## **Editor's** Thoughts

October is very special to me! Not only all the festivals like Dussehra, Deepavali, Eid, etc., are celebrated in October, but it also happens to be my birthday month. Festivals are celebrated by one and all but 'Birthdays' are truly precious as they are absolutely personal and it is on this day that we see the light of day and come into this wonderful world! I proudly proclaim to be a Libran, as many celebrities also happen to be Librans. Many of our RCBW rotarians' birthdays also fall in the month of October.

October 24 happens to be World Polio day. What Rotary and its partners have achieved is nothing short of remarkable. We have helped reduce polio cases by 99.9 percent world wide, immunising more than 2 Billion children across 122 countries! Last year alone, more than 370 million children were vaccinated across 30 countries, using more than 1 billion doses of oral polio vaccine. As a result, we are seeing near historic lows in the number of cases. In August 2020, the World Health Organisation certified the African region free of wild polio virus, an incredible achievement for Rotary members and huge step on the road to eradication. To stay agile, Rotary and its partners are deploying a new polio vaccine, nOPV2, to fight outbreaks of circulating variant polio virus, which continues to threaten children in Africa as well as several countries in Asia and the Middle East, including Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Also, United Nations Day is celebrated each year on October 24, since 1945, to mark its promotion of human rights, diversity and progress across countries. Since its inception, UN has impacted the lives of people on issues like human rights, peace and security development, disease prevention, gender equality, education, humanitarian assistance etc.

Rotary and UN share a vision for peace and critical humanitarian issues. On many occasions, UN bodies like UNICEF and Rotary partner to provide life saving medicine, clean drinking water, education material etc. to children and families in developing countries.

Finally, a thought to ponder over. The key to unlocking our potential lies in our willingness to think, and to 'Imagine'. We must 'Imagine' things that aren't there presently and try to make them happen!






Rotary Club of Bombay Worli had organized two Blood Donation drives on **Tuesday**, **October 18**, **2022** :



## Zugrewadi – RCBW's Dream Project – A Report by Rtn. Kavita Godbole

A new chapter was written in the history of the Rotary Club of Bombay Worli (RCBW) on October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022 when top dignitaries from Rotary clubs of Mumbai District 3141 and top dignitaries from Raigad district came for the Inauguration of the New School Extension Building at the Adivasi village of Zugrewadi in Raigad district. To be specific, 25 dignitaries from Raigad district including Dr. Kiran Patil (CEO of Raigad ZP), Dr. Neha Balsare (Deputy Director SCERT, Pune) and from the Rotary family Rtn. Sandip Agarwalla (District Governor 3141), Rtn DGE Arun Bhargava, Rtn PDG Lata Subraidu, Rtn PDG Sunnil Mehra and other senior office bearers from Rotary, were present.

Each of the above dignitaries were so impressed with the work done that they each have committed to help and assist Rotary Worli to further enhance the outcome of students education so that they become productive members of the community. They have also offered to help in every way they can so that this experiment could be replicated at many such villages in Raigad district.

Rtn DG Sandip Agarwalla had this to say "It is a matter of great pride for D3141 that RCB Worli has taken on such an impactful and meaningful work in this village for the last 7 years. Under the leadership of President Sachin Singhvi and Project Director Kavita Godbole this remarkable project showed that enthusiastic and dedicated team work of all the club Rotarians can achieve. The entire event was organized to perfection with attention to every detail."

In the words of Rtn PDG Sunnil Mehra "It is a pleasure to see such great work done by clubs of our district and truly becomes an emotional moment being witness to the same. Our time was well spent by seeing that RCBW is changing lives and impacting communities"

Rtn Dr. Manish Motwani said "An absolute pleasure to witness this amazing project impacting so many. Continuity of projects in this zone year after year has increased the credibility of the club multifold".

Rtn Ashmi Parekh addressing Rtn Kavita said "It was such a pleasure to come, visit and witness stupendous work done by you and your club. I feel extremely proud of you. Project of this level and far from Mumbai is not easy to execute. Your hard work paid off".

Our journey with the Zugrewadi village started seven years back when a formal assessment of the existing condition of the village was done at the request of RCBW by the students of the Tata Institute of Social Sciences.

This study identified that:

- a) Malnutrition of kids was a significant problem;
- b) Adequate school facilities for children of the village and its surrounding areas with proper sanitation for boys and girls was not available;
- c) Lack of clean water for household use and
- d) Poor health of children and adults.

In order to meet the above needs of the villagers, RCBW immediately started working on all the above areas by:

- 1. Providing eggs and chikki along with khichdi with vegetables to all the students everyday as per the recommendation of Pediatric doctors;
- 2. Constructing check dams and providing bore wells for clean water for drinking and household needs throughout the year;



- 3. Constructing toilet blocks for boys and girls with water;
- 4. Educating children on the benefits of safe sanitization and providing sanitary napkins to girls and ladies of the village;
- 5. Organizing Medical camps regularly for eye, dental and general health by doctors of our club and medication/supplements were provided to the villagers at no cost.

The Inauguration on October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022 was the culmination of the following major activities:

- i. Construction of the New School building comprising of four classrooms with furniture;
- ii. Laboratory with associated equipment;
- iii. Computer room with equipment along with the library;
- iv. Kitchen and dining area for hygienic preparation of daily food and
- v. Playground with equipment for various age groups.

The above addition in facilities will now accommodate 200+ students at a time as compared to present 120 students.

The holistic development of the village has resulted in now providing good education with modern facilities to all the children living nearby. It has resulted in ladies not having to walk 8 kilometers to get daily needs of water. The health of children and adults has improved considerably with nutritious food and regular health check-ups. The playground has given new life and vigour to them which will improve the overall development of their mind and body. The Zugrewadi village with the help of all the participants has been transformed from dependency and underdevelopment to sustainability and sufficiency.

Our further plans of improving lives of Zugrewadi village includes:

- i. Providing solar energy for school and street lights
- ii. Getting more qualified teachers with the help of authorities in Raigad district
- iii. Scholarships for deserving students
- iv. Nurses' training for girls
- v. Vocational and skill development training for villagers in areas of farming, carpentry, plumbing, electrical and masonry etc.

Our experiment of adopting a backward Adivasi village has been very satisfying as the beneficiaries are the ones who had very little or no hope to improve their standard of living. We plan to do more of this in future and we believe more and more people and organizations need to adopt similar villages so that progress and prosperity comes to all.

In conclusion, as our Rtn Mehul Zatakia aptly summed up the Inauguration function, "The flawless inauguration involved a massive coordination between our club, district, various government agencies, the villagers, the school and its students. The gigantic efforts put in by the club President Sachin Singhvi and his entire team (including Rotaractors) was commendable. Full credit to Rtn Kavita Godbole who has steered this project successfully through various Presidents and continues to be the driving force for this commendable initiative".



## The Rotary Foundation (TRF)

### November is the Rotary Foundation month

### What is TRF?

The Rotary Foundation was established in the year 1917 by the 6<sup>th</sup> RI President Arch Klumph, to create source of Funds for various charitable and educational programmes of Rotary International. It is funded only through the voluntary contributions from Rotarians and well-wishers of the Foundation. These donations get invested for three years and interest is used towards administrative expenses. Thus, 93% of the donation goes for actual programmes which is highly remarkable. It is perhaps a World Record among charity driven organisations, as per Charity Navigator and American Independent Charity Watchdog Organization that evaluates charitable organizations in United States. Districts and Clubs can avail this Fund for various programmes and projects falling under 6 areas of focus:

- a. Promoting Peace;
- b. Providing Clean Water;
- c. Saving Mothers and Children;
- d. Supporting Education;
- e. Growing Local Economies;
- f. Fighting Disease.

Contributions are collected in three Funds:

- a. Annual Fund;
- b. Endowment Fund;
- c. Polio Plus Fund.

# **Untold Discoveries**

## **Exploring Bizzare Places in the world**

HAPPY Diwali my dear friends!!!

This Diwali let us explore 2 bizarre places in the world.

1. The first one is 'The **Crooked Forest' in Poland.** It is a grove of oddlyshaped pine trees located in the village of Nowe Czarnowo near the town of Griffino, West Pomerania, in north-western Poland. It is a protected natural monument of Poland.

This grove of 400 pines was planted in the village of Nowe Czarnowo around 1930. Each pine tree bends sharply to the north, just above ground level, then curves back upright after a sideways excursion of three to nine feet (1-3 m). The curved pines are enclosed by a surrounding forest of straight pine trees.

It is generally believed that some form of human tool or technique was used to make the trees grow or bend this way, but the method has never been determined, and remains a mystery to this day. It has been speculated that the trees may have been deformed to create naturally curved timber for use in furniture or boat building. Others surmise that a snowstorm could have bent the trunks, but there is little evidence of that.



2. The **Darvaza gas crater** also known as the **Door to Hell** or **Gates of Hell**, is a burning natural gas field collapsed into cavern near Darvaza, Turkmenistan. The gas reserve found here is one of the largest in the world. The name "Door to Hell" was given to the field by the locals, referring to the fire, boiling mud, and orange flames in the large crater, which has a diameter of 70 metres (230 ft) and its depth is 30 m (98 ft).

Accurate records of how the crater ignited have not been discovered, and some facts are disputed. One of the more popular theories is that Soviet geologists intentionally set it on fire in 1971 to prevent the spread of methane gas, and it is thought to have been burning continuously ever since. The crater has become a popular tourist attraction. The surrounding area is also popular for wild desert camping.


