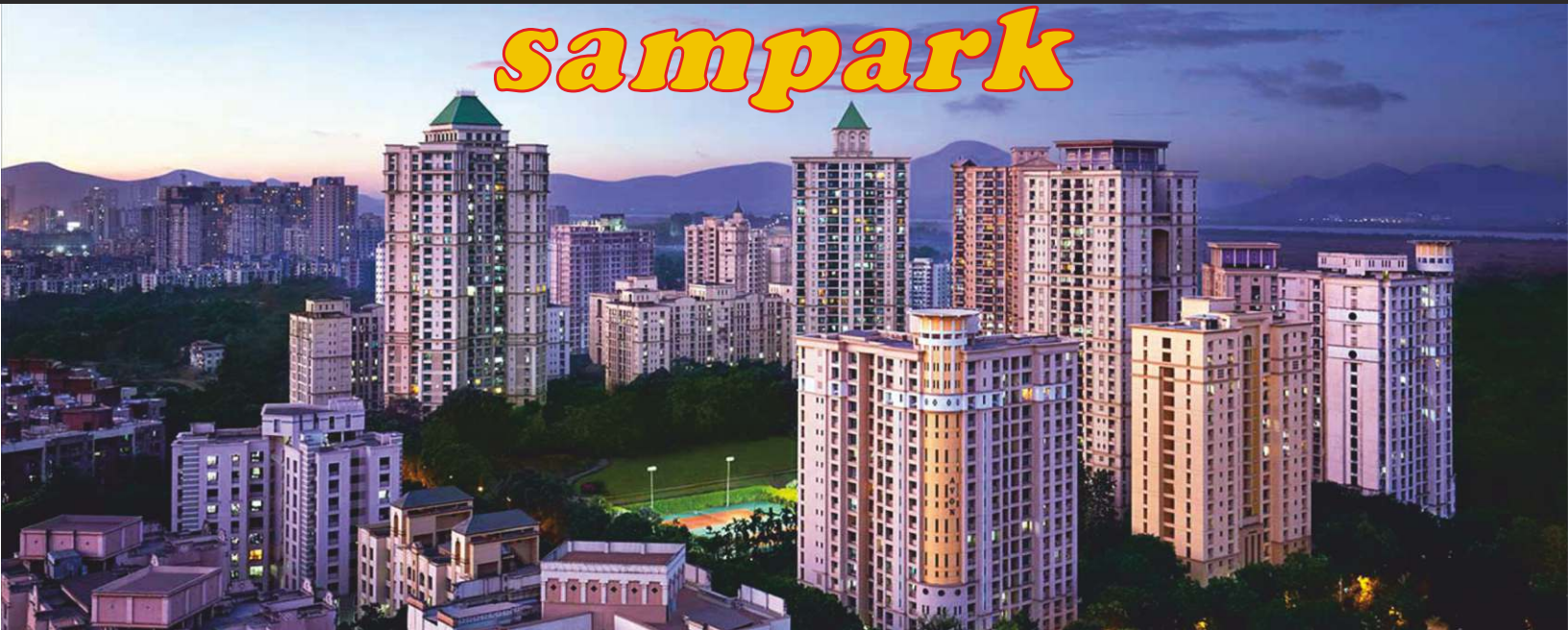

Glimpses of Dry Waste Management project



Rotary club of Hiranandani Estate(RCHE) along with ATOS as part of their CSR activity have implemented a **semi-automatic Dry waste segregation project** at Thane (E). This project is an ongoing project run by **Samarth Bharat Vyaspith** wherein dry waste was being segregated by spreading the waste on the floor. The actual process was cumbersome and slow.

RCHE and ATOS have now established a 3000 Sq feet covered area with a proper concrete floor and a rain proof shed. Two mechanized equipment's were installed

- ❖ Motorized segregation conveyor with variable speed control and belt and hopper 9M long.
- ❖ Bailing machine capacity 30 T

This project has helped in segregating the waste 5 times faster and reduced the volume of the segregated waste to 20% by compressing it and bailing it. The segregated waste can now be separated and stacked and is able to carry more weight per cubic feet. The working staff are now able to segregate the

waste standing which has improved their productivity multi fold. The conveyor has fastened the process as bins have been put on both sides of the conveyor for ease of segregation. The project will get to employ more women to handle the increased volumes.

The DWM project strives for maximum waste recovery through recycling, reuse and aims at zero waste to be disposed onto dump-yards and landfills. The long-term objective is thus to reduce the environmental degradation caused by solid waste.

A properly run decentralised DWM project will contribute to a cleaner local environment, maintaining pure surface and ground water, healthy soils, and clean air. Noteworthy, a clean local environment will immediately benefit the most vulnerable groups of society whose livelihoods often depend on the natural resources available locally.

The project will also give opportunities for the start-up of micro-enterprises in recycling, e.g. recycling of paper, Tetra Pack cartons, Pet bottles and etc.

Constructing toilet blocks in Ashram Shalas at Ranshet and Kochai Tribal Residential Schools



Rotary club of Hiranandani Estate(RCHE) along with ATOS as part of their CSR activity along with the help of GramsevaPratishtan (Local NGO) are constructing toilet blocks in Ashram Shalas at Ranshet and Kochai Tribal Residential Schools. Both the schools are suffering from Nil or Insufficient sanitation facilities. In Ranshet the Students resort to open Defecation practices. Lack of wash stations and Toilets force the children to actually use the nearby natural water source. Such Unhealthy sanitation habits render the children prone to infections and other hygiene related issues.

The Ranshet school has nearly 500 boys and the Kochai shool has 310 girls. In Kochai the existing toilet is nearly defunct and the girls have no alternative but to use this facility.

In Ashram Shalas no grant is allotted by the government for infrastructure development and maintenance. The school heavily depends upon private donors for infrastructure development.

In order to address the above need Rotary Club of Hiranandani Estate with the ground support of Gramseva Pratishtan supported by other donors have proposed to construct a sanitation facility for boys at the school. The said facility will help avoid the issues cited above and provide the students with clean and safe sanitation facility and help maintain hygiene. The project also aims at sensitizing the students and teachers about safe and hygienic sanitation practices and maintenance of the facility in future to avail maximum benefit to students.

Roti making & a Dough making machine to SEAL Ashram Vangani, Nere, New Panvel



Rotary club of Hiranandani Estate Handed over a Roti making & a Dough making machine to SEAL Ashram Vangani, Nere, New Panvel on 01.06.2021.

SEAL is an Ashram dedicated to rescuing destitute and missing children from the Railway Platforms and Streets of Mumbai and Suburbs. They rescue them and provides them shelter, food, clothing, health-care, and education. Once they are healthy they then start the process of reuniting them with their families.

They have around 300 underprivileged people from all ages men, women, girls, boys mainly HIV & TB patients, mentally challenged, handicapped, visually impaired, abandoned parents and fully orphaned children.

In COVID period they have avoided and are avoiding getting any form of external help so as to minimize the risk of the inmates contracting the dreaded Virus.

Preparing meals all by themselves for so many inmates is a task and that to 3 times a day. RCHE was approached by them and we were requested to help them out.

RCHE has now installed a 1000 roti per hour machine along with a dough making machine. Hopefully this will help them out of their crisis.

Rotary club of Hiranandani Estate recently inaugurated a "Kitchen Garden" at an Aanganwadi in Wada district.



The concept is to reduce Malnutrition which is prevalent among children in rural India and very much visible in these Aanganwadi's. The unutilized land available with the Aanganwadi was utilized for this purpose. The land was barricaded with cement pillars and partitioned to keep the animals away.

The land was then cleared of all stones, debris and was flattened. Fertile soil layer was laid and various green vegetables, leafy vegetables, Brinjal, Tomatoes, Papayasaplings were sown. The concept is to utilize the produce inside the aanganwadi to provide nutrition to the children.

The idea behind the project is also to encourage the mothers and in turn the villagers to replicate the garden in their own backyards and reap the benefits of the vegetables & fruits.

The other aim was also to show other nearby Aanganwadi's that they also can create a kitchen garden and encourage the villagers to grow vegetables in their backyards. This will also provide them little income if the crops are harnessed well enough. This was a small effort by RCHE to overcome malnutrition. Thanks to all the members who donated and participated in this project & made this successful.
