We are proud to announce the commencement of our Cervical Cancer Vaccination project; a crucial initiative aimed at safeguarding the health of young girls in our community.



On 27th September 2025, at 11:30 AM, our club administered the first dose of the Cervical Cancer vaccine to 30 girls from Sane Guruji School. We are pleased to share that a total of 140 parents have provided consent for their daughters to be vaccinated under this program. The second dose is scheduled for March 2026.

This impactful project is being carried out in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Bombay West, under the leadership of President of RCBW Rtn Jayant Sanghvi, President of Innerwheel Club of Bombay West Brinda Desai and guided by our dedicated Project Coordinator, Dr. Bhavna Patel and Medical Director Rtn Manish Mehta

Positivity isn't just about you; it's contagious! Spread kindness, empathy, and encouragement. Watch how it transforms your world and those around you.


