





The Magic of Rotary is belonging, and it's a feeling that can appear when you least expect it.

Earlier this year, I was in Slovakia serving as a president's representative during a six-week trip through Europe. When I wrote to Katarina Cechova, governor of District 2240 at the time, I mentioned that my grandmother Veronica Zilka grew up in a small village in the area before settling in the U.S.

It wasn't long before Cechova tracked down my grandmother's village, Jakubova Vol'a. She even organized a visit for me, where I received an unforgettable Slovakian welcome.

When I entered the community center of Jakubova Vol'a, a small crowd of people dressed in traditional Slovakian clothing greeted me. They sang with beautiful and powerful Central European voices that reminded me of my grandmother.

A lot of families play cards or games when they get together. When I was young, my father would pick up his accordion and lead my family in song. My grandmother would sing along with her impressive voice.

When I walked into the community center and heard traditional music from my childhood — when I saw a woman play the accordion the way my dad played — I suddenly felt like a little girl sitting at my grandmother's house in Monessen, Pennsylvania. I burst into tears of joy at the memories.

But the magic didn't stop there. District Governor Cechova really outdid herself. A local genealogist worked with a videographer to make a short film about my grandmother. We watched the video together in the community center.

When the video ended, I turned around and saw a man standing in the back of the room. I quickly learned that this stranger, Frantisek Zilka, was my second cousin. His grandmother and mine had been sisters. I felt like I had been struck by lightning.

I visited my newfound cousin's home, which happens to be the home where my grandmother was born. There, he shared old photographs I had never seen of my dad, my uncle, and my grandmother.

Since then, I can't stop thinking about my family of Rotary. When I refer to you as my family, I'm not just being kind. I really think of everyone in Rotary as my family. But I never would have imagined that my Rotary family would introduce me to long-lost personal family.

Sitting in that community center listening to traditional Slovakian music from my childhood filled me with joy and a profound sense of belonging. I am so grateful to District Governor Cechova and everyone who helped create that magical experience.




MESSAGE FROM DISTRICT GOVERNOR RID 3141





<u>RI SPECIAL OBSERVANCE THEME-EDUCATION & LITERACY-</u>Ekal Maps Global Grant Project <u>-By Rtn. R Vanamali</u>

The Ekal Maps Global Grant Project was launched with the objective of promoting Functional Literacy of Children in Villages of India.

The project entailed providing 1 set of MAPS (Large size, Rugged, Graphical) of India and World to 19,397 village Aachals or Shaalas of Ekal Foundation across 9 States of India. It's estimated about 6 lakhs of rural children would benefit from this initiative every year after full implementation.


This project was conceived by Ekal Foundation India and their US Head approached Rtn Ms Archana Uppal of Rotary Club of Trumbull (RD 7980),USA for funding support from Rotary. Rtn Archana undertook a field trip to India facilitated by Ekal Foundation for Need Based Analysis of the massive project, after which she shared her ideas with Rotarians Vanamali & Latha, requesting participation of RCBP.

After seeking respective Board approvals, a Global Grant Application was filed with District 3141.

Global Grant approval was received from RI in Oct 2016.

Total Grant Value approved was USD 30,454.80.

The project coordinators were: Rtn R Vanamali, Global Grant Coordinator, Host Club, RCBP & Rtn Ms Archana Uppal, Global Grant Coordinator, Main Partner Club, Rotary Club of Trumbull (USA)




Our own Club's contribution was about 10%, rest was shared between, Rotary Club of Trumbull & a partner club, all the related Districts & matched by Rotary International (the largest contributor). Hence, as Rotarians from India, we need to understand that when we contribute to TRF, our entire contribution comes back to us 3 years later for our Global Grant & District Grant projects.

Our MAP Supplier for the project is a well-known Printer from Delhi, M/S UNITED PUBLICATIONS. They had a rich past experience working with various Rotary Clubs & EKAL in the North.

There were many challenges faced by us during the execution of the project, especially for approvals & reporting. A key challenge which led to enormous delays was getting approvals from Rotary District Governors & TRF District Chairs from 9 Districts (across India). I had to seek help from various past DGs from our District to obtain the necessary cooperation from various Rotary Districts.


Within the Club, I received great support from current & Past Presidents as also from Club Treasurers, like Vivek Govilkar & Dilip Talreja. For our final 'Project Financial Closure, I received tremendous support from Rtn.Subodh Bohra, District Treasurer (known as the TRF & GG Guru as far as accounting matters are concerned). The greatest support came from, of course, Rtn Archana, Ekal Foundation India Team & United Publications.



It was our happiest day when we received intimation from RI South Asia Office in September 2023 that our Global Grant closure was successfully achieved & they thanked all Rotarians for their time, money & efforts!

SANSKRITI- Art, Culture, Herítage - Ganeshotsav - By Sadhna Bhave

Modak is Ganesha's favorite sweet and made in many Hindu homes during the first day of Ganesh Chaturthi Festival. Every year, as Ganesh festival approaches, I can't help but think of the kitchen air, which fills with the fragrance of freshly grated coconut, jaggery melting into it, with the aroma of crushed cardamom and nutmeg, the delicate scent of rice flour being worked into that perfectly thin, translucent layer that only my mother in law can master - soft, plump dumplings called Ukdiche Modak.

As a Sindhi married into a Maharashtrian family, I picked up many things from her how to make the smoothest shrikhand, the yummiest peethla—there was something about her modaks that i couldn't quite master. She works her nimble fingers with precision - the rice flour coating has to be impossibly thin, just enough to encase the plump coconut and jaggery filling without overpowering it - just perfect. Maybe one day my version will be half as good!

There's a special way to eat these modaks too. You don't just pick them up and eat them. No, you carefully place two (or more if you're feeling indulgent!) on your plate, poke a hole in the top, and then the final touch: a fat dollop of ghee. It's an indulgence, yes, but Ganesh comes only once a year, and this is our way of celebrating together as a family.







There is a story related to the Modaks. The Modak was gifted to Mata Parvati by Lord Vishnu, and he asked her to give to the one who truly deserved it. But Mata Parvati had two sons - Ganesha and Kartikeya, and how could she give it to one of them. Therefore, she organized a contest. She said that the one who would travel around the universe three times would get it.

Kartikeya began his journey on his peacock, but Ganesha did parikrama of his parents, as they meant the world to him. Moreover, he knew that they represented the universe. Thus, by winning Mata Parvati's heart with his wisdom, he grabbed the Modak.

MODAK RECIPE


Ingredients: For the Dough (Outer Rice Covering):- 1 cup rice flour (fine variety)- 1 cup water- 1 tsp ghee (clarified butter)- A pinch of salt.

For the Filling:- 1 cup fresh grated coconut- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup jaggery (adjust to taste)- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp cardamom powder- a pinch of nutmeg powder - 1 tbsp poppy seeds- 1 tbsp chopped dry fruits (like cashews and raisins, optional)- 1 tsp ghee

For Serving:- Ghee (for drizzling) Instructions:

- 1. Prepare the Filling: Heat 1 tsp ghee in a pan on medium heat.
- Add the grated coconut and sauté for 2-3 minutes.
- Add the jaggery and stir continuously until the jaggery melts and blends with the coconut. Don't overcook, as the filling should be moist, not dry.
- Add cardamom powder, nutmeg, poppy seeds and dry fruits. Stir well.
- Remove from heat and let it cool. The filling should be slightly sticky and moist.2. Prepare the Dough: Boil 1 cup of water with a pinch of salt and 1 tsp ghee.
- Once the water comes to a rolling boil, lower the heat and add the rice flour slowly, stirring continuously to avoid lumps.
- Turn off the heat, cover, and let it rest for 5-7 minutes. After resting, transfer the mixture to a plate and knead the dough while it's still warm. Knead well to make a soft, smooth, and lump-free dough. If needed, grease your palms with ghee for easier handling.

Assemble the Modaks:

- Grease your palms with a little ghee and take a small portion of the dough.
- Roll it into a smooth ball and then flatten it into a disc. The edges should be thinner than the center.
- Place about 1-2 teaspoons of the coconut-jaggery filling in the center.
- Now, carefully start pleating the edges of the dough. Bring the pleats together to seal the modak at the top, forming a pointed shape.
- Repeat for the remaining dough and filling.4. Steam the Modaks:
- Grease a steamer plate or a banana leaf with ghee.
- Place the modaks on it, leaving some space between them.
- Steam the modaks in a steamer or pressure cooker (without the whistle) for about 10-12 minutes on medium heat.
- Once done, let them rest for a few minutes before serving. 5. Serve:

Place the modaks on a plate, poke a generous hole on top, and drizzle warm ghee inside for that extra indulgence. Tips:-Dough texture: The dough should be soft and pliable, so kneading it well is key. If it feels too dry, sprinkle a little warm water.- Practice pleating: The pleating can be tricky, but with practice, you'll get better at it. You can also use a modak mold if available to make the process easier. Enjoy the modaks warm, and don't forget the generous dollop of ghee!

What is Zentangle art and how did it originate?

Zentangle is a form of meditative art that involves creating intricate designs with repeated patterns. It was developed by Rick Roberts and Maria Thomas in 2003 to help people focus, relax, and achieve inner peace through drawing.

The basic technique of Zentangle includes using a pen or pencil to draw abstract patterns on a small piece of paper or card, typically measuring 3.5 inches by 3.5 inches (8.9 cm by 8.9 cm). The patterns are usually black and white and often feature curved or organic shapes. Creating a Zentangle is meant to be a relaxing and meditative experience, focusing on the repetitive motion of drawing the patterns.

Many individuals find that practicing Zentangle helps alleviate stress and anxiety, improve concentration and focus, and promote a sense of calm and well-being.


ROTARY FAMILY-ZENTANGLE ART - Contd-

I started zentangling when I was in 6th grade. I learned it at my school, Shikshantar.

We were learning this art form so we could present it at the Humara Mela function, and after that, this art just kind of stuck with me.

I found zentangle to be an intriguing art form because it contains different kinds of patterns and there are no limitations on the patterns; they can be drawn in any way, making it easier to express yourself.

















Second, just as nature has its different aspects like trees, rivers, sky, etc., but is viewed as one whole beauty, zentangle art is also a merger of different patterns that represent different ideas, emotions, or thoughts of the artist, but you still view it as a whole.

You see it as a whole personality portrayed by the artist, which completes the motive of the artist - bringing forth their emotions and ideas. Due to a combination of all these reasons, I think zentangle art has been the best way for me to express my feelings and thoughts through art.




