The enthusiasm and gratitude from both students and Rotarians highlighted the transformative impact of this project.

The Installation Ceremony at Chatrapati Shivaji Vidyalaya was a grand affair, marked by a significant tree plantation drive. Each plant was dedicated by the students in honour of their mothers, symbolizing growth, respect, and a commitment to environmental stewardship. The Plants were donated by RCMM to the school to be planted in the school premises.





SUPPORTING OLD-AGE HOME AT VIRAR

The Samarth Ashram, established by the Jeevan Anand Sanstha in Virar (East), Tal. Vasai, Dist. Palghar, provides care for homeless and helpless elderly individuals. They offer medical facilities and support, and make efforts to reunite these seniors with their families, though this is not always possible.

RCMM received a request from Rtn. Manoj to assist the ashram with towels, blankets, and other necessities. On 7th August, 2024 Rtns. Dhananjay, Kishore, Manoj, and Varsha, along with PR Vidula, visited the ashram and distributed chaddars, bedsheets, towels, and napkins to each resident. This effort brought immense satisfaction.

REVIVING HOPE: BICYCLE MAINTENANCE AND RESTORATION

As you travel deeper into the interiors of Maharashtra, you witness the challenges students face just to attend school. Despite long distances and tough conditions, these young learners remain dedicated to their education. Unfortunately, in many families, boys are given priority, often leading to girls dropping out.

To address this, the Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim (RCMM) has been actively supporting the students of Tilher School by providing bicycles, with other Rotary clubs joining the cause. The school operates a bicycle bank, where graduating students pass on their bicycles to the next batch. However, over the years, these bicycles have worn out and required significant restoration.

Taking the initiative, Rtn. Kishore assessed the situation, identified the necessary repairs, and coordinated with a vendor. On August 7th, 55 fully restored bicycles were handed over to the students. This project was especially fulfilling, knowing these children walk over 5 kilometers each way to reach school. A recent blood test revealed that 90% of these children suffer from low hemoglobin levels, making their determination to attend school even more remarkable.







REVIVING HOPE: BICYCLE MAINTENANCE AND RESTORATION

In addition to the bicycles, RCMM distributed Ideal Study App coupons to 90 students. This mobile application, designed for 10th standard students of the SSC Board of Maharashtra, offers comprehensive resources in Marathi, English, and Semi-English mediums. A demonstration of the app was provided, showing how it can help students enhance their learning experience and improve their scores—provided they have access to a mobile handset.

This project is a testament to the power of smart solutions and the importance of going digital, paving the way for a brighter future for these determined students.








ORGAN DONATION AWARENESS

Organ donation awareness in India is a critical issue that demands attention. Despite significant progress, misconceptions and cultural barriers still hinder donation rates. Increasing awareness through education campaigns and addressing concerns surrounding organ donation can potentially save countless lives and improve healthcare outcomes across the nation. RCMM along with RCRRC and RCKCM had organized the Organ Donation Awareness Session on Zoom on 10th August, 2024 for Rotarians and Rotaractors. Almost 55 plus people attended the session. Session was managed by Rotaractors. Rtr. Bhoomi commenced the session with National Anthem and welcoming all for the session. Speakers Rtn. Dr Satbhai and Rtn. Sunita were introduced by Rtr. Pranjal.

Rtn. Sunita began by emphasizing the importance of organ donation and how it can save lives. She explained that anyone can become an organ donor, regardless of age or medical history. She highlighted the significance of eye and skin donation, noting that these are the most commonly needed tissues.

Rtn. Sunita also provided guidance on the registration process for organ donation. She stressed the importance of keeping family members informed about one's decision to donate, as this awareness is crucial. If relatives are unaware of the donor's intentions, it can complicate the process after death, potentially leading to missed opportunities to save lives.

KARGIL: VALOUR REIGNITED - SESSION BY BRIGADIER AJIT SRIVASTAV

Kargil Vijay Diwas is a day of great significance for India as it commemorates the country's victory over Pakistan in the Kargil War of 1999. The day is celebrated on July 26 every year to honour the brave soldiers who sacrificed their lives in the war and to pay tribute to their heroic acts of valour and courage. The day is marked by various events and ceremonies across the country, including parades, wreath-laying ceremonies, and cultural programs.






PROJECT NATIONAL INTEGRATION - Library Books to Army Goodwill school



32 MEASURING HAPPINESS BY RTN. S VENKATESWARAN

In a recent session on 24th August, Rtn. S Venkateswaran delivered an insightful and interactive presentation on the concept of "32 Measuring Happiness." He began by sharing why he is proud to be a Rotarian, grounding his perspective in the Rotary's 4-Way Test. He emphasized the importance of truth, fairness, goodwill, and the benefits to all concerned, setting the stage for his discussion on happiness.

Rtn. S Venkateswaran then posed a fundamental question: "What is happiness, and what brings you happiness?" He distinguished between happiness and pleasure, explaining that while pleasure is fleeting, true happiness equates to a sense of fulfilment. He introduced the concept of a Happiness Score, represented by the formula H = F, where happiness is directly proportional to fulfilment.



To quantify happiness, he proposed a simple equation: the Happiness Score (HS) is the ratio of fulfilment to requirement, or F/R. When this ratio equals 100%, one has achieved complete happiness. However, he added that it is possible to exceed 100% by fulfilling not just one's own requirements but also the needs of others. This, he explained, leads to a higher level of happiness, represented by HS (Rev), where additional fulfilment (F1, F2, F3, etc.) is factored in.

Reflecting on his personal journey, he shared how Rotary has helped him shift his life perspective from focusing on "gold" or goals to embracing "platinum" or purpose. He discussed how his goals have evolved from seeking wealth, fame, and personal success to pursuing satisfaction, fulfilment, and significance in life. He now prioritizes giving over receiving and considers humanity at large as his extended family, moving beyond immediate and extended family ties.

He concluded by expressing his deep gratitude to Rotary for providing the opportunity to transform his outlook on life, shifting from the pursuit of success to seeking purpose and significance. With this newfound perspective, he proudly declared, "I am proud to be a Rotarian."




