CATCH THEM DOING RIGHT!

A father was cajoling his daughter to jump into the pool. The little girl was adamantly refusing. He was getting frustrated. Then something happened. He sweetened the offer with a promise of a big two-scoop Chocolate ice cream.

Splash! She was in the water before he could count 3! That little incentive was a nudge.

A nudge is a small act - an extrinsic one - that triggers people to change behaviors and take decisions. A municipal corporation was sending repeated emails to tax defaulters to pay up. Without a result, it changed a tactic. It sent a 'personalized' email to every defaulter with colored graphics depicting details of taxpayers in the neighborhood with no dues. 63% paid up in 3 days.

Behavioral economist, Dr Richard Thaler, won the 2017 Nobel for his outstanding work on the Nudge theory in which he suggested consumer behaviour can be influenced by small suggestions and positive reinforcements.

Proponents of nudge theory suggest that well-placed 'nudges' can reduce market failure, save the government money, encourage desirable actions and help increase the efficiency of resource use.

Our brain needs a higher number of positive entries than negative ones in order to counterbalance the built-in negativity bias. Several small, frequent, positive acts or comments work more effectively than one giant-size positive. The size of the positive is not what counts; it's the quantity. This is strictly a numbers game!

So, Friends, when was the last time you praised a direct report, a colleague—or your boss? You may have to think long and hard to remember the last time you recognized the efforts of a peer or leader.

Catching people doing something right is a powerful management concept to use with direct reports. It can also be a great way to build trust and camaraderie with others. Think about the last time you were recognized for your efforts. I'll bet you felt pretty satisfied and encouraged to keep up the good performance. No matter what your role, you have the power to ignite that same reaction in others.

So, My Dear Fellow Rotarians, let's start catching people doing something right, be it your colleague, subordinate, boss, fellow Rotarian, or your teammate, and create a lasting change in the community and in ourselves!

Celebration



Wonderful Birthday celebrations of our distinguished PP Rtn Mohan bhai Patel was organized to celebrate his completion of 93 Years (born: O1st August 1929) on 3rd August at Rotary Service Centre.

PP Rtn Mohan bhai Patel is a successful inventor, visionary, entrepreneur, industrialist, farmer, environmentalist, social worker and philanthropist. Mohan bhai Patel's 93 years of life journey would make for an interesting read for everyone.

He was born in Uttarsanda village, Kheda district, Gujarat. With the freedom struggle on in full force, Mohan bhai actually participated in the "Dandi March" of 1930 as a one-year old, in his mother's arms!!! At the age of eight, he was selected to be one of the guard-ofhonour, as a pole bearer holding a lathi, to welcome the visiting Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru and Sardar Vallabh bhai Patel, as part of their freedom struggle movement tour across India. Due to long wait for their arrival, the young Mohan bhai was exhausted standing holding the lathi, and let the lathi slip, which fell on Sardar Patel, just as Sardar Patel crossed the young exhausted Mohan bhai. Sardar Patel handed the lathi back to young Mohan bhai with the words, paraphrased as, 'Son, hold tight and be firm'. For 86 years and counting, Mohan bhai holds those words as his life's mantra and continues to live by it.

Mohan bhai got fully involved in India's Freedom Struggle, even having to flee to Bombay (Mumbai) to escape arrest, while he continued his studies, till he went to London for higher studies in 1947. He returned briefly (less than two weeks) in 1952 to marry his soulmate Chanda ben, on 17 January 1952, and returned to London with her by his side. He is a proud father of his sons Nayan and Kartik and daughter Nisha.

As an Entrepreneur and Industrialist, Mohan bhai established -

- the Patel Extrusion Group, believing that 'determination leads to success', pioneering manufacturers of aluminium collapsible tubes and other packing items, and runs it with the motto - 'excel in everything that one does'. Added to this is his firm belief in producing all the machines required for his factories indigenously. Making India Aatma Nirbhar, long before it became a slogan.

As a Farmer, he established -

- the SUPA Farm, spread across 250 acres of then grassy land in Talasari, Palghar District
- o created employment to local tribal population
- o brought about localised Green Revolution
- o heralded a cultural revolution in the area

















- Sheriff of Bombay (Mumbai) in 1984-85 by Government of Maharashtra
- Honorary Doctorate in Science from Sardar Patel University



- Priyadarshini Award for Education in 1990
- Jamnalal Bajaj Awards for Fair Business Practices in 1997
- Vishwa Guajarati Award in 2000
- Platinum Jubilee Award for contribution to Growth of Technical Education in India
- Rotary Lifetime Achievement Award from Rotary Club of Bombay West

13 Rotarians, 72 student volunteers 3 others , total 88 volunteers volunteered

for 352 manhours.
