A Great Soul! A Great Visionary! A Great Leader of People! An Entrepreneur!

Above All...a Great Human Being!

We all know, that to become a "saint" is perhaps easier, but to become a real human-being in the real sense requires effort and dedication and a genuine love in one's heart and here was a person who had that!; he was naturally endowed with this quality – a God's give to him. Well, his worldly name was Mohan Lal Gupta, in short MLG, as he used to write for himself. To me he was an elder brother and a benefactor and a saviour. He is no more in this mortal universe, but his presence can be felt by anyone who came in contact with him. Such a great personality he had that he will remain unforgettable. He printed his genuine humanly conduct on any person who came in his association. What a Great Soul!

I started knowing him when with another person we started having Sunday morning Bhagwat Gita reading satsang at Menaka (Guptaji's residential place). During one of those encounters, he mooted the idea of starting an alternative therapy center – he himself was a Pharmacist, well versed in the nuances of medicines and their effects and side-effects as also having worked with world renowned Pfizer Company. The idea behind his proposal was twofolds: first, to discourage dependence on medicinal usage and also to provide a hangout place to the retirees and people looking for some company as well as a stream to contribution and service. In short, the seed for starting "Swasthya Kendra" (SK) was sown by Guptaji and today that seed has blossomed to be a huge tree giving shade and fruits to many a people. Incidentally, Swasthya Kendra is the name of clinic working under the Umbrella of "Golden Era Care & Serve" of which MLG as the founder Trustee-Chairman.





SK as baby was borne in a rather dilapidated place in Aram Nagar, 7 Bungalows, Mumbai, allotted to Late Shri Lala Lajpat Rai (as I understood) by the Bombay Collector. MLG was instrumental in repairing and refurbishing it to a give a decent look and start the Acupressure services there, which remains a flagship service of SK tll date. As we know, with his involvement and influence, he mustered support from the Rotary Club ----- and Inner Wheel Club and many Rotarians personally. Even after SK moved from Aram Nagar to Lokhandwala Garden No. 4 (courtesy: Celebration Club, Lokhandwala), Guptaji's involvement remained, in fact multiplied. His vision to start more services at SK resulted in adding some very prestigious services like Physiotherapy and Homeopathy, etc.

His love for special-needs and underprivileged people was also equally touching and unmatched. I have numerous examples of that too, but let me just say that the way he greeted and embraced my son Gaurav (a Down Syndrome man) was divine.

I believe these examples are enough indicators of MLG's spirit of service-to-humanity and dedication to support sick, lonely and suffering individuals. Incidentally, at SK, we also provide, Sajog, Magnetotherapy, Counselling (Career, Relationships, Food & Nutrition), Acupuncture (besides Acupressure), etc. MLG's personal and professional support has been the backbone for Team SK to manage, maintain and advance in all directions. Golden Era Trustees and Team SK will continue to cherish the love and support MLG provided and will continue to draw from his unfading enthusiasm and spirit of dedication and contribution to humanity.

Like many of you, I also know about his love for Urdu literature (he was my guru to translate some Urdu verses (shers) – haha!). In the last years of his life, he was fond of one Gazal (Aaj Jane ki Zid na karo), which I sang for him many a time! Besides that we both used to spend time recalling some Urdu Sher's and also some known/unknown Gazals! Where are you Guptaji? I miss you for those small, sweet sessions over a cup of coffee!

For all the above and also his invitations to me to his home when he made tea for both of us, and many more short sweet meetings we had together, I remain ever so indebted to his love and support extended to me whenever I approached Guptaji for that.

Friends! I can go on ... I do feel overwhelmed with his memories but as we all know, one day we all have to leave his mortal body but the legacy we leave behind remain alive for a long time to come and MLG has left a rich legacy. He will never die in our memories and those will be our source of inspiration to continue the great work he has done in his life-time.

I close with a short prayer to Almighty God to continue to hold MLG in His Benevolent Lap and keep him in Eternal Peace.




