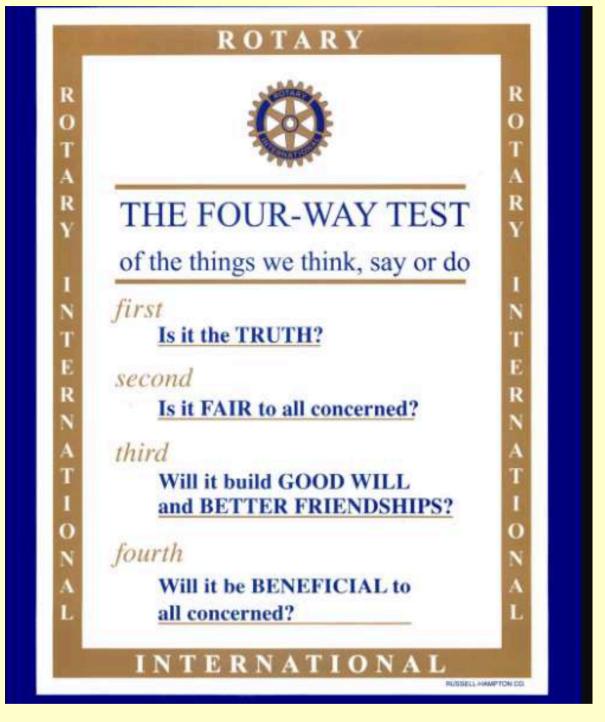



"Sustainable Living"

That's a wonderful pledge! Celebrating & adopting a plastic-free Sustainable lifestyle, festivals by choosing sustainable and natural products is a meaningful way to honor the life while caring for the environment. Here's a simple pledge we can all take:

"I pledge to celebrate festivals & adopt lifestyle even from in a way that honors our planet. I will choose gifts made from natural and sustainable materials, avoiding plastic and synthetic products. I will opt for beautiful cotton bags, stainless steel containers, and other eco-friendly alternatives. Together, let's light up our homes and hearts with every festival that is kinder to the Earth."

let's embrace sustainability and inspire others to do the same.While Gifting Sweets, dryfruits or edible please use steel containers .There are Healthy ,food products which are packed in plastic boxes but when they are used creates huge Synthetic waste which is unable to Reuse, process or Recycle! Heaps of plastic pollution is increased & causing our existence very Hard! Think about Future of our Next Generation. Care for our Earth .

Celebration can be with natural products & adoption of Sustainable lifestyle. Creating a plastic-free home can be a gradual but rewarding process. Here are some practical steps you can take to reduce or eliminate plastic from different areas of your home:

1. In the Kitchen:

Storage: Replace plastic containers with glass, stainless steel, or clay options. Use mason jars or other glass containers for food storage.

Wraps: Use natural material wraps or silicone lids , banana leaves, instead of plastic wrap!







Shopping Bags: Always bring reusable cloth bags for grocery shopping.

Produce Bags: Swap plastic produce bags for reusable mesh or cotton produce bags. Utensils and Tools: Switch to wooden, metal, or bamboo cooking utensils instead of plastic ones.

Dishwashing: Use natural bristle brushes or biodegradable sponges, and dish soap in bars or refillable bottles. Use coconut shred periodically change it for washing vessel.

2. In the Bathroom & wash Basin

Personal Care Products: Opt for solid shampoo bars (soaps for hairwash), conditioner bars, and soap bars that come without plastic packaging.

Toothbrush: Use a bamboo toothbrush instead of a plastic one. Toothpaste sometimes replace with tooth powder which are in tin packing !

Switch to a safety razor with metal blades instead of disposable plastic razors.

Cotton Swabs: Buy biodegradable cotton swabs with paper or bamboo sticks instead of plastic.

3. Cleaning Supplies:

Cleaning Products: Make your own cleaning solutions using natural ingredients like vinegar, baking soda, and essential oils. Alternatively, buy cleaning supplies in bulk or in plastic-free packaging. I am using decauction of marigold petals with few neem leaves & orange ,lemon peels as body cleaning solution.

Laundry: Use soap , or a laundry detergent that comes in a cardboard box or refillable packaging.

I am using orange peels in water bucket when orange peels are available in home . Soak your daily clothes in water+ orange peels .Keep for 3 hours .Just squeeze soaked clothes & keep for drying with Orange fragrance ! less chemicals & less plastic in home!

Broom and Dustpan: Choose ones made from wood, metal, or recycled materials instead of plastic.







4. In the Bedroom:

Bedding and Mattresses: Look for organic cotton, bamboo, or other natural fiber like cotton, bedding and mattresses that are free from synthetic materials.(coire)

Closet: Choose clothing made from natural fibers like cotton, wool, hemp, or linen instead of synthetic fibers, which are made from plastics.

5. Shopping and Groceries:

Bulk Buying: Purchase dry goods in bulk using your own containers. Bring your own bags and containers to reduce packaging waste.

Shop at farmers markets ,vegetables ,fruits or stores that offer loose, unpackaged produce in cotton bags which can be washed easily. Also use leaf base plates ,vegetable packing ,bamboo ,Cane baskets or banana leaves even in picnic.

6. Other Household Items:

Furniture: Choose furniture made from natural material.

On digging a bit deeper I started wondering was his analogy really true but to my surprise the triumphant moment was short lived as the killer impact of INFLATION became evident.




Figure 1: Purchasing Power Over the Years
