GUEST SPEAKER Mr M.M SHARMA

Our club invites distinguished guest speakers to break the monotony and enrich the learning experience of our members. Mr M M Sharma, our eminent guest speaker of the day is an authority on a subject that few of us may know about as corporate honchos but probably not as individuals – "Competition Law & Policy Practice". An Advocate at Delhi High Court, he holds a Post Graduate Diploma in Economics of Competition Law from Kings College, London and presently heads the Competition Law & Policy practice





over 38 years' experience, including Regulatory & Judicial experience as Judge Advocate (JAG Branch) in the Indian Navy / Coast Guard of over 10 years. He has worked in the Competition Commission of India (CCI) as Additional Registrar during 2006-2008. and was responsible for drafting the Implementing Regulations under the Competition Act, 2002.

Topic of the day was **Competition law and its impact on market.** He explained the importance of Competition law as it promotes fair competition in markets, which benefits consumers, producers, and distributors. Competition leads to increased efficiency, wider choice

for consumers, optimal utilization of scarce resources, and economic growth. Competition also benefits all stakeholders in the economy, including consumers, producers, and distributors. He gave the overview of **CCI** and its journey so far.

He also gave examples of how monopolies and cartel formations have harmed and looted the consumer and could be controlled through such laws only when challenged.







How can competition law help your business? When should you consult a competition lawyer?

A Competition Law advocate can help you if your raw material supplier, enjoying monoipoly in the market indulges in arbitrary increase in prices without justification or all the raw material suppliers form a cartel, leaving the buyer with no option at all in

absence of competition. Such suppliers also tend to restrict discounts or refuse to supply. You could also be excluded from the market due to restrictive conditions imposed by a large buyer etc.

A lively Q&A round that followed demonstrated that it was an engaging session and the information given by Mr Sharma was well received. President Rtn. Baljit Ahluwalia presented a gift to Mr M.M Sharma. Vote of Thanks was delivered by PE Rajeev Goel.



Durga Puja -To feast or fast?

Durga Puja is synonymous with fun times for Bengalis, whereas the Navratras, for many Indian cultures, are celebrated with some form of abstinence. For Bengalis, it is the time their daughter Durga comes to her parents' home or 'Maika' for her annual holiday with her four children. She is part of our family here on Earth and it is in that spirit that she embodies a Goddess. Her presence is reason for celebration, social gatherings, people dressing up, hearty meals, fairs, music, dance and joyous celebration. As a festival, Durga Puja deeply intertwined with the arts, crafts, music, theater, films - all forms of human expression. It is an all-round celebration. Durga and the spirit of Durga puja resides in the hearts of all Bengalis. In lighter vein, even when some Bengalis offer Anjali (offering to Goddess Durga in the morning), it is with an eye on the 'prasad' and the women, adorning beautiful white and red sarees draped in the quintessential Bengali style as well as traditional jewellery, look like manifestations of Durga. The most loved part about these celebrations is that Goddess Durga brings everyone together in festive fervour, oftentimes people from all cultures.





In Bengal, committees organising the Puja are headed by non-Bengalis. Puja pandals and various competitions are judged on the basis of creative content, encompassing a host of different genres of the arts and participants from different cultures. Therein lies the beauty of this inclusive social festival, which brings everyone together for a joyful time.
