In mid-December, RCMM executed another impactful project, donating essential medical equipment to the paediatric department of JJ Hospital, aiming to provide enhanced care and hope to countless newborns. The event was graced by District Governor (DG) Chetan Desai and JJ Hospital Dean, Rtn. Dr. Pallavi Saple, along with the hospital's dedicated medical staff and Rotarians. DG Desai toured the paediatric ward to assess additional areas where future medical support could make a meaningful difference.

Christmas celebrations at Seva Bharati School were filled with joy and warmth. The tiny tots received sparkling blankets and enjoyed a sponsored meal, spreading smiles and holiday cheer. Another commendable act of kindness was the urgent collection of donations for 1,300 blankets to protect poverty-stricken Adivasi tribal children from the harsh winter, accomplished within just two days.

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

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


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EMPOWER EDUCATION – PROVISION OF COMPUTERS SHREE SHANTADURGA HIGH SCHOOL AT VADACHA PAT

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PAEDIATRIC CARE ENHANCEMENT: PROVIDING MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

The 'Paediatric Care Enhancement: Providing Medical Equipment to J. J. Hospital' project stands as a testament to how compassion and collaboration can create a lasting positive impact on society. This thoughtful initiative is a shining example of the Rotary Club of Mumbai Mahim's (RCMM) commitment to enhancing healthcare services for children, inspiring others to join hands in humanitarian causes.

At the heart of this endeavour was the donation of essential medical equipment to bolster paediatric care. The contributions included a spirometer, two advanced pulse oximeters, a paediatric AED machine, and a television for the paediatric ward. Each of these items plays a critical role in improving medical outcomes and the overall experience for young patients.

- **Spirometer:** This device measures lung function and is essential for diagnosing and managing respiratory conditions such as asthma, bronchitis, and other pulmonary diseases. By providing accurate lung capacity readings, it enables timely intervention and treatment for children with breathing difficulties.
- **Pulse Oximeters:** These sophisticated devices monitor oxygen saturation levels in the blood. They are crucial for detecting hypoxemia (low oxygen levels) and ensuring that children receive timely oxygen therapy or other necessary medical attention, particularly in cases of respiratory distress or sleep-related breathing disorders.
- **Paediatric AED (Automated External Defibrillator) Machine:** Specifically designed for children, this life-saving device can detect and treat sudden cardiac arrest by delivering a controlled electric shock to restore a normal heart rhythm. Having a paediatric AED on hand significantly improves survival rates during critical emergencies.
- **Television for the Paediatric Ward:** Beyond medical care, the well-being of young patients is a vital aspect of recovery. The television serves as a source of comfort and distraction, helping to alleviate the anxiety and stress that children often experience in hospital settings.

The complex procedure to correct an Inlet Ventricular Septal Defect was carried out using a minimally invasive approach, with only a 5 cm incision on the chest. This advanced technique ensured reduced post-operative pain and a less noticeable scar, significantly enhancing the patient's recovery and overall well-being.

180 years of healing history at JJ Hospital

To celebrate 180 years of teaching and healing, Sir JJ Hospital has opened a museum to showcase its rich medical heritage. The medical college and hospital was started with a generous donation of Rs1 lakh. While the administration has started the museum in the hospital's Boys Common Room, it will be later shifted to the original medical college building, which is ground plus two structure and also houses the JJ Marg police station. The Boys' Common Room - also a heritage structure inside the hospital premises - is said to be a 159-year-old building that once housed the hospital's infectious diseases ward. In the 1960s, it served as the site of its bacteriology department. The museum houses artefacts, busts and pictures that are more than 150-100 years old. "This institution is the only example of a single person donating an entire hospital for a medical college. The Grant Medical College (GMC) and Sir Jamsetjee Jeejeebhoy Hospital opened to students and patients on 15 May, 1845, making it a historic day. This remarkable history is reflected in the museum," said Dr Pallavi Saple, Sir JJ Group of Hospitals dean She added that the museum will introduce the visitors to the illustrious history about the hospital as well as the founding members, whose contribution made the establishment a reality. "The museum also depicts the renowned alumni of the hospital, who are known for their huge contribution in the medical field," said Dr Saple.

- Dr Acacio Veigas, the Goan doctor to ring alarm bell about pandemic, was also a GMC graduate






