd July, educational study material distribution program was held at the ECD where study materials were given to the students of class 5th to 7th std students. Total beneficiaries 92.

- 5.15 sessions conducted on computer literacy for village adults in August 2024.
- 6.There are 45 home visits conducted through Community Connect in August 2024.

## ARIF ZAKARIA IN CONVERSATION MADHOO SHAH

Rtn Madhoo Shah was in conversation with Mr Arif Zakaria on the eve of release of the highly anticipated web series, "Freedom at Midnight" at Centre Stage, NSCI. The series paints a sweeping picture of the tumultuous year of Indias independence from Great Britain in 1947. #### **MENSTRUATION MATTERS**

This initiative's aim was to tackle the stigma around periods and initiate the period talk earlier for adolescent girls and enable them to be prepared for them when they arrive. This event was done in collaboration with a Delhi based organisation named Pinkishe. They provided us with 250 sanitary pad packets. The event was conducted successfully by 5 volunteers at a municipality school (Karmaveer Bhauroa Patil Vidyalaya). We were able to cross the targeted number of beneficiaries within the stipulated time period, crossing over 270 girls.

#### **ECHOES OF PRIDE**

The event included a visit to the trans shelter home where the volunteers got to interact with a group of 20-30 transgenders, followed by a session on intimate hygiene and menstrual hygiene, after which a sanitary pad drive was conducted and finally an open discussion with the community discussing about their varied gynaecological problems that they tend to encounter on regular basis. One on one counselling sessions were also planned.

## **ECHOES OF PRIDE**

The 2 day workshop aimed to promote right based approach to abortion and sensitise medical students about gender, sexuality and sexual and reproductive health rights. The workshop with about 30 participants and facilitators trained after attending international conferences featured interactive lectures, skits to demonstrate patriarchy and micro-aggressions, simulations of abortion procedures and round table discussions for values clarification. Pre and post workshop questionnaires showed significant improvement in participants' understanding of gender and abortion laws even from a legal aspect. Feedback was overwhelming with participants expressing the need for such sensitisation to fill the gaps in the current medical education.

### SIGNSPEAK MED

Webinar in which the participants learned the basics of sign language, Medically relevant sign language, which will prove invaluable when interacting with patients who are deaf or hard of hearing. It was an interactive session where participants engaged with the lecturer to learn better.

#### **HEALTHY HEROES**

A Paediatric Health Camp conducted in Riddhi Siddhi Charitable Trust Orphanage based in Mira Road and Airoli. It was conducted on 27th July, 2024. The camp included 7 volunteers from RC Medicrew and about 50 children ranging from the ages of 10 to 17 years old. The volunteers conducted a basic health check up for the children along with referral to the nearby hospital if needed, followed by a discussion regarding the importance of a balanced diet and a healthy lifestyle from an early age. The children were shown several presentations demonstrating the health benefits of eating healthy and participating in routine health check ups. This was followed by a question and answer session where their doubts were answered by an intern doctor.





#### MISP FOR A BETTER INDIA

We conducted a 3 session series to cover the 9 modules and post module certification of the Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP), a United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) initiative. 3 modules were covered per session and we had around 30 participants for the same. MISP helps understand the set of services to be provided during complex humanitarian settings to ensure the maintainance of sexual and reporductive health. It covers a wide range of topics right from gender based violence, sexually transmitted diseases and safe abortions to SRH co ordinator roles and Inter Agency Reproductive Kits (IARH).

The participants were very keen to discuss reproductive health and helped make the sessions extremely interactive.




