




## Eye Camp at Govt. Senior Secondary High School Chakkarpur (14th Dec)











Under the leadership of Rtn Dr. Dinesh Saksena and in association with NGO Vision Springs, our club set up an Eye Camp to check the eyesight of Class VI, IX and XI children of Government Senior Secondary High School at Chakkarpur. 686 children from class 6th, 9th and 11th, all sections were screened starting from 9 am to 3.30 pm. The two teams from Vision Spring sincerely worked till the end. Spectacles were prescribed to 82 children (12%) whereas 15 children needed hospital referral. The spectacles would be ready in 3 weeks time approximately. The camp was quite successful with every one's cooperation. The school staff helped us in organising the set-up and provided hot tea too to the entire team. Special thanks to, President Balji Ahluwalia, R'anne Dr. Manju Saksena, Rtn Sushma Mattoo, Rtn Gita Jain, Rtn Meeta Ghosh and R'anne Reena Mittal for their presence to motivate team members.

An eminent social activist and a Past President of Rotary Club of Gurgaon South City, who has dedicated a whole lifetime to providing blood and blood related services to various medical institutions in Gurgaon and the underprivileged who otherwise have no hope of getting timely help. He is now the President of The Rotary Club of Gurgaon South City Community Services Society which is managing five renowned charitable institutions dealing with Blood related services. Blood is our life, saving our lives and Rtn Sharma has ensured that blood and blood related services are available to save lives wherever required and possible. Beginning his address, he complimented our club for leading in collection of Blood Units in District 3011 with 5 BDCs and more than 750 units already to its credit. He then





spoke about the history of the five institutions conceptualized and established by the Rotary Club of Gurgaon South City under the aegis of The Rotary Club of Gurgaon South City Community Services Society between 2017 till now. All these institutions are saving lives of the underprivileged round the clock free of cost or at nominal charges.











#### These are:

### 1. Rotary Blood Centre, Gurugram (Since 2017)

The biggest standalone Charitable Blood Centre in Gurugram providing 24/7 services to more than 400 Medical Establishments in Gurugram and neighboring areas.

#### 2. Rotary Thalassemia Centre, Gurugram (Since 2019)

The biggest standalone Charitable Thalassemia Centre in Gurugram providing free treatment to 140 registered patients.

#### 3. Rotary Skill Centre, Gurugram (Since 2019)

The only Blood Centre providing free of cost training to Medical Lab Technicians in the field of Transfusion Medicine. It has a tie up with IPHH, Delhi, GD Goenka University, Gurugram and Shri Vishwakarma University, Palwal whose students are being trained and supported with placement in reputed Blood Centers and Path labs.

#### 4. Rotary Dialysis Centre, Gurugram (Since 2022)

The biggest standalone Charitable Dialysis Centre in Gurugram providing high quality Dialysis services to patients at the lowest charges in Gurugram.

### 5. Rotary Charitable Path Lab, Gurugram (Since 2023)

The only charitable path lab in Gurugram providing free testing services to all BPL card holders and at nominal charges from others. The insight provided by PP Rtn










### President Baljit Ahluwalia as a Guest Speaker at Rotary Club Of Delhi





He talked to the Village Panchayat who had done nothing about it except reporting it to concerned department many times. Eventually he took it upon himself to stop this collosal wastage and went about fitting plastic taps or repairing the existing ones.





This OUT OF THE BOX idea has now been taken up as a project by DoAr students who went to Jafrabad village in Tauru, Haryana and fixed 50 taps in a day, all by themselves saving a mindblowing 324000 litres of water everyday.
